DUKE IS TO MARRY

English Society Quite Excited In Guessing Who Are to Be Brides-Maids at York's Wedding.

LONDON, Mar. 9.—The women who are to be invited to the wedding of the Duke of York and Lady Elizabeth Bowes-Lyon are perhaps most concerned with deciding what to wear, but millions of other women in England and elsewhere are just now more interested in guessing who will be named as bridesmaids.

So far no names have been announced, but those on the outside hear from those on the inside that there will be eight of them, including three princesses. Two of the princesses, Maud, younger daughter of the Princess Royal, and Lady Mary Cambridge, niece of the Queen, were bridesmaids at the wedding of Princess Mary last year. Lady May Cambridge, the 16-year-old daughter of the Earl and Countess of Athlone, will be the third princess to attend the bride. Another of Princess Mary's bridesmaids, Lady Doris Gordon-Lennox, so the gossips say, will also be in the wedding party at the coming royal nuptials.

Among the other young women of the aristocracy who, one hears, will be similarly honored, are to be at least two daughters of Scottish peers, Lady Mary Fox Strangeways and Lady Katherine Hamilton, daughter of the Duke of Abercorn, also are mentioned as likely selections.

Pending official announcement of the wedding program, a wave of advance reports sweeps daily through drawing rooms and tea shops. These talkers have it there will be no "best man," but the three brothers of the royal bridegroom will attend him as his "supporters." The ceremony will take place in Westminster Abbey.

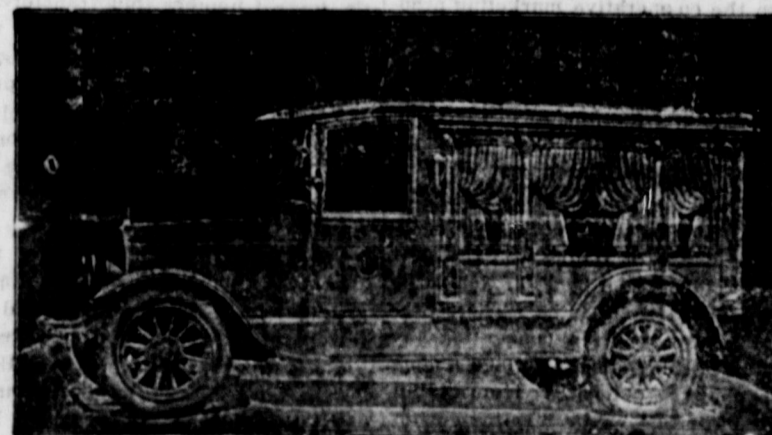

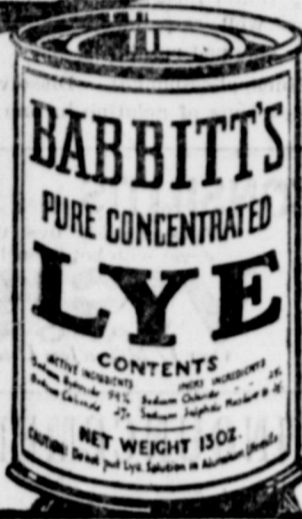

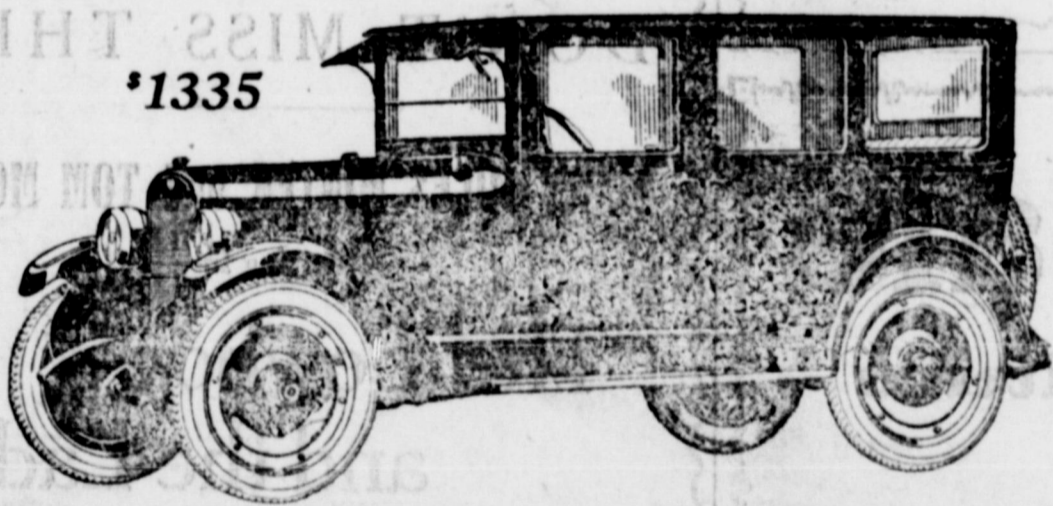

Think Range Good About San Angelo.—W. G. Murray and S. C. Arnett, ranchmen, have returned to their homes at Lubbock from San Angelo, Coleman and other points in that section where they made a trip in the interest of their cattle business. Never in the history of the cattle business in that territory have conditions been better for the ranchman than at this time, according to Mr. Murray. The weed crop is growing and the good season that is in the ground at this time insures its continual growth to far into the spring, and the weeds upon which cattle thrive are especially well along in growth at this time.—Lubbock Avalanche.

HOUSEHOLD HINTS.

Here are some suggested menus:

- Puffed Rice

Eggs, scrambled with tomatoes: Take two good sized tomatoes, peel, cut them in pieces and saute them in hot olive oil or butter. When cooked, drain off the liquid and mix with hot scrambled eggs. Season with one-fourth teaspoon salt, a few grains of pepper, and serve on hot toast.

Scrambled Eggs: allow an egg to each person. Have ready a frying pan heated and melt a tablespoon of butter, bread eggs in saucer and slip in to pan without beating and begin to scrape them from the bottom of the pan with a broad-bladed knife, just as fast as you can, cooking until a little softer than you wish to serve them, as they will stiffen after they are removed from the fire; sprinkle with salt and serve at once.

Stewed Celery: stalks which are too tough or coarse for serving uncooked may be used for this dish.

Wash, scrape and cut the stalks crosswise. Cook in little or boiling salted water to barely cover celery. Cook gently for one-half or until tender. Drain and add to sauce made of

liquid and milk to make three-quarters cup (sauce enough for one pint cooked celery).

Bran Muffins: Sift one cup flour, one teaspoon salt and three teaspoons bran; one and one-fourth cups milk one-half cup molasses and one egg well-beaten. Bake in greased muffin pans in hot oven over 30 minutes.

Veal Birds: Wipe one-half inch thick slices of meat cut in slices 3x3 1-2 inches. Spread pieces with stuffing, roll and tie, sprinkle with salt and pepper, dredge with flour. Brown with thin white sauce and cook slowly until tender. The trimmings may be used to make white stock, which may be added to the sauce.

Savory Carrots: Scrape, then cut new carrots into straws; cook tender in boiling salted water and drain dry. Season with one-fourth teaspoon salt (to 2 cups carrots) dash of peppers, two or three drops of onion juice, and two tablespoons butter and shake over fire until hot and glazed. Pile on dish in pyramid form; add one cup green peas, well seasoned, and sprinkle with chopped parsley.

Pineapple Sponge: Dissolve two tablespoons of gelatine in one cup of

cold water; melt over hot water; add four tablespoons granulated sugar, one tablespoon lemon juice and one cup of pineapple juice. Beat whites of three eggs stiffly and when the mixture begins to set, beat them in gradually; continue to beat until mixture is of a jelly like consistency, then pour in wet mould and chill. Decorate with pineapple slices.

All measurements are level, the half pint measuring cup, and the regulation teaspoon and tablespoon being used.
