Defendant's Attorneys To Ask For To Negotiate Before Removal New Trial And In Event New Trial Is Denied, Will Make An Appeal.

Two years in the penitentiary was the sentence meted out to J. C. Gray at the hands of the jury who reported at 2:30 Friday afternoon, after being out twenty-two and a half hours.

Defendant's attorneys announce that a motion for a new trial would be filed and in the event a new trial is denied, the case will be appealed.

The report of the jury was signed by W. W. Youngblood as foreman and stated that the jury found Gray guilty of manslaughter and fixed the sentence at two years in the peniten-

"We do not recommend a suspension of sentence," the report concluded. Judge Joiner discharged the jury immediately.

BEST WATER IN ALL WEST TEXAS

Addition of Filtration Plant Will Give Sweetwater Best Water Supply System Any City In Western Texas.

The Sweetwater City Commission has just authorized the installation of a filtration plant at an estimated cost

of \$35,000 The filtration plant will be of the most modern mechanical type as approved by the State Health authorities. It will have two settling basins, mechanical aeration and other modern features. Work of installation will begin at once. A Dallas engineer has been employed to supervise the pro-

By this addition to its water system. Sweetwater will have one of the best city water supplies in West Texas. Lake Trammell, in the hills, nine miles south of the town, contains one and one half billion gallons of water, sufficient to supply a city of twenty thousand population for two and one half years without a drop of rain. The water at the dam is seventy feet deep and the take proper has an area of over two hundred acres, with a deep extension of Sweetwater Creek back into the hills. The lake is over one hundred feet higher than the town, which it supplies with gravity flow, The drainage area which supplies the lake contains 54 square miles of ter-



HOUSEHOLD HINTS.

PLAIN FRITTER BATTER. Cup of flour.

2 level teaspoons baking powder. One egg.

Half cup of milk. Quarter teaspoon salt.

Add 2 tablespoons sugar if sweet batter is desired. Sift dry ingredients together. Add beaten eggs and milk, and beat until smooth.

#### APPLE FRITTERS.

Make plain fritter batter as above. Take four large, sound apples; peel, and fry. core and quarter. Dip each quarter in batter, and fry to light brown in a smoking hot lard. Each fritter will at first sink to the bottom of the kettle; then as the heat starts baking powder into action and dough begins to swell, it will rise to surface, and should be gently turning, the turning to be repeated until fritter is finely colered. Most fritters are done within 5 minutes, time needed to cook them being yolks of eggs, sugar and butter. When determined by one which should be cooked as a tester.

#### BANANA FRITTERS.

1 1-3 cups pastry flour 1 1-2 level teaspoons baking powder 2 tablespoons sugar

Half cup milk 2 eggs, beaten separately
