NEW COMMISSION GOES INTO OFFICE

Joe H. Boothe Sworn In As Mayor With Musgrove Re-Elected-Street Commissioner Elected May 5.

DUDGEON TURNS IN RESIGNATION

Old Commission Holds Short Session Previous to Re-Organization-Burton-Lingo Co. Granted Permit.

At a special meeting of the City Commission Friday afternoon, W. T. Trammell was appointed Street Commissioner to serve until he is formally elected on May 5. His bond was approved and he was formally sworn in. Dr. Dudgeon presented his resignation which was accepted.

The reorganization of the City Commission was partially effected Thursday afternoon, when Joe H. Boothe filed his bond and was sworn in as mayor and took the chair vacated by George H, Sheppard. The run-off election will be held May 5. This date was selected by Mayor Sheppard as one of the last acts of his term.

The old commission held a short session prior to the organization of the new one. There was some discussion relative to a communication from the Sweetwater Cotton Oll Mill requesting overflow prevention at City Lake. The above mentioned plant was damaged several thousand dollars by high water last spring and the work requested is to prevent a recurrence of the flood water damage. A cost estimate running from \$1,200 to \$1,800 for this work was discussed and the matter was laid on the table for the new commission to solve.

The auditor's report on the city finances was read and ordered placed on the minutes. (This report was published in The Sweetwater Reporter on March 27.)

A request from Hubert Toler relative to the assessment on his property was read. This request was acmember of the Board of Equalization. It was granted.

A permit was granted the Burton-Lingo Lumber Company to build a warehouse of brick and concrete at an estimated cost of \$9,000.

The vote of Tuesday's election was polled. Joe Boothe's bond was approved, and that of W. R. Johnson and W. H. Bartlett continued.

The withdrawal of John Myers as a candidate for Street Commissioner was announced and the ballots with the name of W. T. Trammell ordered for the election May 5.

Joe Boothe, after taking the oath, said:


