MY TURN

WILLIAM J. ELLIS was one of the last of the old time long distance stagecoach drivers of Texas. He performed a vital service in the frontier days in West Texas, driving the treacherous 800 mile route between San Antonio, Fort Concho and El Paso in the 1870s and later he "pulled the ribbons over four bucking broncos which drew the stage" on the northwestern route between San Antonio, Fredericksburg, Mason and San Angelo.

"Will" Ellis was born in 1851 and died in 1933. He began his career as a stage driver at the age of 23. A man who knew the rough side of life in the days when life, at its best was not smooth, he was a family man, a Baptist deacon and a Sunday School Superintendent during the last 40 years of his life.

During his later years he enjoyed telling the tales of stagecoach robberies which would put many TV westerns to shame. Indian raids had ceased by the time Will Ellis came on the line, but the stage coach in that area always ran the gauntlet of robbers and desperados. The "Knights of the Road" were not particular who they robbed. Mothers, military men and ministers were all fair game.

One of Will's more interesting anecdotes tells of the lone highwayman who in 1888 stopped the stage near San Angelo, made the passengers get out and put sacks over their heads. After relieving them of their cash and valuables, he continued to hold them while waiting for the stage from the opposite direction. During the four hour delay, the passengers were entertained by the robber with stories of adventure and daring. When the other stage failed to show up, he then wrote out a certificate for each passenger, citing their bravery, and verifying that they had been robbed once. He bid all a pleasant journey and sent them on their way.

The boldness of some robbers was unbelievable. There were two men named Potter and McDonald who ambushed stagecoaches on the San Angelo road seven times within a three month period during the winter of 1884. The stage would leave San Angelo at four a.m. and the robbers would invariably stop it six miles out of town. It makes one wonder why some Sheriff, Marshall or Ranger didn't get the idea of staking out the area to wait for these bandits.

"On one occasion after robbing the eastbound stage," according to Will Ellis, "when the westbound coach was delayed from Abilene on account of heavy rains, they (the robbers) told the driver of the eastbound stage, which they had just robbed, to tell the other driver to hurry up, as they were waiting for him and it was cold. The drivers met about thirty minutes later and the message was delivered."

However, on the arrival of the westbound, two lawmen were among the passengers; a U.S. Marshall and a deputy. When the officers drew their guns, the thieves opened fire, hitting the deputy with a fatal shot to the chest. Only the fact that the horses broke and ran as the shooting began, prevented further casualties. The robbers fired after the fleeing stage and one bullet passed through a trunk in the rear boot, wounding the Marshall in the back.

Later, according to Ellis' narrative, the two robbers were apprehended when McDaniel gave his sweetheart some jewelry taken from one of the women on the stage. The two were sentenced to 50 years in the penitentiary but McDaniel escaped from jail at San Antonio and was later killed while resisting arrest.

As the railroads came in, making cross-country travel safer and more comfortable, the stage lines were discontinued and Will was out of a job. He operated a very stable until the appearance of the automobile. He then turned to farming near the little town of (Continued On Page 7)

Curfew Will Take Effect On June 1

The curfew for Friona teenagers will go into full effect on June 1, and in the meantime, a number of youngsters have been stopped and issued a warning ticket.

"We have been giving on the average about three warning tickets per night, and up to ten on weekend nights," said Assistant Police Chief Randy Gerles.

The curfew is for youngsters under the age of 17. It starts at 11 p.m. on "school nights," or Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursdays, and at midnight on Friday and Saturday.

Anyone found in violation of the curfew can be punished by a fine of up to \$500.

There will be certain exceptions allowed to the new curfew, which will include special medical emergencies made necessary by illness or injury; or if the minor is returning home or going to employment at the late hour, or attending an official school, religious or other recreational activity supervised by adults or sponsored by the City of Friona, civic organization or another similar entity.

Honor students have recently been named by the school officials.

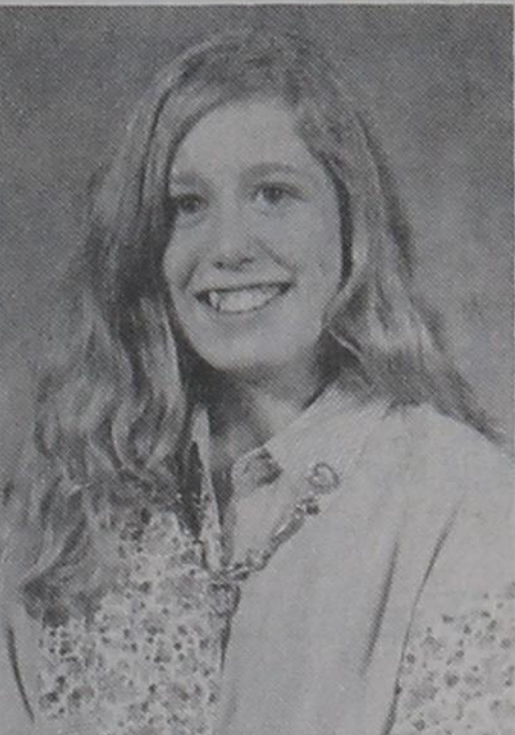

Items covered will be first aid for children, and how to handle bleeding.

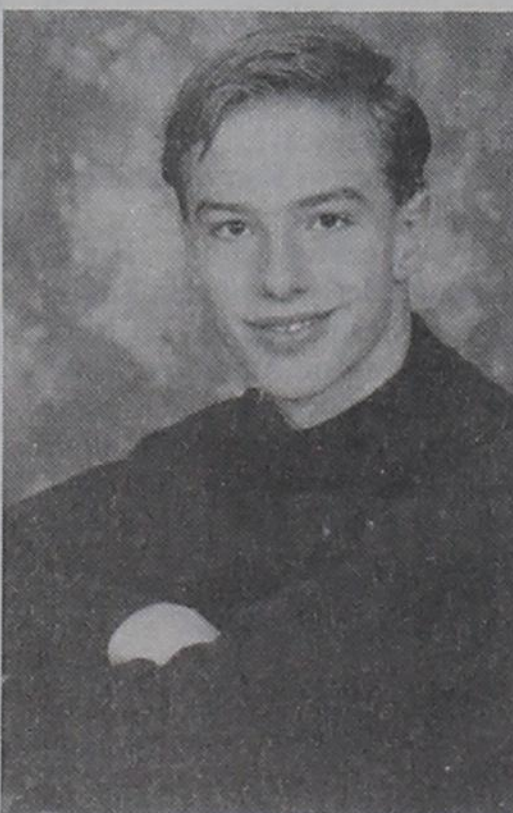

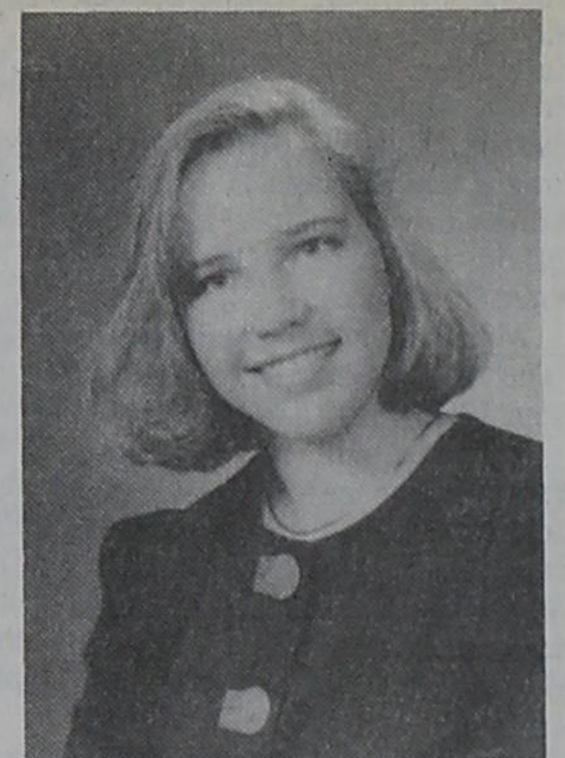

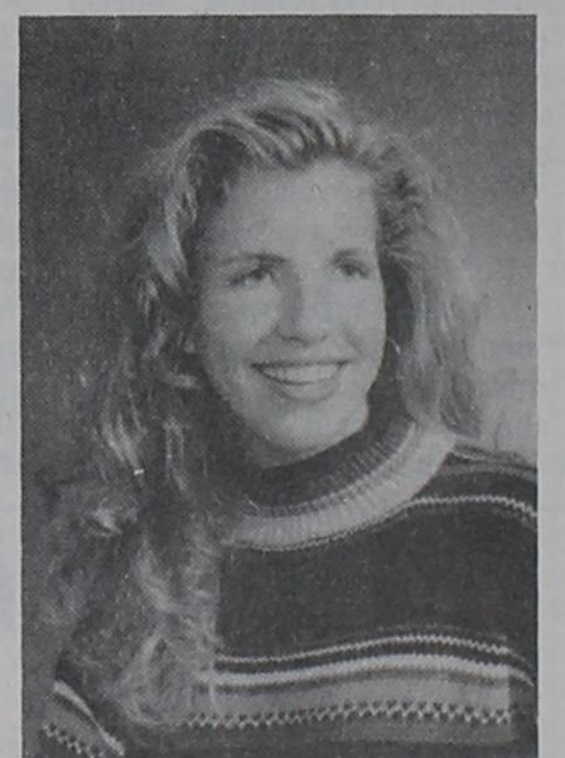

She also stated that preparation is easy and simple. "All one needs to do is to slice fresh cucumbers and coat the slices with cornmeal or cornmeal and flour mixed as you do slices of squash and fry them in the same manner."

Thanks, Mildred. I plan to try this the first time I have fresh cucumbers.

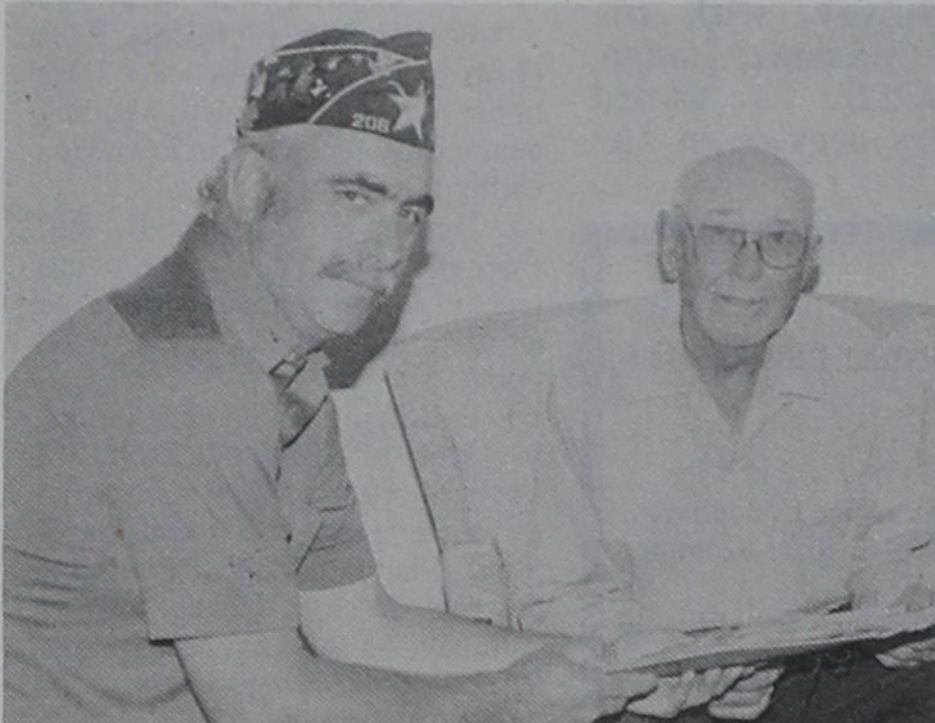
