When he opened the door the bills and cheeks had turned a golden brown and were about to curl up and begin


He snatched it out, however, while it was still recognizable and in accounting for his error explained that he thought only of safe guarding it, and dida't have "money to burn."



There are two classes of soupsnilk and stock soups-and these inlude practically all kinds. Vegetabes are combined with either milk, or meat stock, or both. The many varieties of soup get their names from the different materials used in them, which give substance and flavor.

Some of the vegetables most commonly used in soups are, potatoes, young carrots, celery, ripe tomatoes, fine corn, pasley, balcy, ice, macaroni, baby lima beans, Dutch cabbage, ok ions and sweet seed peppers

For soup stocks, pieces of rough nuscle and bone, such as shin, neck, extails and calves' heads are used-Smoked, salted, or very fat meat in any large quantity is undesirable, aln is used for flavor

The general rule for stock is to llow for every pound of meat and one, 1 quart cold water, 1 teaspoor alt, 4 peppercorns, 4 cloves, 1-4 teaooon mixed herbs, and I tablespoon f each vegetable cut fine.






