starches, or "complex starches, or "complex
carbohydrates." caren't off limits, but it's importan to eat them in moderation and have them worked into your diebetic meal plan.
n though there are general guidelines to follow, there's no one diet for dibetes. Your diabetes mea
plan must be based on your individual needs and developed by a registered dietitian. With this kind of expert assistance, a meal plan can be "customized" to fit your
