Court House **Bonds Called** For Payment

The last of the bonds issued for the purpose of building Parmer county's present court house in Farwell have been called in for payment by Walter Lander, county treasurer. The court house was built in 1915 and bonds issued which were payable at the option of the county for a period of 38 years, the last bond due and payable in 1953.

Good management and growth of the county enabled the administration to pay off these bonds in 16 instead of 38 years with a tax levy of 10 cents on the \$100 val-

Parmer county land is evaluated for state and county tax purposes at \$8.50 per acre, or \$5,270 per section. At that rate Parmer county farmers have been paying \$5.27 per section for court house purposes. The average farm is from one-half to one-quarter section, making the cost from \$1.30 to \$2.65 per farm per year.

Parmer county officials believe that they will be able to make a very substantial decrease in taxes this year because of savings they are now making by economical operation of county affairs. During the past month they salvaged old irrigation pipe laid in the court house grounds many years ago, together with an abandoned windnill, and sold these articles for sufficient money to put in the new aliche drive which has just been ompleted into the court house



Court House **Bonds Called** For Payment

The last of the bonds issued for the purpose of building Parin Farwell have been called in for payment by Walter Lander, county treasurer. The court house was built in 1915 and bonds issued which were payable at the option of the county for a period of 38 years, the last bond due and payable in 1953.

Good management and growth of the county enabled the administration to pay off these bonds in 16 instead of 38 years with a tax levy of 10 cents on the \$100 val-

Parmer county land is evaluated for state and county tax purposes at \$8.50 per acre, or \$5,270 per section. At that rate Parmer county farmers have been paying \$5.27 per section for court house purposes. The average farm is from one-half to one-quarter section, making the cost from \$1.30 to \$2.65 per farm per year.

Parmer county officials believe that they will be able to make a very substantial decrease in taxes this year because of savings they are now making by economical operation of county affairs. During the past month they salvaged old irrigation pipe laid in the court house grounds many years ago, together with an abandoned wind-mill, and sold these articles for sufficient money to put in the new caliche drive which has just been completed into the court house
