regarding the hurtful things which are considered newsworthy in other papers. We see quite enough of reporters shoving microphones in the faces of grieving families, the rudeness, the prying into personal lives, the hard cynical reporters and
editors who only care about getting the "inside scoop." We editors who only care about getting the "inside scoop." We
also don't follow police cars and ambulances out to accident scenes in order to get front page pictures of the bloody
accident victims.
Have you heard this one lately? "Newspapers are the
dinosaurs of the media and once television, local newspapers will become extinct." That's a good one! Hometown weekly newspapers have grown from 36 million to 80 million in the last decade
greatly exaggerated."

Then it was television, then cable, the internet, the information highway, the world wide web, etc., etc. Wrong! Except for crime or natural disasters (like tornadoes) the television crews ignore us. Magazines can't touch us. The
