Eye Drops

## It seems simple enough. You're supposed to put a few drops in your eyes.

 supposed to put a few drops in your eyes.Easier said than done. Chances are you've had the experience. You put medication in your eye only to have it immediately spill out. Here are some precautions and steps you might take to assure that the medication stays in and works.
Start by washing your hands. Read the recommended dosage and stick to it. Lie down or sit up with your head tilted back and put in
the drops. Once in, keep your eyes closed for 30 to 60 seconds. This encourages absorption of the drug. Do not blink for a few minutes. Finally, hold your index finger at the junction of your lower eyelid and nose for a few minutes. This blocks the opening of your tear outflow canal and cuts down on drainage.
If you're nervous about putting in eye drops, enlist the help of a family member or friend.
