City increases fees, sells house and bicycles, considers purchase of new firemen pickup

The Friona city council met in regular session Monday June 13 at 6:30 p.m. in council chambers at 619 Main St. Mayor J.B. Douglas presided. All council members were present except Councilman Pope who was on vacation. Councilman Jim Atwell was elected to serve as Mayor Pro-Tem for the 2011-2012 term.

Also present were Friona volunteer firefighters Terry Sharrock, Bryan Campbell, Glenn Reeve, Will Cooper, and Fire Chief Jim Taylor.

At the top of the agenda was a Public Hearing concerning Friona water quality. A meeting notice was mailed to all water customers and printed in the Friona Star. However no members of the public were present to comment.

The council held a lengthy discussion on funds to purchase a new pickup for the fire department. The current pickup, code named FD One and used by the Fire Chief to respond to fire calls, was wrecked when sideswiped by a Bootleg Fire Truck while in heavy grass fire smoke. The pickup was declared totaled by the insurance company.

A bid was accepted from Stevens 5-Star in Hereford for approximately \$28,000 for a replacement truck. With an insurance settlement of \$12,468 and \$8,500 from the county, the city is still about \$8,000 short to purchase the new pickup. Various ways of raising the \$8,000 were discussed among council members and firemen present.

Chief Taylor said at least 90% of the department's fire calls are made out in the county. Firemen have spent 434 man hours and made 8 runs just to hay fires at Cattle Town Feedyard this year. Taylor said they have made 55 fire calls out in the county so far in 2011. (Now 56. They were dispatched at 2:30 a.m. Tuesday morning to a grass fire at CRS and FM2013.) The council agreed to the need for the new truck and said they would work to find the \$8,000 in needed funds.

Bids were opened for a group of miscellaneous items, bicycles, computer and police equipment as advertised. Only the six bicycles had bids ranging from \$6 to \$16. The other stuff will be hauled off as junk. The bid for new roofs on city buildings at 619, 621, and 623 Main St. was awarded to Fortenberry Roofing in Littlefield. Their bid of \$61,600 was accepted. A building at 617 Main that adjoins the city buildings and is owned by B.K. Buske, will need some work before the roofing can begin.

The city accepted a bid of \$1,000 from Maria Gonzalez for a house at 207 Ashland. The house was owned by the city due to unpaid taxes. The school board and county commissioners also approved the sale. Gonzalez plans to demolish the old house and put a trailer home on the property.

City water well #4 at 7th and Columbia continues to be a problem. The well, which has not been used for residential water in two years, is still showing EBT (gasoline fuel) contamination. They have been pumping water out of the well down to the railroad tracks in an effort to clear the contamination but the problem remains. It was decided to turn it off for two months and test the well again. If still contaminated it will likely be capped.

In other business the council increased the returned check fee to \$30 and the after hours service fee for on-call city workers to \$30. The annual Kid Fish event staged two times a year costs the city a total of \$7400. The city is contracted for one more fishing day in September but the council said the event will likely not be included in the upcoming 2011-12 budget.

The next meeting of the city council will be Monday July 11 at 6:30 p.m. in the council chambers. All city council meetings are open to the public.

Local woman is scam victim

Your grandson (or granddaughter) is probably not in jail in Mexico!

A Friona woman received a phone call from a person posing as her grandson, saying he was in jail in Mexico and needed money to be released. This has been a popular scam around the country recently as featured in regional and national newscast warnings.

The phone call was convincing enough to prompt the elderly resident to wire \$6,800 via Western Union as instructed. The scam fell apart the next day when another phone call asked for an additional \$7,300 but Western

Union became suspicious and refused to send it, warning the woman it was a scam. It turned out her grandson was safe and sound here in the U.S.

Please advise your elderly relatives and neighbors to refuse all phone requests asking for money for any reason, especially large amounts of money. Advise them to not give out any personal financial information, account numbers, or credit/debit card information over the phone. If you suspect a phone request is a scam, it probably is. It is not rude to just hang up.

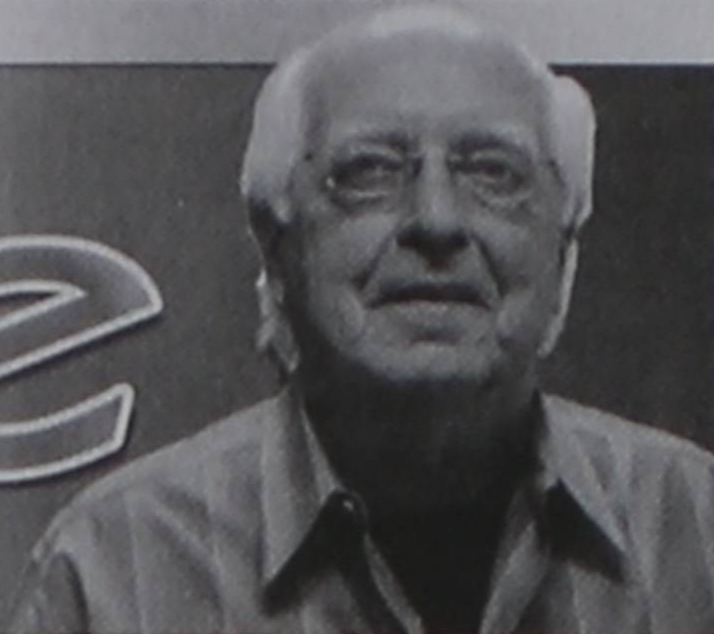

governor perry's phony pray day

Reliant Stadium in Houston, August 6, 2011. Governor Rick Goodhair Perry invites you to join him and pray for rain.

I'm going to dive right in here for a few paragraphs and try to get out without stepping on too many feet.

Prayer is good. It doesn't always work but it is better than resorting to violence. (However if beating the crap out of somebody would make it rain I'd have to consider it.)

I can't figure out Perry's reasoning for the prayer gathering. Why pick August 6 instead of tomorrow or this weekend? If the governor

is serious about praying for rain it seems he better get started way before August.

I think perhaps it is a political gimmick to appeal to the right wing conservative family value religious voters. I think it is phony.

Lot of people think anytime is a good time to gather and pray. Who can argue against prayer especially if it's for rain? What happens if the state gets a bunch of rainfall the next several weeks and by August 6 we have floods and hurricanes. Guess we could still gather and pray for the rain to stop or give thanks for what we received.

You haven't heard much about this. Governor Perry has asked the American Family Association (AFA) to host his pray day. The AFA is headed by the uber-righteous Wildmon family who believe that their values should be everybody's values.

Because the AFA is heading up Perry's Pray Day, it has prompted outrage from the Human Rights Campaign (HRC) and GetEqual, groups representing Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender (LGBT) Texans.

The LGBT community, which is said to number over

900,000 in Texas, says they are being left out of the Pray Day because the American Family Association is "an extremist hate group that will speak hatred against the LGBT."

I know that some who read this hate gays and lesbians. Yes I said hate. And to make it worse the hate is done in the name of religion. The Wildmon family apparently hates the gay community so why can they be taken seriously by so many?

The Human Rights Campaign (HRC), the nation's largest LGBT civil rights organization, has condemned Perry's collaboration with the American Family Association. The HRC has a new online platform—Call It Out—that calls attention to homophobia and transphobia and says of Perry's Pray Day, "Aligning with groups who, on a daily basis seek to demonize LGBT Americans, sets a dangerous precedent."

Private citizens have the right to gather and pray. Private citizens have the right to invite only certain kinds of other private citizens to gather with them. Private citizens have the right to hate or love or neither.

Governor Perry has a right, as a private citizen, to invite people to gather to pray. However once you use the "Governor" title to invite people to pray and bring in the Wildmons as the main attraction it excludes other segments of society and becomes a church vs. state issue and causes friction.

If Governor Perry's Pray Day becomes a platform for the AFA to spew hatred toward the LGBT community or any other group that doesn't follow their belief, then it is wrong for the governor's office to be associated with it. This simmering conflict over the August 6 Day of Prayer is a good example of why the government should stay out of religion.

It is wrong to teach hate to our youth. It is wrong to follow those who espouse hate and racism and discrimination. It is wrong for Governor Rick Perry to lend his office to a Day of Prayer. Hate, especially in the name of religion, serves no useful purpose. The End!

There! Hope I didn't step on too many feet.

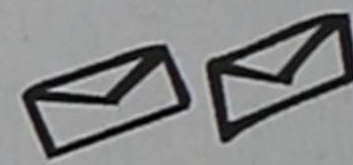

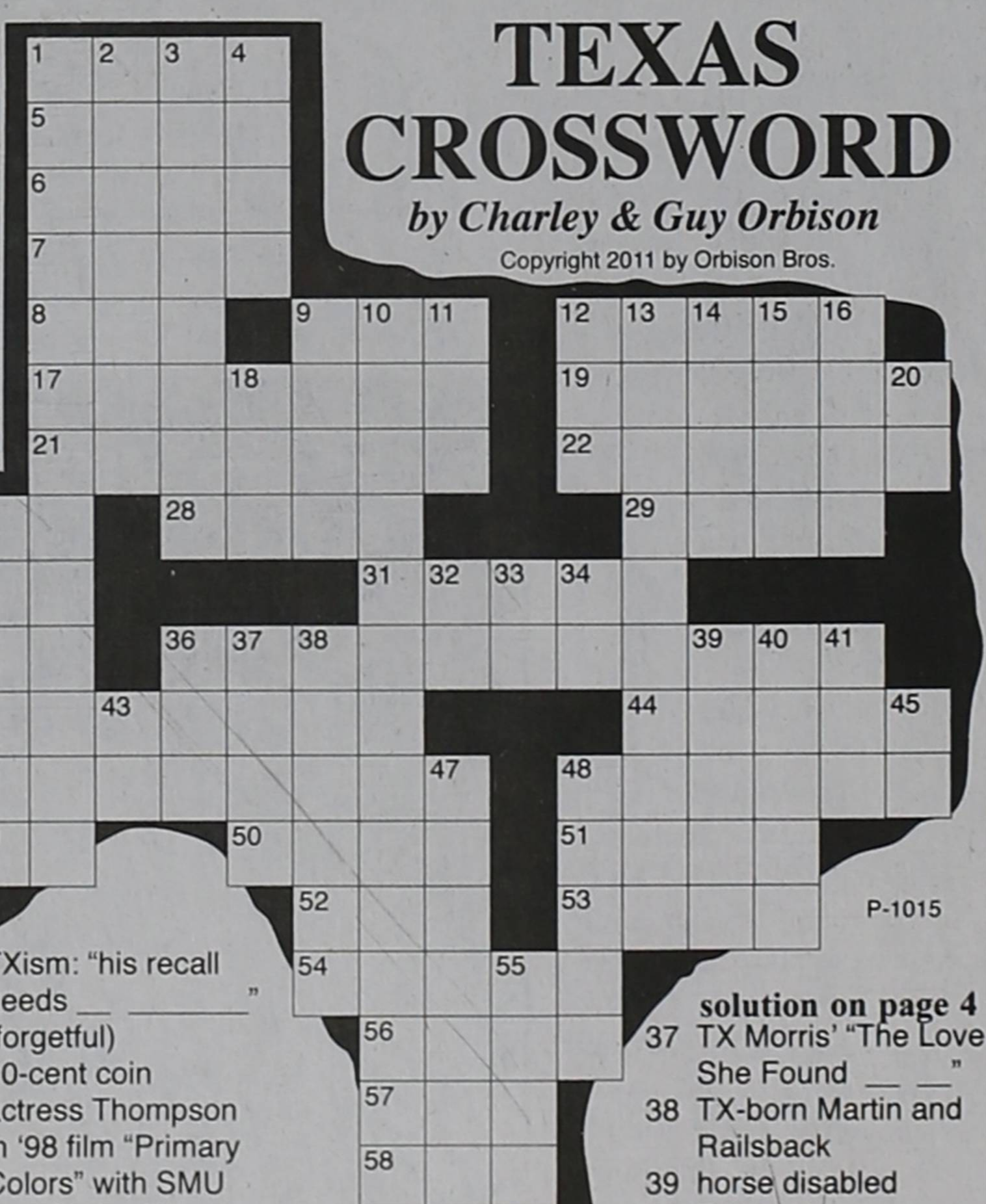

Commissioners deny roll-off box cost in Bovina

Parmer County Commissioners met in regular session Monday June 13, 2011, in Farwell. They affirmed the disaster declaration banning the sale and use of fireworks in the county until Tuesday July 5 and kept the county burn ban in effect indefinitely.

Anyone caught shooting fireworks during this period is subject to a Class C misdemeanor charge and a fine.

After several meetings with Bovina officials concerning the county paying for Bovina's trash haul-off an agreement could not be reached on cost splitting so commissioners voted to stop paying. In the past Bovina's roll-off box was open to all residents who could come and dump trash there for free and the county was paying the waste company fee to haul off the boxes, with monthly fees in excess of \$3,000.

Bovina officials requested the county to pay a flat \$1,750 monthly fee for the roll-off box but commissioners denied the request. As a result of the commissioners' action, the Bovina officials said their roll-

off box would now be available to Bovina residents only. The county placed an ad in this edition of the Friona Star explaining the other options available to county residents for disposing of trash.

In other action commissioners approved the purchase of a new backhoe for Precinct 1 Commissioner Kirk Frye. County Judge Trey Ellis said that new emission requirements taking effect next year would increase the cost of heavy equipment used by the commissioners and they would save about \$15,000 per unit by purchasing equipment prior to the new emission requirements.

A resolution was approved supporting the creation of the South Plains Rural Transportation Planning Organization and assigned Judge Ellis as a voting member of the organization. It was also determined that the current precinct boundaries would remain unchanged as a result of the 2010 census. Although county population increased about 200 there was not enough change in demographics to require redistricting.

Mini-bucking stock coming to Amarillo

The Miniature Bucking Stock Association (MBSA) will make a tour stop at the Amarillo National Center Saturday June 25. Young riders from five states are coming to Amarillo to compete for cash prizes and silver buckles.

There are three age groups: "Lil buckers" (age 6 & under); "juniors" (age 7 - 10); and "seniors" (age 11-13). The MBSA matches the bull's level of bucking for each group. The required weight limit is not to exceed 120 pounds. At the June

25 show MBSA will be offering a \$500 added money bull ride on a standard-size bull for those age 14 - 17.

There will also be a futurity competition for the breeders at 1 p.m. on June 25. The object is to see whose two-year-old bull bucks the best. Buckles and cash prizes will be awarded to the best mini bucking bull breeder.

Doors open at 6 p.m. and the event starts at 7 p.m. General admission is \$12, children 5 and under are free.

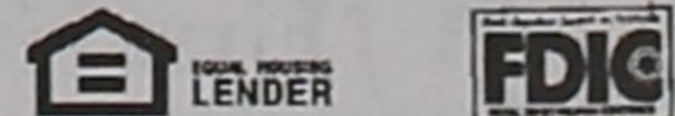

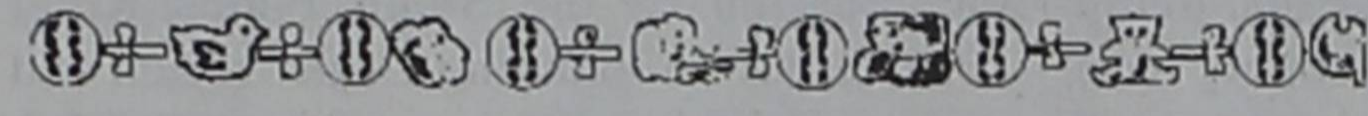

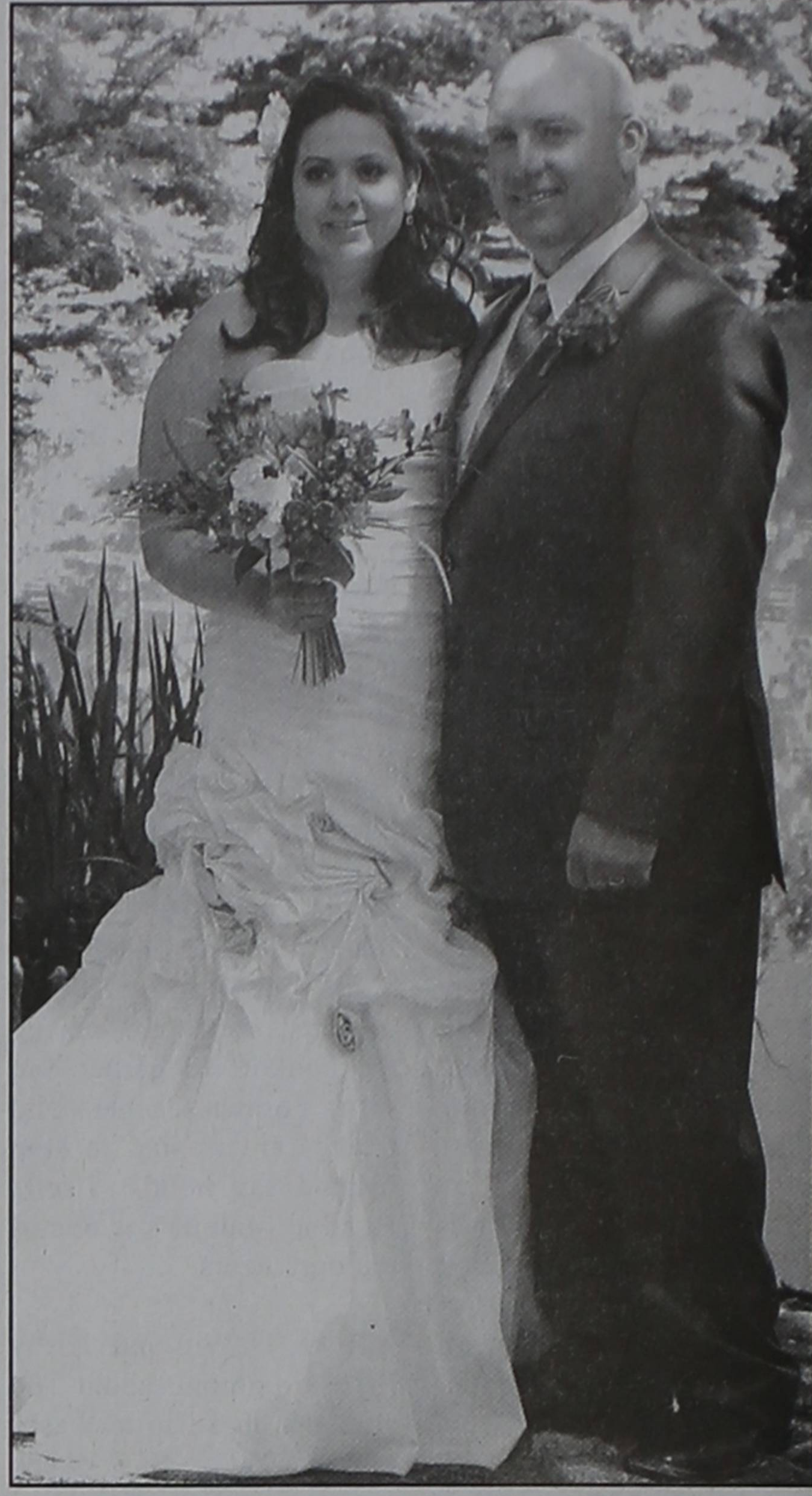

Thirty members of the Friona High School Choir traveled to Austin May 29 to compete in the UIL Texas State Solo and Ensemble Contest.

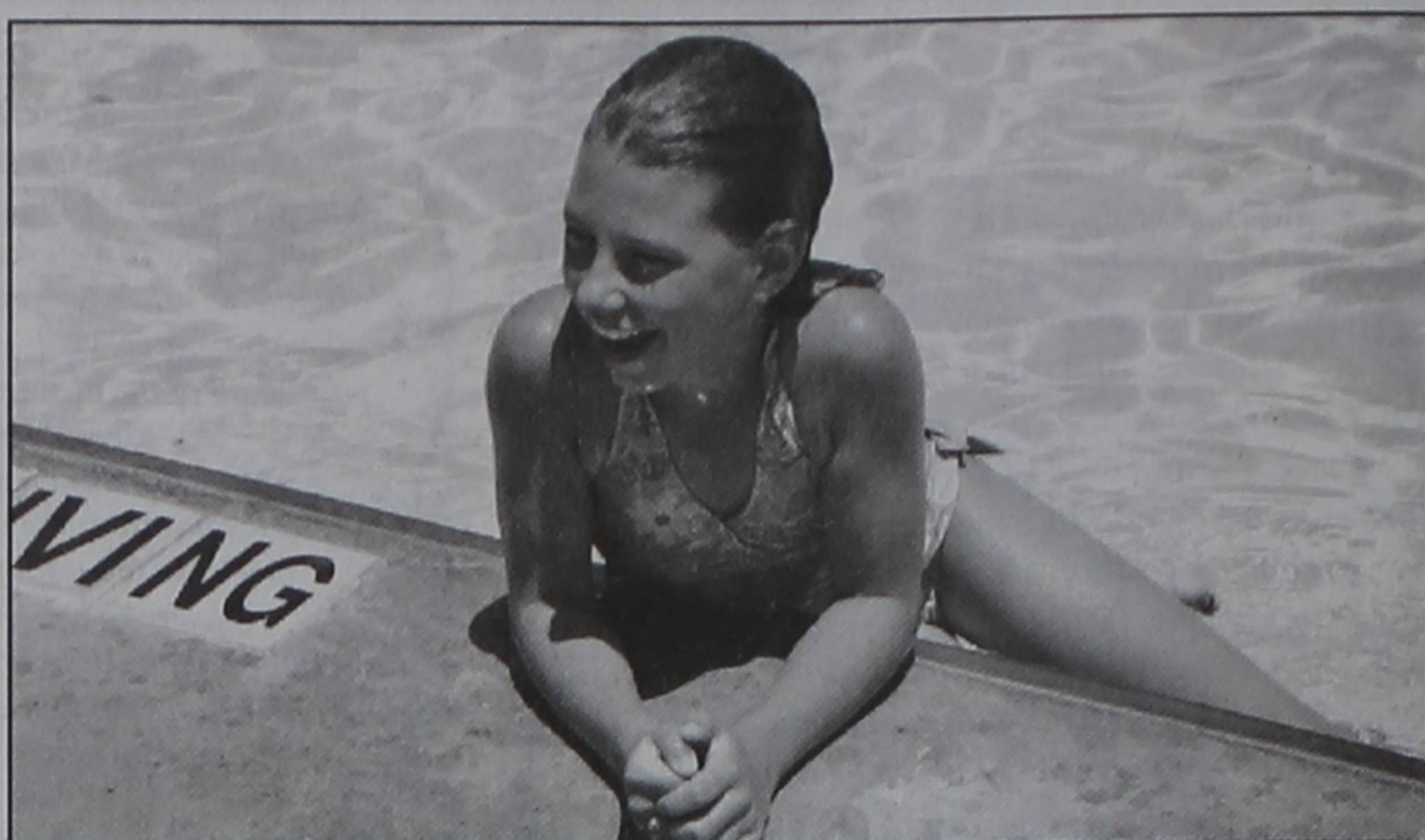

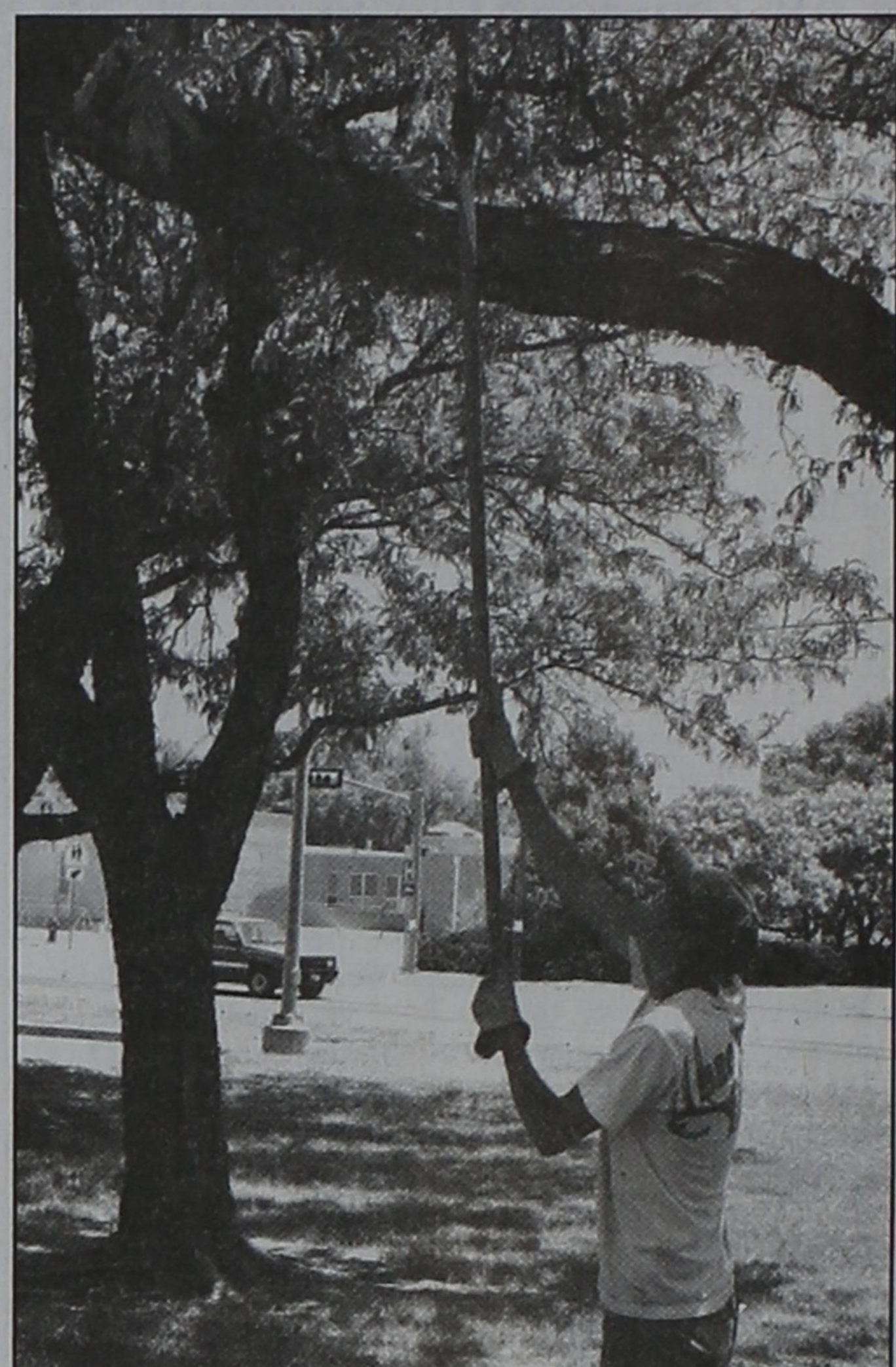

Tasty Cream Drive-In

If there is an institution in Friona it has to be the Tasty Cream Drive-In. Now entering its 62nd year, the burger joint is just as popular as ever and remembered fondly by locals and former residents far away.

Tasty Cream Drive-In was established in the early 1950s at the corner of 9th and Main St. The first owner was Kenneth Williams. Subsequent owners have been Preston "Pete" Collins, Madge Loflin, Don Powell, Lee Gibson, Arthur Stokes, Bill Hardin, and John Tannahill.

During the time Lee Gibson owned the drive-in he still worked in his barbershop and cooked during the lunch hour and after 5 p.m. The building owner gave Gibson one-week notice to vacate the building at 9th and Main. He moved into a former Gulf Station at Main and Hwy 60 where the business is still located today.

Bill Hardin owned the drive-in from 1981 until 2005 when he sold it to John Tannahill. When Mr. Tannahill died suddenly in 2006, the restaurant passed into the hands of his daughter, Lori Tannahill Luna. Mrs. Tannahill coaxed Bill Hardin back to take over the operation. The restaurant was closed and completely remodeled with new paint and tile and all new kitchen appliances. It re-opened to great anticipation and fanfare.

Hardin still mans the grill, cooking up those famous cheeseburgers. He said that he has had several hundred employees over the years. Some employees have been the children of former employees.

The diverse menu includes tacos, chicken or steak fingers, chicken fried steak burger, salads, chili dogs, fish baskets, shakes, ice cream, and plenty of fountain drinks. Three years ago Tasty Cream won 1st place in the annual Friona Cheeseburger Festival and Cook-Off.

One thing is sure, for generations past and present Tasty Cream will always have a place in the heart of Friona history.



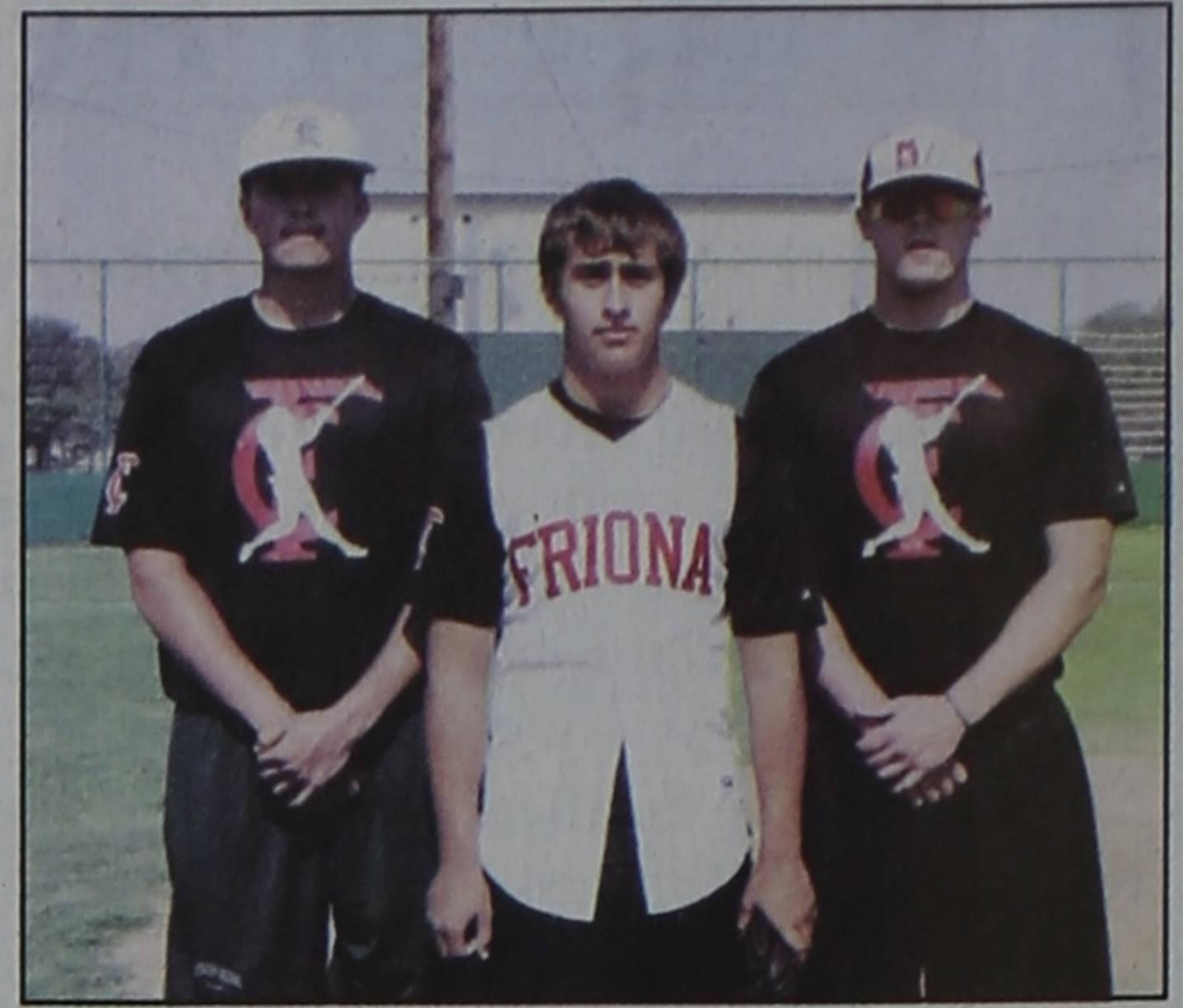
