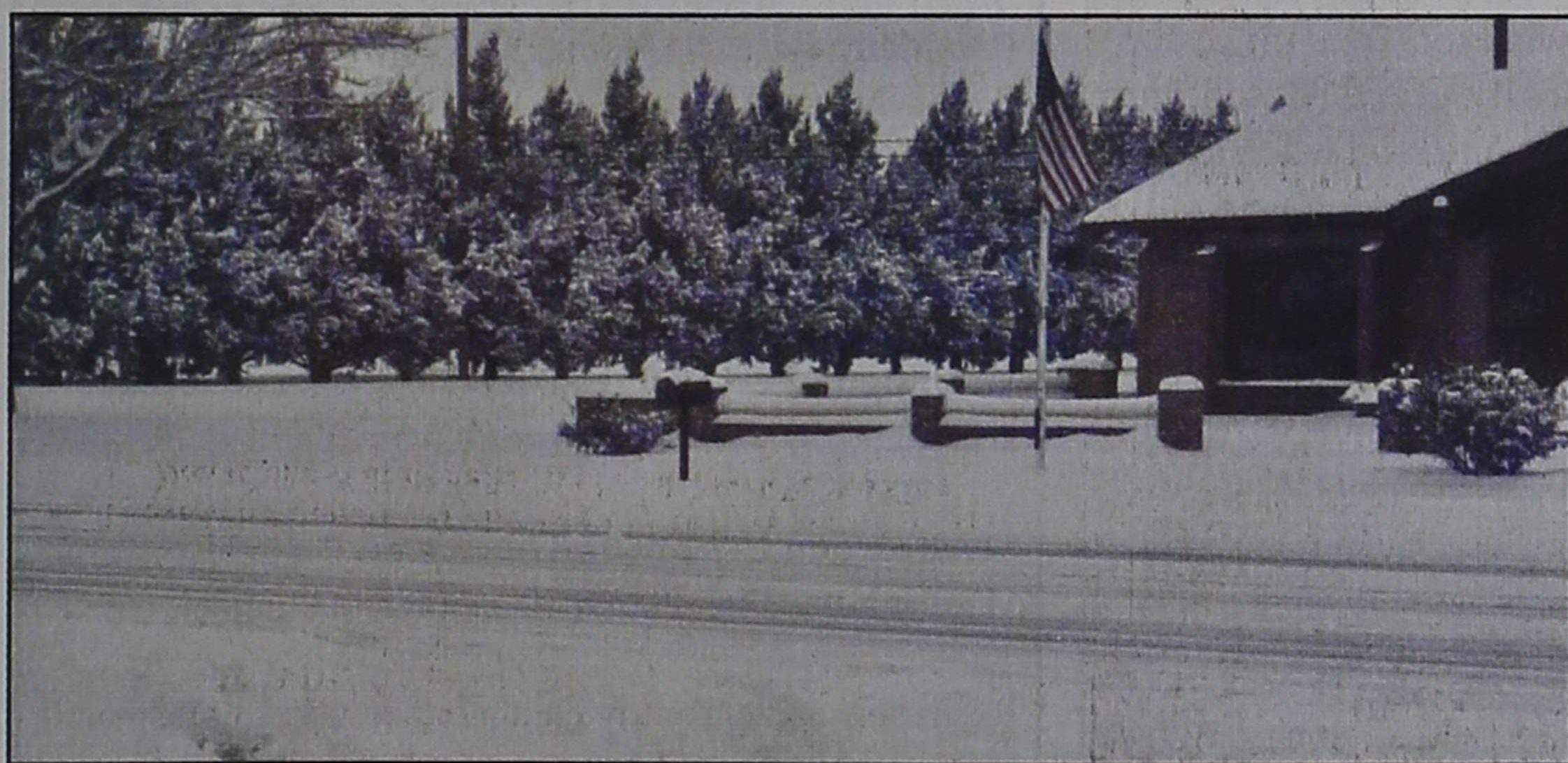

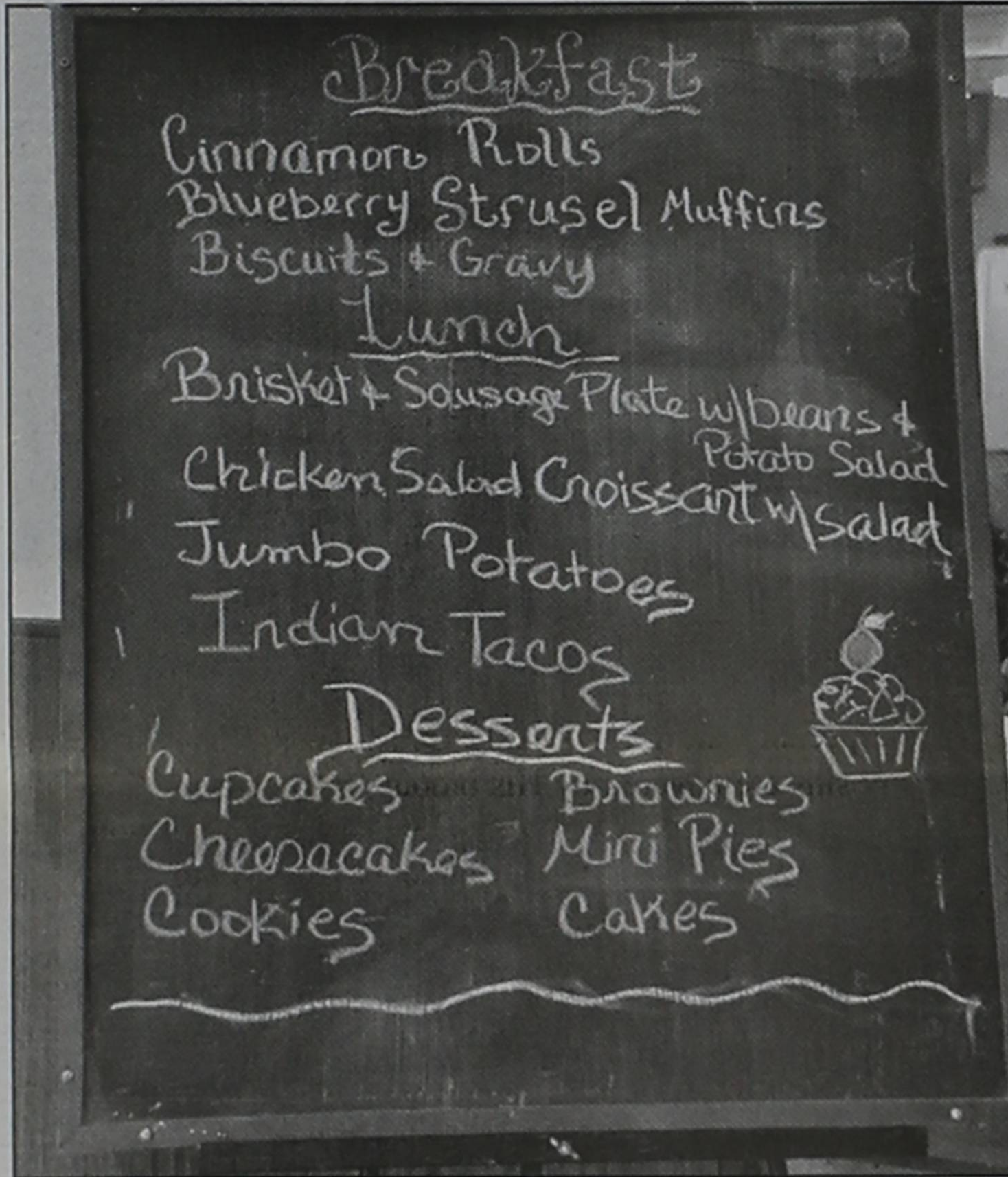

Commissioners approve joint primary

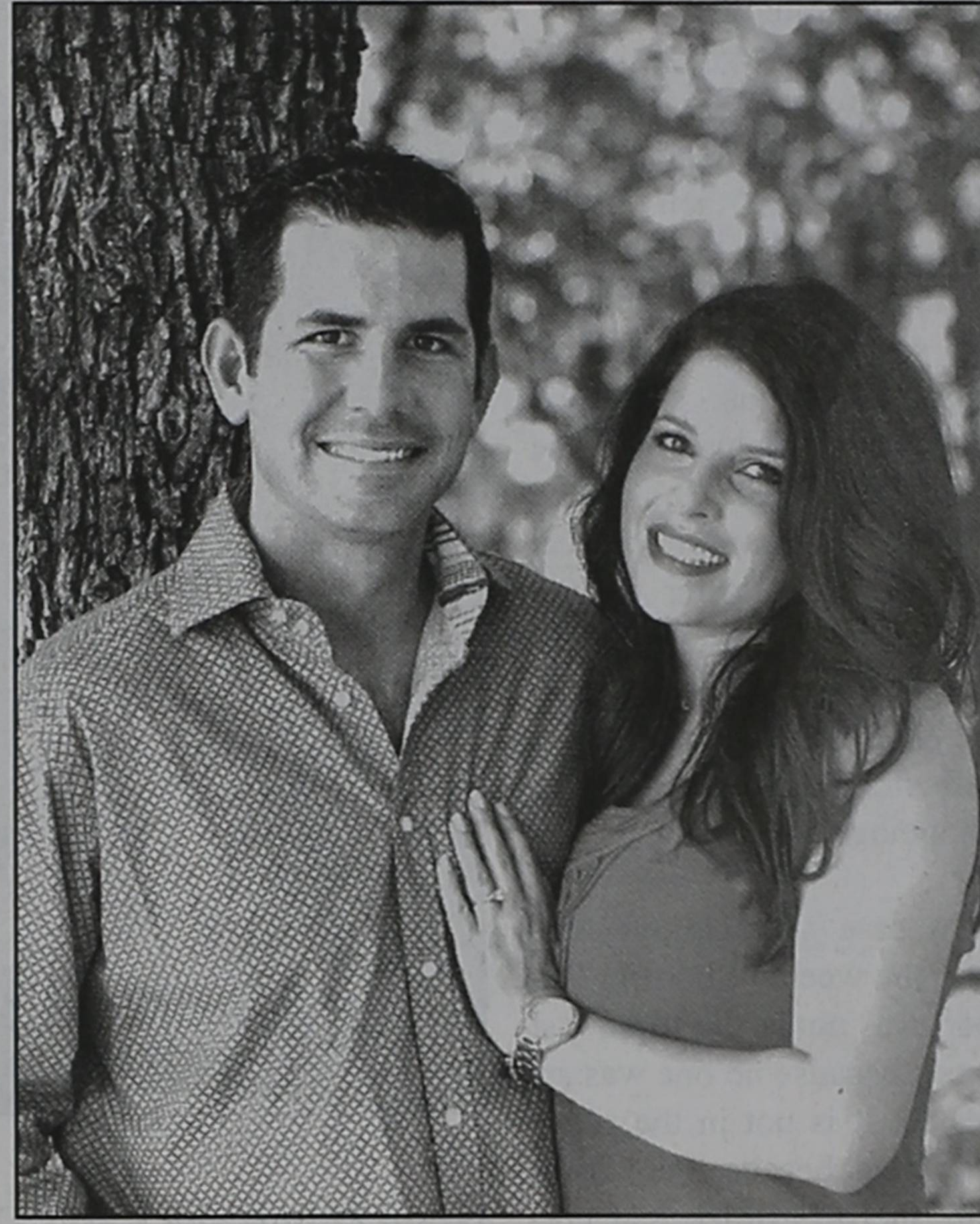
County commissioners met Monday November 25 in Farwell. A Christmas luncheon for courthouse/county employees will be held December 23 in Farwell, coordinated by County Extension Agent Shana Fleming.

Resolutions were approved authorizing an agreement between Lazbuddie ISD and Parmer County to apply for a block grant to the Texas Department of Agriculture's disaster relief fund. The grant amount of \$350,000 will be used to drill a new water well for Lazbuddie ISD. It will be a no match grant unless costs are more than \$350,000.

NRCS agent Earl Behrends gave an update report on the two dams located in Parmer County near Bovina and Lazbuddie. The report on the dams' status is required every two years.

Commissioners approved a resolution to hold a joint primary for the March 4 elections. This means that Democrat and Republican candidates will be included on the same ballot rather than separate ballots. Also approved was the transfer of a Sheriff Department pickup truck to the Parmer County Precinct 3 Commissioner. The truck was going to be traded in but was transferred instead to Precinct 3.
