FM 1172 road repair project
The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) is set to begin work on a $\$ 3.26$ million project to make roadway improvements to almost seven miles of FM 1172 in Parmer County, from FM 2397 to SH 86.
"The project will make needed improvements and repairs to the pavement, but is also expected to enhance the overall safety of the roadway," said Steve Perez, P.E, TxDOT Littlefield Area engineer.
Motorists traveling on FM 1172 will see traffic reduced to one-lane and detoured around the work zone at various times throughout the project as contractor Gilvin-Terrell, LTD., of Amarillo, rebuilds and resurfaces the roadway. The project is scheduled to begin next week and will start with culvert work, Perez said Motorists are asked to drive with caution through the work zone, be on the lookout for workers and avoid distractions for their own safety and the safety of the workers. The project's completion date is scheduled for September 2014

The Texas A\&M AgriLife Extension Service will conduct two workshops to train farmers and ranchers to use their iPhones and iPads or other tablets and smart phones to make decisions to increase their bottom lines.
Agricultural $\qquad$ cations of Tablets and Smartphones classes will be held from 9 a.m. -3 p.m. March 4 at the Texas A\&M AgriLife Research and Extension Center, 6500 W. Amarillo Blvd.: in Amarillo, and on April 3 at the Roberts County Annex, 122 Waters St. in Miami.

The registration fee is \$20 for each workshop, to be paid at the door by check, said DeDe Jones, AgriLife Extension risk management specialist in Amarillo. Workshop materials, refreshments at breaks and the noon meal are included in the registration fee.

## AMENDMENT XXI

The twenty-first amendment was passed by Congress on February 20, 1933 and ratified on December 5, 1933
Section 1
The eighteenth article of amendment to the Constitution of the United States is hereby repealed. Section 2.
The transportation or importation into any State, Territory, or Possession of the United States for delivery for delivery or use therein of intoxicatin liquors, in violation of the laws thereof, is hereby prohibited.
Section 3
This article shall be inoperative unless it shall have been ratified as an amendment to the Constitution by conventions in the several States, as provided in the Constitution, within seven years from the date of the submission hereof to the States by the Congress. Prohibition was regarded as a failure. Do you understand why?

## Letters to the Editer

Congressman Randy Neugebauer (R-TX) joined five western lawmakers on a letter to U.S. Fish and Wildlife Services (FWS) Director Dan Ashe urging a quick approval of conservation efforts to preserve the Lesser Prairie Chicken, and a two month delay of the scheduled listing decision.
"This is part of our effort to ensure the FWS doesn't move forward with a costly listing of the Lesser Prairie Chicken when innovative state and regional efforts would make the listing unnecessary," Neugebauer explained
"Within months of FWS approval of the Lesser Prairie Chicken Range-Wide Conservation Plan, there are now 4.8 million acres of existing or pending enrollment in conservation plans across the Lesser Prairie Chicken Range. That's roughly the size of Delaware and Connecticut combined," Neugebauer said.
"We wrote this letter to urge FWS to finalize the accompanying oil and gas Candidate Conservation Agreement with Assurances (CCAA) for this agreement, Neugebauer explained. Instead of stalling with neverending reviews, FWS could finalize this agreement and incentivize additional conservation efforts. If their goal s to protect this species, why not encourage action under a plan that it has already endorsed?"
In the letter, the lawmakers also pressed FWS to extend its final listing decision until June 11, 2014, to allow more acreage to be enrolled in the range-wide plan. "With the clear and growing success of these conservation plans, we urge USFWS to allow sufficient time for this unprecedented, range-wide conservation effort to succeed, by immediately finalizing the oil and gas CCAA and extending the decision deadline," the letter reads.
Neugebauer said that he is confident that given the opportunity to fully implement the range-wide plan, states will prove that listing the lesser prairie chicken is not necessary.

## Costa Rica was an Adventure!

The tropics, volcanos,
rivers, the Pacific Ocean, lakes, wildlife preserves, and hanging bridges were all part of the adventure that our 34 travelers experienced on this Costa Rican trip.
We departed from Friona on January 25 for this vacation paradise. We landed in San Jose and enjoyed getting to see the Capital of Costa Rica. The next day we visited a coffee plantation and learned about the planting, harvesting and processing of coffee. We also learned that because of disease, coffee is not one of the top industries of Costa Rica any longer. The top industries are 1) The top industries are 1)
tourism, 2) the making of tourism, 2) the making of
computer chips and other computer components, 3 ) farming- pineapples, co-
conuts, sugar cane and baconuts, sugar cane and bananas and 4) dairies.
On the second day of our trip, we drove over 5 hours on rough, winding, mountainous roads in our big 54 -passenger bus, to Tamarindo Beach in the province of Guanacaste, on the Pacific side of Costa Rica. We really enjoyed sitting and walking on the beautiful volcanic, sandy beautiful volcanic, sandy
beach where we watched beach where we watched
the waves roll in and saw several surfers and folks playing in the water, but not us. We were waiting for tomorrow and that adventure!
On day 3, most of us signed up for the "Afternoon Sunset Catamaran noon Sunset Catamaran joyable sailing along the beautiful coastline with the sun warming us up, feeling and smelling the salt of the ocean breezes and enjoying the camaraderie of our fellow passengers. Some of us even snorkeled and that is where the adventure began.
We were given our gear and jumped in the ocean. We snorkeled around the catamaran and some of us swam to the shore where the strong waves pushed us in and pulled us back, pushed us toward shore and pulled us back. We land lovers learned about the ocean and its strength by this adventure! Later, we saw a beautiful sunset and then our catamaset and then our catama-

the strong waves still rolling in and the crew from the catamaran had to use flashlights to spot the large rolling waves in order to rolling waves in order to position the dinghy to take on the waves. They were
experts at this and we only experts at this and we only
got drenched once! They got drenched once! They to make the bow of the boat head into the wave instead of leaving the sterm for the waves to overtake us completely! Wow! What a memory this made! We all laughed after it was over, in spite of our being completely wet.
Day 4 found us again on board our bus and on the "roads" of Costa Rica. In route, we saw Teak For route, we saw Teak Forests and Coconut Trees
along with the Papaya and Banana Trees. We noted the dairy cattle and many horses in fields grazing. Our destination was the Monteverdi Cloud Forest. We enjoyed a nature walk We enjoy the alk through the cloud forest and were so impressed with our guide, Chris, who knows so much about the plants, trees, birds and animals. This walk helped us to appreciate the conservation efforts that Costa Rica has ongoing to keep these beautiful forests alive and prospering.

The next day we visited a butterfly garden and hummingbird gallery before walking on a "Hanging Bridge" tour. We crossed 11 bridges overlooking the canopy below of the forest. That afternoon we Zip Lined! Most of our group was adventurous enough to do this and we all enjoyed it. There were 11 platforms that we walked to in order to be hooked up to the lines stretching across the forest. It was something we had looked forward to and one of the reasons we chose Costa Rica as our destination. That evening, we attended a lecture on the migratory birds that flock to Costa Rica every year and why. One bird in particular is close to extinction and in order to save these birds, trees are being planted that are indigenous to the area and these birds.

Day 5 found us at Victorino's Farm Victor Mata is the man who gave the lecture the evening before and asked us to plant a symbolic tree to emphasize the restoration of the forests. Our Meagan Balli and Judy Rocha were chosen by our group to plant an Avocada Tree, which is native to Costa Rica and needed for some species of birds to survive. We were informed that $80 \%$ of the land in Costa Rica is protected for restoration and reforestation of indigenous trees.

We then headed for our next 2 overnight stays from the mountainous landscapes of Monteverde to Arenal named for the volcano there. We took a cruise on Lake Arenal the largest, most important
lake in Costa Rica. This lake provides $23 \%$ of the power for Costa Rica. 90\% of all power in the country is by made by water. The next morning we took a boat trip on the Cano Negro River to see the wildlife. We saw crocodiles (Cayman) and at least 2 kinds of monkeys: Howler Monkeys and Capuchin Monkeys. We saw puchin Monkeys. We saw birds of many species, butterflies and the surrounding land covered by forests. This was a slow paced, enjoyable cruise. The Arenal Volcano area is known as the land of spas and hot springs. Some of us took advantage of the local spas for a relaxing and a much-needed massage after our adventures of the days before.
We enjoyed the food native to the country: rice and black beans are served with most meals and this dish was very good, fruits like was very good, fruits like bananas, plantains, pineapple, papaya, and oranges were served in abundance. We usually had fish, beef or chicken for dinner. Their tamales are wrapped in banana leaves and are very good. They serve corn tortillas and lots of fruit salsa. As you can see, none of us went hungry and probably most of us gained a couple of pounds.
We wound up at our arrival point of 8 days ago, San Jose. We took a city tour and discovered that the capital city is very modern with large hospitals, universities, embassies, and other kind of business buildings like any large town of 1.3 million people. There are 2.6 million with the surrounding area making it having $65 \%$ of the total population of Costa Rica. The day we left, Feb 2, was not only Super Bowl Day that they enjoy, but also voting day for a new president. The president has to have $40 \%$ of the popular vote so they expected to have a run off the first Sunday of April and the final vote on the first Sunday of May.
We loved our great adventure and hope that you can visit our friend and ally Costa Rica.
