Cheeseburger lovers to converge on Friona

If you enjoy a great, homemade cheeseburger and a good time, Friona is the place to be July 19. The 9th Annual Texas Cheeseburger Festival sponsored by the Friona Chamber of Commerce and Agriculture will kick off at 7 a.m. at the Friona City Park. Entrants will begin setting up at that time with cheeseburgers being cooked onsite. Cargill Meat Solutions will be donating the beef for the event.

Entry deadline for the cheeseburger cook-off is Friday, July 11 at 3 p.m. Entry fee is \$100 and includes 100% pure beef with buns, cheese, lettuce, onion, tomatoes and ice.

Judges will begin judging at 11 a.m. with cheeseburgers being sold to the public from 11:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. Tickets will be sold for \$7 for four tickets. If you want a whole cheeseburger, give the cook-off team all four tickets. For two tickets, you can have two different halves of a cheeseburger and for four tickets, you can have four different cheeseburger quarters.

Judging will be based on The Judge's Choice of the Best Tasting Cheeseburger.

The first prize winning cheeseburger will win \$1,000 with second place receiving \$300. A People's Choice Award and Cutest Campsite will also receive prizes.

The public will be able to vote for the People's Choice award by placing money in designated cans at each cook-off site. The money will go to the Parmer County Cancer Coalition.

The chamber needs contestants for the Cheeseburger Eating Contest that will be held at 1 p.m. Only six entries will be accepted. The winner will receive \$50 in Friona Bucks and bragging rights. If you are interested, contact the Chamber at 806-250-3491.

If you have a car, pickup or motorcycle that you are proud of a Car Show will be held on 7th Street next to the park with registration beginning at 11 a.m. Entry fee is \$20 and registrants will receive one free cheeseburger with each car show entry.

Car Show trophies will be given for People's Choice, 1st place, 2nd Place and Best of Parmer County. Motorcycle trophies will be given for Best Stock, Best Custom and People's Choice.

Vendors will be throughout the park during the event. Deadline for vendors is Friday, July 11 at 3 p.m.

Tickets will be sold at the Chamber office until July 18 then tickets will be available at the Gazebo in the Friona City Park on the day of the event.

Juvenile curfew on city council agenda

The Friona city council will meet in regular session Monday July 14 at 6:30 p.m. in council chambers at 619 Main St. All council meetings are open to the public.

The meeting will open with two public hearings as advertised in this Friona Star. One hearing will be to hear comments on the renewal of the juvenile curfew ordinance. The other hearing is for comments on the annual drinking water quality report. Members of the public will have time to comment on the two topics.

The mayor will appoint and

swear in Municipal Court Judge Deborah Campbell for a two year term 2014 to 2016.

In regular session the council will consider and take action on items:

- * approve minutes of previous council meetings.

- * approve ordinance granting Atmos Energy franchise and rights to conduct business in the city.

- * authorize city manager Patricia Phipps to sign contract with data billing company to bill and collect for Friona EMS services.

- * authorize city manager to

sign an amendment to the Atmos Energy lease agreement for the office space in back of city hall.

- * consider request from Adriana Stowers to hold a sidewalk sale at Creative Chaos, 613 Main St., for July 18-19.

- * consider and take action to abolish or modify the juvenile curfew ordinance.

- * authorize city manager to transfer sanitation administrative tax to the general fund.

- * appointment of Kathy Sandoval and Ann Kelley to the Friona Public Library advisory board for a two year term ending in 2015.

* approve accounts payable and financial statements.

At the end of this public agenda, the council will go into closed executive session for the annual evaluation of the city manager, then reconvene into regular session and consider further action, if any, on executive session discussion.

These items of business make up the tentative council agenda and are subject to change. The final agenda will be posted on the front window of city hall 72 hours prior to the meeting.

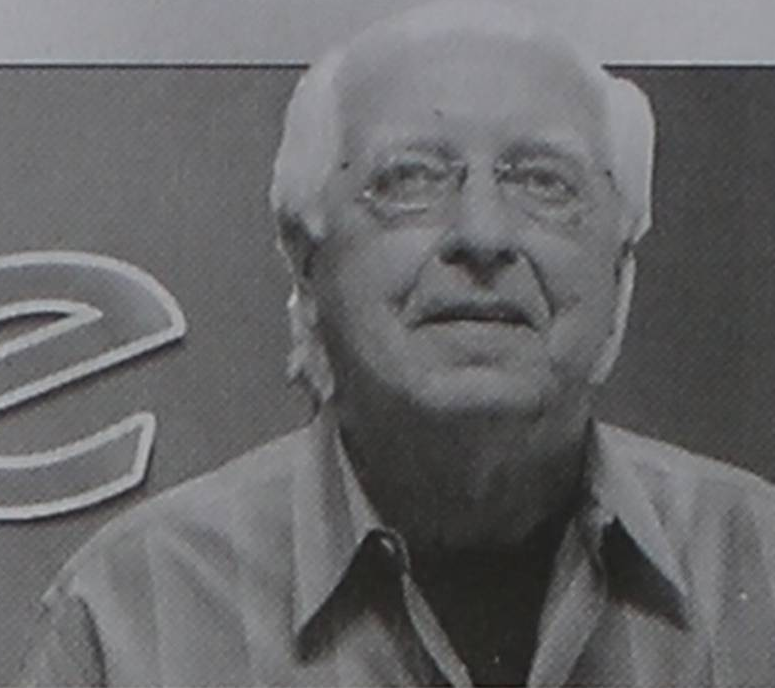

when we grow up

What do we want to be. When I was a youth in the 40s and 50s I never gave much thought to being something when I grew up. Life was very simple way back then. Doesn't seem like there were a wide variety of career options. Certainly not like today. We spent a good bit of time barefoot in the dirt shooting marbles, making slingshots out of tree branches and innertube rubber strips, and riding our American Flyer bikes all over town. Our high school did not have a counselor that I remember. We took simple classes like English, typing, civics, and speech. I tried to avoid math. We had algebra I and algebra II but I couldn't tell the difference. Wonder if algebra back then was the same as algebra today. Going to ask Sandra Berend next time I see her.

Looking back now, none of the jobs I have had over the years were planned in any way. After high school in 1957 I traveled the 60 miles from Hillsboro to Dallas looking for a job. Not a specific kind of job, just a job. Went to work for Lone Star Gas Co. in the key-punch department. Anybody remember the keypunch days? After a few months I snagged a little better job in the mail room of Dallas Power & Light Co. If I recall I made the move for an increase of \$35 a month. I drove a DP&L pickup delivering mail to a couple of power plants in the Dallas suburbs. My high school friend and roommate Milton Smith was working for a company called Braniff Airlines. One day he mentioned an opening in the Braniff print shop where he worked. He said

I should apply so we could ride to work together. I applied and was hired. Did not know at the time it was the start of a 30-year career in the airline/travel agent industry. I guess you could call that a career. I can promise that the Friona Star, or any other newspaper, was not something I planned out. It was a matter of timing and happenstance. But then that is the way my "careers" have come about. Us older folks like to ask small children "what do you want to be when you grow up?" I know kids are cute and all but not very many 5-year-olds know what kind of career they plan to have. Most little ones will say the obvious: want to be a fireman, policeman, or doctor. They get a lot of coaching from their well-meaning parents. Recently a Facebook post of a little boy in an Army

uniform holding a U.S. flag went viral as they say. His daddy was in the Army so he wanted to be in the Army too. At least that's what the parents said. The little boy and his family, mom, dad, and older sister, appeared on Fox & Friends morning show. The little boy sat in mommy's lap with his camo fatigues on. The Fox lady asked the little guy "what do you want to be when you grow up?" Of course he was supposed to be cute and say "be a soldier like my daddy." The kid didn't say anything. The silence was awkward. Finally his mom leaned down and whispered and he said "like my daddy." I think the question should be "what do you want to do" when you grow up, not what you want to be. Oftentimes what we are doing and what we are being are not the same.

She was such a 'busy' woman that I never thought of her as old. She was always doing something around the house, at the church or with her family.

She loved my grandfather more than life itself. When he passed away, she was not the same. She would talk about him all the time.

After grandpa passed away, her favorite activity became going to garage sales. She didn't want for anything but she would plan all week for her 'garage sailing' on Friday and Saturday mornings. She would have a route planned that would take her to all the best garage sales in Altus, Oklahoma.

She would call one of my uncles to take her on her rounds and tell him to be at the house by 6 a.m. so they could have a breakfast of eggs, bacon, biscuits and chocolate gravy.

If the designated uncle was not there at 6 a.m. she would be on the phone checking on him. When he arrived she would be sitting at the table waiting for him with hot food and a game plan. Her purse and the newspaper would be waiting at the front door ready for a day filled with finding a new treasure.

At the end of the day she came home with a crop of new dresses for church and the same amount of money she left the house with that morning. Everyone knew my grandmother and would let her have her pick for no charge.

Out of the blue, Granny quit planning and just wanted to stay at home. Everyone attributed it

to her advanced age. She was 90.

She started falling and her health declined so the family thought it was best to put her in a facility that could take care of her 24-hours a day.

The family visited often and the visits consisted of Granny talking about old times and how much she missed Grandpa. She loved him without fail.

Their marriage had not been easy but she had learned to cope and love him fiercely. They had five sons, two daughters and countless grandchildren as well as great and great-great-grandchildren.

When she passed away at 92 she no longer spoke but when she would see a picture of my grandfather she would get a sparkle in her eye and a smile would slowly come to her face.

I saw that same thing on a friend's face recently. He is 90 and his beautiful wife is 85. She no longer recognizes most people but she lit up when she saw him. Just by looking at them, I knew they were still in love.


I know it is tough on him to deal with but he still makes the effort and shows his love for the woman he fell in love with so many years ago.

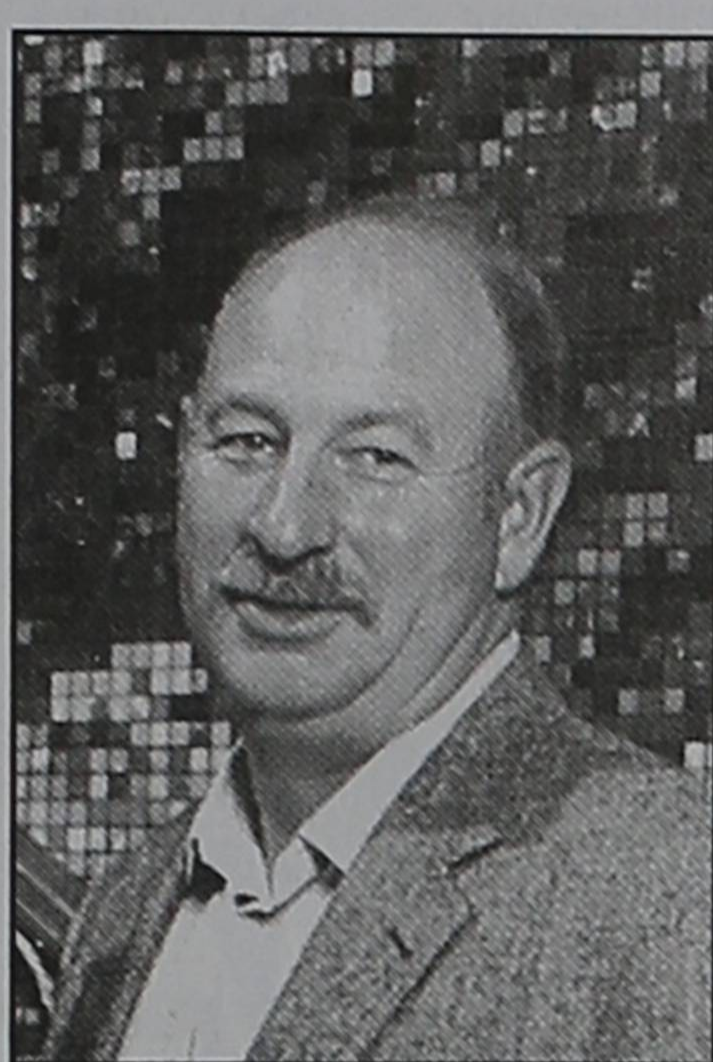
Gary Scott Gober

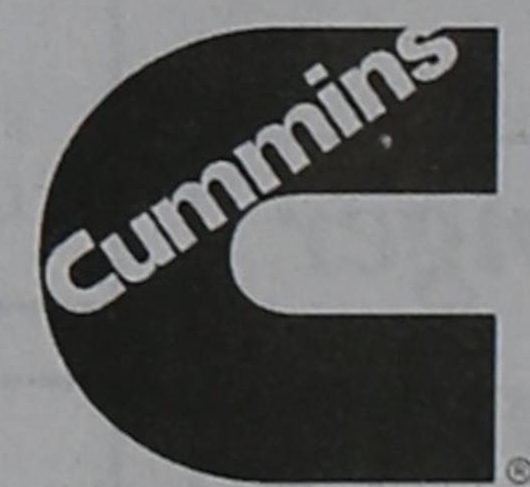
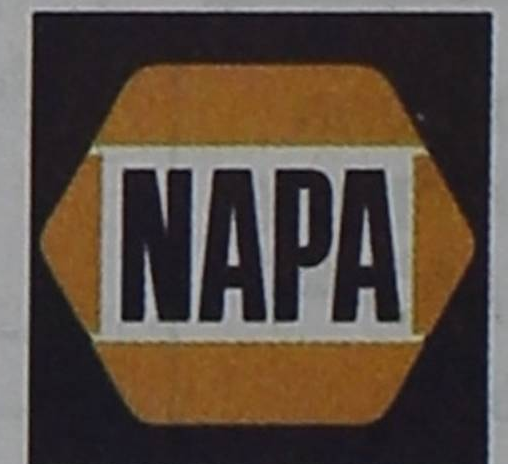
