Friona city hall will be closed Friday July 25 and Monday July 28 for a computer update but telephones will be answered.

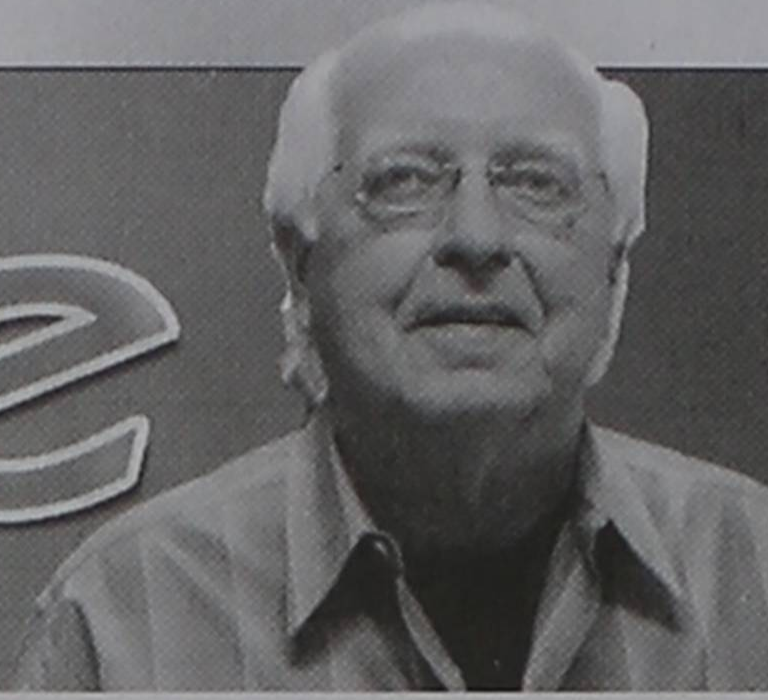

I was sorry to hear about the passing of Bill Ellis last week. I met Bill when I moved to Friona in 1980 to become the Principal of Friona High School.

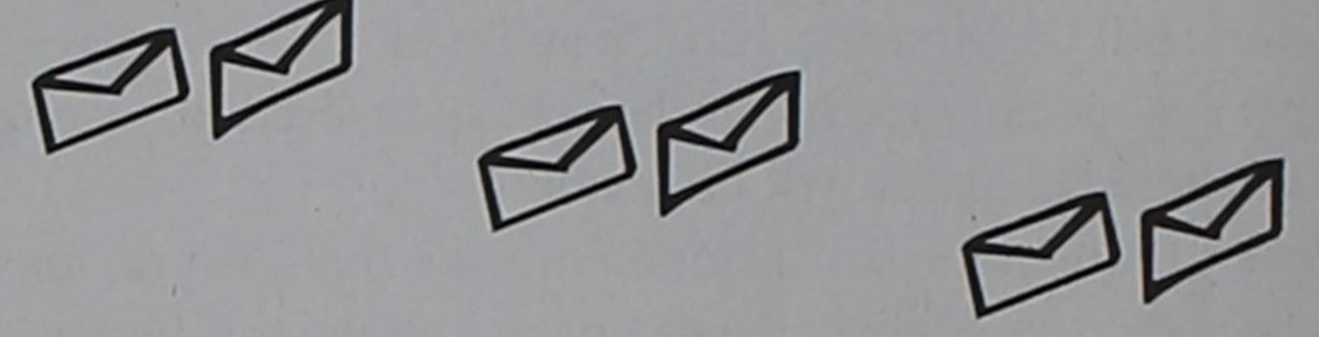
I always appreciated Bill's total support of Friona High School and Friona I.S.D. during my tenure as principal and Friona I.S.D. Superintendent.

Marilyn Monroe said, "Give a girl the right shoes, and she can conquer the world." By the looks of my closet I should be really close to conquering the world.

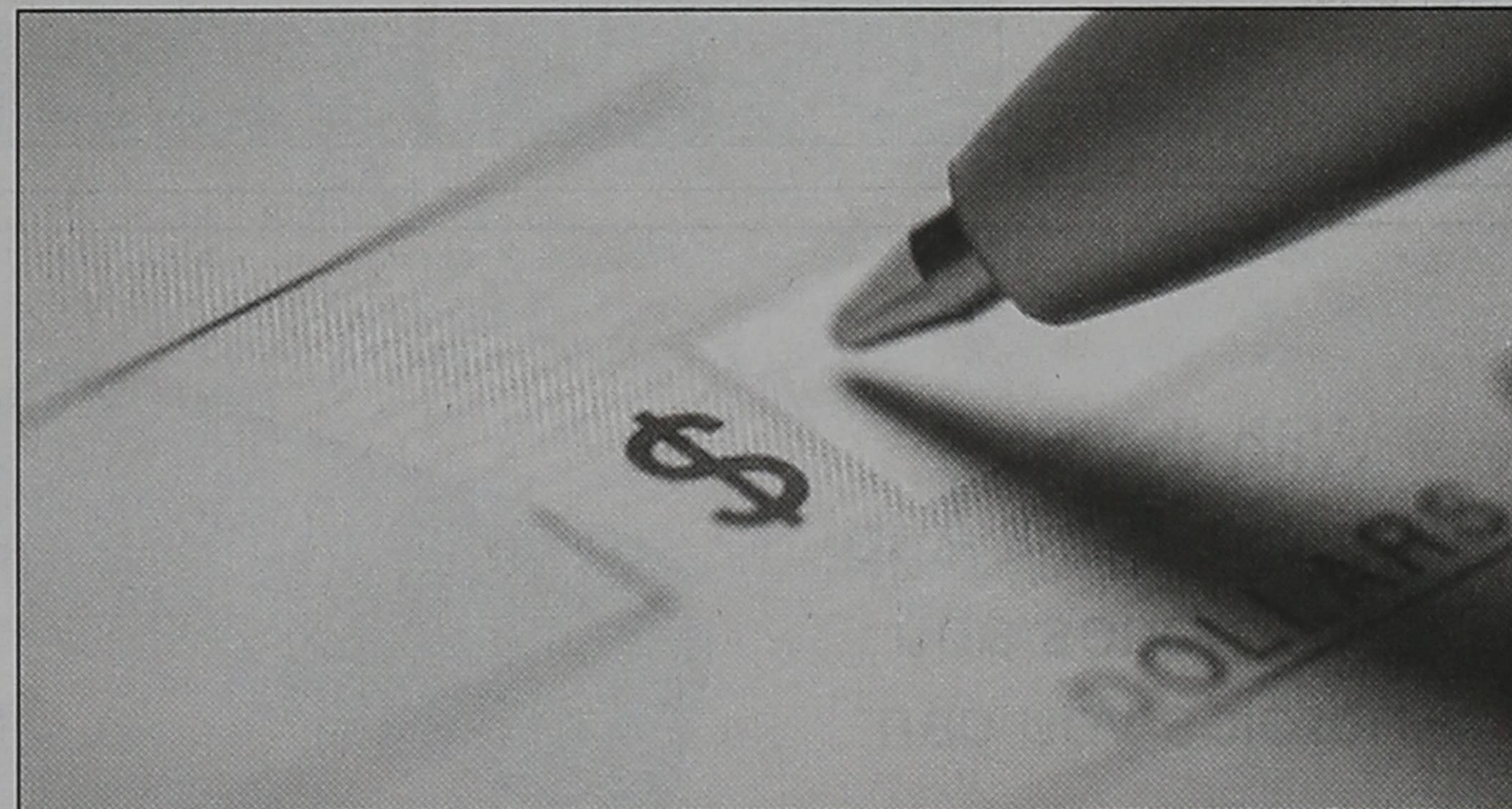
For everyone out there that has a closet full of shoes, that is okay. You will need one of those pairs when you leave the house today and nothing else will work but the ones in your closet.

Roadways in Bailey, Castro, Cochran, Dawson, Gaines, Garza, Hale, Hockley, Lamb, Lubbock, Parmer, Terry and Swisher counties will see \$8.1 million of preventative maintenance work during the months of July and August.

"Seal coating provides a variety of benefits to the roadway," said James Combes, P.E., Brownfield Area engineer, "including a waterproof surface that prevents moisture from entering and weakening the roadbed. Seal coating also reduces deterioration and cracking of the asphalt surface, which prolongs the life of the pavement."

Other roadway benefits include an improved non-skid surface in wet or icy conditions and an anti-glare and increased reflective surface for night and wet weather driving, Combes noted.

Contractor Ronald R. Wagner & Co., LP, of Kendalia, Texas, is scheduled to begin seal coat operations Thursday, July 24, on FM 828 in Dawson County. Other roadways included in the 2014 seal coat program are:

- Bailey County—FM 54
- Castro County—SH 194 and FM 168
- Parmer County—FM 2013 and FM 2298

The seal coat operations are expected to continue through late-August. Motorists can expect lane closures and a pilot car to guide traffic through the work zone, and are asked to drive with caution through the work zone, be on the lookout for workers and avoid distractions for their own safety and the safety of the workers. Work will take place weather permitting.

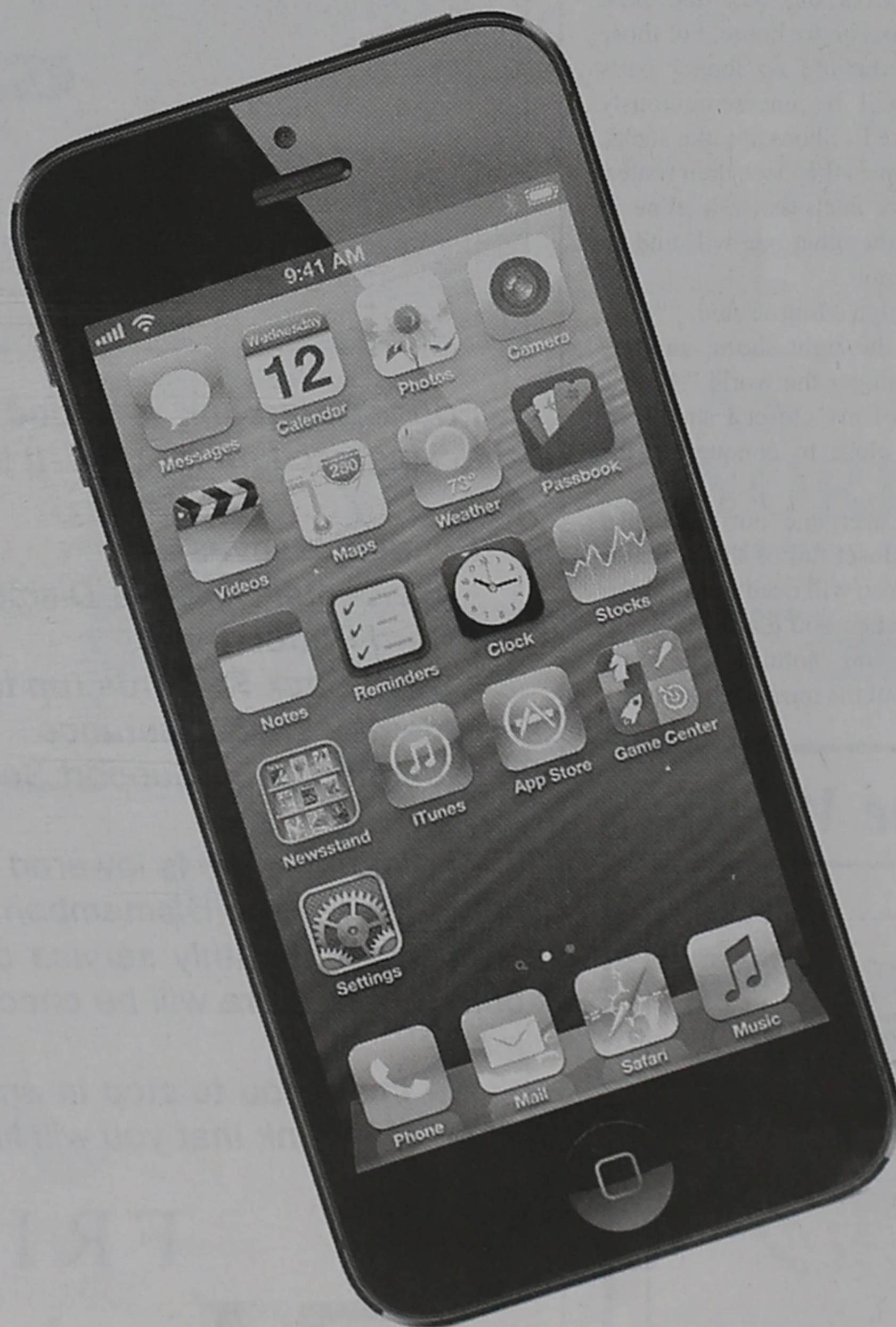
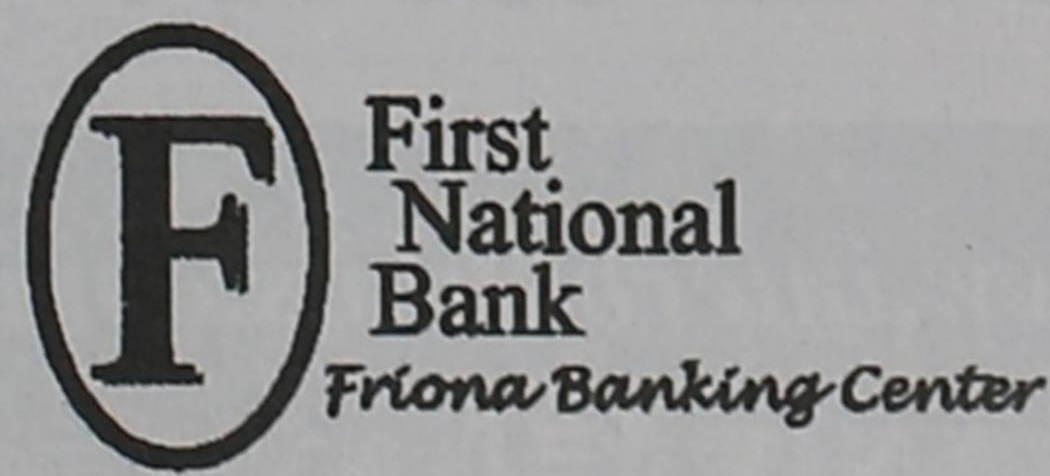

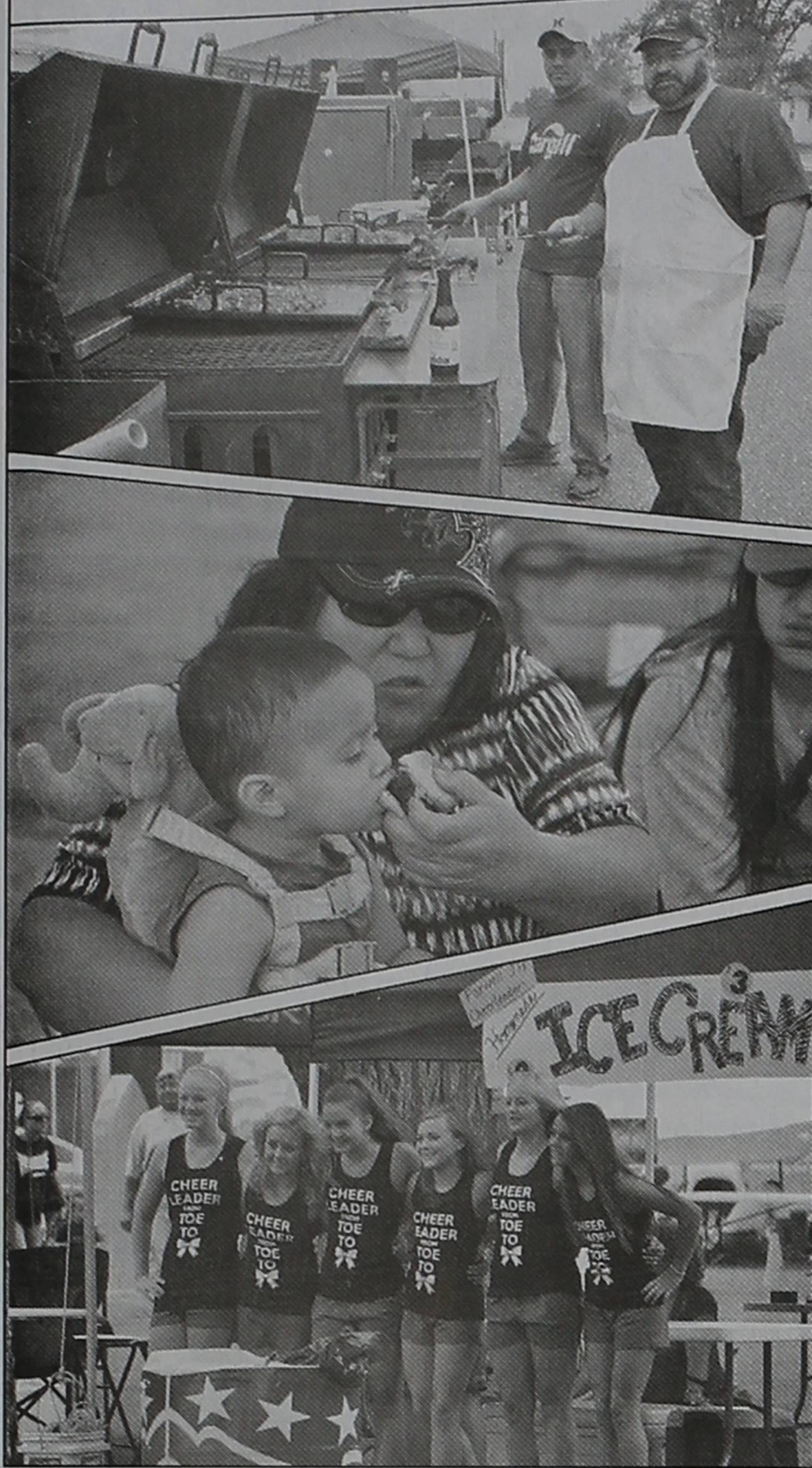

Dolores "Dee" Marie Colley

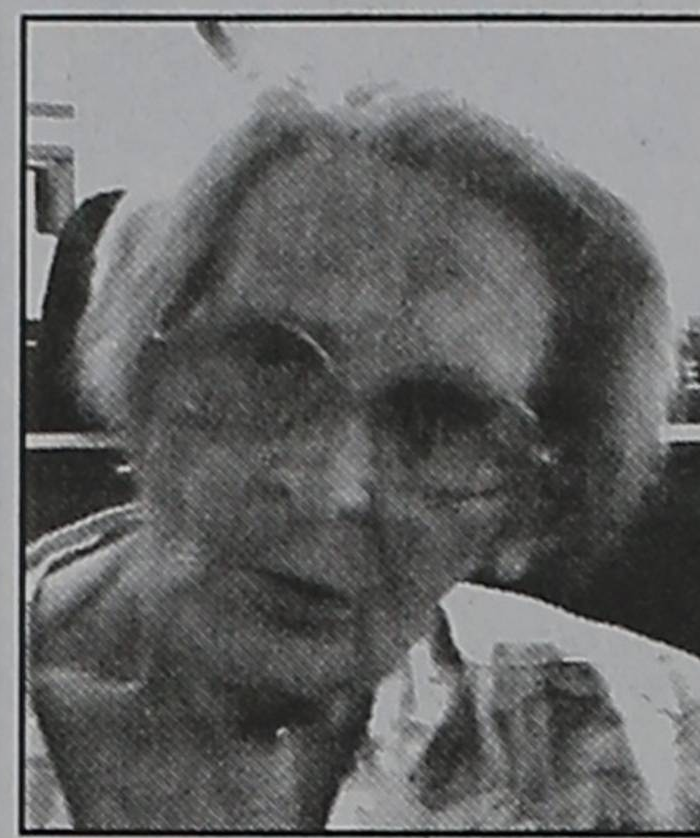
Dolores "Dee" Marie Colley, 83, longtime Friona resident, died, Thursday, July 17, 2014 in Amarillo, Texas.

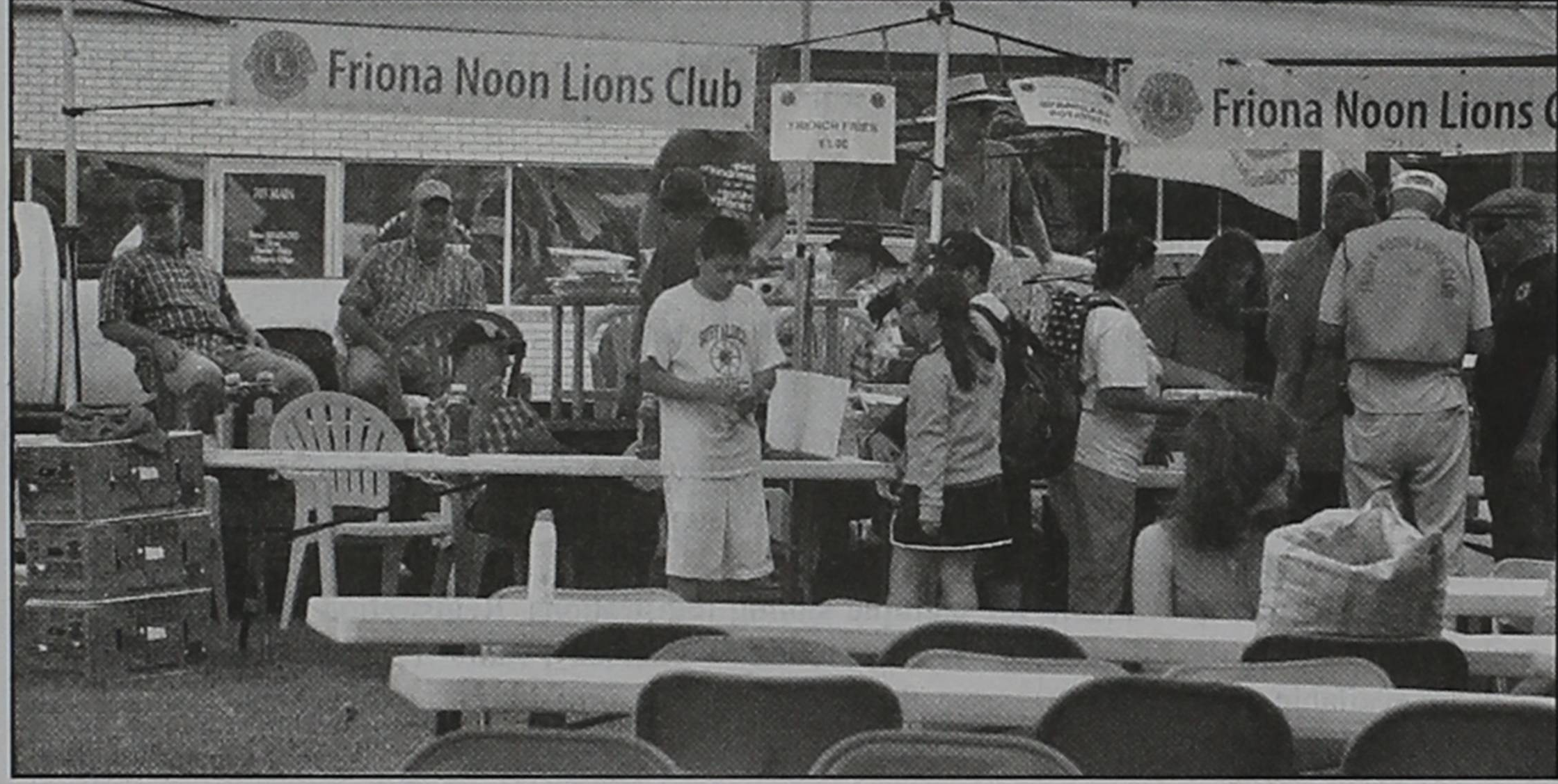
