## Free child safety seat inspection today

The Parmer County Healthy Baby Coalition and Parmer Medical Center are sponsoring free child safety seat inspections, this Thursday, November 6 from 3:30 pm to 6:30 pm. The inspections are a community service and are free of charge. Participants will receive one-on-one education provided by a certified CPS technician provided by the Texas Department of Health and Human Services. Bi-lingual services will be provided.

All interested parents (or grandparents) are to drive to the EMPLOYEE parking lot at Parmer Medical Center between 3:30 pm and 6:30 pm today (Thursday), with your car seats and children. Staff will greet you in the parking lot and provide directions to the inspection station. Santa will also be present at the inspection station for participants.

The Healthy Baby Coalition is also having sign up for free pre-natal classes Saturday, November 8, from 9:00 am to 11:00 am. Registration will be at the conference room of Parmer Medical Center. All expectant mothers are encouraged to register for the free classes.

Mothers who participate in the classes earn points to use for free baby items for their newborn. Classes are available in both English and Spanish.

The coalition will also be accepting donations of new or gently used baby items at the same time.

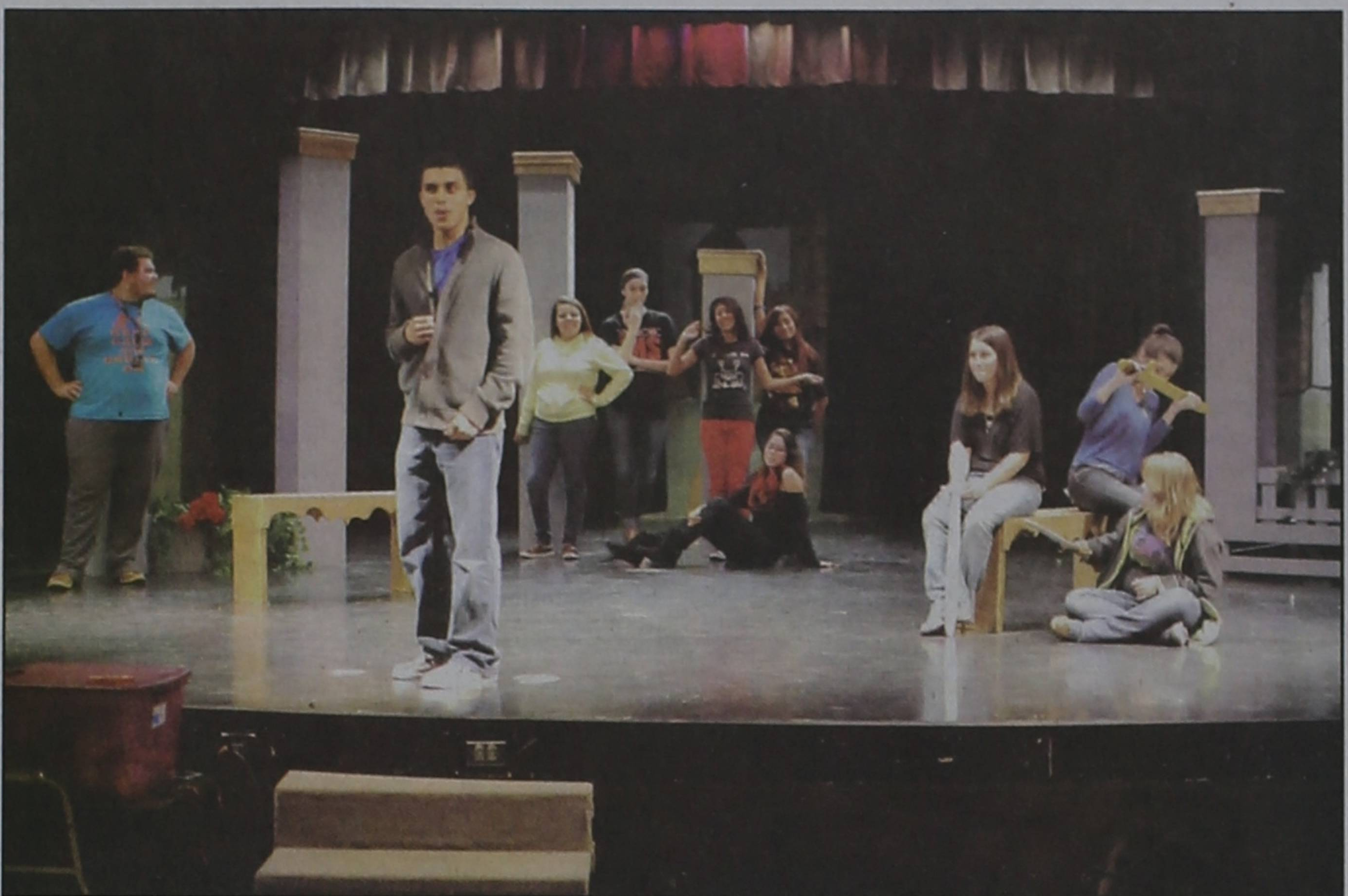
Bring the kids to talk to Santa during Christmas in the Park. Santa will arrive around 5:30 p.m. and be in the depot until 7 p.m.

- consider and take action on approval of accounts payable and approval of the October financial statement.

- consider and take action on allowing the Friona Volunteer Fire Department to trade in the 1978 Mack Truck toward the purchase of a 2007 Freightliner from Master Time.

The council will convene into closed session for discussion about real property. After the closed session the council will reconvene into

regular session and consider tentative agenda for the

Monday meeting and are subject to change. The final agenda is posted at city hall

I am into my second year of Community Bible Study in Clovis. I enjoy CBS because the Bible study is in-depth, and because I have gotten to meet many wonderful ladies and children.

Being in Clovis, many of our ladies are military wives. I quickly admit that I don't know much about the military and how things work with them. Maybe it is because I am uneducated where the military is concerned; maybe it is because I am such a softie, but from some of the things I have heard, I have to wonder how much common sense is practiced in some areas of the military.

For example, last year the father of two young girls was deployed right before Thanksgiving and returned home right after Christmas. Another father missed Thanksgiving and Christmas last year with his young daughter and newborn son. He was deployed again this summer and was supposed to be home a few weeks ago. His deployment got extended until after Christmas, so he won't be spending Thanksgiving and Christmas with his family again. And, 30 days after he gets home, they will be moving.

Children don't understand why Daddy or Mommy isn't home and has to miss holidays and birthdays. They don't understand what their deployed parent is doing, or why they are doing it. The at-home parent has a tremendous responsibility raising children and trying to answer their tough questions about the deployed parent. They have to take care of the home, and often they are long distances from other family members. A few weeks ago, one family's dryer went out. The husband is in the Middle East, and from his wife's descriptions, he was able to figure out what the problem was. He ordered the part, sent her a video of how to fix the dryer, and she fixed it. She had never done anything like fixing a dryer, and she was so excited that she repaired it!

Veteran's Day is November 11th. When you are thanking God for all veterans who have fought for our country, and as you pray for our current military who are serving our country and doing their very best to keep us free, please say a prayer for the mothers and fathers who are taking care of children and homes. Thank you, because they need our love, support, and prayers, too.

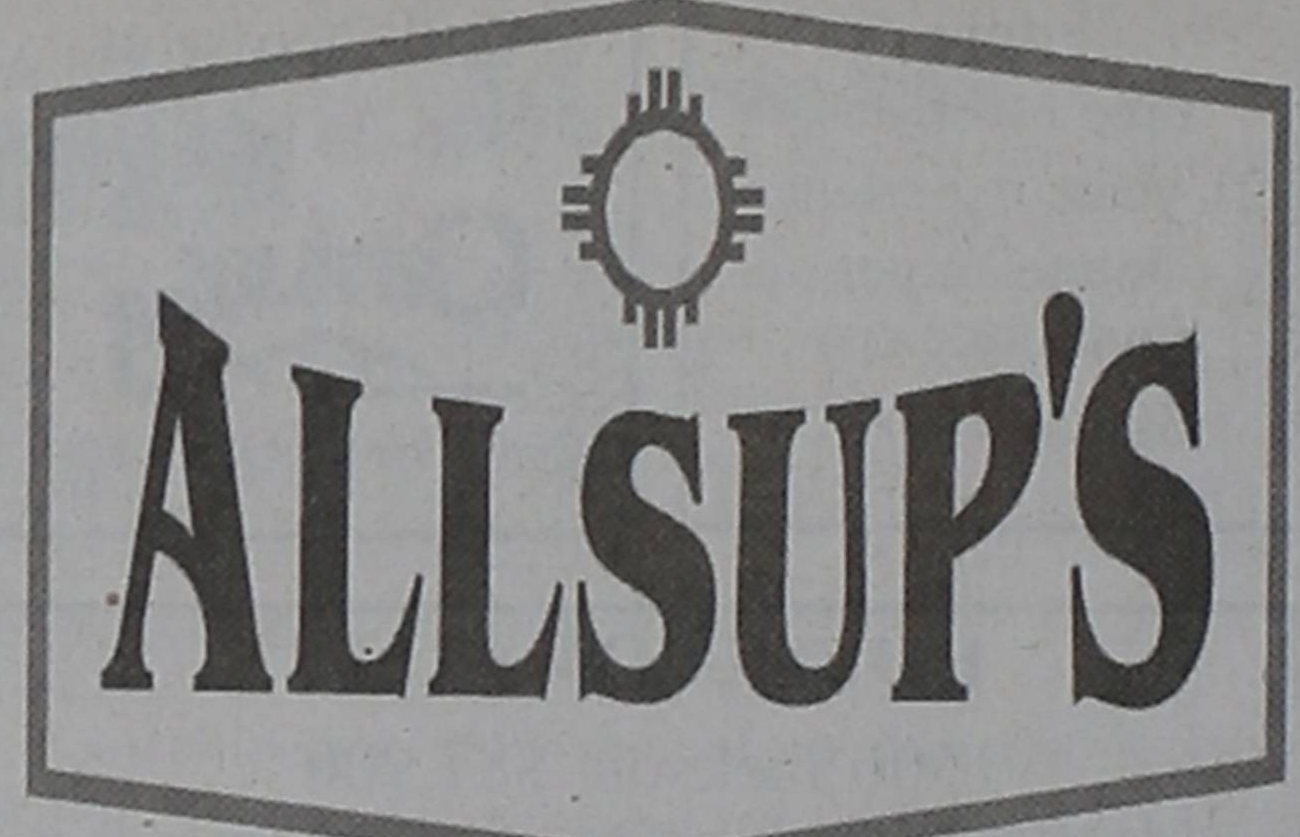

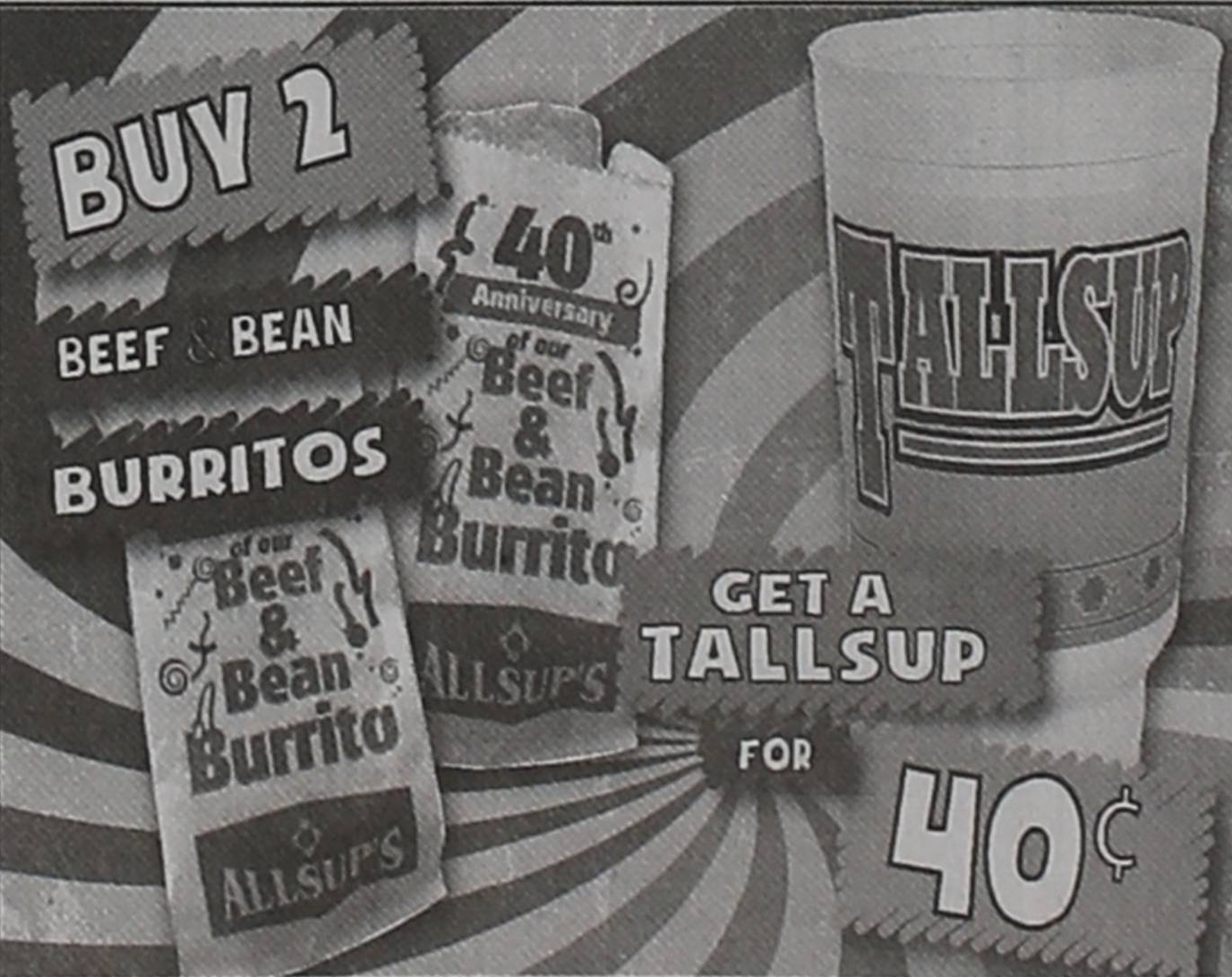

Briana Alvarado placed 33rd with a time of 13:01.88. Congratulations to Daniel and the Cross Country teams on the 2014 season.



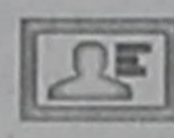

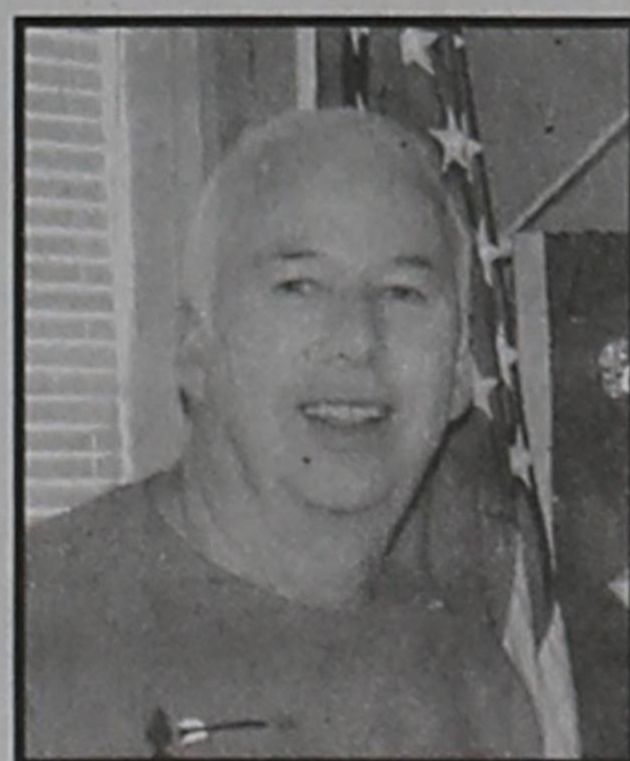

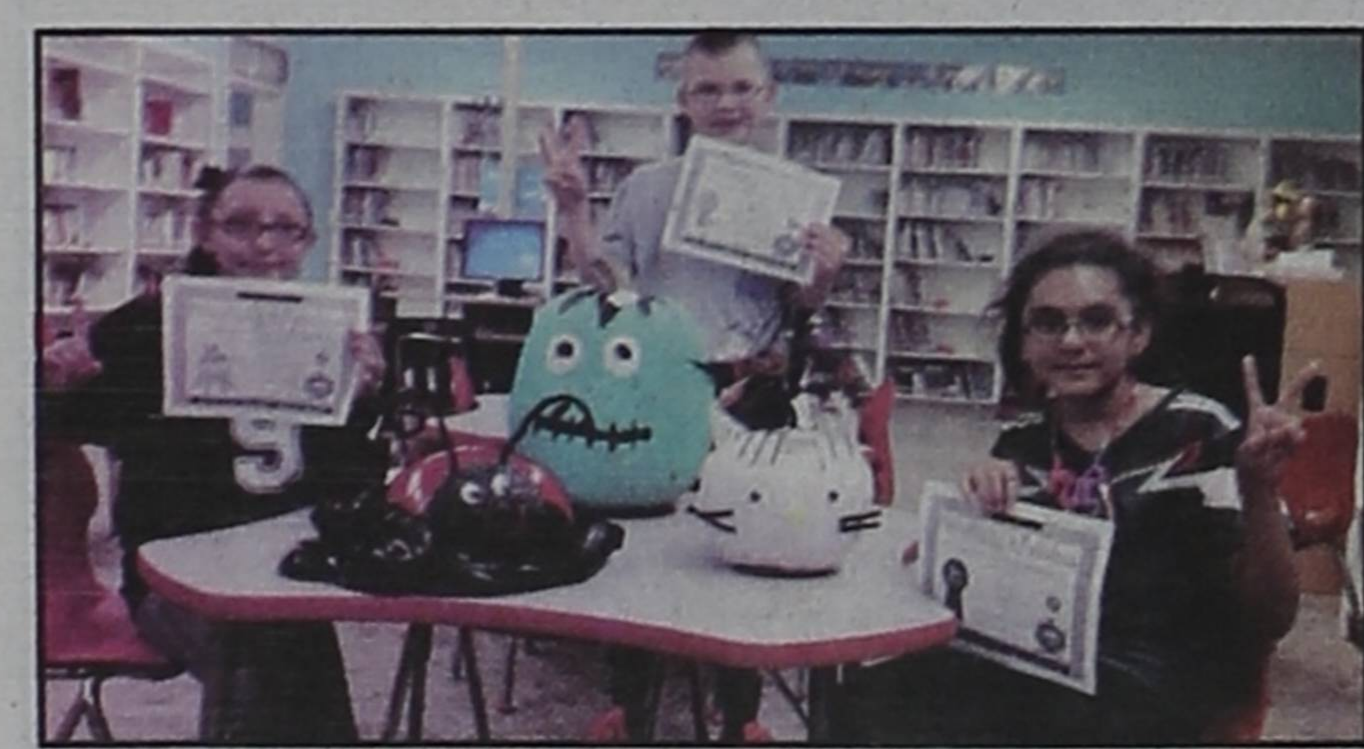
