

As long as the wind is blowing, the turbines hum and electricity flows. But since the wind doesn't blow all the time, a backup source of power such as natural gas or coal is always needed.

The state is, after all, big and blustery. Texas leads the nation in by 2012. wind-power production with more than 2,000 turbines and an annual maximum capacity of 2,768 megawatts (MW). That's this source of power, seemingly the most benign and enough electricity from wind to help serve 600,000 average homes. The operative word is "help" because wind doesn't blow all the time. Virtually every kilowatt of wind generation everyone likes to see massive turbines or high-voltage lines on must be backed up by some other type of generation (like gas or coal plants). Although 600,000 homes sounds like a lot, the state has approximately 9 million housing units in need of Magazine.) electricity, along with churches, town halls, offices, factories and all the public amenities citizens have grown to expect.

"The wind as a 'fuel' is free, but harnessing it with an electric dynamo and transmitting it to a market where it is needed can be very expensive," says Bill Harbin, general manager of Lighthouse Electric Cooperative in windy West Texas. "An additional cost is for transmission lines to deliver the power to a market where it can be used." He also said, "The variable output that accompanies strong gusts followed by light breezes would create challenges for grid stability. That's because natural gas and coal-fired generators and hydroelectric plants must increase or decrease their output to keep total generation in balance with consumers' electrical loads."

PROS: Clean, sustainable, cheap "fuel" source.

CONS: When the wind doesn't blow, electricity doesn't flow. Turbine rotors kill birds and bats. Some call turbines an eyesore. Construction of more transmission lines to carry power from West Texas to major urban areas is costly.

OUTLOOK: West Texas wind farms will continue to proliferate; plans are in the works to address transmission issues.

.The holidays are hastening and that means one thing: food. No holiday meal is complete without at least one pumpkin pie. Around our holiday gatherings one pumpkin pie is usually not enough.

This recipe provided via email by Family Features caught my eye. How about a pumpkin pie topped with glazed pecans and cranberries. The recipe folks described it as "crunchy, sweet-tart topping". Dried cranberries and pecans baked in an orange meringue mixture add a subtle crunch to the silky pumpkin pie filling.

If time is limited prepare the topping a day or two ahead and store in an airtight container, then sprinkle over the pie Line jelly roll pan with parchment paper. In medium bowl stir together just before serving. It sounds good and should make nice sugar, orange juice, meringue powder and vanilla. Add pecans and conversation in the kitchen when your relatives ask, "hey what is that on the pumpkin pie?"

#### Pumpkin Pie with Glazed Pecans and Cranberries (Makes 6-8 servings)

For the glazed pecans and cranberries:

¼ cup granulated sugar 1 tbsp. orange juice

1 tsp. meringue powder

1/2 tsp. vanilla extract

1/2 cup pecan halves

14 cup dried cranberries

#### For the pie:

Pumpkin pie with a serious twist

1 pkg. (15 oz) refrigerated pie crusts

1' can (16 oz) solid pack pumpkin 1 can (10 0z) undiluted evaporated milk

34 cup granulated sugar

1 tsp. ground cinnamon ½ tsp. ground ginger

½ tsp. salt

¼ tsp. ground cloves

To prepare glazed pecans and cranberries: Preheat oven to 300F. cranberries. Stir until well coated. Spread single layer onto prepared pan. Bake 25-30 minutes, stirring occasionally, until nuts are golden brown. Cool completely.

Increase oven temperature to 425F. Press one pie crust onto bottom and up sides of pan; trim edges and prick bottom with a fork. Bake 7-8

In large bowl beat eggs; stir in pumpkin, evaporated milk, sugar, cinnamon, ginger, salt and cloves; pour into pie shell. Roll out remaining pie crust; cut with leaf-shaped mini cutters. Place leaf cutouts on jelly roll pan. Place pie on jelly roll pan; bake 15 minutes. Remove leaf cutouts to cooling grid; cool completely.

Reduce oven temperatures to 350F. Continue baking pie 50-55 minutes or until knife inserted in center comes out clean. Cool completely on cooling grid. Before serving, arrange leaf cutouts around edge of pie and sprinkle with glazed pecans and cranbernes.

## Three men safari in Africa
