The Friona ISD board met in regular session Thursday June 11.

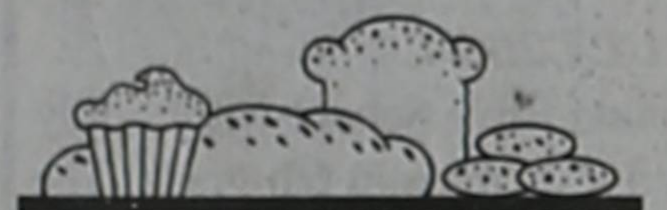

# Relay for Life raises \$23,000, weather chases event indoors

The 7<sup>th</sup> annual Relay for Life cancer walk got off to a great start Friday evening. The weather was cool and overcast as teams set up their campsites. The survivor, caregiver, sponsor photo session was held at 7 p.m. and the survivor lap kicked off by 7:30 p.m. at Chieftain Field.

The Hereford high school Marine ROTC provided the presentation of the flag during the singing of the national anthem by Dusty Hansard. Walkers began to

circle the track as the Noon Lions and Cargill cooked fries and burgers.

But organizers were keeping an eye on the weather radar as threats of rain and lightning were in the forecast. Around 8:30 p.m., co-chairman Greg Lewellen and the Relay committee decided to move everyone inside to the high school gymnasium as storms were threatening. The 2007 Relay suffered the same fate when a storm and rain wreaked havoc with campsites and equipment.

The luminarias were arranged on the gym floor and the HOPE tribute for the Johnston family was set up in the visitor stands. Lights in the gym were turned off about 9:30 p.m. and participants walked around the gym floor as more than 460 names of luminaria honorees were read. Officials said over 1,000 luminarias were sold. There were 11 teams and more than 300 participants this year.

The Parmer County Idol competition was also held in the gym. Winners were

Janet Denton, judge's pick-adult; Stormi Upton, popular pick-adult; Brooklynne Johnston, judge's pick-child; and Megan Sharrock, popular pick-child.

Preliminary figures this week showed the Relay had raised about \$22,800 with money from a few teams still to be collected. The figure includes \$400 from the Noon Lions fries and \$900 from the Cargill burgers during the Relay, and \$1200 from First National Bank's sausage wrap on Thursday. An

official amount should be available by the end of the month organizers say.

Because the evening was cut short, the Relay committee had concession drinks and candy left over which they plan to sell during the July 18 Cheeseburger Festival. Co-chairmen of the 2009 Relay for Life were Greg and Jamie Lewellen. Relay committee members were Jyl Grimsley, Barbara Grimsley, Patti Johnson, Allison Johnston, Gayle Murdock, and Stormi Upton.

## New Texas school vaccine requirements

The state legislature has added more immunization requirements for the 2009-10 school year. Students must present proof of immunization compliance at the time of enrollment according to the Texas Administrative Code. Students must have these vaccines before they begin school. Provisional enrollment and exemptions may be discussed with the nurse.

**3 and 4 year-olds:** 4 doses of DPT/DtaP, 3 doses polio, 1 dose of MMR (on or after 1<sup>st</sup> birthday), 3 doses Hepatitis B, 3 doses HIB, 1 dose Varicella, 1 dose Pneumococcus, 2 doses Hepatitis A.

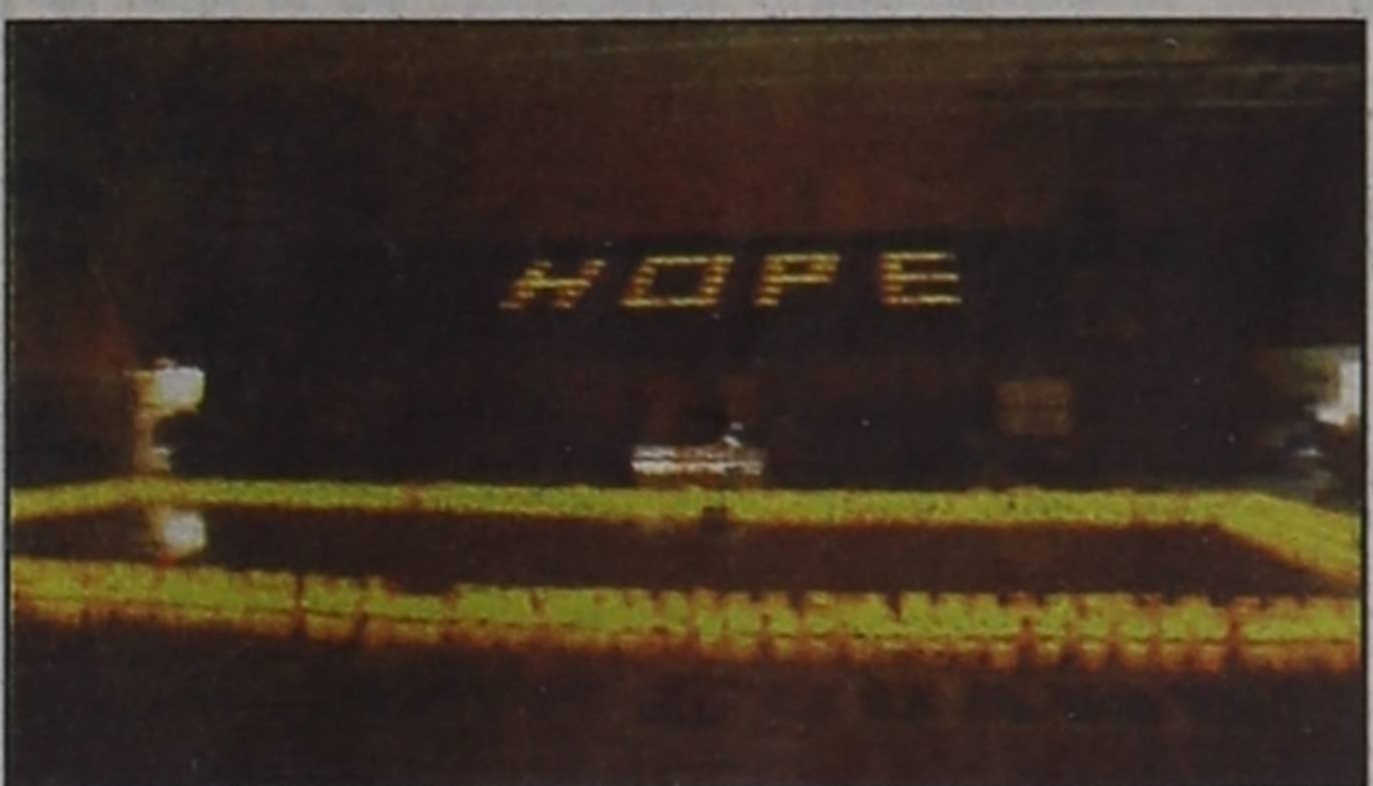
**Kindergarten:** 5 doses DPT/DtaP, 4 doses Polio, 2 doses MMR, 3 doses Hepatitis B, 2 doses Varicella unless child has verification of previous chicken pox disease, 2 doses Hepatitis A.

**First and Second grade:** 4 doses DPT/DtaP, 4 doses Polio, 2 doses MMR, 3 doses Hepatitis B, 1 dose Varicella unless child has verification of previous chicken pox disease.

**Third, fourth, fifth, and sixth grades:** 3 doses DPT, 4 doses Polio, 2 doses MMR, 3 doses Hepatitis B, 1 dose Varicella unless child has verification of previous chicken pox disease.

**Seventh grade:** 3 doses DPT/DtaP, 1 booster of Tdap if it has been at least five years since the last dose of Td. If five years have not passed the booster is due when 5 years have passed from the last dose, 4 doses Polio, 2 doses MMR, 3 doses Hepatitis B, 2 doses Varicella unless child has verification of previous chicken pox disease, 1 dose Meningococcal vaccine.

**Eighth through twelfth grades:** 3 doses DPT/DtaP and one Tdap/Td booster in last 10 years, 4 doses Polio, 2 doses MMR, 3 doses Hepatitis B, 1 dose Varicella unless child has verification of previous chicken pox disease.

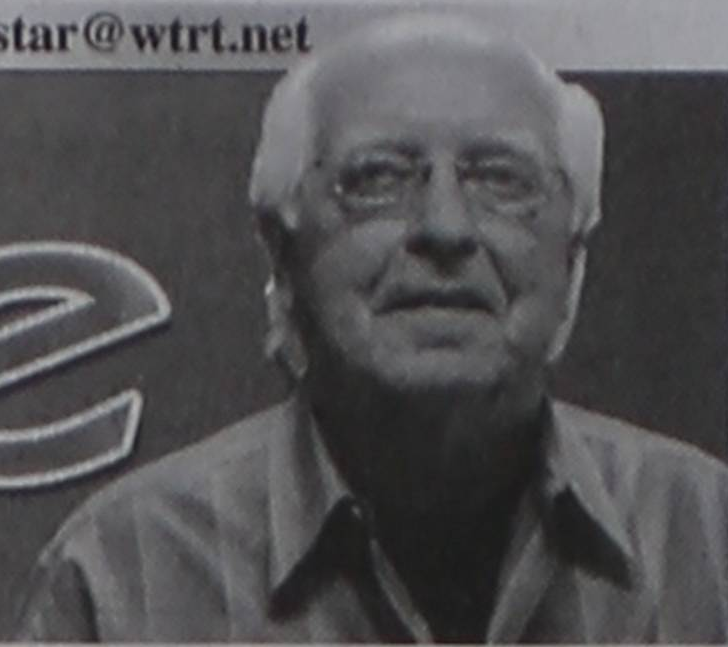

## lets do some laundry

What would Granny Allen think?

My great grandmother Allen, like many other pioneer women, washed clothes in an iron pot over a fire in the back yard. She made her own soap and had a sawed off broom stick to move the clothes around in the pot.

The clothesline was staked up by a few strategic 2 X 4s to hold the wet load of overalls and dresses and underwear.

When I was a boy in Hillsboro in the 40s we took our clothes to Mr. Payne's laundry where mother washed clothes in the "modern" roller washers while she gossiped with Mrs. Payne. Mr. Payne was a short stocky man, able to pick up a number three washtub full of wet clothes and put it in our car.

At home, mother got on one side and me on the other to lug the tub of clothes to the backyard clothesline. She had convinced me long before that hanging out the laundry was fun.

When my sisters and

brother came along I hung out long rows of diapers and learned how to fold them after they dried. I'm not sure when we got our first washing machine in the house.

Even after I left home and got married we loaded our clothes into baskets and headed for the washateria (i.e. laundromat) where we often had to wait for open machines. For decades, we loaded the washer from the top and the dryer from the front. Granny Allen wouldn't have cared either way as long as she didn't have to build another fire.

Fast forward to a conversation I overheard last week. Two ladies were discussing the pros and cons of front load washers. They talked for almost 30-minutes. About front load washers.

They apparently both had front load washers to go with their front load dryers. They discussed the different wash cycles and how front load washers get clothes cleaner than those old pesky top load washers.

Pardon my ignorance but when you enclose a batch of dirty clothes in a metal container and apply soap and water, just how do the clothes get cleaner in a front load. I know, there is a scientific answer about the tumble effect as opposed to the top load agitator.

One lady said the only problem with a front load is you can't open the door to add a few clothes once the washer was running. The other lady strongly disagreed. On her washer, she said, you could certainly stop the action and add clothes without having water run all over the floor.

Front load washers are obviously more powerful than the old top loads. One of the ladies said a Sears guy told her you shouldn't have a front load washer on a pier and beam floor. It needs to be on concrete. Now they tell me, she said.

Back when we were washing at Mr. Payne's, all the clothes went into a tub of soapy water, then a tub of rinse water, then through the

rollers to squeeze the water out. There were no permanent press, knit and delicate, or normal cycles.

One of the ladies said her front load had a 'hand wash' cycle. I guess that is for really delicate stuff that modern women don't want to wash by hand. The other lady said the next washing machine she gets won't be a front load because she doesn't like hers.

It amused me how long the ladies could carry on a washing machine conversation. My machine at home is a simple white Sears model with the minimum of whistles, bells, and cycles. I don't remember ever discussing it with anyone though.

I hope whether you have a top load or front load your washing experience will be an interesting one and that you will share it with your friends and family. If you have a personal washing machine story to tell drop me a note.

Have your people call my people and we'll get together and talk about laundry.

## Chunky Guacamole

Guacamole should be an easy make. Smush some avocados and mix in some onions, tomato, and cilantro. Not everyone likes guacamole or pico de gallo. To me you can't have Mexican food without both. Here is a Family Features quick and easy recipe for some chunky guacamole, provided by Boudro's: A Texas Bistro on the Riverwalk in San Antonio.

### Chunky Guacamole

Makes 2 servings

Juice of ¼ of an orange

Juice of ½ of a lime

1 avocado

1 tbsp medium diced red onion

2 tbsp roasted and charred Roma tomatoes, diced

1 serrano pepper, roasted, seeded and diced

1 tbsp chopped cilantro

Ground sea salt to taste

Squeeze juices into bowl. Add avocado and coarsely chop. Add onion, roasted tomato, Serrano, and cilantro, then fold into avocado mixture. Add salt to taste. Result should be chunky, not mashed.

## Watermelon-cucumber salsa with mint

Serve with grilled pork, chicken, or shrimp.

1 ½ cups diced and seeded watermelon

1 cup diced, peeled cucumber

2 tbsp minced red onion

2 tbsp finely chopped fresh mint

1 tbsp lime juice

¼ tsp Tabasco sauce

½ tsp salt

Combine all ingredients in a medium bowl. Yield: 2 cups.

## Mango ginger relish

Perfect with pork, shrimp, Brie cheese, or chips

2 mangoes, peeled & diced

3 tbsp minced red onion

2 tbsp lime juice

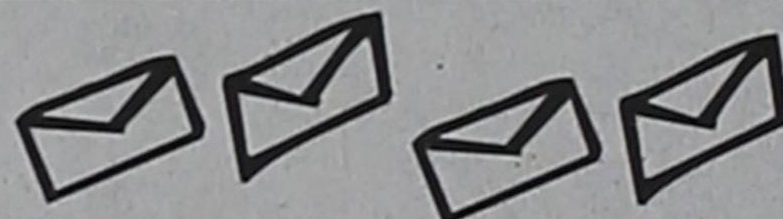
1 ½ tsp grated peeled fresh ginger

Pinch cayenne

I have been wanting to write you about my son Ronald Melton being a missing person from San Antonio since May 19, 2009.

Ronald left San Antonio on May 19 for Friona. He left the Lopez Retirement Home in a taxi to the bus station. One suitcase arrived at the bus station here in Friona but not him. The San Antonio police said he did not buy a ticket. That's when I had a terrifying feeling something was wrong.

Ronald had been missing for three weeks. It was on the TV news and San Antonio daily paper as a missing person the week of June 1.

I had a prayer with the heavenly father Saturday night June 6 and ask if he would let me know something the following week, dead or alive. Sure enough my granddaughter Amber Drake came last Tuesday, June 9, at 3 o'clock in the afternoon and told me Ronald had been found. I had to cry for her. How happy I was.

Ronald had been in the V.A. Hospital in Amarillo for three weeks. He went to the V.A. Hospital in Big Spring June 9 and now he is in the Big Spring State Hospital. The V.A. Hospital in Amarillo notified the V.A. Hospital in San Antonio is how we found out where he was. I still don't know how he got to the V.A. Hospital in Amarillo.

I want to thank everyone for their prayers that knew about Ronald's missing, especially my pastor, Rev. Rick Burton. I want to sympathize with other persons who have loved ones missing, young or old.

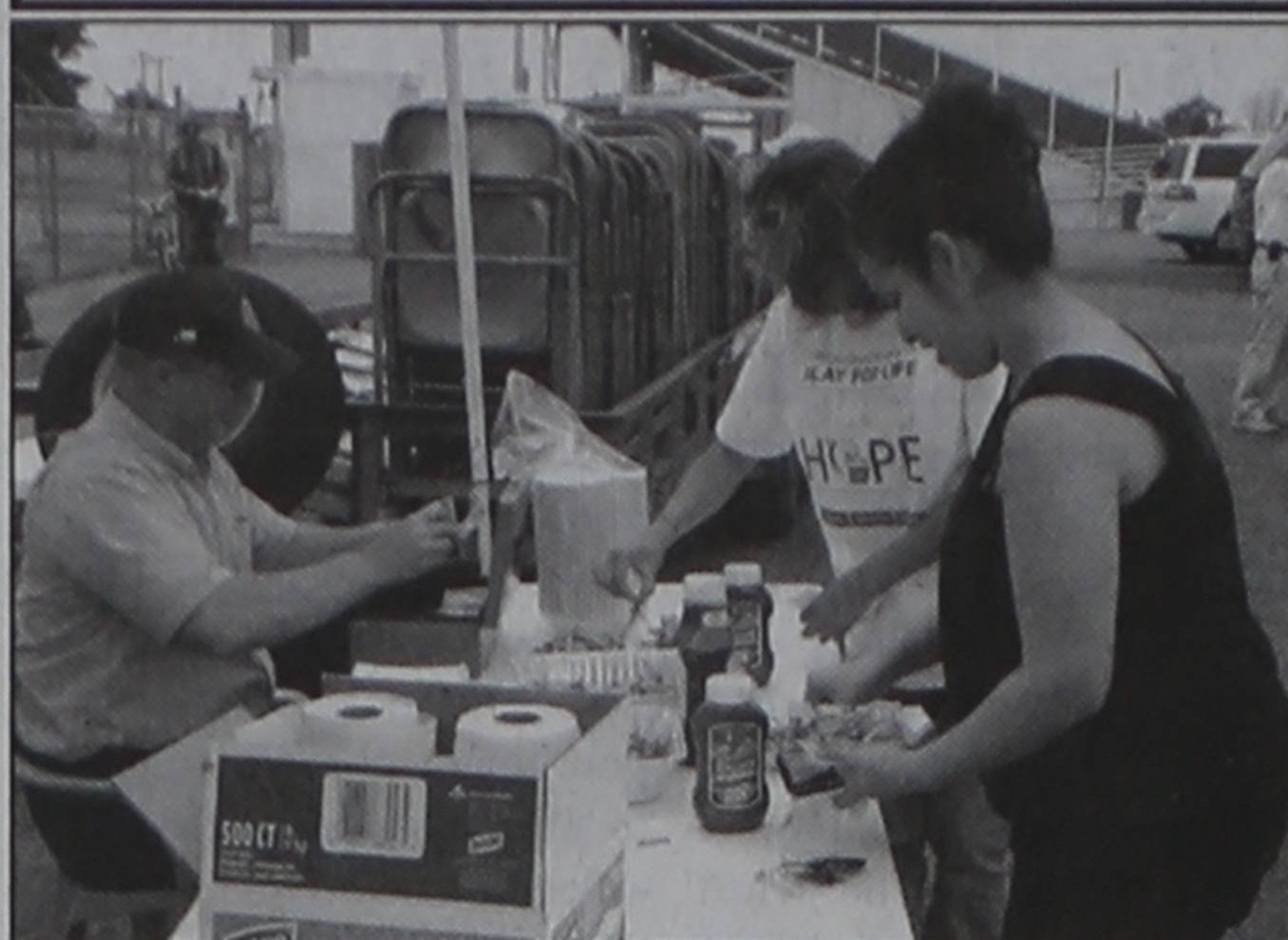

Before one gets married, they better really do some prayerful consideration.



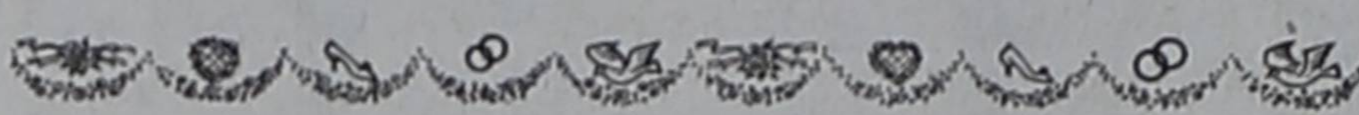

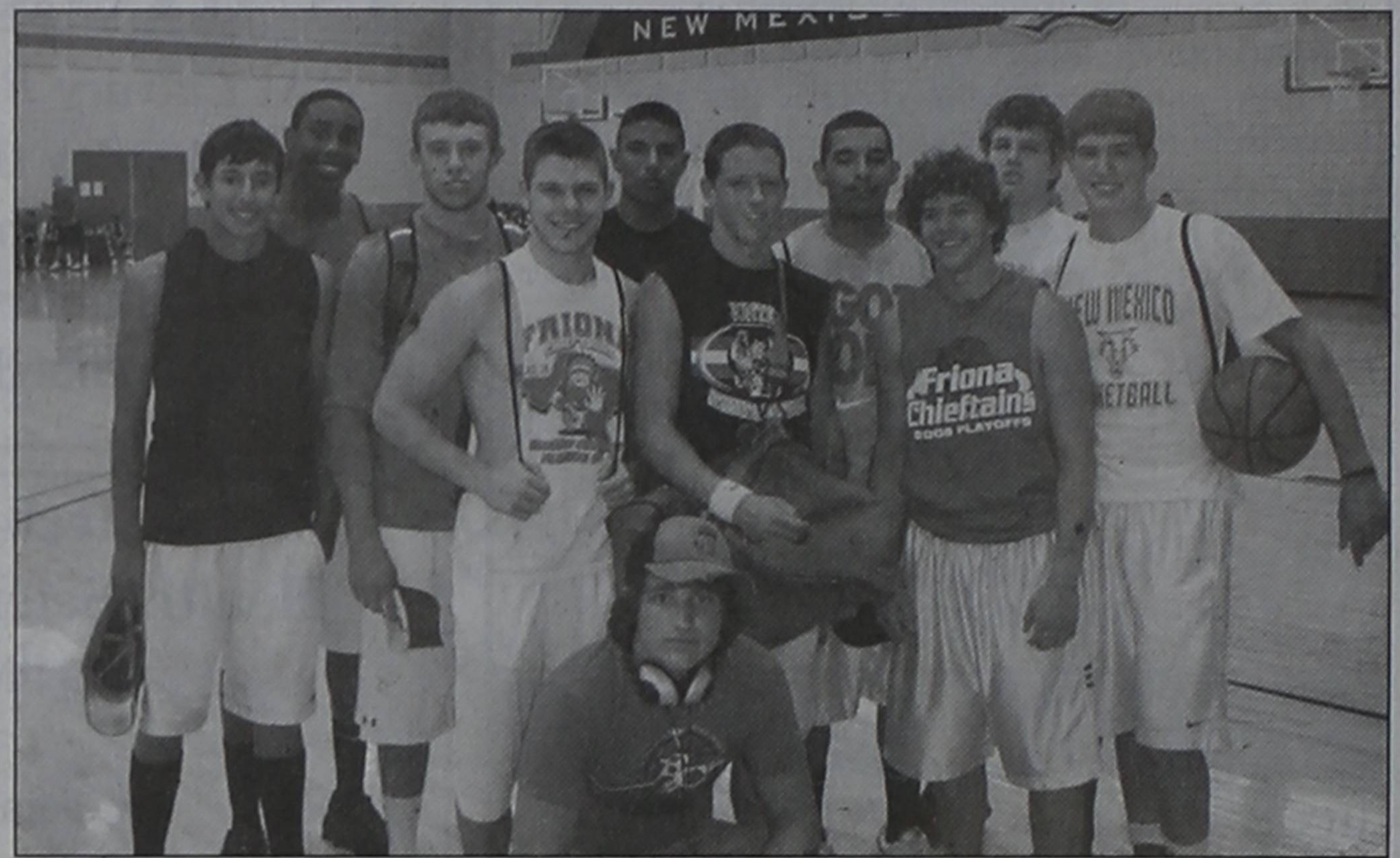
