The relocation of the building was the outgrowth of the Texas Sesquicentennial that year. The Heritage Society was then established to continue handling any renovations and repairs as needed.



She is the daughter of Rudy G Trevino, long time Friona resident and 1972 FHS graduate who was pastor of Templo Bautista from 1978-1981. .






Like father, like son

T. LEON TALLEY, Minister, Sixth Street Church of Christ Genesis 26 reveals an interesting account in the life of Isaac. When famine came to the land of Cannan, Isaac took refuge in Gerar, home of Abimelech, King of the Philistines.

Genesis frequently mentions famine as a test of Patriarchal faith. It was a famine which caused Abraham to leave Canaan and go to Egypt. It was again a famine which caused Isaac to travel toward Egypt.

In a spiritual sense, any barren, dry, unproductive moment, when God is not close, can be properly called "a famine". Like Abraham and Isaac, we also go through these moments and they try our reliance on God. Isaac seems to forget God's providence and special care

because he deceives Abimelech and his men. He lies about his wife Rebeccah, telling them she is his sister. His fear surpasses his faith in the divine promise.

Where did Isaac learn to lie like this? From his father! Children almost always deal with their problems in the same way that parents meet their problems. This account is a powerful example of the influence of parents.

Thankfully Abimelech learns the truth. He rebukes Isaac and warns anyone from touching her. He chastises Isaac for his lack of faith and moral courage.


