Bovina teens face felony charges for BB gun spree

Four teens from Bovina are accused of shooting out dozens of car windows in Bovina, Farwell, and Clovis during the December holidays. They are now facing felony indictment in Texas and more than 50 criminal counts in Clovis, according to a recent report in the Clovis News Journal.

Parmer County District Attorney Kathryn Gurley is combining damage amounts from Bovina and Farwell, which elevates the charges to the felony level. The damage level for felony charges is \$1,500 to \$20,000. Mrs. Gurley expects to present the case to the grand jury in March.

The teens were arrested by Farwell Police Chief Larry Kelsay and officer Frank Ramirez during a routine traffic stop on Christmas day. Clovis police had issued an alert with a witness description of the vehicle. Chief Kelsay and Officer Ramirez were each given a \$300 bonus by the Farwell city council for the arrest according to a report in the Stateline Tribune.

The teens are two 18-year-old males, one 18-year-old female, and a 17-year-old male, all of Bovina. Gurley said the 17-year-old can be tried as an adult. The names have not been released pending the filing of charges.

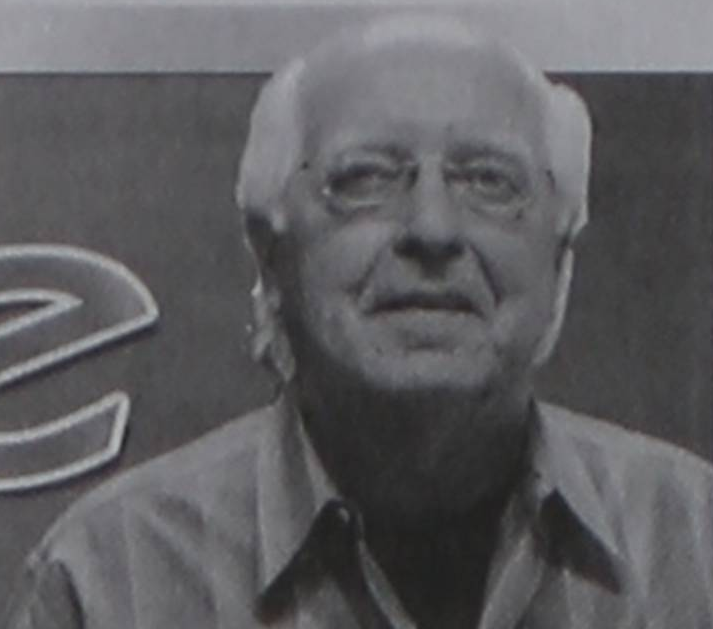

Is this really chili?

Maralin Springer of Jamaica, New York won \$400 for this recipe from Better Homes & Gardens magazine. It is said to be a chili recipe. Some of the ingredients seem to disagree, at least as far as Panhandle chili is concerned.

Cayenne pepper, peanut butter, coconut milk, shredded carrots, and cannellini beans do not sound like chili ingredients but maybe they have a different opinion in New York. This one is probably not going to make it to Terlingua but might be a fun experiment for your next chili cook-off.

Coconut Chicken Chili

Serves 4

- 12 oz skinless boneless chicken breast halves, chopped
- 1 lg onion chopped
- 1 1/2 tsp chili powder
- 1 1/2 tsp ground ginger
- 1/4 tsp cayenne pepper
- 1 tbsp olive oil
- 1 tbsp all-purpose flour
- 1 14-oz can unsweetened coconut milk
- 1 tbsp peanut butter
- 1 15-19 oz can cannellini beans rinsed & drained
- 3 medium carrots shredded
- 1 stalk celery sliced
- 1 medium green onion sliced
- 5 cloves garlic minced
- 2 tbsp chopped fresh basil
- hot cooked jasmine rice
- fresh basil & sliced jalapenos (optional)

1. In large saucepan cook chicken, onion, chili powder, ginger, 1/2 tsp salt, 1/2 tsp black pepper, & cayenne pepper in hot oil over medium heat for 6-8 minutes or until chicken is no longer pink. Stir in flour & cook one minute more. Stir in coconut milk, peanut butter, & one cup water. Bring to boiling, stirring occasionally.

2. Stir in beans, carrots, celery, green onion, garlic, and chopped basil. Return to boiling; reduce heat. Simmer, covered, 10 minutes. Serve with rice. Top with basil leaves and sliced jalapenos.

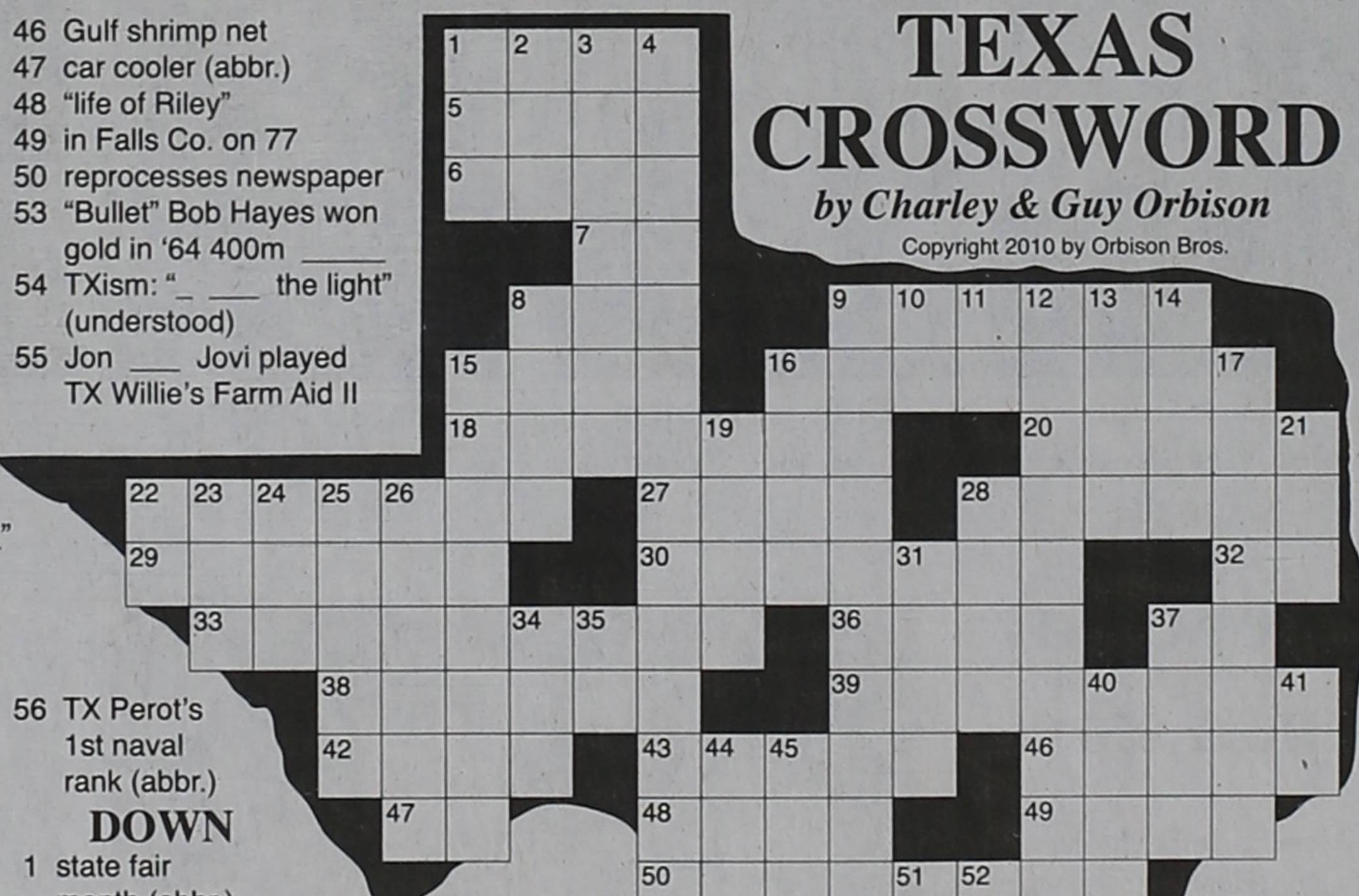

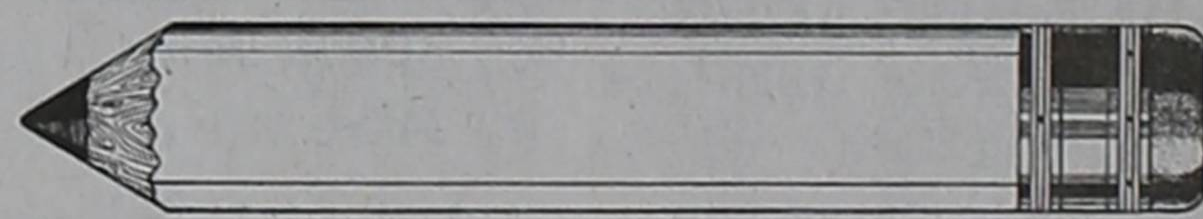

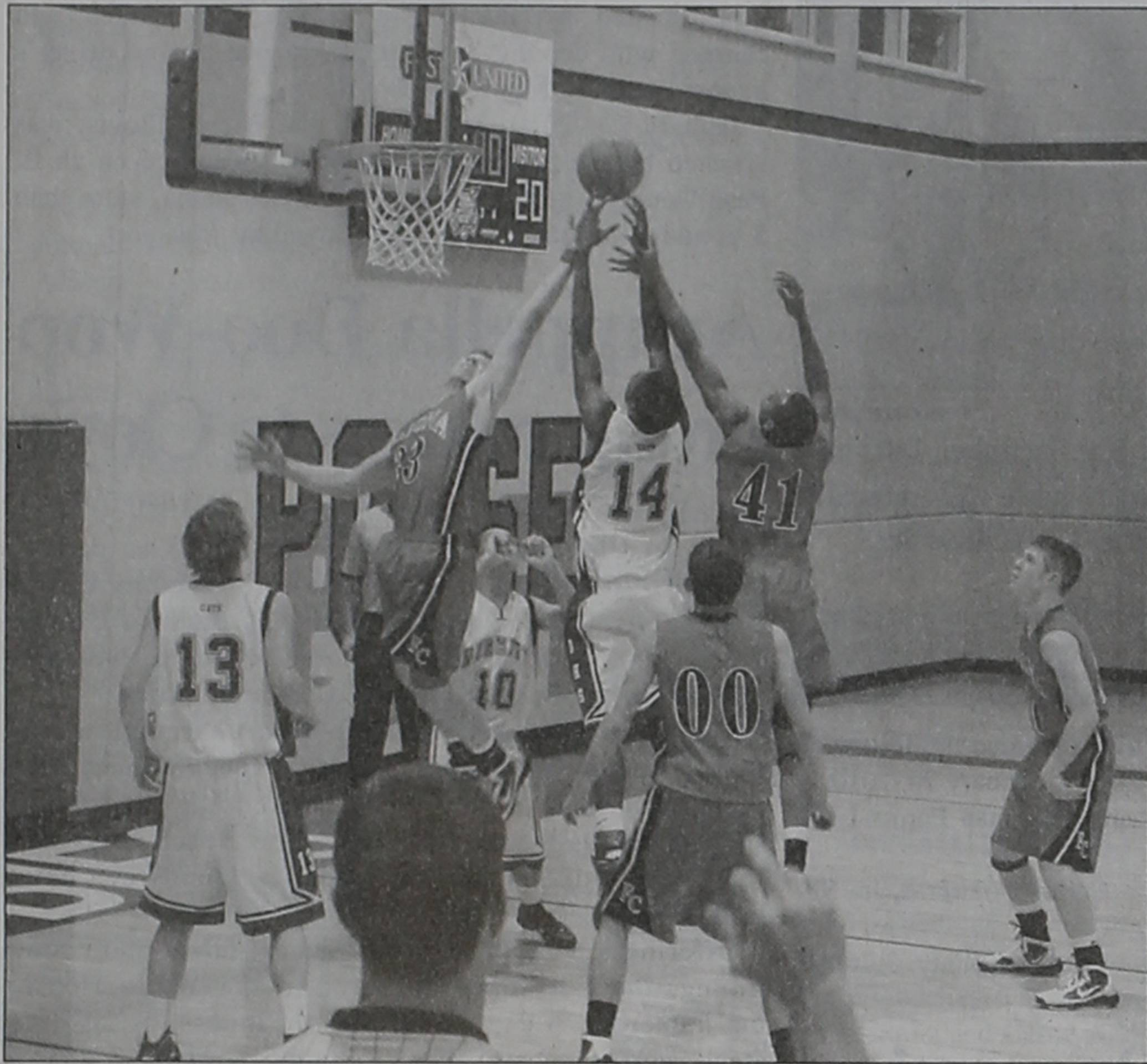
The 6th Street Church of Christ hotline (250-3495) re-

ing days scheduled in Friona and Bovina. Those dates will probably not be decided until the County Commissioners meeting February 8. We will keep you posted.

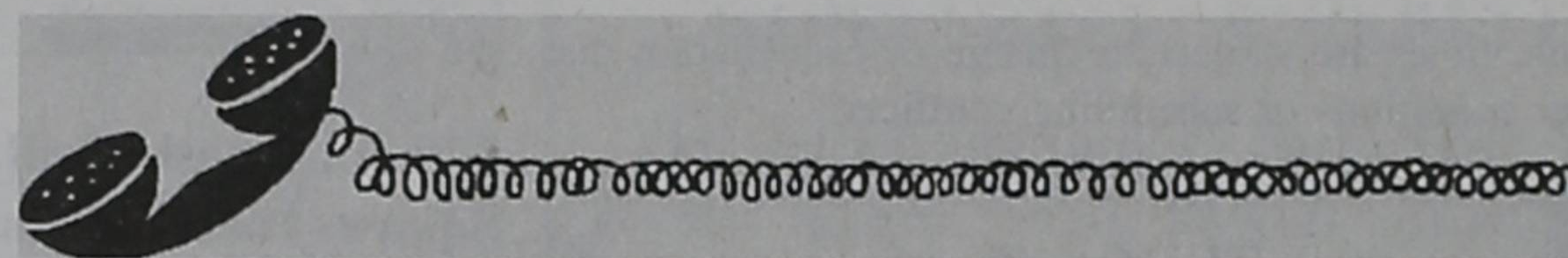

Disaster

Few preachers and televangelists, mullahs and imams, reverends or priests, gloat over natural disasters, very few — presenting them as payback for human transgressions. Earthquakes and tsunamis are caused not by transgression but by tectonic plate movements, and tectonic plates—like everything else in the physical world—are sadly indifferent to human affairs, sadly indifferent to human suffering.

The tragic story of a ceremonial, sacrificial young lady cast into the depths of a volcano is simply designed to erase fear and the guilt of not respecting nor understanding the force of volcanism. Both the self and God are believed appeased until they erupt.

One crosses the street on foot, and one is in danger of losing life from the approaching vehicle because the body is not built for such force. One lives near a frequently flooded river, one lives on the coast, and one lives in a wooden house with a fireplace; all three need to be conscious of natural risk of flood, hurricane, fire, and need not have an automatic response of blame towards the self nor of God—unless harm results from not respecting natural risk. Then one is going to feel blame, but is it warranted?

Some who simply rest with a physical solution to the cause of things which seem beyond control are sometimes accused of being indifferent. Of course the very opposite is the truth: all people hurt when the news of disaster strikes, even the gloating ones.

People don't hope nor have a belief in a heavenly paradise just because earthly suffering exists. No, it's much, much more than that. Nor do we expect a heavenly paradise simply because of our generosity. True generosity is not selfish. The simple fact is Jesus is a savior who indeed suffered, who indeed wept, and who indeed healed not by merit, but by grace. He felt, and he acted. He died, and he resurrected.

Do we need a disaster to motivate us to help? No. Should we help? Yes, in precisely the way in which your heart provides grace. And just whom does it help? All of us. Why? We are brother and sister. Don't feel guilty if all you can do is pray. Prayer may be the best thing one can do, because it helps all of us find a better way to live.
