FHS principal Chris Morrow earns doctorate degree

Friona High School Principal Chris Morrow appeared before a committee at Tarleton State University in Stephenville last Friday to defend his doctoral dissertation, "An Analysis of High School Principals' Technology Use Pertaining to Instructional Leadership Impacting Student Achievement."

Morrow began work last October on the approximate 120-page dissertation. "I had been enrolled in the doctorate program for several years," he said, "but had not worked on it until last year." To remain in the doctorate program he had to pay \$300 per semester, including the summer. "I thought if I was paying \$900 a year I should get busy and finish it," he said.

Morrow, who assumed the FHS principal position at the start of the 2008-09 school year, is a native of Ft. Worth.

He graduated from Haltom High School in 1990. He then attended Texas Tech where he received a Bachelor's degree in political science in 1995. He also later completed his Master's degree in Education Leadership from Tech. From 1996 to 2003 he was a coach and teacher at both the junior high and high school level with stops at Pearsall, Gatesville, Post, and Boerne. By 2004 he and the family were living in Stephenville and he was assistant principal at Dublin High School. The same year he started work on his doctorate at Tarleton.

He became K-12 principal in the small town of Huckabay, with a total school enrollment of less than 200 students. He served there for two years before moving to Friona.

Dr. Morrow is married to Laura and they have four

daughters, Kendall 13, Madison 9, Emma 7, and Brinley who will be one-year-old in April.

High school students and staff decorated his office,

gave him cards, and had a nameplate and coffee mug inscribed with Dr. Chris Morrow to welcome him back from Tarleton. "To me since I had been working on the

dissertation so long it wasn't a big deal to finally get it over with," Morrow said, "but I want to thank the students, staff, and everyone for their thoughtfulness and support."

Commissioners approve April 13 runoff election

The March 2 Republican primary generated one lone runoff election to be held April 13. In the race for Texas Supreme Court Judge Place 3 there were six candidates. None received the required 50% of the vote so the top two will be in a runoff.

County Commissioners met Tuesday March 30 and officially approved the April 13 runoff election. The polling places will be Calvary Baptist Church, Bovina EMS building, Lazbuddie school, and Farwell Community Center. See the official election notice from County Clerk Colleen Stover elsewhere in this issue of the Star.

Early voting for the runoff will be April 5-9 only at the Clerk's office in the Farwell

courthouse. Polls will be open 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. on April 13.

On the ballot for the Supreme Court position are Debra Lehrmann of Tarrant County and Rick Green from Dripping Springs.

Lehrmann has 22 years of judicial experience. She wrote the Texas Annotated Code and is currently a district judge.

Green is a lawyer but devotes most of his time to promoting WallBuilders, a fundamentalist Christian group headquartered in Aledo. He is a former state legislator.

The winner of this April 13 Republican primary runoff will face Democrat Jim Sharp and Libertarian William Bryan Strange III in the November general election for the Supreme Court Place 3 position.

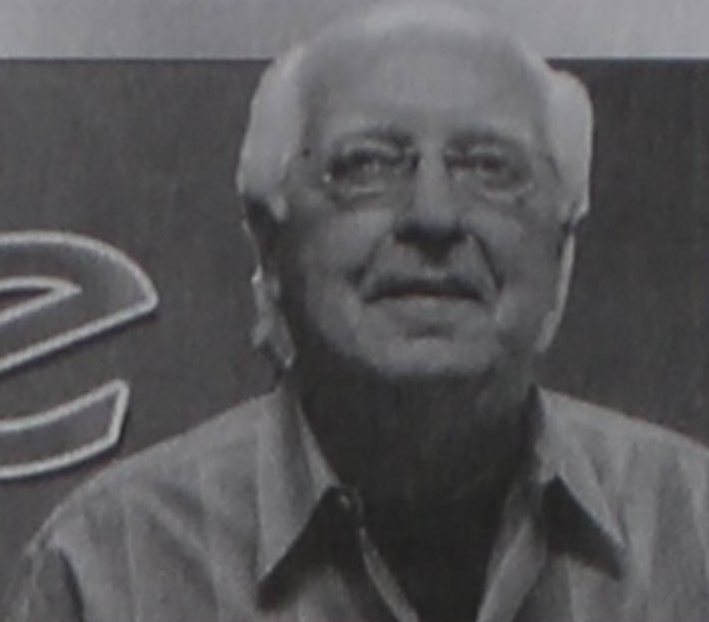

Quiche it up light and crispy

If your folks turn up their nose at the mention of 'quiche', perhaps you could tell them this is a crispy veggie pizza with some tasty fruit on a stick. This recipe and suggestion was in the USA Weekend magazine Sunday from Pam Anderson, contributing editor and the author of five cookbooks, including The Perfect Recipe for Losing Weight & Eating Great.

She says after you prepare the asparagus quiche, cut some pineapple, strawberries, kiwis, and mangos into bite-sized chunks, thread one piece of each onto 4-inch skewers, and serve the fruit kabobs with the quiche. The photo in the magazine looked really tasty. Good luck with yours. (What's a jellyroll pan?)

Light & Crispy Asparagus Quiche

Serves 8

- 1 lb asparagus, ends snapped off and discarded, stalks cut into 1-inch lengths.
- 4-5 green onions, trimmed & sliced thin (about 1/2 cup)
- 1 tbsp olive oil
- Salt & ground black pepper
- 1 sheet (half a 17.3 oz box) puff pastry, thawed
- 3 lg eggs
- 3/4 cup evaporated milk
- 1/2 cup (4 oz) sour cream
- 1/2 tsp dried tarragon
- 1 1/2 cups grated Swiss cheese (about 5 ozs)

Adjust oven racks to lowest and upper-middle positions and heat oven to 400.

Toss asparagus and green onions with olive oil and a generous sprinkling of salt and pepper.

Roll pastry on a lightly floured surface into an 11-by-16-inch rectangle. Fit into a 10-by-15-inch jellyroll pan, making sure the pastry is not stretched. Evenly distribute asparagus mixture over pastry. Bake on lowest oven rack until golden brown, 12-15 minutes. Reduce oven temperature to 300 and remove pastry from oven.

Whisk eggs, milk, sour cream, tarragon, and 1/4 tsp each salt & pepper. Pour egg mixture evenly over crust and sprinkle with cheese.

Put quiche on upper-middle rack; bake until filling is just set, 20-25 minutes. Turn on broiler; broil until cheese bubbles, about 2 minutes. Remove, let quiche rest a few minutes, then cut and serve.

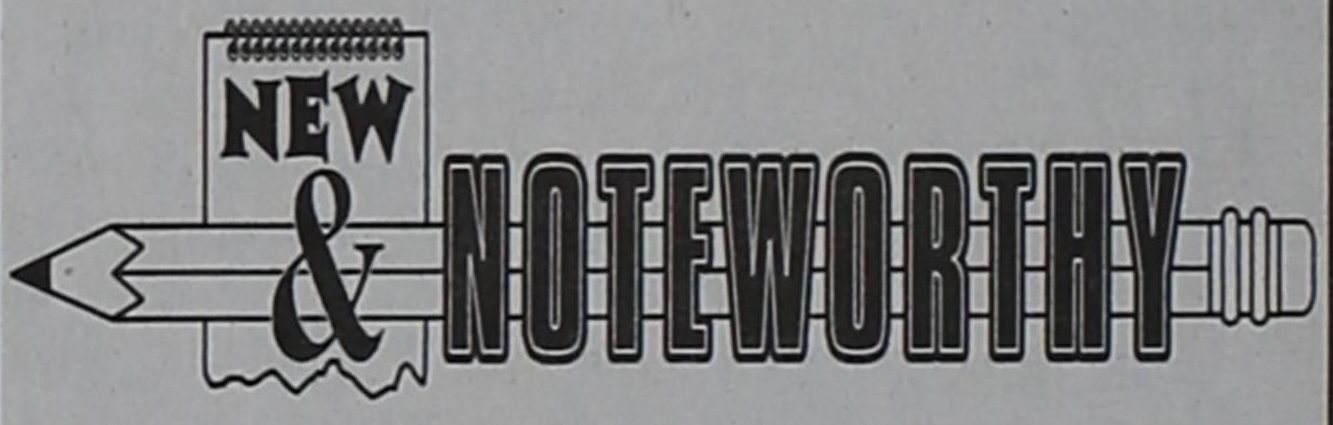

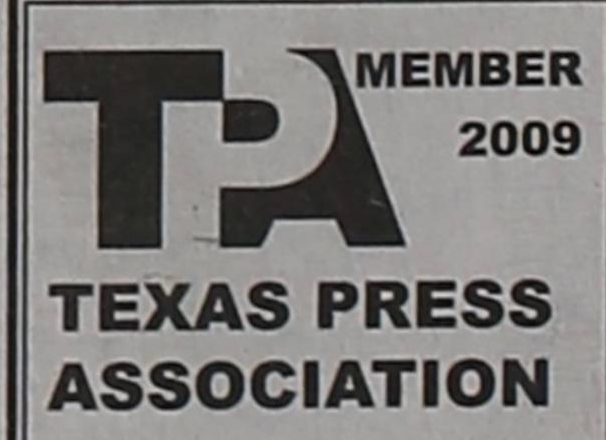

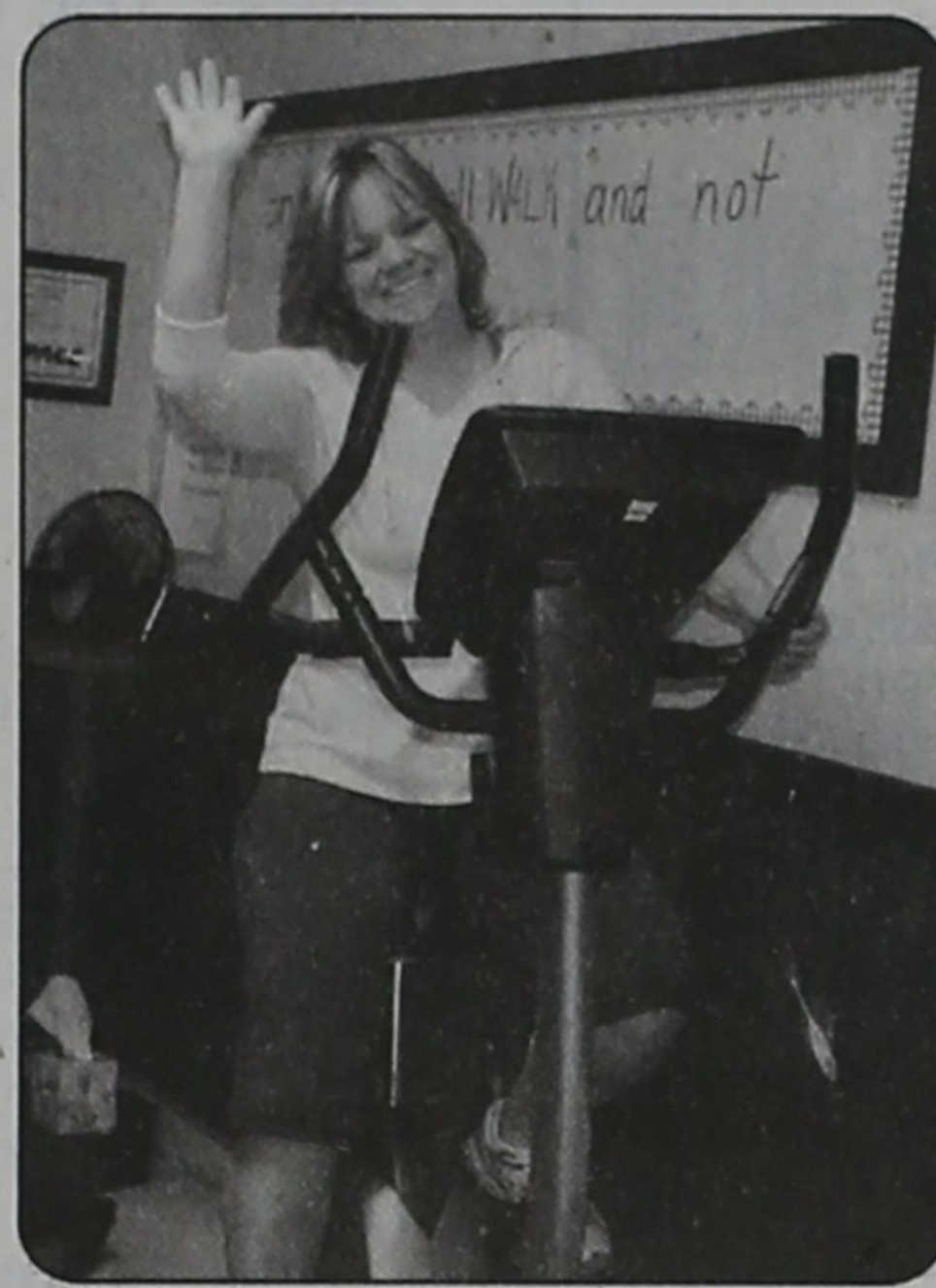
Kendall Neill, an outstanding player for the Canyon Eagles, is the nephew of Mark and Lisa Neill and grandson of Kenneth and

Three Pre-Easter ponderings

This Sunday we celebrate Easter, the most important holiday of all because it celebrates the victory of Christ over death, hell and the grave. His sufficient and substitutionary payment for our sins, and the opportunity for each and every person to be right with God based on the finished work of Christ on the cross. Easter is not to be celebrated faithlessly, effortlessly, or lazily, but God desires that you would remember the work of Christ on the cross, worship God for sending His Son, and respond in faith and obedience.

Jesus hung on the cross for six hours (9am-3pm our time). During these six hours the first three were as a normal day, but the latter three were dominated by a supernatural darkness that covered the Earth (Mark 15:25, 33). In the first three hours Jesus said three things.

1. The Prayer from the cross, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they do," Luke 23:32-34. After suffering excruciating pain, Jesus prays according to God's will, that people would find forgiveness from God. Forgiveness is not automatic, but happens only when you repent of sins and turn to Christ in faith.

2. The Power of the Cross to save, "Assuredly, I say to you, today you will be with Me in Paradise," (Luke 23:39-4). Jesus was crucified between two criminals, who were getting what they deserved. In fact, Matthew 27:44 says that these vile men cursed Jesus while on the cross and railed against him, joining in with the many others cursing the Christ. Thankfully, though, one criminal realized that Jesus was his only hope for salvation. In other words, he called out to Jesus as Lord, and Jesus saved him, just as He saves all who call on the name of the Lord (Rom. 10:9-13).

3. The Practical Provision from the Cross, "Woman, behold your son!...Behold your mother!" (John 19:26-27). Jesus' work on the cross is spiritual and also practical. In just a few weeks Jesus would be gone from the earth, so He ensures the care of His mother into the hands of a Christian caretaker, John. In fact, 1 Timothy 5:8 reminds us that following Christ begins with those closest to us and how we care for them.



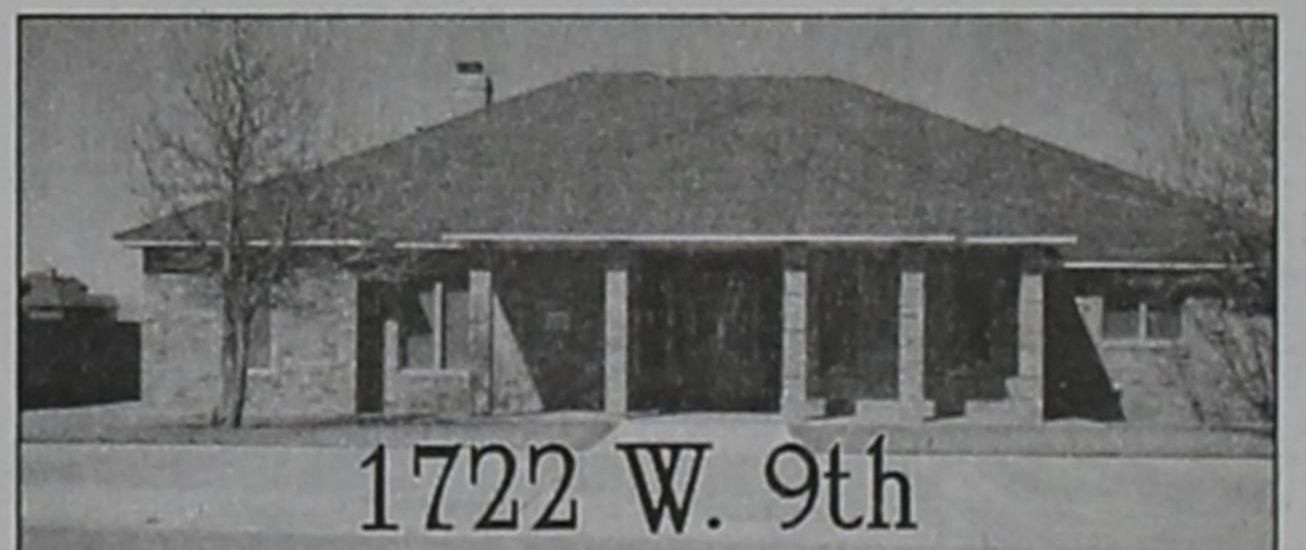

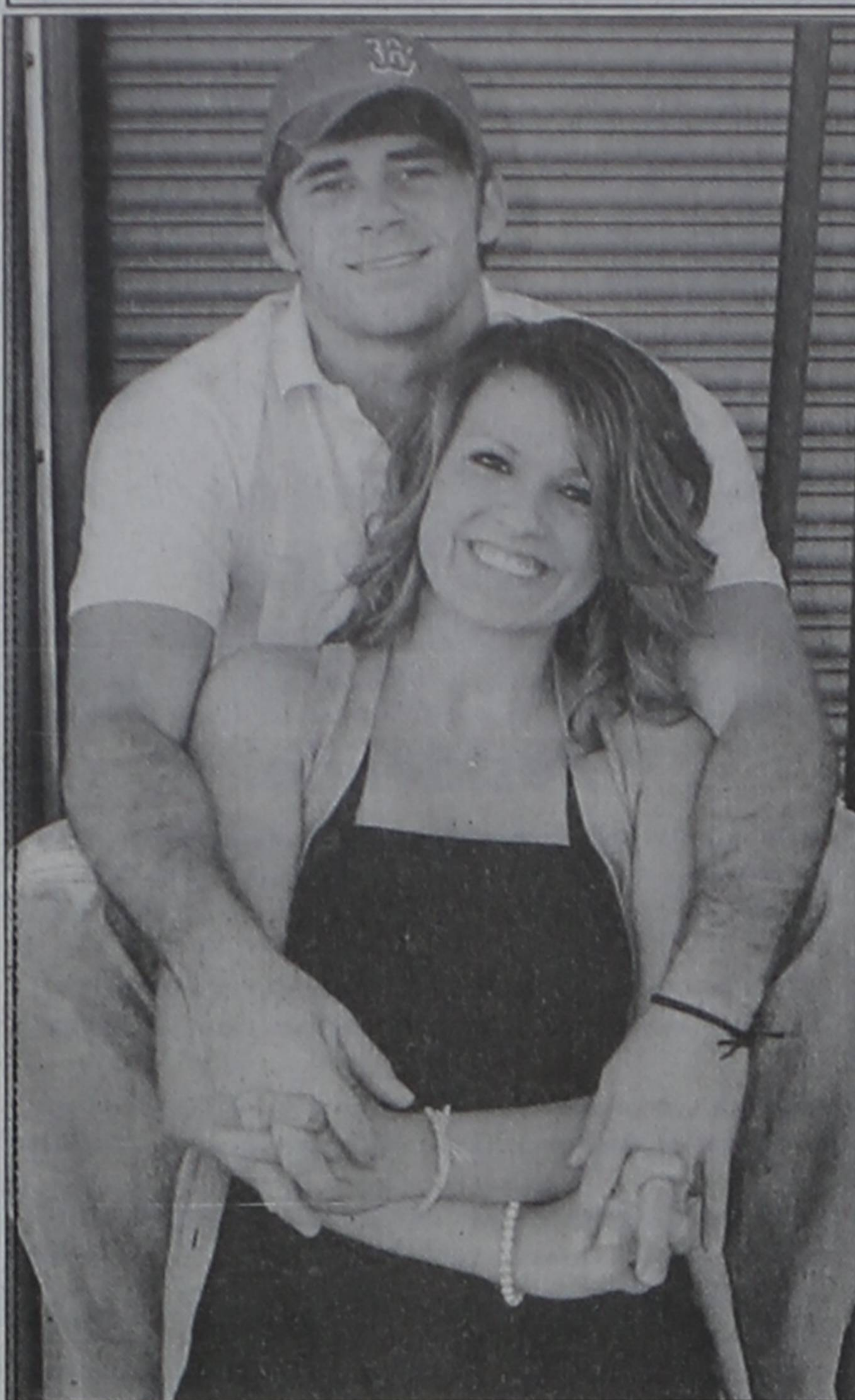
