Cumulative voting for city elections

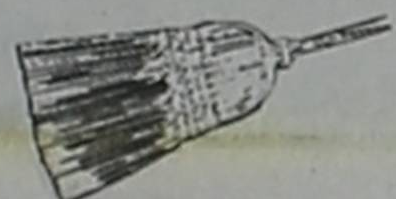
Friona voters in the city election May 8 (and early voting) will be governed by a cumulative voting rule. It means you have two votes for city council since there are two seats and three candidates. Those two votes can be cast for one candidate or one each for two candidates.

City manager Patricia Phipps reminds that voters can darken only two circles on the ballot. Each candidate is listed twice. The cumulative voting applies only for the city council race. The race for mayor will be a single vote.

Bad idea: inmate runs, but not far

On April 15 at 6:25 a.m. a working inmate, Jesus Antonio Magallanes, 17, fled from custody at the Parmer County jail in Farwell while being escorted carrying out trash. Magallanes was serving a 180 day sentence for misdemeanor traffic charges and a probation violation.

He and another inmate were being escorted by two corrections officers. As an outside door to the garage area was opened, Magallanes ran out, pushing the door closed behind him. Sheriff Randy Geries said Magallanes was a working inmate for a month prior

to the incident and had performed his job functions before.

A quick response from area law enforcement played a key role in locating Magallanes at a local residence in Farwell. Sheriff Geries said his family had once lived at the residence which is only four blocks from the jail. He was found hiding under some blankets inside the residence.

His jail clothing was found discarded in a detached garage next door. He was apprehended and returned to the jail where he now faces charges of escape from custody, a third degree felony.

Early voting dates for city elections

The local election for seats on the city council and for mayor will be held Saturday, May 8 in the council chambers on Main St.

Early voting will be April 26 through May 4 at city hall. From April 26 to April 30, early voting hours will be 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. On Monday and Tuesday, May 3-4, special early voting hours will be 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. at city hall.

Voters are required to bring their voter registration card and a photo ID.

Three candidates have filed for the two open city council positions. They are Martha Barker, Ronnie Stevick, and Cheryl Weatherly. Barker and Stevick are incumbents. Filing for mayor are incumbent John Taylor and challenger J.B. Douglas.

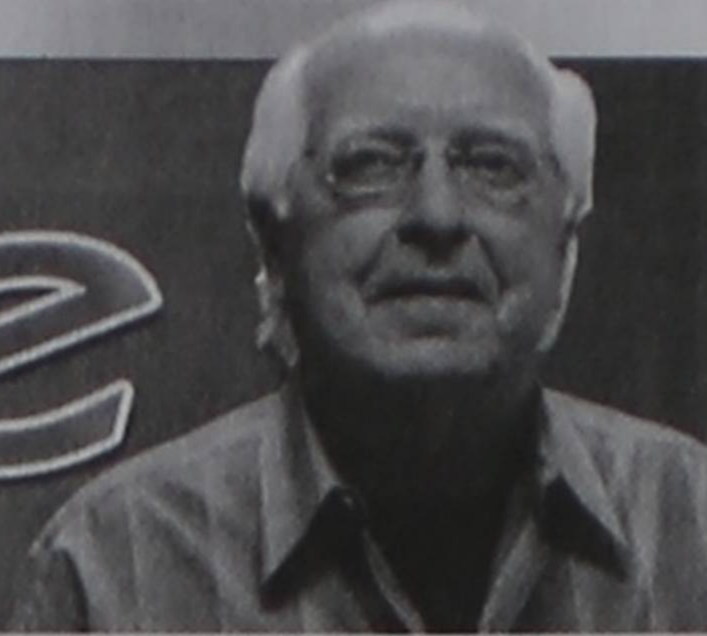

high school. In her off-time she and a lot of friends hung out there. Life is often a matter of timing.

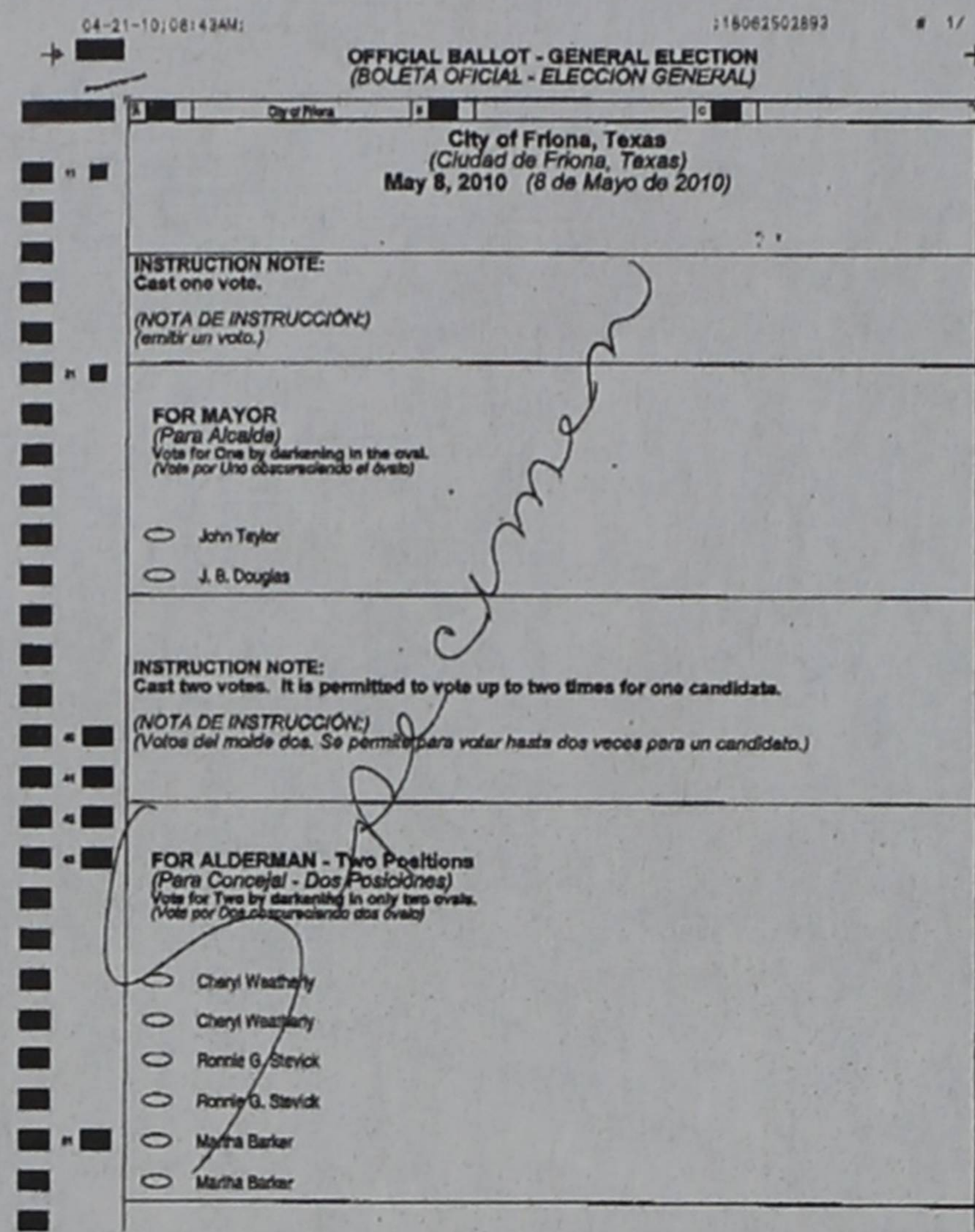

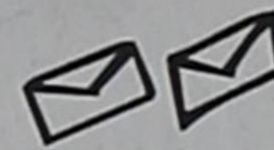
Thank you so much for your efforts in keeping Friona aware of happenings in and around town.

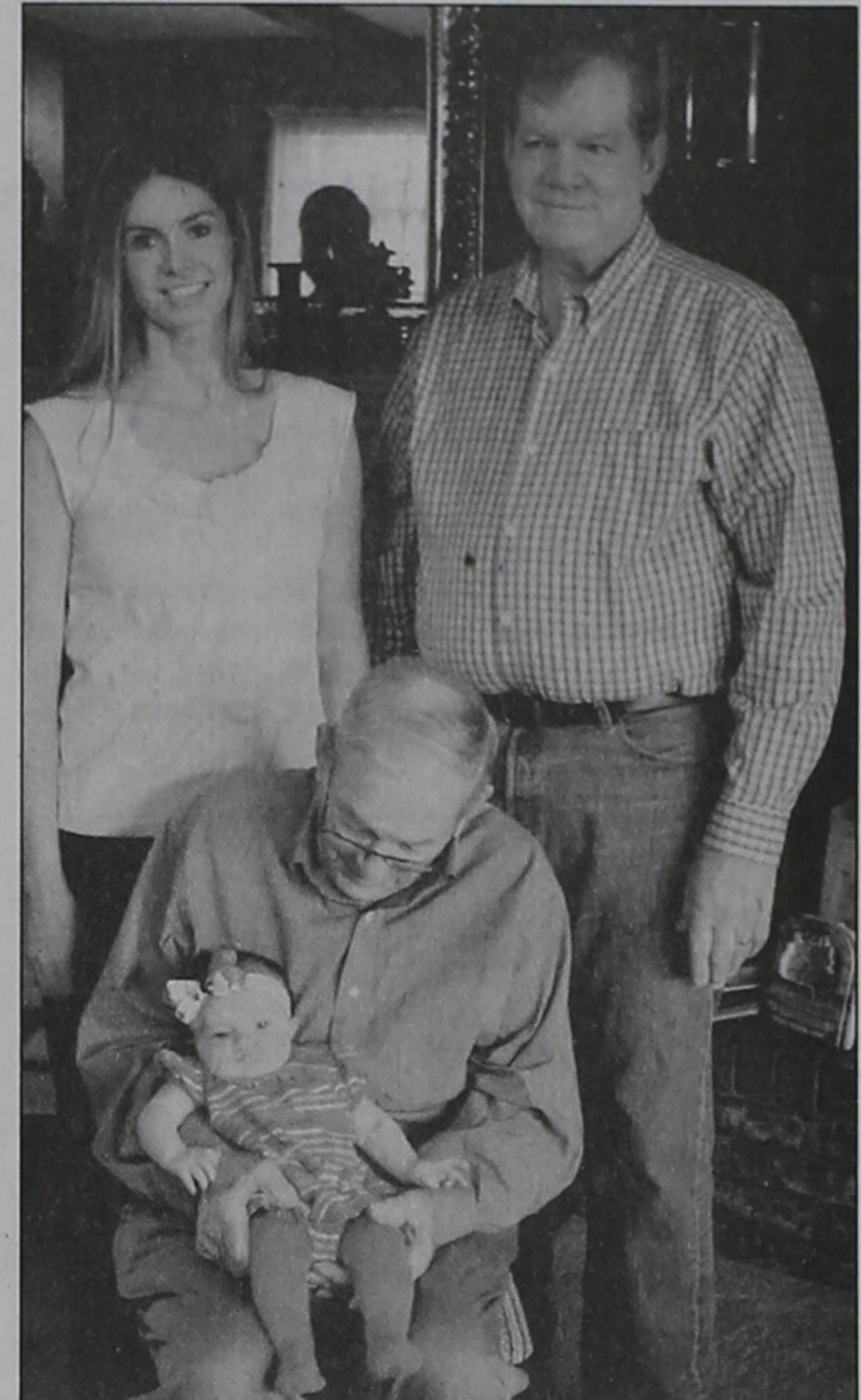

Bovina man sentenced to 66 years on sexual charges

On April 13, 2010, Claude Alexander Miller II, 60, of Bovina plead guilty to aggravated sexual assault of a child and child pornography charges. Miller received 40 years in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice (TDCJ) from the charges filed in 287th District Court of Parmer County. He has been transferred to TDCJ on these charges.

The initial report was made to the Parmer County Sheriff's Office in late 2008 and early 2009. A local child victim had been identified and Miller was charged with assaulting the child. After three search warrants were executed on Miller's Bovina home, numerous pornographic photographs were discovered on his home computer.

The U.S. Secret Service forensic lab assisted in the examination of the computer hard drive, uncovering photographs which Miller believed he had erased. Subsequently, federal charges were filed on Miller for possession of the child pornography. Miller was also sentenced to 26 years on the federal charges.

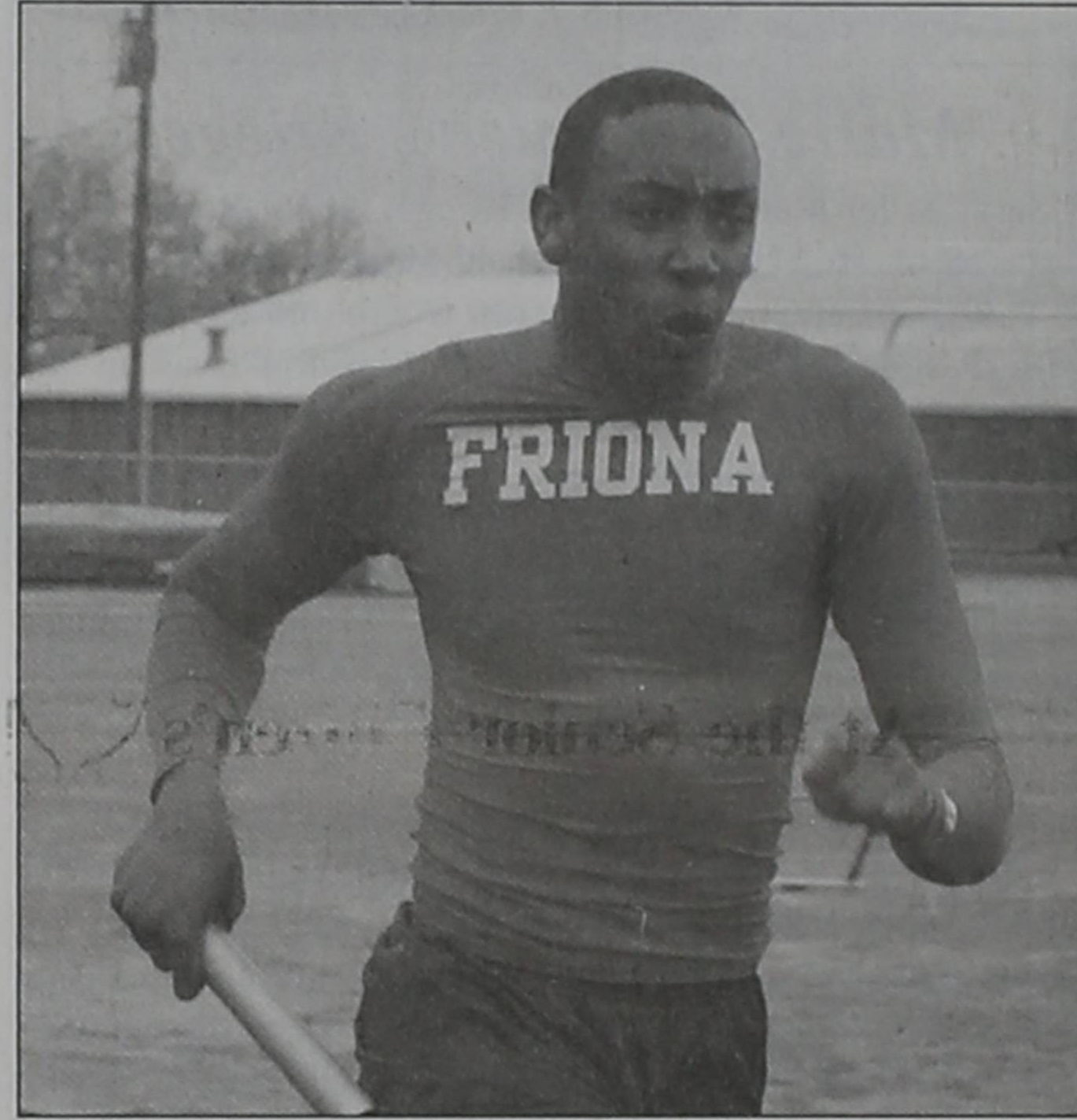

Putting God in a box

Have you ever tried to put God in a box? When I speak of putting God in a box, I point to the ways that we tend to put limitations or stipulations on who God is and what He can do through expectations, schedules, attitudes, actions or a host of other things. It sounds really silly to think that you could put the omniscient, omnipotent, omnipresent God of all time, space and history in a box, but that is exactly what happens in 1 Samuel 4, 5 and 6.

You see, in the Old Testament God had given His people the ark of the covenant, which was an ornate chest about 3' x 4', covered in gold, containing the ten commandments, a jar of manna, and a piece of Aaron's rod that budded inside, and on top were two ornate cherubim on each end of the mercy seat. The ark was a powerful symbol of God's presence with His people and holiness, but after time the people reduced God and sought to just put him in a box.

When you seek to place God in a box, you lose the sense of God's holiness and wonder that is rightly due Him, and replace that with a sense of mundane rituals called religion. When you place God in a box, limiting who you think He is, you get religion, but when you walk with God daily, guided by His Word and led by His Spirit, you get relationship. God sent Jesus, not to give religious rules and regulations, but so that through His death, burial, and resurrection we might have a relationship with God, where we walk daily with Him and experience His greatness, wonder and holiness.

Over 25-years of knocking on doors the ladies had stories to share. Several times they arrived with a meal to find the client on the floor after a fall. On more than one occasion they found no one home, which causes an initial scare since the clients are eld-

They told of searching throughout the house, the yard, and neighborhood until it could be determined the client was safe. Once they traced a client to the local

golf course when she was not at home. All agreed it is a warm experience to visit with the meal recipients. The drivers are often the only visitors that many clients have. The volunteers stated they receive great satisfaction helping those who are in need.

Pesticide training/testing April 30 in Muleshoe

There will be a Texas private pesticide applicator training and testing program April 30, 2010 at the Bailey County Extension office in Muleshoe, Texas. The office is located at 118 West Ave. C in Muleshoe (just west of 1st Bank). The training will begin at 8:30 am and testing should conclude by 1:30 pm.

Texas AgriLife Extension Service will provide the training and Texas Department of Agriculture will administer the test. Attendees are encouraged to bring a calculator and pencil for use during testing.

A private pesticide applicator license is required if someone uses or supervises the use of restricted-use or state-limited-use pesticides or regulated herbicides to produce an agricultural crop on personally owned property, rented property, property owned by his or her employer, property under his or her general control, or the property of another person if applied without

compensation, other than the trading of personal services between producers of agricultural commodities. No license is required to apply general-use pesticides to produce agricultural commodities.

Individuals who want a Texas private applicator license must attend a private applicator training program offered by Texas AgriLife Extension Service, pass the Texas Department of Agriculture private applicator exam, and purchase a license. The private applicator license fee is \$60. Private applicator licenses expire five years after the date issued and then must be renewed.

Plentiful rains brighten cotton prospects

No matter whom you talked to before this week, the tone of just about every conversation about 2010 production prospects was optimistic, began with a smile, and included a comment about how the area's soil moisture profile has rarely looked better. After this week's plentiful, widespread rainfall, the situation has only gotten better in most of the High Plains.

Since it is the High Plains, though, those prior conversations also included the obligatory reminder that the area still needed a "planting rain" to replenish upper level moisture lost during pre-plant field operations and really get things started right.

Following several inches of rain over a majority of the region, it appears the requests for a timely "planting rain", have been filled beyond most expectations this week. With just 2-3 weeks remaining until planting operations normally begin, and soil temperatures on the rise, things are looking pretty good for the 2010 High

Plains planting season.

Rainfall amounts reported by the National Weather Service were lightest in the counties along the Texas-New Mexico border. Rainfall totals rapidly climb above the 1-2 inch mark moving eastward, however. Rain was still falling at 9:30 a.m. Friday morning when the NWS showed Post, Texas at 3.2 inches, with the highest rainfall total for the previous 24 hours.

It's hard to imagine the current situation could have been scripted any better following multiple rainfall and snow events throughout the late fall and winter months. Early moisture already had High Plains producers whistling a happy tune when thinking about the opportunity for a solid start when 2010 cotton planting begins in late April and reaches terminal velocity in mid-May.

About the only thing left on the 2010 checklist, other than to fill in the

moisture gaps along the western edge of the region over the next few weeks, is to have soil temperatures reach optimum cotton planting levels.

In order to help growers track soil temperatures and finalize 2010 planting plans, Plains Cotton Growers has reactivated the "Soil Temperatures" link on the PCG Weather pages at: <http://www.PCGwx.com>.

For the past several years, as a service to High Plains cotton farmers, PCG has made daily soil temperature information available on the PCG Weather Pages. Look for the "Soil Temperatures" link in the left sidebar.

Growers can also go directly to this page and bookmark it by typing <http://www.plainscotton.org/weatherdata/index.php> into their Internet browser.



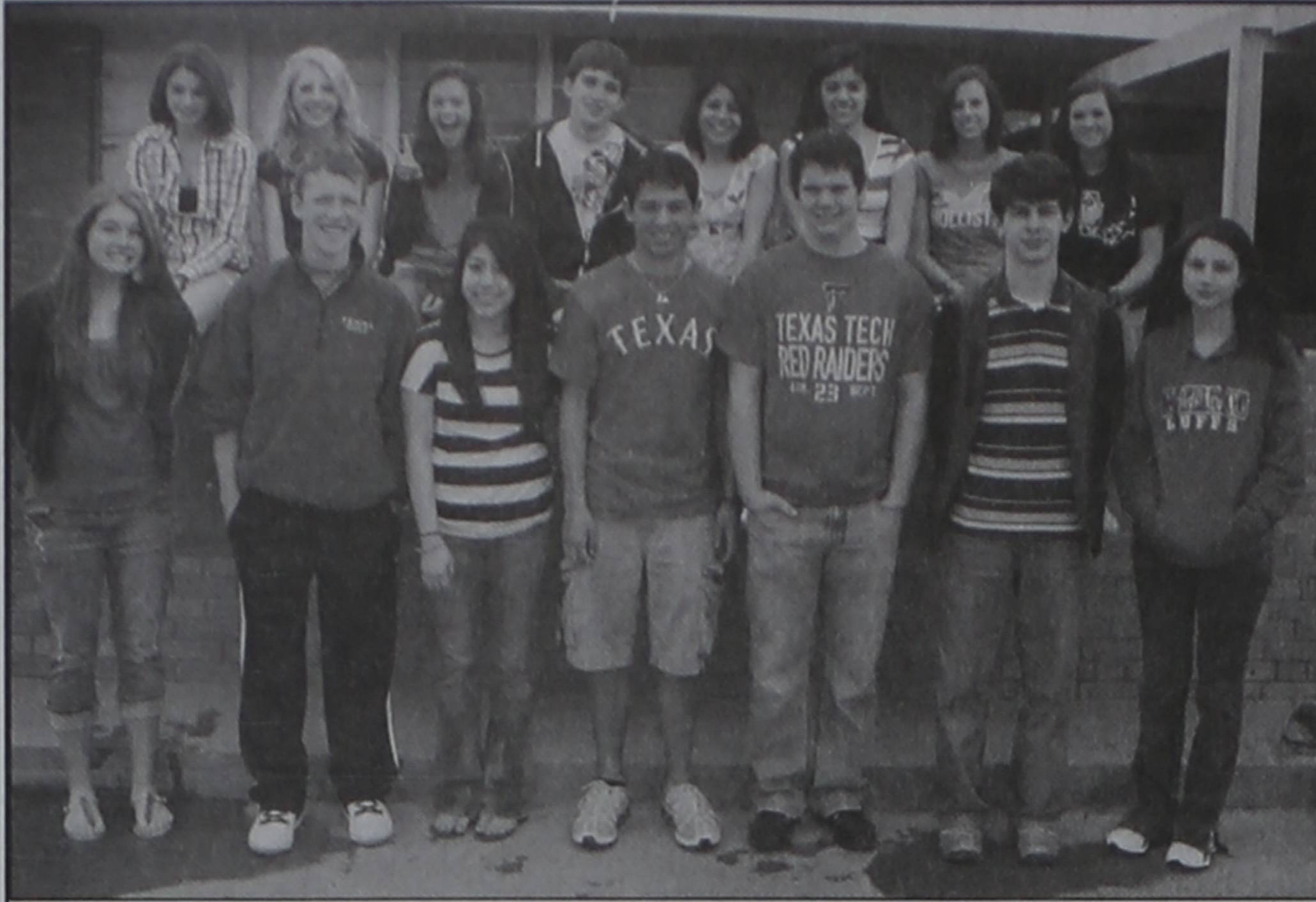

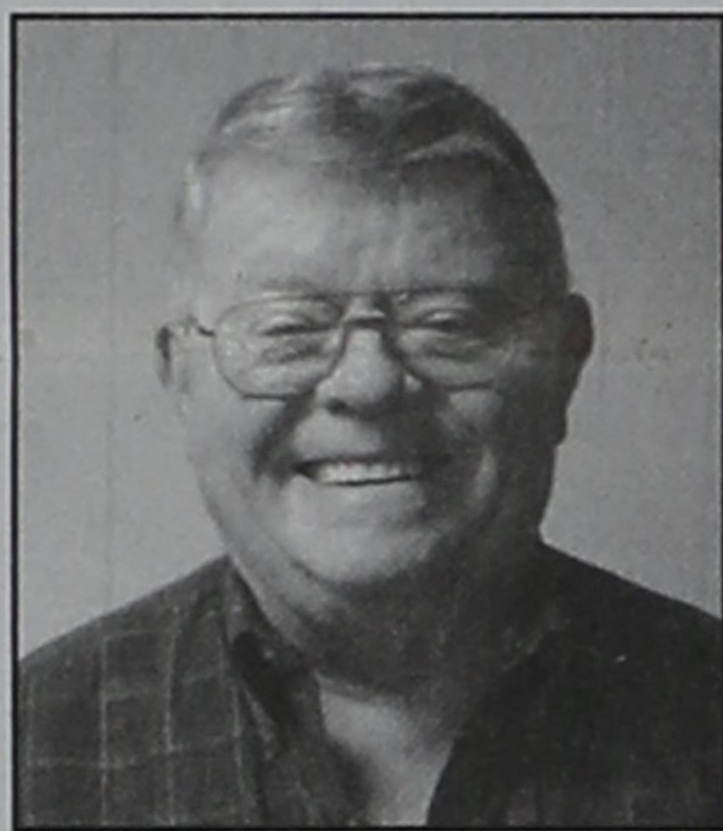

A hot air balloon themed rehearsal dinner was held at Ruby Tequila's in Lubbock, hosted by Bill and Jane Bridges.

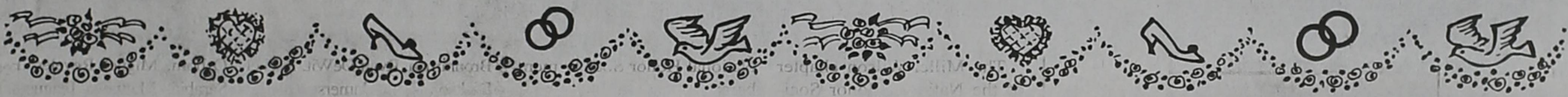

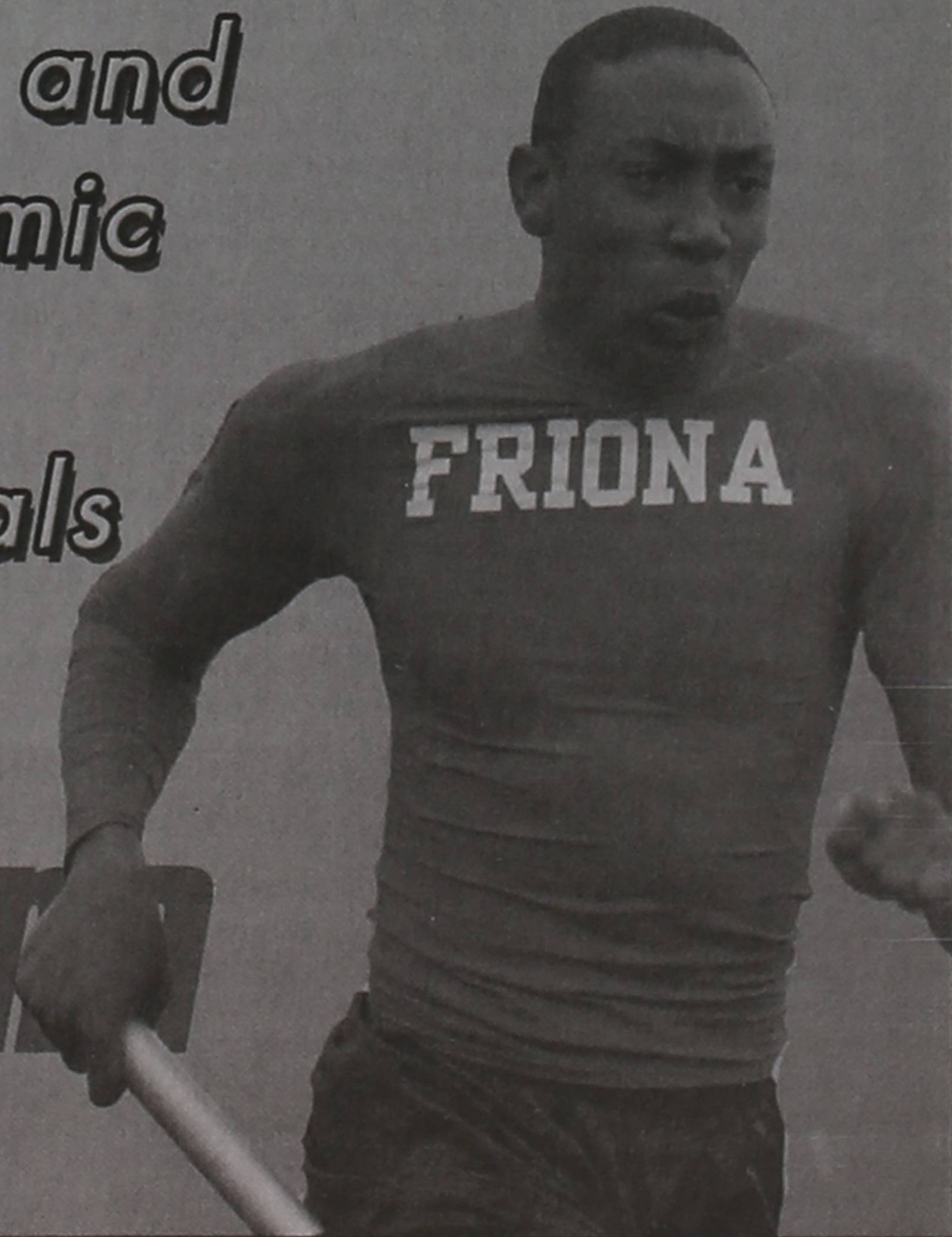

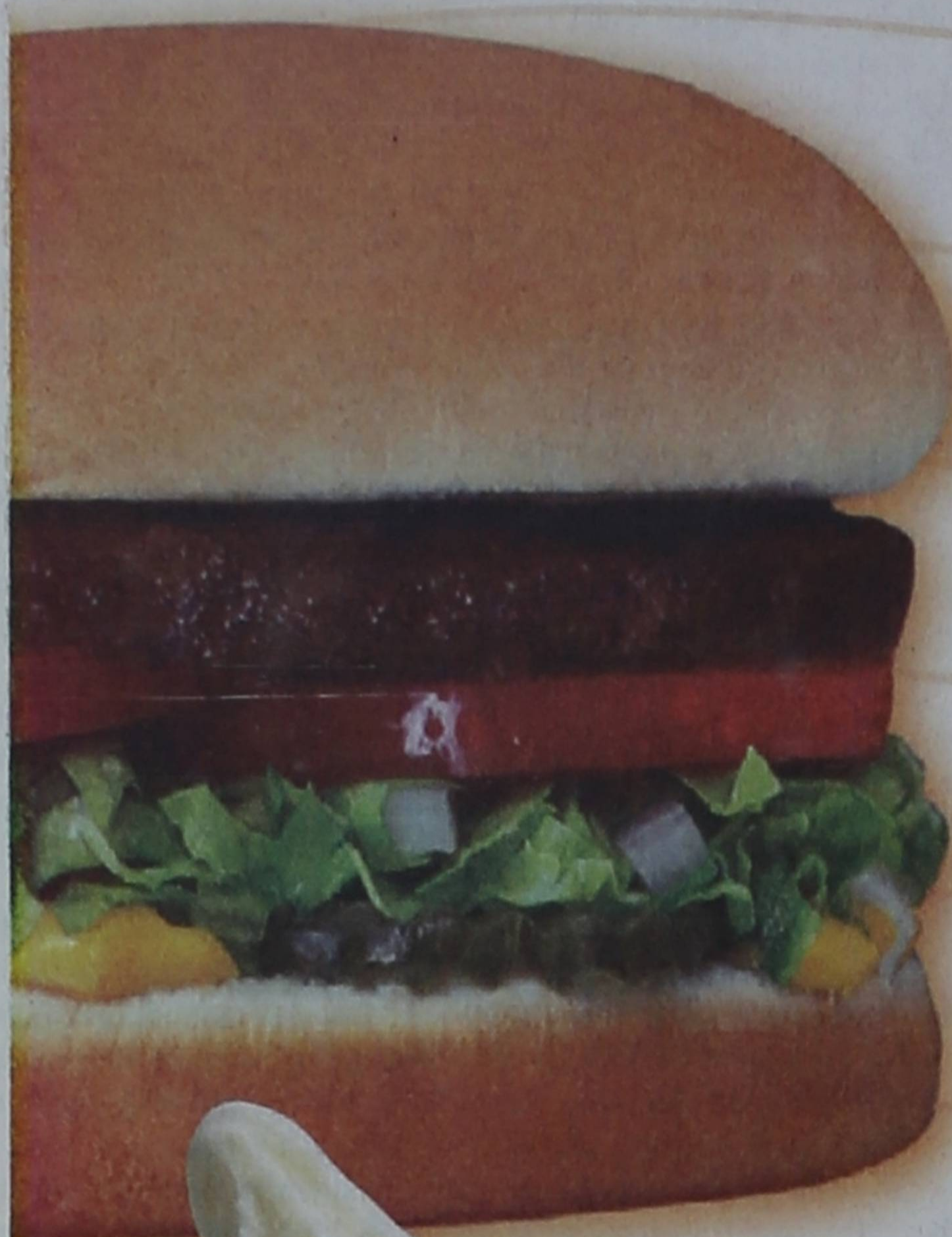
