Almost revival

What does revival look like? As one who has not experienced a time of widespread revival in an area where I have lived, I look to God's word and see many pictures of revival. 1 Samuel 7 gives one a picture of an "almost revival" in the nation of Israel. Things among the people are pitiful, as they are constantly taunted by their enemies, careless about the things of God, and have drifted off into idolatry.

Samuel calls the people to a solemn assembly for a time of confession and repentance of sin. The people seem to have been cut to their hearts because of their ungodliness (v. 6), and are responding to God's demands on them. In fact, while they are having this solemn assembly the evil Philistines show up ready to fight. Instead of scattering scared, God's people cry out to God, and God rescues them by thundering from heaven and putting the Philistines in confusing rage, leading to their defeat.

Things seem to be going great for Israel. People are seemingly repentant and God has rescued them from their enemies. This is "almost a revival", but the missing element is a resolute determination for the people to make lasting change, submitting to the Lord in all areas of life. Their emotionalism died out over time and in the years ahead their desire is not for God as their king, but to enthrone a man over them as their leader, and look to him for hope, instead of God.

Without a stubborn, loving commitment to Jesus Christ, you too may end up flaking out on Jesus, looking only to the winds of emotion for spiritual fervor, as opposed to the promises of God, His purpose for your life, and His power to transform and sustain you year in and year out.

A heart felt thanks goes out to all who said a special prayer, sent flowers, plants, cards, and those who brought goodie-baskets during my lengthy hospital stay. Thank you to all those who came and visited me and my family during this time. Each special thought made every day a bit brighter.

God, my refuge and strength

Psalms 42 is authored by one of the sons of Korah. The beautiful words of vs. 1-2 remind us that as the deer depends upon water, so our lives depend upon God. It's a shame much of humanity is dying of thirst. Life without God is like drought.

The psalmist has an intense yearning for God and making this yearning even greater is the taunting of the ungodly. He says that his tears have been his food day and night.

Tears are sometimes the meat that feeds the soul. Tears can ease a hunger that bread never satisfies.

Then the psalmist reminds himself that praising God will change his heart process, his feelings. Verses 5-6 give us four words that change everything, "Hope, God, Praise, and Remember".

We must place our hope in God and in God alone. We must praise His name for all that He is, and has done, and will do. And we must remember what He has done for us. In other words, "Count Your Blessings!"

"Love others as I have loved you"

(Jesus according to St. John)

Of the 613 Commandments, Jesus summarizes best of all, the foundation that should be at our feet when we walk, when we talk, when we observe, and when we respond. In life, and especially in religion, just how often is this summary followed?

One really doesn't have to be in command of history nor of personal awareness to know that Jesus' summary is not followed very much. Why? Love is so illusive, when we experience it (its power, its overwhelming emotive presence), we instantly turn selfish and cling to the point that the last thing we want to do is to share it.

It's more precious than gold, and we know it. Its power rests not in things we know, things we do or things we stand for, but in simple grace-received. It scares us tremendously, to the point of hoarding; so precious, so powerful, we box it up, and hide it in our hearts and minds deep, deep inside, for fear we are going to have it stolen. I was told once, "The only thing you will ever have in abundance is love, and the only way to get more is to give even more away."
