Parmer County Cancer Coalition Celebration in the Park June 19

The new Parmer County Cancer Coalition (PCCC) is being formed to replace the Relay for Life cancer walk.

A PCCC Celebration in the Park is planned for Saturday, June 19, from 3-8 p.m. Setup begins at 2 p.m. Instead of luminaries, Hope Ribbons will be sold for \$5 to honor cancer survivors and those who have been lost to cancer. The ribbons are in different colors corresponding to the many different types of cancer.

Ribbons will be hung in the trees in the park during opening ceremonies of the Celebration. Ribbons can be purchased

from any team member, the Friona Library, Chamber of Commerce, or from Allison Johnston.

Teams are forming now. Teams will sponsor a cancer survivor and raise awareness of the type of cancer their survivor fought or is fighting. Participant fee is \$25 from each team member. Teams will have campsites in the park. Activities at the campsites are up to each team. They can sell drinks, candy, play games, etc. to raise money.

Several team competitions will be held throughout the evening and the team with the most points will win a prize. There will

be live entertainment and many kid activities planned.

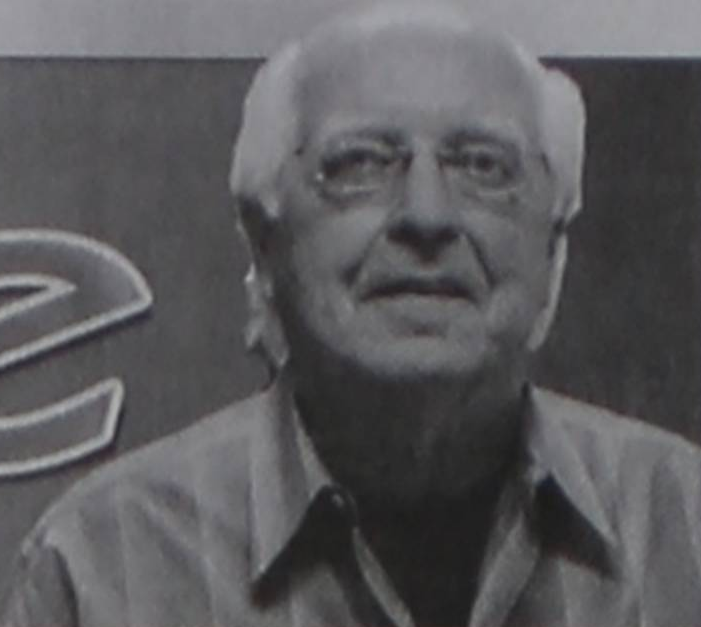

leave Arizona alone

Many proponents of a 21st century constitution seek additional federal oversight of state and local laws.

A lot of smart people study the U.S. Constitution.

There are Constitutional lawyers, professors, teachers and just plain folk who are Constitutional scholars. Many of us hold the Constitution in high respect, like the Flag and the National Anthem.

Then there are the other folks. Those who think the Constitution is outdated. Those who would like to see a 'new 21st century Constitution' diminishing the democratic and representative form of American government.

(At about this point some of you will stop reading. Carr is talking about politics again and he's going to use a lot of big words and besides most political stuff is boring.)

In simpler language then, Arizona passed a law allowing law enforcement to ask people if they are in the country legally. The law does not allow them to stop people willy-nilly for no reason. Yet many are shouting it is all about racial profiling.

It is Arizona's law so the rest of us should just shut up.

Arizona passed the law primarily because the federal government has not done enough to secure the border with Mexico. President Obama has joked about Arizona. Instead of helping them he is casting negative comments about one of the states. I don't think that is the government's purpose. (He doesn't spend much time in Arizona either.)

Even Governor Perry, whose ego continues to blossom, has criticized Arizona's efforts to control the violence caused by illegal immigrants. Hey Guv Perry, people in Arizona have been killed and kidnapped by alleged Mexi-

can gangs, legal or illegal. What if it happened here in Texas? Besides, I thought you liked to backtalk the feds.

So tell me, what was Arizona supposed to do? The governor asked for help from Washington many times but none came. So they forced Obama's hand and he didn't like it. Now he doesn't have an answer to help them except to criticize and make fun.

It amuses and concerns me to see illegal residents and illegal sympathizers gathering on the streets of America to protest our country and our laws. "We are here so what are you going to do about it?"

Here's what I think. They say there are 12 million illegal Mexicans living in America. They say it is not possible to round them all up and send them home. It is apparently not possible to stop more of them from coming here either.

So let's speed up the process and make them all legal U.S. citizens. They are here anyway. Why shouldn't they enjoy the right to pay taxes, buy car and health insurance, have mortgage payments, pay for braces, try to send their kids to college, save for retirement, pay social security taxes, and generally live like the rest of us Americans.

There isn't any other an-

swer. Either let them continue to live and work here illegally, or make them legal citizens so the government can confiscate more of their dough. If you have a different solution I would like to hear it.

The truth is there will never be immigration reform. In D.C. they like to talk about it but they have no idea what it is or what to do about it. It would be political suicide to pass a law granting amnesty to the illegal population. Yet that seems to be the only logical answer.

Politicians like to hear themselves talk. For the most part, as we like to say out here, they are all hat and no cattle. As Judge Markman said above, many uninformed Americans want the federal government to take over more state and local laws by forming a 21st century Constitution.

That is a serious consequence for the future of our kids and grandkids. The sovereign state of Arizona decided to take back some of that power from Washington. Hell yes, good for them. They should be supported, not chastised and criticized.

On the other hand, I've been to Mexico many times and I wouldn't want to live there either. I'd rather go eat at Leal's.

A tasty popover treat

Do you have an ovenproof skillet? You'll need one for this breakfast treat. And don't forget when you put a skillet in the oven the handle will be hot.

Jill Melton, an editor at Relish magazine, calls these magical skillet pancakes a "Dutch Baby". Eggs, flour, and milk combine to form a bubbly, puffy pancake. She calls them Jill's Puffy Pancake but you could use your own name.

She says let the eggs sit at room temperature for 10 minutes before making the pancake and have plenty of lemons on hand. Any recipe that starts off with butter is going to be a favorite of mine. The recipe doesn't mention syrup so guess that is optional.

Jill's Puffy Pancake

Serves 4

- 2 tbsp butter
- 1/2 cup 2% milk
- 1/2 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 tbsp butter softened
- pinch nutmeg
- lemon wedges
- powdered sugar (optional)
- fresh berries (optional)

- Preheat oven to 425.
- Melt 2 tbsp butter in 10-inch ovenproof skillet over medium heat, tilting to coat bottom and sides of pan.
- Whisk together milk, flour, sugar, eggs, softened butter, and nutmeg in bowl. Pour into skillet. Cook one minute.
- Place pan in oven and bake 12-15 minutes, until puffed and golden. Squeeze lemon over top and sprinkle with powdered sugar and fresh berries. Cut pancakes in pan and serve immediately with a spatula.

The Texas Elementary Principals and Supervisors Association (TEPSA) named Christina Woods of Friona Elementary the District 16 Assistant Principal of the Year.

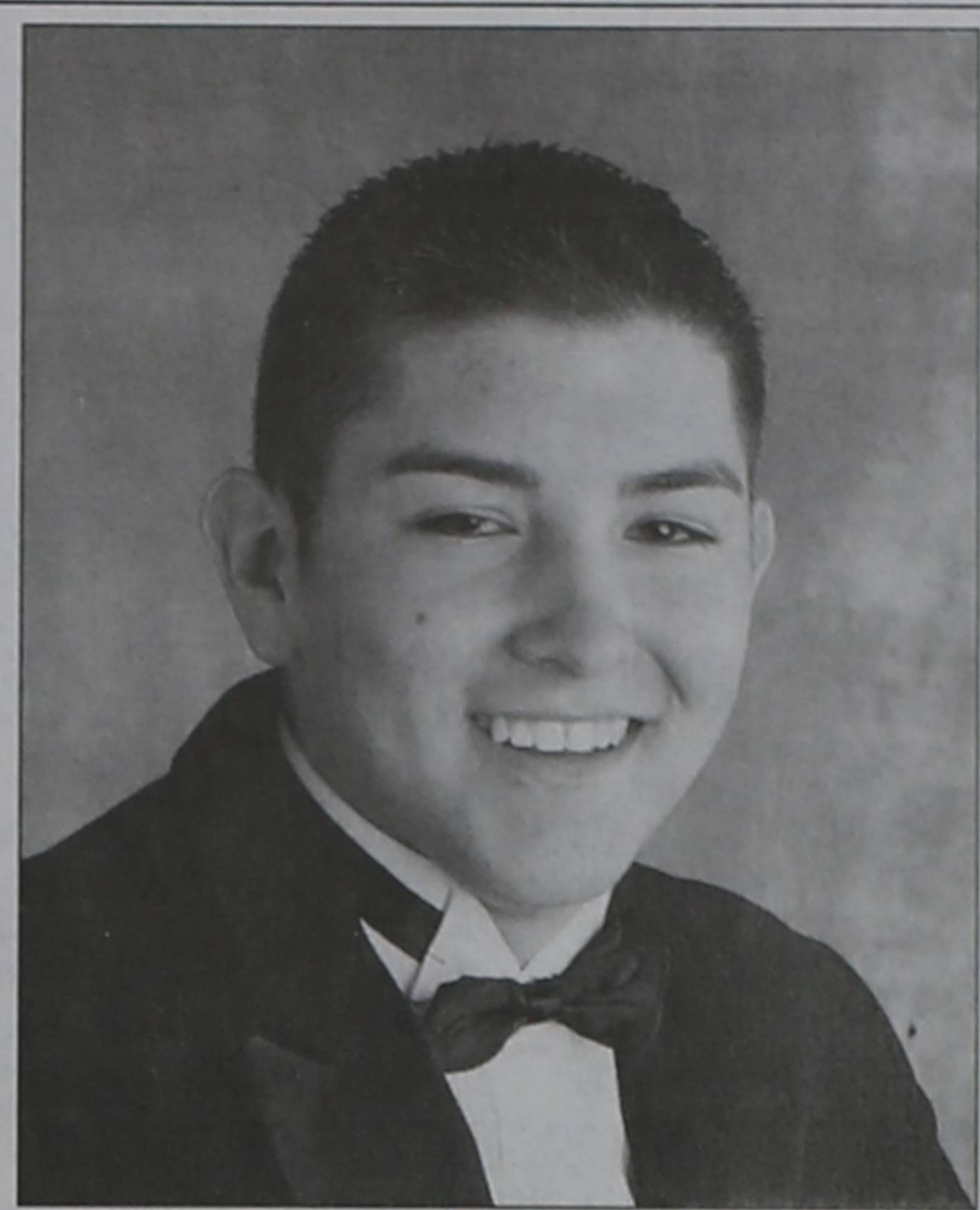

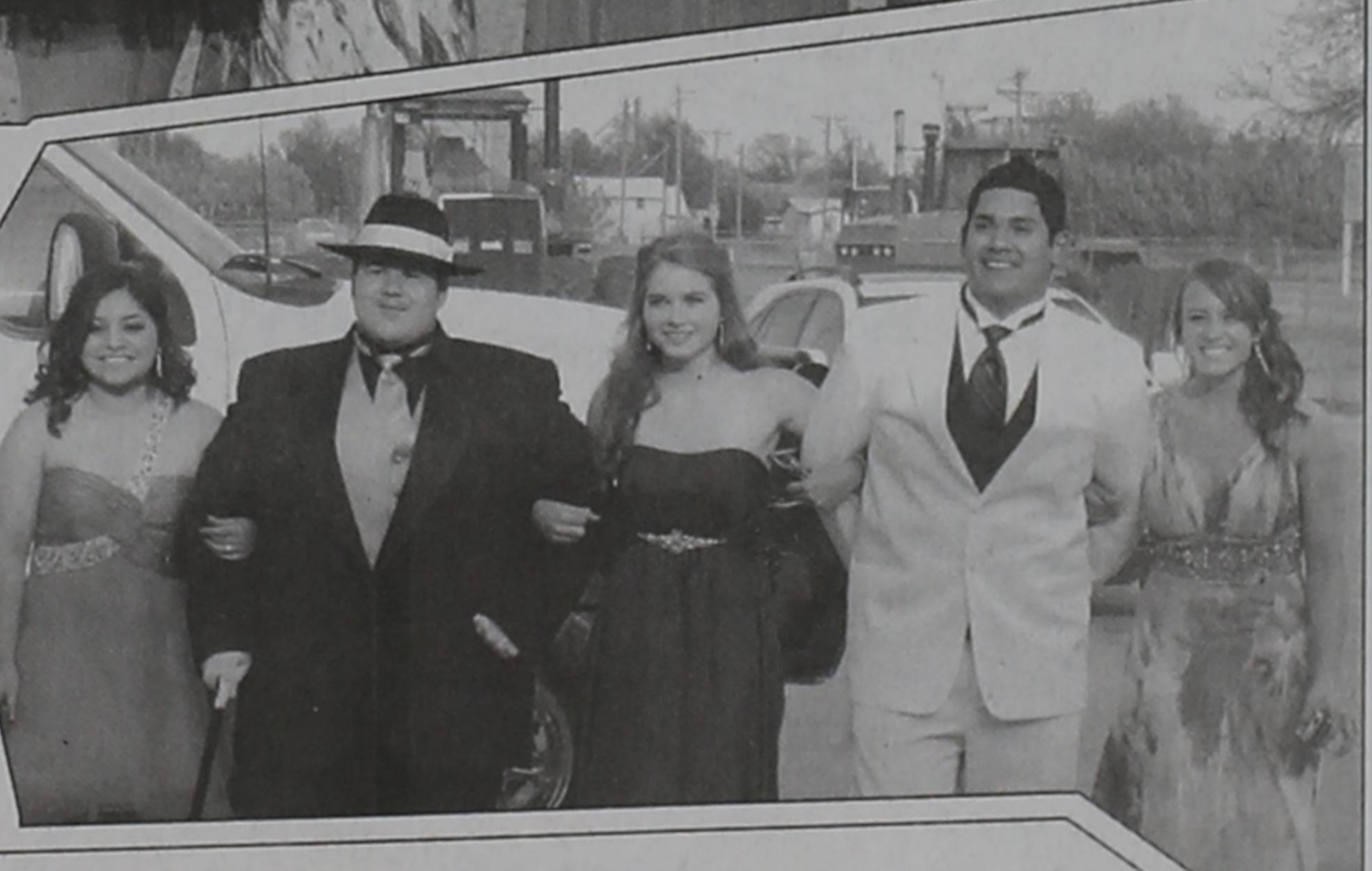

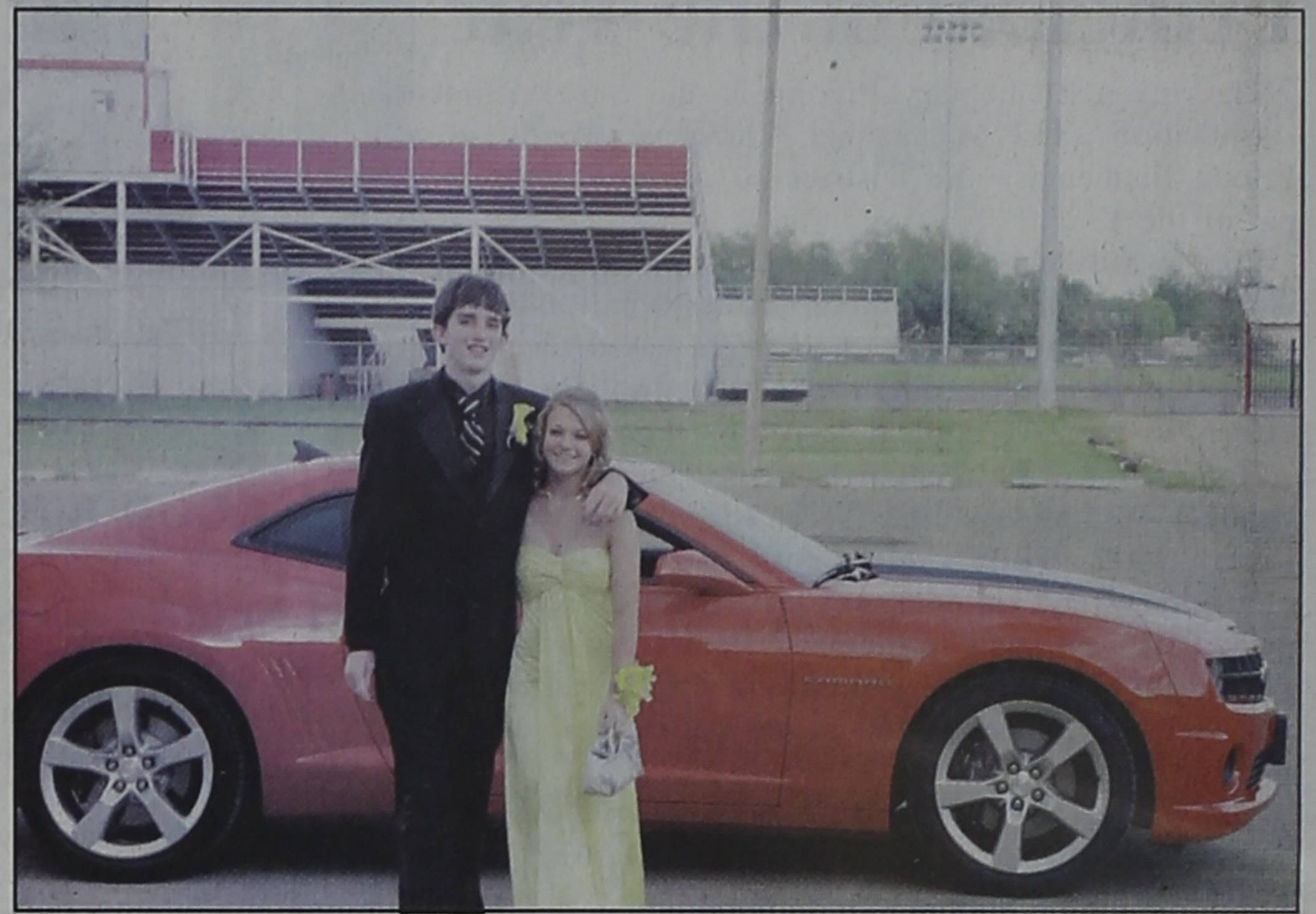
