
I guess what I don't understand is why you put one picture on the front page and another on page eight.





1 can GRANDS biscuits (not flaky) cut into fourths. 8 eggs beaten


1 lb sausage, cooked & drained (spicy or regular, your taste)

1 pkg fajita seasoning


2 cups grated cheese






Ranch Rodeo in Amarillo June 4-5

FSA loans for the disadvantaged

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) allocates a portion of its farm loan program funds specifically for socially disadvantaged applicants (SDA) including minority and women producers.

"FSA farm loans are available to all qualified applicants, but by setting aside funds specifically for minorities and women, the Agency ensures members of these specific groups can receive a portion of available funds-assuming they meet FSA loan eligibility requirements," said Thomas S. Taylor, Farm Loan Manager for Parmer County FSA.

"Applicants requesting direct real estate loans should be aware that funding for this purpose is limited and may require a waiting period before funds are available and applications approved," said Taylor.

FSA guaranteed loans are made by banks or other commercial lenders and are guaranteed by FSA for up to 90 percent of any loss. The guaranteed loan program includes both operating and real estate loan programs.
