Friona volunteer firemen will manage the fireworks show which will be set up at

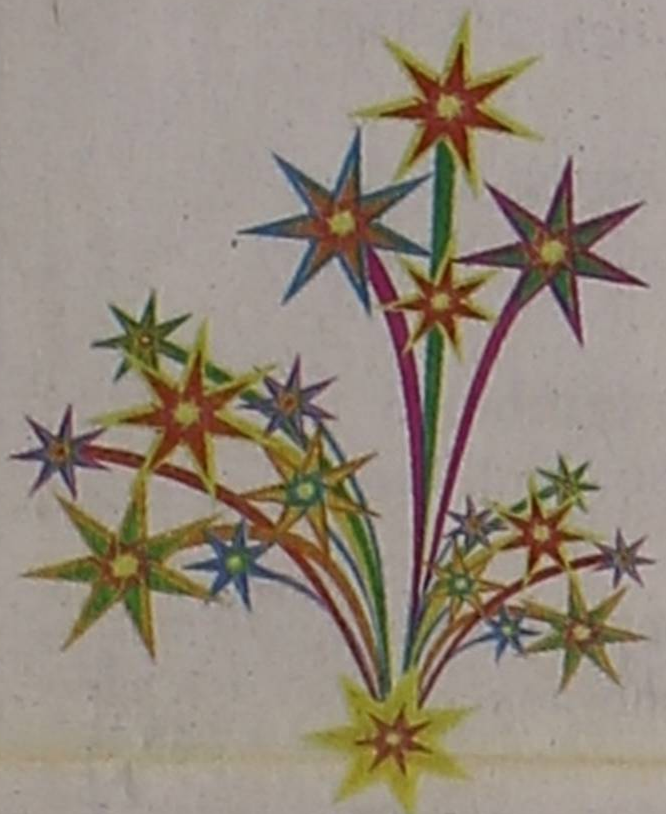
the north end of the field and begin at dusk, some time between 9:30 and 10 p.m.

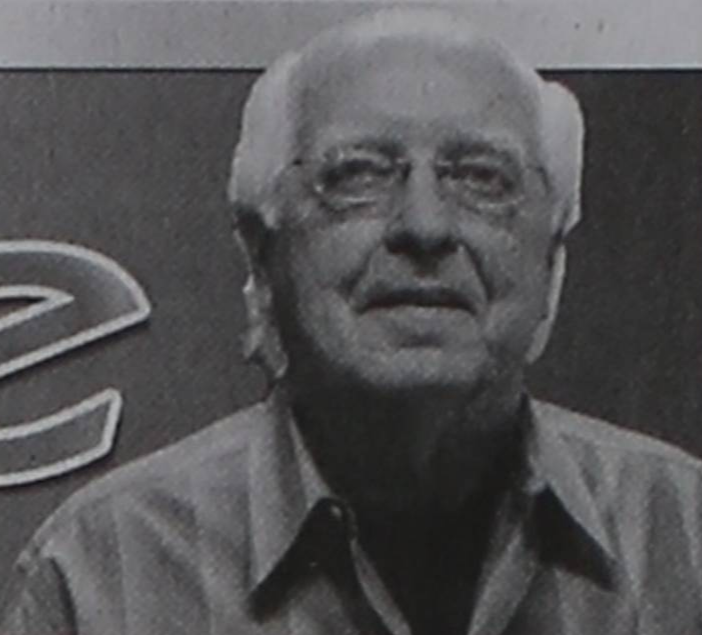

## dealing with the paperwork

Last week I visited a dermatologist in Amarillo. Since it was my first visit I had to fill out the obligatory new-patient paperwork.

My mother had been to the same doctor about a month earlier. I asked her to make an appointment for me while she was there. They sent the paperwork home for me to fill out ahead of time. At least I avoided the 'clipboard with the pen attached, fill this out in the waiting room' experience.

I even copied my driver license and Medicare card in advance. They always ask you for those too. I arrived with paperwork in hand 15 minutes early as requested.

In spite of some hard-living years, I have arrived at this point in life 70 years later being blessed with better than average health. I have not had any serious ailments (knock on wood). No recent hospital stays, not many doctor visits. Nor do I take any regular prescribed medications. The most I take are a couple of Aleve or Ibuprofen as needed for old-age aches.

So when I get to that long list of "have you ever had any of the following" I usually skip down it checking the "No" box. Same for the "list medications currently taking". I like to put a big N/A in that section for not applicable.

The kind lady at the desk looked over my paperwork then looked over her glasses at me. "You are not taking any medications?" she asked

in disbelief. All older folks are supposed to take copious quantities of pills and elixirs.

Continuing to peer at me she said, "Are you allergic to any medications?" I couldn't resist the impulse: "I don't know. I haven't taken most of them." Her look said 'not funny'. We moved on.

Doctor waiting rooms always seem to have a TV up near the ceiling, tuned in to Fox News, with the sound muted so as not to disturb you while you are trying to remember when you last had an operation and what it was for.

One part of the paperwork really intrigued me. It was the marital status, listed as S M W D. Single, married, widowed, divorced. Maybe a doctor's office wants that information to calculate their chances that you can pay the bill.

Maybe they have forgotten it is still on the form. I doubt they ever look at it. Or do they? I'm divorced but am I not also single? Do they treat someone that checks widowed more gently than a divorcee?

## Is this meatloaf in disguise?

Another recipe from the Bovina Baptist Church cookbook, The Fruit of the Spirit, published back in 2003. Recipes were submitted from area residents.

This one, appropriately named Ona's Baptist Meat Balls, was submitted by the late Ona Patterson. I'm not much of a gourmet cook but it appears this might be meat loaf disguised in balls since it doesn't say anything about spaghetti.

### Ona's Baptist Meat Balls

- 3 lbs hamburger meat
- 2 eggs
- 2 cups oatmeal
- 1 can evaporated milk (large)
- 1 cup chopped onion
- 1/2 tsp chopped garlic
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1/2 tsp pepper
- 1 tsp chili powder

Mix and make into balls. Place into pans.

- 2 cup catsup
- 2 cup brown sugar
- 1 tbsp liquid smoke
- 1/2 tsp garlic salt
- 1/2 cup chopped onion

Mix and pour over meatballs. Bake at 350 for 1 hour.

3. As soon as the line becomes available, your telephone will ring with a different ringing pattern to alert you. Simply pick up the phone, and the number that was busy earlier will be ringing.

**To turn off repeat dialing:**  
 If at any time after you have dialed \*66, you decide you don't want to call the busy number back, pick up the phone and dial \*86 to cancel your request.

**PUBLIC COMMENT / PUBLIC MEETING.** You may submit public comments or request a public meeting on this application. The purpose of a public meeting is to provide the opportunity to submit comments or to ask questions about the application. TCEQ will hold a public meeting if the Executive Director determines that there is a significant degree of public interest in the application or if requested by a local legislator. A public meeting is not a contested case hearing.

**OPPORTUNITY FOR A CONTESTED CASE HEARING.** After the deadline for submitting public comments, the Executive Director will consider all timely comments and prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. **CRP news from Parmer Farmer**

Information from the June 2010 issue of the Parmer Farmer newsletter concerning managed haying/grazing of CRP.

The managed grazing for Parmer County is effective now through September 30, 2010. Managed haying is authorized July 2, 2010, through September 30, 2010. Only one cutting of hay is allowed. Hay may not be stored on any CRP acreage. Hay harvested under managed provisions may be sold.

Before haying or grazing, CRP participants: 1) shall request approval to hay or graze eligible acreage, 2) obtain a modified conservation plan to include haying or grazing requirements as determined by NRCS, 3) shall not hay and graze the same acreage, 4) shall be assessed a payment reduction based on the number of acres actually hayed or grazed times the CRP annual rental payment times 25%, 5) receive approval from the county committee.

Participants who hay or graze CRP acreage without approval, or fail to follow these provisions, will be subject to

non-compliance provisions and penalties. Cattle must be removed by September 30, 2010 and hay must be removed by October 9, 2010. These dates will not be extended.

You are required to control weeds and maintain a good grass stand on your CRP acreage. You may not store any equipment, hay bales, or any other object on your CRP ground at any time during the contract period.

You are only allowed to hay or graze CRP during the managed haying/grazing season. Failure to do any of the above is a violation of your contract. Any violation means you will be assessed penalties which could include termination of your CRP contract. The CRP contract is a binding contract and you are responsible to abide by all rules.
