## Primary school summer camp Tuesday July 17

Students that were in Pre-K, kindergarten, or 1<sup>st</sup> grade last school year are invited to attend a summer camp Tuesday July 27, from 8 a.m. to 12 noon. The camp location is in the Early Childhood Center at 8<sup>th</sup> and Euclid south of the primary school building.

The camp theme is Nursery Rhymes and Fun Times. Students will learn to tie shoes, jump rope, and will act out nursery rhymes. All students will receive several books to take home.

## Silage workshop in Farwell Jul 28

A silage and forage workshop will be held at the Farwell Community Center July 28 at 10 a.m. The meeting is open to all. One TDA CEU will be offered. Lunch will be served following the meeting.

County Extension Agent Benji Henderson says silage continues to be a very valuable commodity for Farmer and surrounding counties. "Silage is an intricate ingredient for many of the feed rations at local dairies and feedyards," Henderson said.

It is a major crop for area producers. The workshop will include pest management by Monty Vandiver. Dr. Mark Marsalis, extension agronomy specialist, will discuss topics in silage production whether sorghum, corn, or small grains.

## Commissioners get positive audit report

Parmer County Commissioners heard the annual audit report from Kirkland and Kirkland CPA at their Monday, July 12 meeting.

The firm reported the county's revenues exceeded expenses by \$845,052 during the past fiscal year. The overage increases the county's combined fund balances to \$3,603, 225. Kirkland has previously recommended the county maintain a surplus of at least \$1.5 million.

The county tax rate will not be deter-

mined until August when commissioners meet with Parmer County Tax Appraiser Curby Brantley. Last year's rate was 0.4859 cents per \$100 valuation.

In other business the commissioners renewed the \$10 road and bridge fee for each vehicle registered in the county; continued to use the Blue Choice health insurance plan for county employees; and decided not to stripe and put in handicap markings for the jail and the north and south courthouse parking lots this year.

Head cooks Ashlee Roberts of Friona and her friend Tawnie Mullins of Hereford won over the judges with a simple recipe of cream cheese and jalapenos mixed in the burger patties. First place prize was \$500 and a nice trophy.

The First Baptist Church Young Adults took second place (\$300) and the Choate family, Stormi and Brent, were third place winners (\$100). Friona State Bank's team was the People's Choice winner.

A total of 13 teams were entered in the annual cook-off. Each team submitted two cheeseburgers to judges who were cloistered in the Old Depot.

In addition to the cook teams, many other vendors were present around the park. The Noon Lions Club turned 400 pounds of potatoes into French fries and sold out by 2:30 p.m. Dr. Bob Alexander was on stage (actually a flat bed trailer) as the resident DJ and master of ceremonies with music and announcements throughout the day.

There were numerous out of town visitors attending the cook-off, including Rick Vanderpool from Athens, Texas. Athens bills itself as the "Home of the Original Hamburger". (See Vanderpool's letter to the editor on page two.) Many other families who were in town for the summer drama workshop productions had the opportunity to attend the "cheesy" activities.

Hats off to the Chamber of Commerce employees and board of directors and all of the volunteers and vendors and cook teams for another successful Cheeseburger Cook-Off here in the Cheeseburger Capital of Texas.

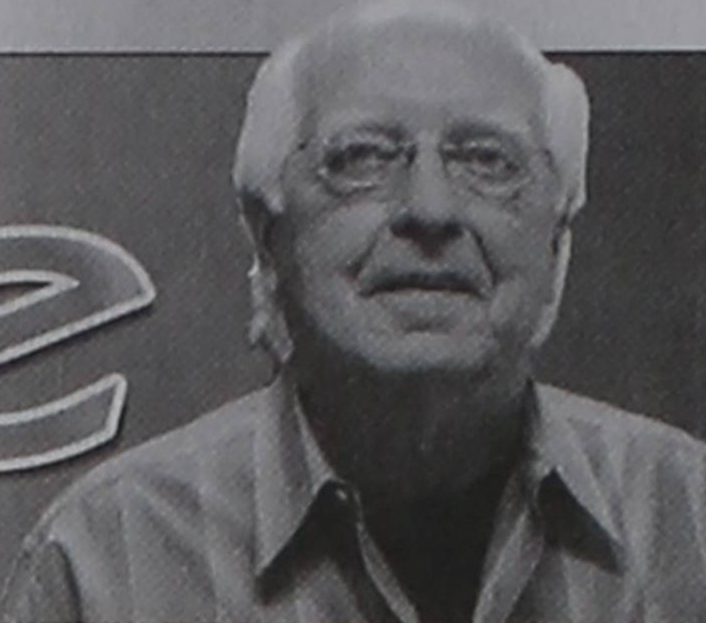

Another casserole from the Bovina First Baptist Fruit of the Spirit cookbook.

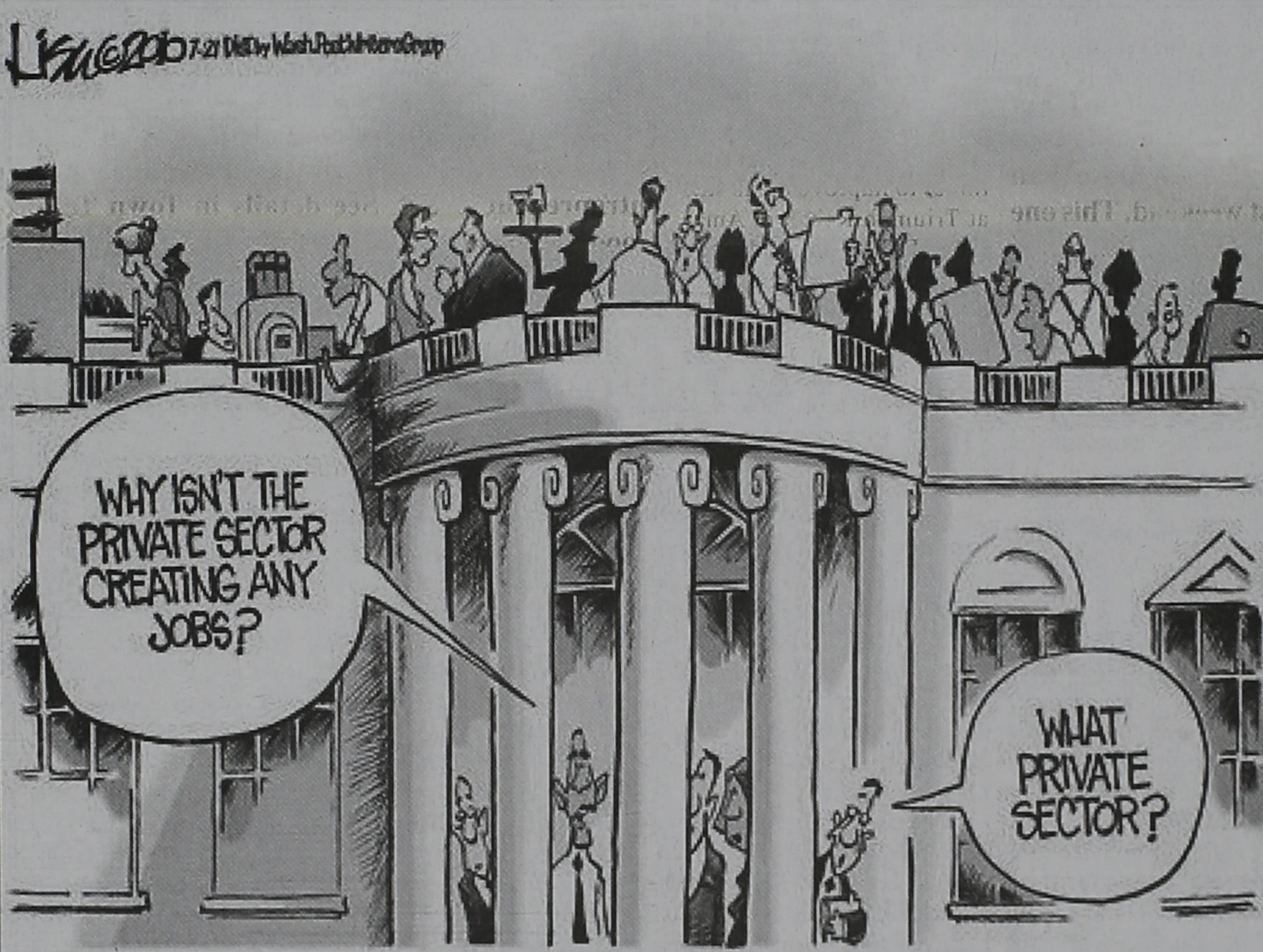

### Tater Tot Casserole

- 1 lb hamburger
- 1/4 cup chopped onion
- 1 can mushroom soup
- 1 pkg tater tots (sm size)
- grated cheddar cheese

Saute hamburger with onion, season and drain. Put meat on bottom of 9x13 pan. Mix cream of mushroom soup with one can of water and pour over the meat. Sprinkle a layer of shredded cheddar cheese over the meat and top with a layer of tater tots. Bake at 325 for 45 to 50 minutes.

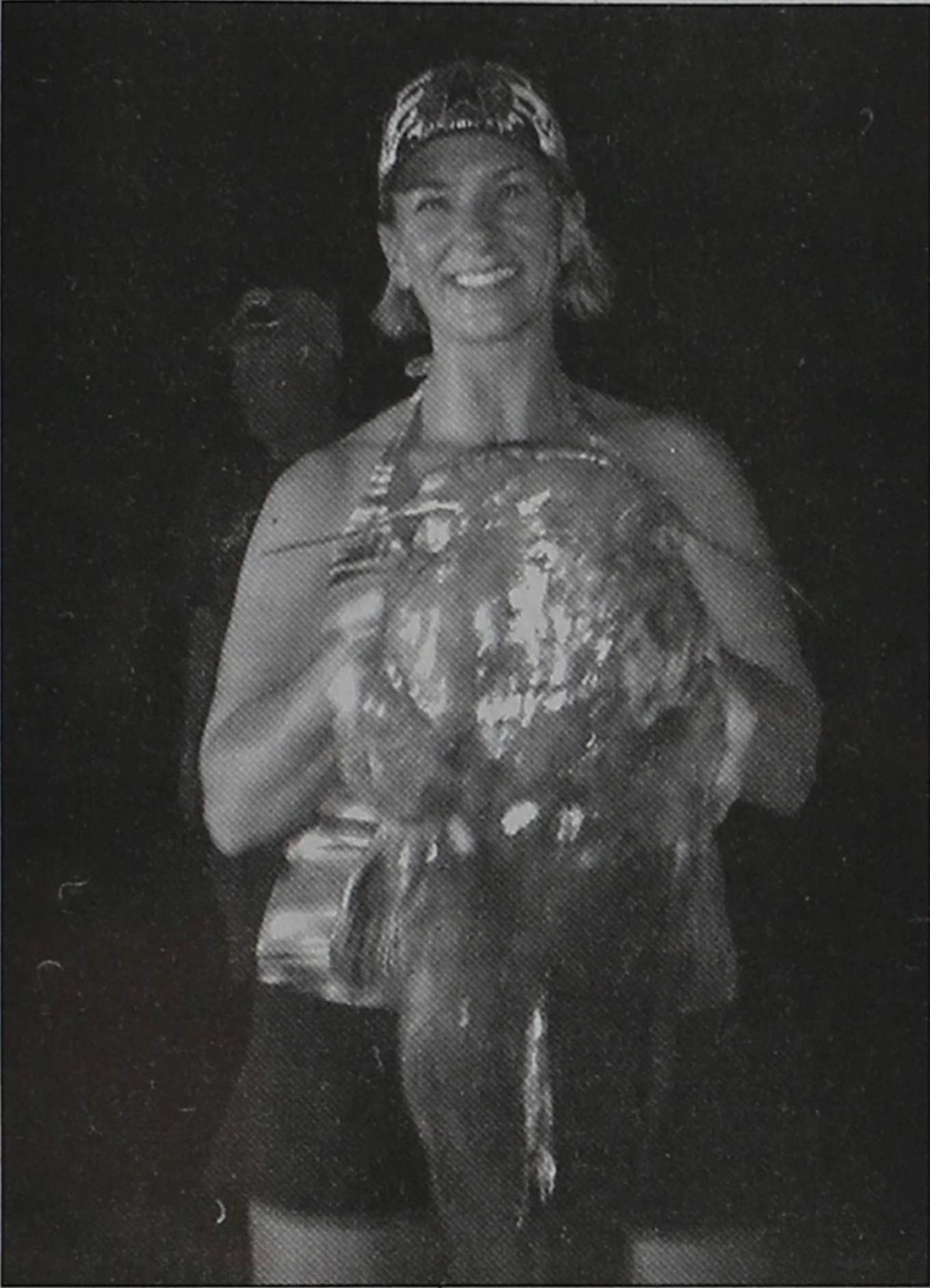
surgery and more surgery planned at Northwest in Amarillo.

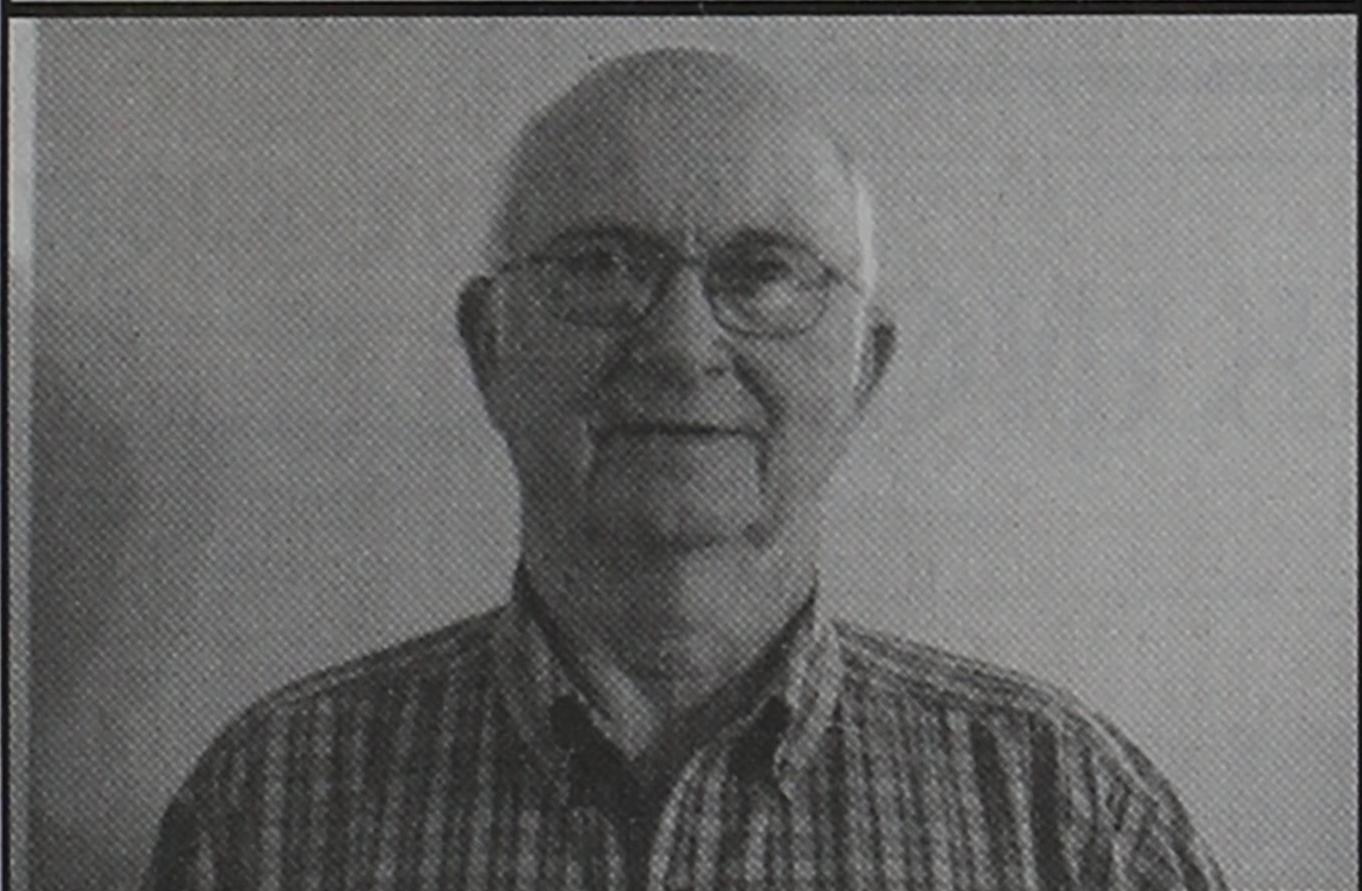


Dana Campbell and her family caught more than 200 catfish at Lake Texoma last weekend. This one weighs about 45 pounds.

# Calvary Baptist Church: The first 50 years

(On July 10-11, 2010, Calvary Baptist Church celebrated its 50th anniversary. The following history was submitted by the church.)

In October 1958 Friona's First Baptist Church elected a committee to bring recommendations about starting a mission. In January 1959 First Baptist Church purchased a 3.99 acre tract of land in the north part of Friona to build a mission when the money became available.

In May 1960 it was decided to start a mission without a building. June 12 was to be the first service for the new mission. It would be held on the upper floor of the American Legion Building on 7th St. across from the city park. Sunday and Wednesday services would be provided.

On June 12, 1960, there were 89 people in attendance for Sunday School and 64 for Training Union. By June 26 Sunday School attendance had increased to 118 and Training Union to 100.

July 1960 brought some major changes. A building was purchased from the First Baptist Church of Bovina. The building was moved to the 3.99 acre site on North Cleveland Street and deeded to Calvary Baptist Church. This name was chosen and the word "mission" was dropped.

Members of the first building committee were W.S. (Red) Crow, Bill Sheehan, and Douglas Connley. The first officers were Thelma Jones, clerk; W.S. Crow, treasurer; Douglas Connley, Sunday School director; J.P. Sims, Training Union director; Herbert Day, Brother Hood director; Naomi Stephens,

WMU director; Cayson Jones, music director; Ruby Howell, pianist; Sam Bailey, O.C. Rhodes, and Bill Stephens, ushers.

On July 14, 1960, a service was held at Friona's First Baptist Church, organizing Calvary Baptist Mission to Calvary Baptist Church with 72 charter members. The church continued to meet in the Legion hall. W.S. Crow was the first deacon to serve Calvary Baptist Church.

The first service in Calvary Baptist's new building was held August 21, 1960. It was immediately recognized that more space was needed for classrooms. The first wing was dedicated February 19, 1961. At the time Sunday School attendance was 218 and Training Union was 123. There were 179 resident members on October 1, 1961.

Where once wheat had grown and cattle had grazed, a symbol of Christian prayer and dedication now stood.

More parking space was needed near the auditorium. Five men on the building committee bought the one-half block of property across Cleveland Street east of the church. This property was later donated to the church by the five men: V.M. Ferguson, H.A. Hyde, Sam Bailey, Ray Castleberry, and Elroy Wilson.

There was still a need for more Sunday School rooms and office space. A new wing was dedicated February 24, 1963. This was the third major building program for the church in its first three years. The new building provided 4,000 square feet and housed the beginner, three primary, a

junior, and youth departments, the church office, and pastor's study. The record attendance for the young church stood at 254 in 1963.

Johnny Brand and J.W. Bradshaw were employed to do the carpenter work but much of the labor was provided by men and women volunteers. The building committee that directed the new addition included Elroy Wilson, chairman; Sam Bailey, V.M. Ferguson, H.A. Hyde, Ray Castleberry, Marvin Jordan, and Ruben Taylor.

In 1965 Calvary Baptist Church purchased the old bank building at the corner of 5th and Main for the African American congregation to have a place to worship. During the time that Brother R. C. Hester was in Friona the mission asked to be organized into a church and Calvary Baptist helped thme accomplish their goal. This mission became St. Esther's Baptist Church.

The church property was annexed into the city in March 1987. While Brother Rogers was at Calvary, St. Esther's needed to be repaired and remodeled but it was necessary for them to own the property in order to make the repairs. In 1980 the property was given to St. Esther's. The condition of the building deteriorated in later years and has since been torn down.

In 1987, twenty four years later, Calvary's new auditorium was completed. The first service was held in the new auditorium August 2, 1987. The new auditorium was officially dedicated September 13, 1987.

In August 1999 the church

voted to to tear down the back part of the old building due to structural damage. The old auditorium was remodeled and turned into the current Fellowship Hall with a kitchen and restrooms. The renovations were done on a 'pay as you go' basis. Money was donated while the roof, metal siding, and interior were being done.

There were many hours of volunteer service dedicated to this major project. The Lord truly blessed this work. When everything was completed the bank account had not been affected at all. Calvary Baptist had a beautiful Fellowship Hall and did not owe for anything. The dedication for the Fellowship Hall was Easter Sunday, April 23, 2000, with the community invited to an early service and breakfast.

In September 2007 the church parking lot was paved, new concrete sidewalks were poured, and a covered portico was constructed on the front of the auditorium. In August 1974 the church bought a house at 905 Columbia to be used as a parsonage. This house was later sold and another purchased at 1124 Etta on September 5, 1984.

A scholarship fund in memory of J.P. Sims was established in 2002. Scholarships were given to graduating seniors through 2009.

The first organ, originally donated to the church, was replaced in 2008 with two new electronic Clavianovas.

The first baptisms held at Calvary Baptist were Risa Howell and Milton Carlton. The first baptisms in the new auditorium were Alicia Smith, Tisha Brown, and Brian Brown. There have been 797 baptisms at Calvary Baptist Church. The first wedding in the new building was Denise Bynum and Jeff Parker on August 23, 1987.

Over the years the church has included a puppet ministry, bus ministry, annual Thanksgiving-Christmas suppers, community Easter Egg hunts, Trunk or Treat on Halloween, Wise Men visits to homes, and the monthly "Feed My Sheep" ministry. The Thanksgiving-

Christmas suppers have been held each year since 1961.

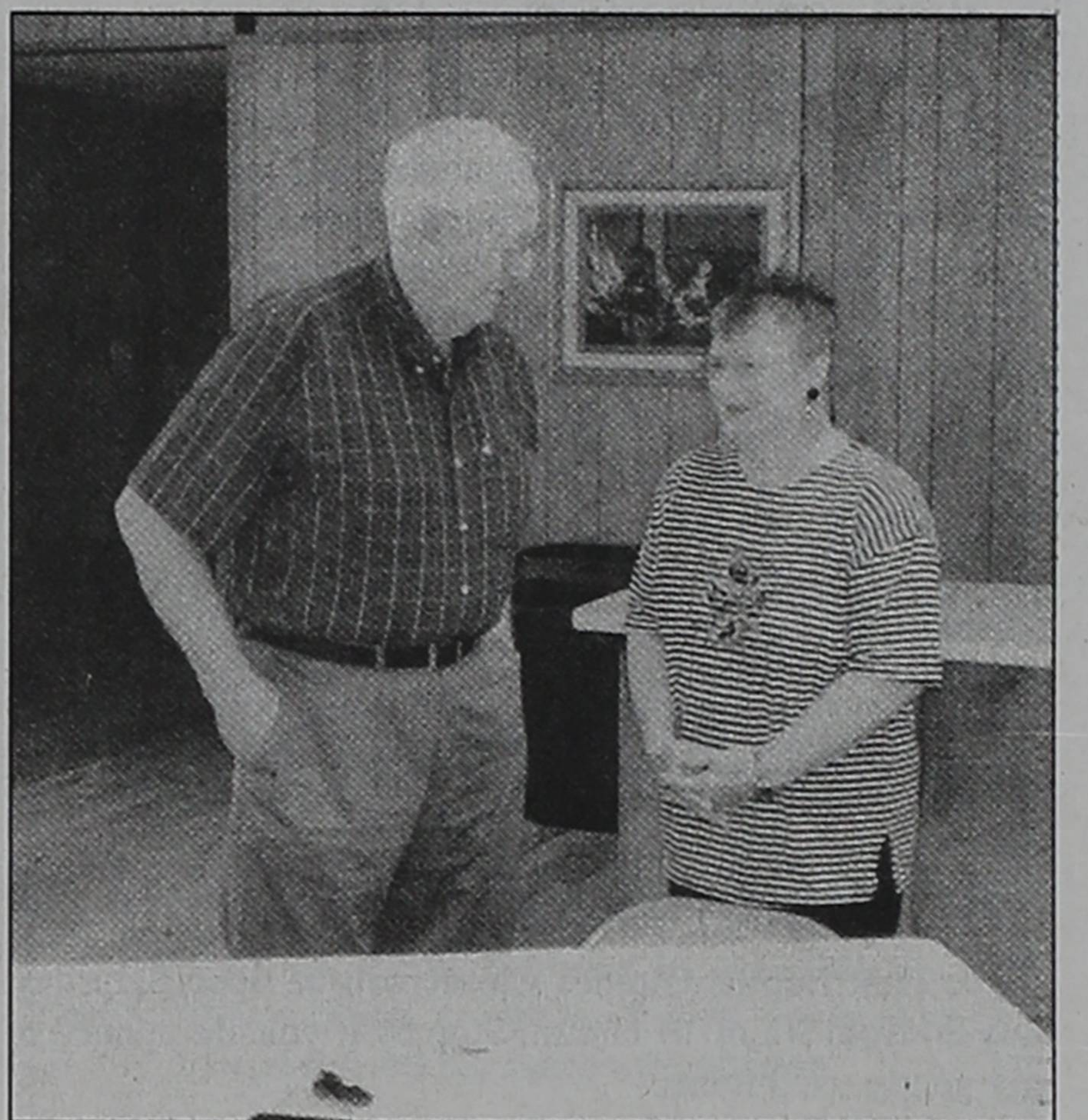
The church has also served as the polling place for Parmer County Precinct 201 since 1982.

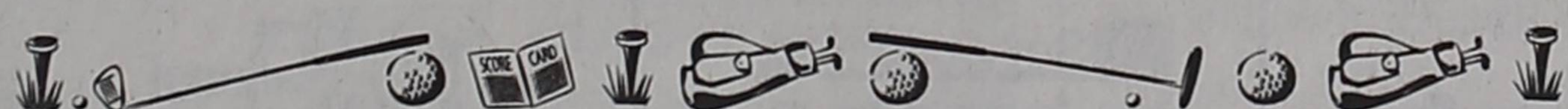

# Budget woes cause AgriLife job losses

Officials have completed the difficult task of notifying employees whose jobs with the Texas AgriLife Extension Service will end between now and October 31.

The personnel cutback affects 94 jobs - 31 vacant positions that will not be filled and 63 occupied positions that will be eliminated agency-wide. The downsizing results from a 5 percent state budget reduction, according to Dr. Ed Smith, AgriLife Extension director. Leaders of the state agency, which has offices in 250 Texas counties, said their decisions were based on maintaining core programs statewide. AgriLife Extension is part of a national community-based adult and youth education system.

"We delayed restructuring as long as we could, because we hoped that economic conditions would improve," said Smith. "But that has not happened and we regret that we have to take these steps." One-fourth of the staffing cut is at the agency's College Station headquarters. The rest is throughout Texas.

"To keep positions strategically distributed, we will refill some vacancies," said Kyle Smith, AgriLife Extension executive associate director. "So displaced personnel may find other internal job opportunities." He stressed that the agency has long maintained a presence in each county. That will continue.

"Counties currently being served by a single extension agent or through a shared position will not be impacted by the new staffing plan," said Darrell Dromgoole, AgriLife Extension associate director for county programs. "We looked most closely at counties where we had three or more positions, especially if more than one employee supported the same subject matter," said Dromgoole.

Dromgoole said all county Extension personnel contribute to 4-H, AgriLife Extension's youth program, and will share full responsibility for that program where needed. "Youth programming remains a strong emphasis of our agency," he said.

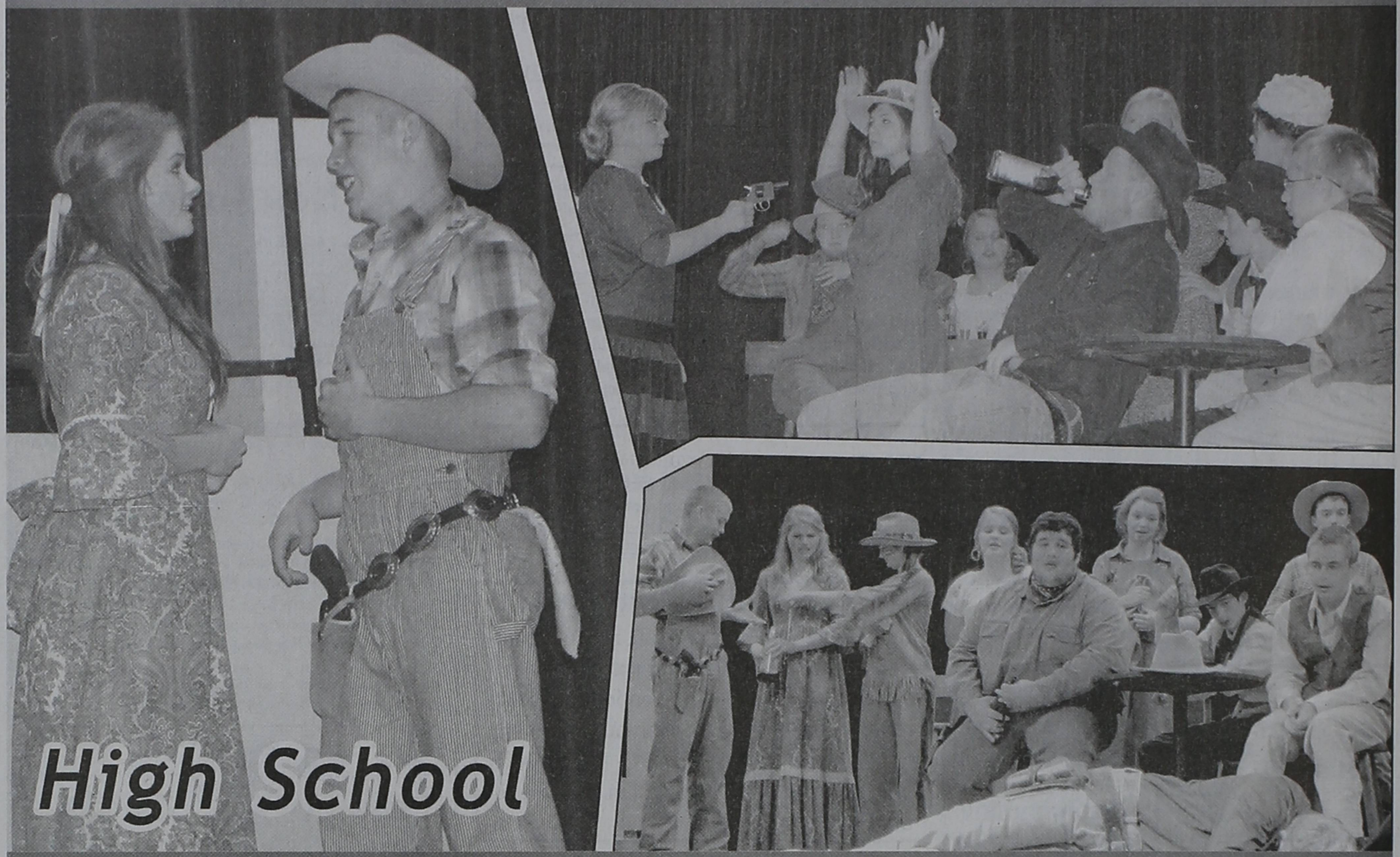

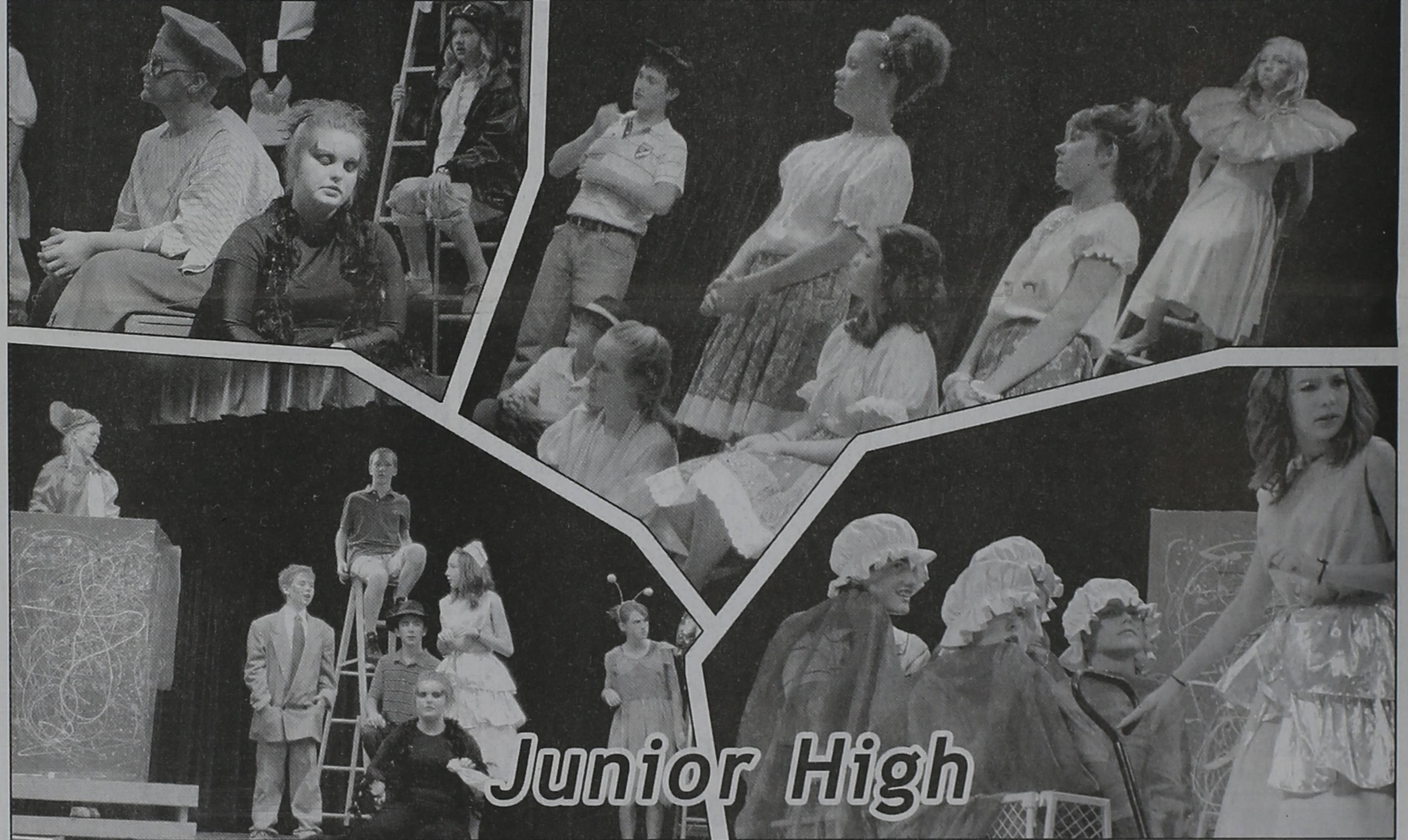

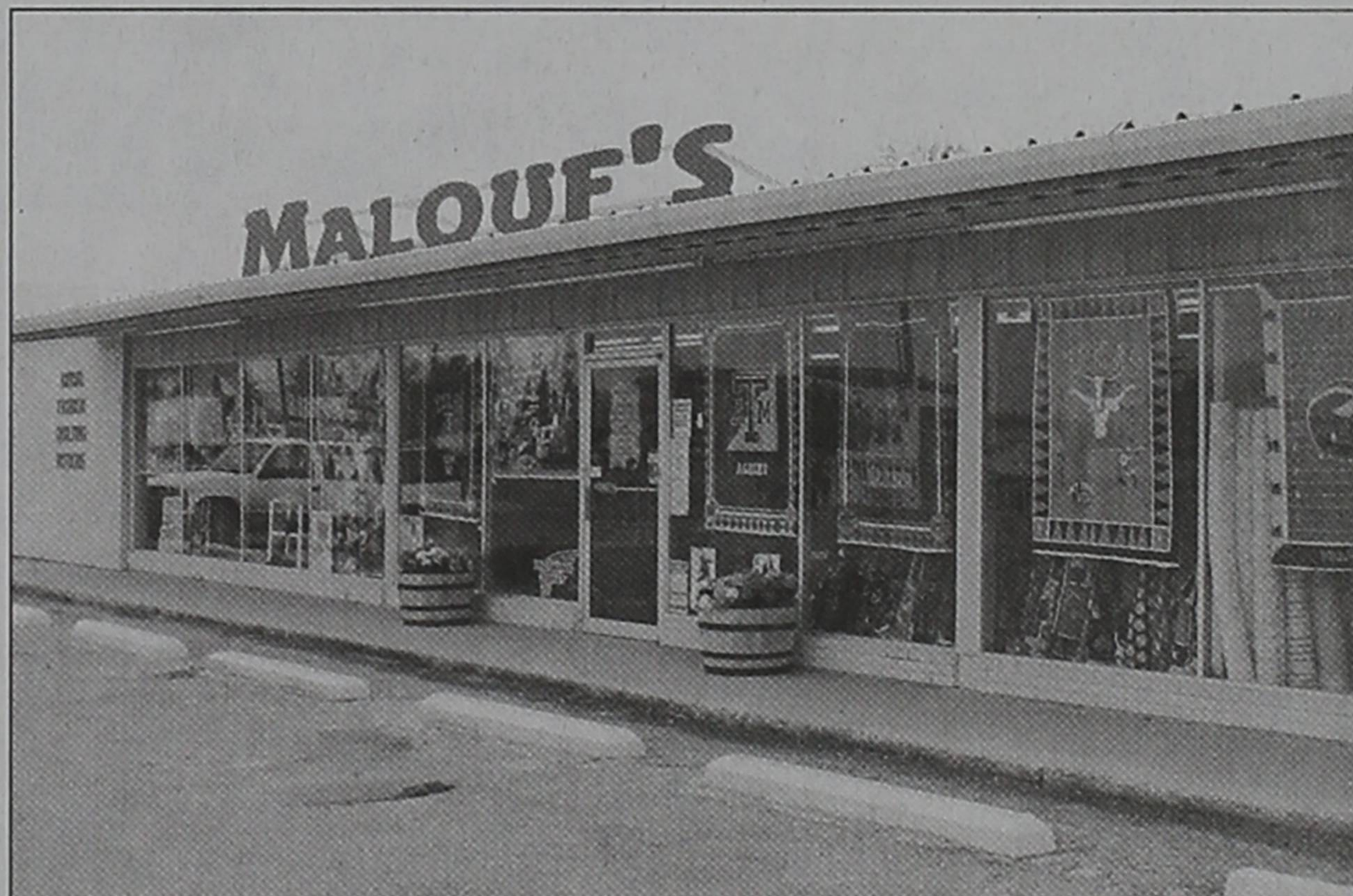

### BUSINESS OF THE MONTH



The Friona Chamber of Commerce and Agriculture kicked off its "Shop Smart - Shop Local" campaign this month. Her continued focus on her father's Old World ideas of superior customer service and providing the best price possible has grown Malouf's Fabrics into the "largest full-line fabric store in the Southwest". Fabric from her store reaches customers throughout the United States and into several countries. Through their dedication to the arts, Malouf's Fabrics has assisted numerous theatrical productions and high school drama clubs in providing fabric for countless costumes and set designs.

On July 22 - 24, Malouf's Fabrics joins eight other Panhandle area fabric shops in participating in the Top of Texas Shop Hop 2010.
