It shouldn't take more than a couple of words to sum up July's weather. Dry and hot. Local official weather guy John Gurley turned in a report with a total of 4.22" of rain during the month. Almost half of that fell on July 15 when 1.57" was recorded.

Actually it was not all that hot compared to past Julys. The high temps were mostly in the 80s with a couple of days topping 90. Overnight lows were consistently in the 60s.

Council to take action on 2010 tax rates

The Friona city council will hold its regular monthly meeting Monday August 9 at 6:30 p.m. in council chambers at 619 Main St. All meetings are open to the public.

A public hearing will take place regarding an interest free loan from the Friona Economic Development Corporation to Vickie Samarron, owner of Vickie's Tex-Mex Store and More. Any citizen wishing to express an opinion on the loan is invited to be present and will be heard. After the public hearing the council will consider and take action on the proposed loan.

The council will also discuss and take action on a series of water rate increases, including meter deposit fees, increased water rates, reconnect fees, and penalties for late payments of utility bills.

Parmer County Tax Appraiser Curby Brantly will present a report regarding the 2010 effective tax rate. The council will then consider and take action on the proposed 2010 rate and set dates for required public hearings.

In other business the council will consider appointments to the Friona Public Library board of directors, consider and take action on a rate increase by Allied Waste Service, and discuss the July financial statement.

These council agenda items are subject to change. The final and official agenda is posted on the front window at city hall 72 hours prior to Monday's meeting.

Seliger will hold a town hall meeting in Friona Thursday August 19, from 10-11 a.m. at the Old Depot in city park. Everyone is urged to attend.

Seliger to host Friona meeting

State Senator Kel Seliger is holding his annual town hall meetings across District 31. He will be making stops in 26 counties over the next several weeks in preparation for the 82nd Texas Legislature that convenes in January. Seliger said, "Representing the 31st District

is a joint effort and the best way to represent people is the way in which they tell you."



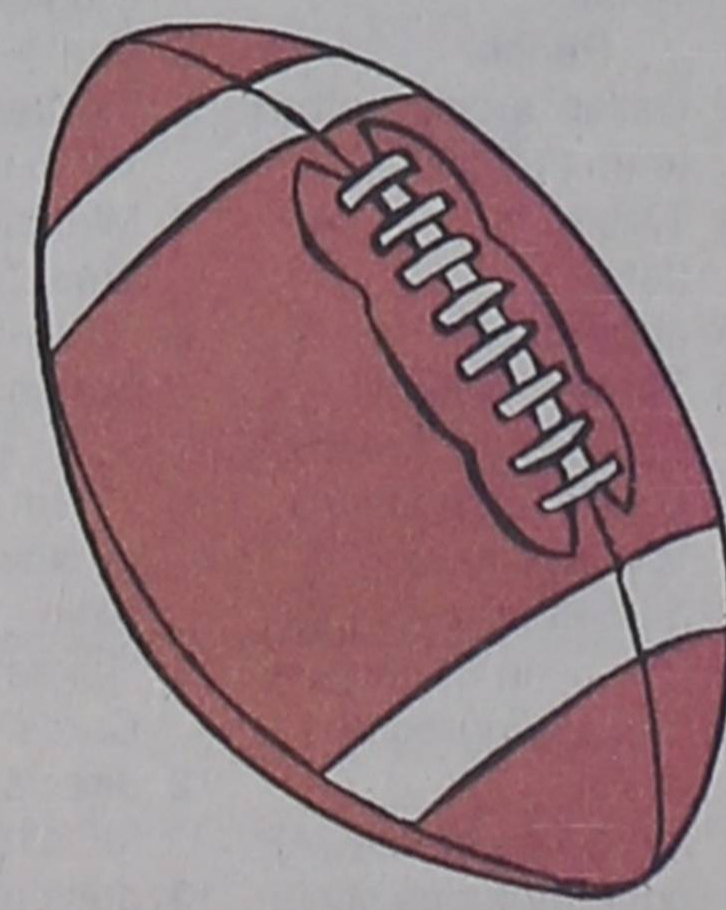

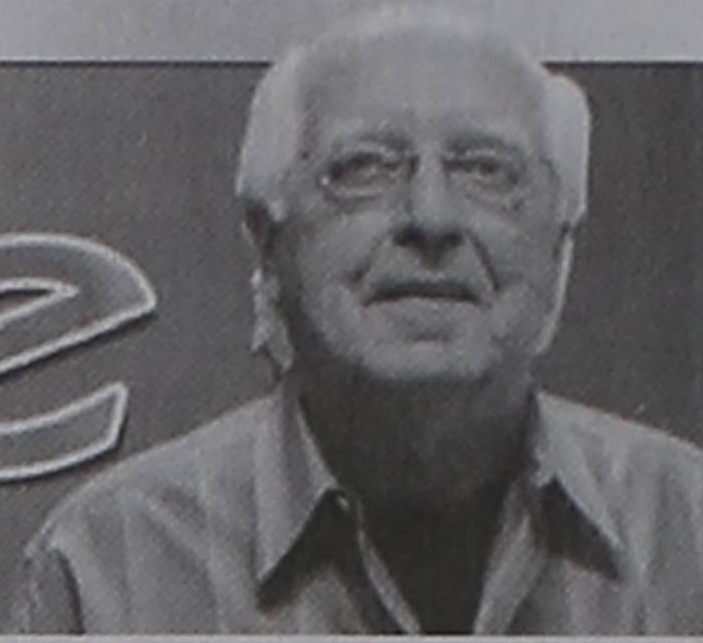

The Bridge: what you need to know about child abuse

Jennie Waggoner paid us a visit this week.

She is an interviewer and facilitator for The Bridge, a

children's advocacy center in Amarillo. It was the first children's advocacy center in Texas, celebrating 20 years in 2009. Many others have followed.

Jennie, a Pampa native and 2008 Texas Tech graduate, is one of two rural forensic interviewers at The Bridge. They cover the top 26 counties in the Panhandle. Her Texas Tech degree is in human development and family services.

The Bridge conducts videotaped interviews of children ages 2-17. These children are referred by law enforcement or Children's Protective Services. The Bridge interviews children who are victims of physical or sexual abuse, or witnesses to drug use, domestic violence, or crimes like homicide, etc.

The Bridge recently opened an office in the Hereford Crisis Center, 218 W. 3rd St. At its Amarillo office, 804 Quail Creek Drive, The Bridge staff provides

exam rooms and equipment for sexual assault exams. This lessens the anxiety for the child and family by eliminating a visit to the emergency room and providing a child friendly atmosphere.

The Bridge also provides funding for counseling to children and their families through a Victims of Crimes Act (VOCA) grant. Other funding comes from area United Ways, private donors, and government grants. The center is also the beneficiary of America's Best Thrift store located at 16th and Washington in Amarillo.

The Bridge staff provides services to more than 1,500 children each year, 80% of whom are sexual abuse victims. They say 99% of offenders are known to the child. It is the job of The Bridge interviewers to elicit facts and information about

their abusers that can be used in prosecution of abuse cases.

Miss Waggoner is interested in bringing information about The Bridge to rural counties. The Bridge provides agency tours and educational programs to the community free of charge to both adults and school age children. She can provide programs for PTAs, teachers, churches, or civic and professional organizations.

Topics available include "Truth, Lies, and Sex Offenders", "Child Abuse, Fact, Fiction, & Prevention", "Internet Safety: The 411 for Parents", and "It's Not Just Jenna". For information about a program for your group call 806-372-2873.

They have a pamphlet available titled "What You Need to Know About Child

Abuse". They have a new website at www.bridgecac.org where you can also make online donations, memorials, or honorariums.

They have a wish list that includes donations of such items as disposable cameras, blank journals, Goldfish crackers, boxed juices, stuffed animals, toys for boys, and Gel pens & other school supplies.

As Randall County District Attorney James Farren stated in The Bridge's annual report: "Children are perfect victims. They cannot protect themselves. The only defense they have is to 'tell'. The Bridge makes that defense a reality, not just a promise. Show Up, Stand Up, Speak Up. If we don't do it, no one will."

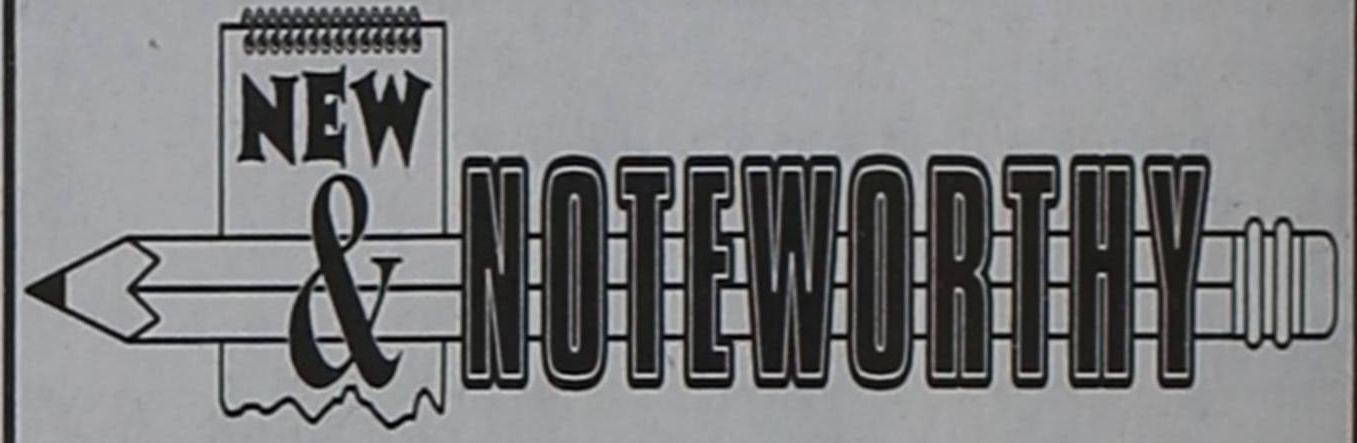

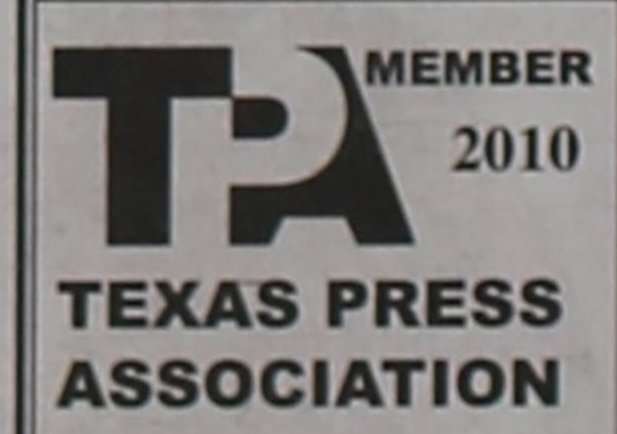

Church food just has to be good

The Taste of Home Church Supper Cookbook. Taste of Home is actually a magazine that produces special cookbook issues. I found the Church Supper Cookbook over the weekend at the Wal-Mart checkout counter.

What better recipes than those cooked for church suppers, especially in small town America. I now have enough tasty recipes to share for the next several months. If you want to check out the magazine they have a website, Taste of Home.com.

All recipes in the cookbook are submitted by folks just like you from around the country. First up is an appetizer even I could prepare, pastrami asparagus rollups.

Sharon Waller of Aromas, California, sent it in. She says, "When people first see this appetizer they're often skeptical about the combination. But once they take that first bite, they're hooked." It calls for bringing water to a boil, which is a real challenge for me, but if you like asparagus, this one will be a treat.

Pastrami asparagus roll-ups

- 24 fresh asparagus spears, trimmed
- ½ cup prepared pesto
- 24 thin slices (1 lb) provolone cheese
- 24 thin slices deli pastrami (¾ lb)

1. In a large skillet bring ½ inch of water to a boil. Add asparagus, cover and boil for 3 minutes. Drain and immediately place asparagus in ice water. Drain and pat dry.

2. Spread 1 tsp of pesto over each slice of cheese. Top each with an asparagus spear; roll up tightly. Place each on a slice of pastrami; roll-up tightly. Refrigerate until serving.

Tired of wasting time redialing busy signals? Just dial a two digit code, and repeat dialing will redial the last number you called for up to 30 minutes, and will ring YOU when the line becomes available.

To use Repeat Dialing:

1. After you receive a busy signal, hang up the phone.
2. Pick up the phone and dial *66. If the line is still busy, the number of the last call you dialed will be called back for 30 minutes.
3. As soon as the line becomes available, your telephone will ring with a different ringing pattern to alert you. Simply pick up the phone, and the number that was busy earlier will be ringing.

To turn off repeat dialing:

If at any time after you have dialed *66, you decide you don't want to call the busy number back, pick up the phone and dial *86 to cancel your request.

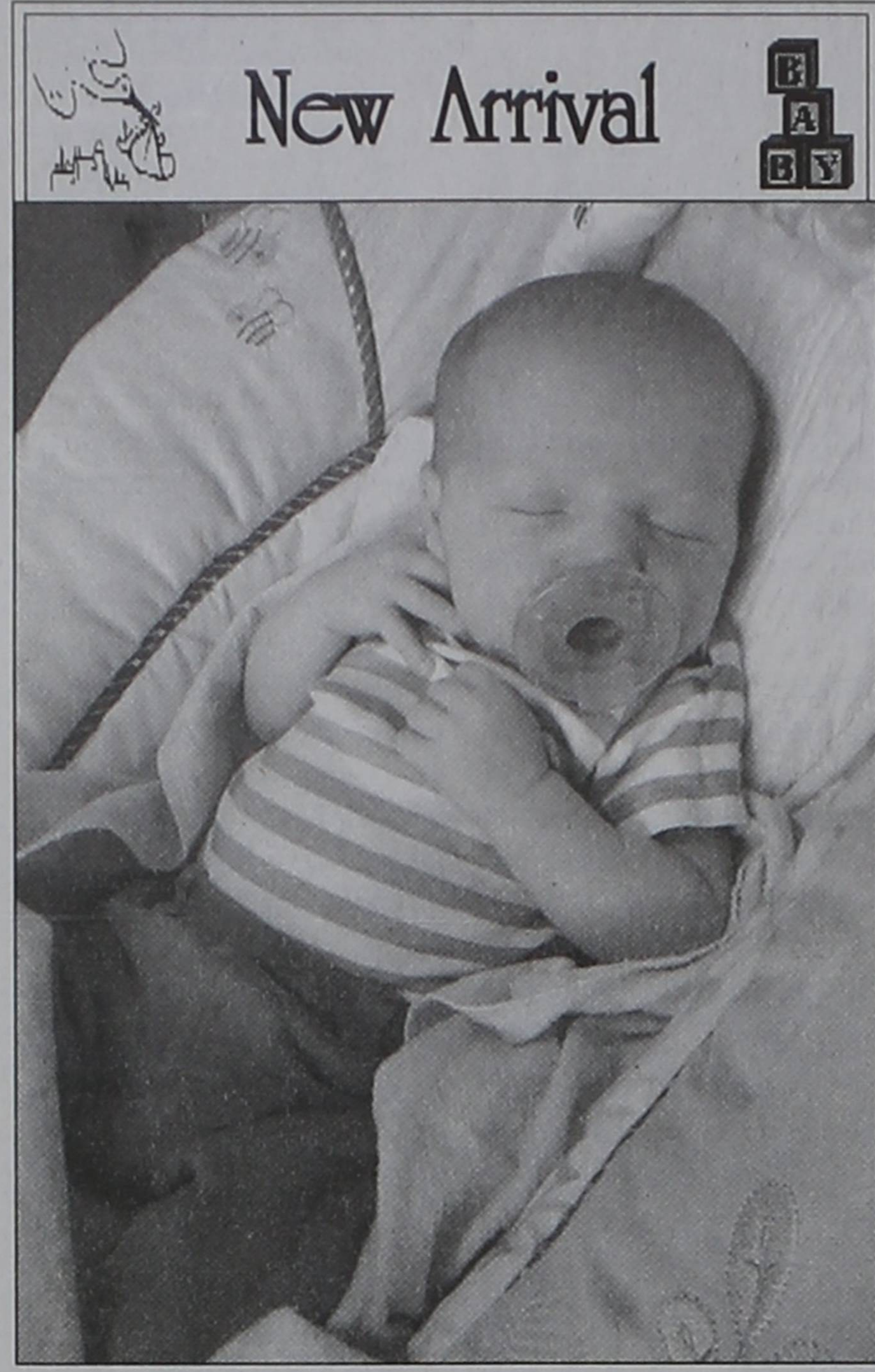

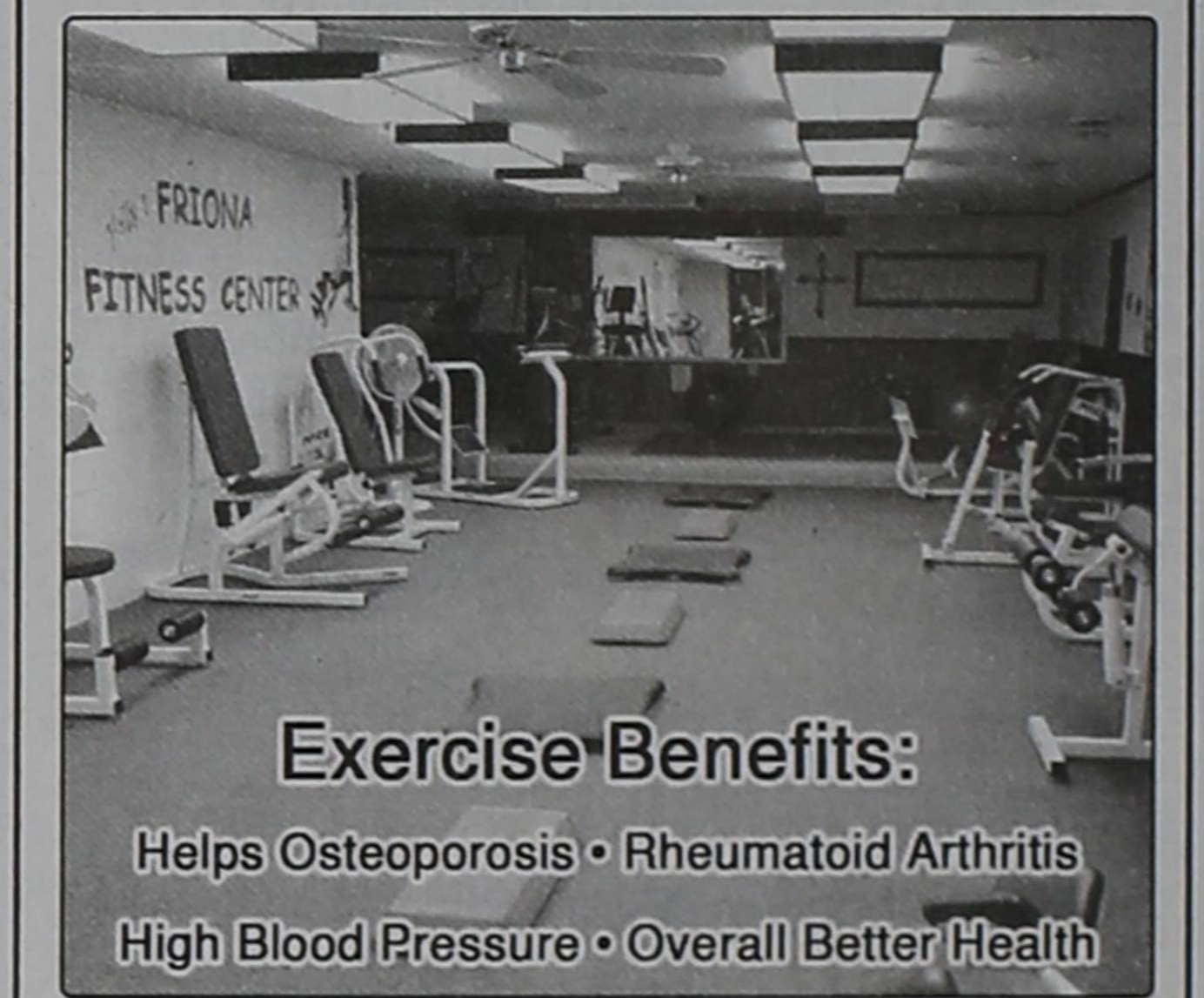

Historic T Anchor Headquarters gets facelift

Although it has a long history of firsts, this ranch building has far greater stories to tell. The T Anchor Headquarters, originally located in the Spring Draw north of present day Canyon between the West Texas A&M University Horse Center and Kimbrough Memorial Stadium and now located on the east lawn of the Panhandle-Plains Historical Museum, has received a much-needed facelift to continue its saga.

On August 12 from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m., join PPHM and the Canyon Chamber of Commerce for the ribbon cutting and opening of the historic T Anchor Ranch on the east lawn of PPHM. Hot dogs, cold drinks and ice cream will be provided along with Pioneer games for the kids.

"I was glad to hear that there was a concentrated effort to do needed repairs on the T Anchor house. The importance of this house as recorded on the 1967 Texas Historical Commission Historical Marker, is still just as important, and it is also just as important to maintain it," Randall County Historical Commission Chairman Harold E. Root said.

In 1975, PPHM moved the log cabin headquarters of the historic T Anchor Ranch to the museum grounds. After numbering and documenting each piece, staff took the cabin apart and rebuilt it true to its original construction. On October 25, 1975, the Panhandle-Plains Historical Society dedicated the T Anchor Ranch Headquarters following restorative efforts.

This fortunate circumstance of events came at the right time. Shortly after the relocation of the building, its previous location flooded—leaving little doubt that the water would have damaged the building greatly.

Since then the Headquarters has slowly succumbed to the elements, but with the help of Rhynehart Roofing, which supplied materials and labor to repair the roof, and Howell Sand Company, which provided materials for new

packed-dirt floors, it has received a much needed facelift. This fall students from Dr. Stephen Bogener's public history class at West Texas A&M University will be using appropriate materials and techniques to re-chink the walls of the blacksmith shop, and PPHM employees are working to further interpret and use the headquarters in exhibitions and programming.

"The restoration of a nineteenth century building provides a valuable hands-on experience for my Intro to Public History students at WTAMU. Not only will they gain a sense of what they might be called upon to do in a public history venue like PPHM, but they will actually learn a building technique centuries old," said Dr. Stephen Bogener, Assistant Professor of History and Geography at WTAMU. "This restoration project launched recently by the museum is a good example of how the WTAMU History Department's Public History Program and PPHM can work together to provide a quality learning experience for students and the public alike."

According to the Handbook of Texas Online, the T Anchor Ranch originated in the fall of 1877, when Leigh R. Dyer, a brother-in-law of Charles Goodnight, drove his herd of about 400 cattle to Spring Draw in Randall County near the junction of Palo Duro and Tierra Blanca creeks. He and his brother Walter cut juniper logs in the canyon, hauled them by the old Timber Creek Indian trail, and constructed a log cabin with two rooms and a breezeway in between.

The T Anchor Ranch and its headquarters have influenced the development of this region in numerous ways from its founding in 1877. In 1881, T Anchor Ranch was the first ranch in the panhandle to use barbed wire fencing, which dramatically changed the way ranchers kept track of cattle herds and allowed for selective breeding to improve beef quality. When A.L. Matlock ran for State Senate in 1882, the ranch manager held the first political convention in Randall County in Matlock's honor at the T Anchor Headquarters.

One of the more interesting stories came as a result of the cowboy strike in 1883. Hands who were dissatisfied with their current wage went on strike, demanding \$50 a month in pay. The strike got so heated that T Anchor ranch manager Jule Gunter felt the cowboys would come to the headquarters and take over the ranch by force. To prevent such action Gunter filled a keg with horseshoes and dynamite with a fuse running as far away as possible. If the cowboys came, Gunter planned to take refuge in his shop and light the fuse; fortunately the matter was resolved before such action was needed.

After the headquarters was purchased by West Texas State Teachers College in 1927, it continued its agricultural influence serving as an agriculture dorm. The students experienced many of the same living conditions the original occupants did including a dirt floor.

Visitors have enjoyed the T Anchor Ranch for decades. Following its mission to preserve the history of this region, PPHM began the process to repair the T Anchor Headquarters and expand its accessibility to patrons.

The improved state of the building will allow for more diverse uses than it has now. PPHM Education Coordinator Millie Vanover plans on using the T Anchor Headquarters for school group tours and the Archeology Fair to discuss the complete history of the ranch house. Special Projects Coordinator

Becky Livingston wants to include T Anchor in the Pioneer Town narrative, Christmas Open House and spring "round up" event with western heritage activities including chuck wagon food, cowboy music and square dancing.

"As an artifact, the Headquarters documents how the earliest ranchers constructed their first buildings as well as some details of how they lived. When the restoration is complete, museum visitors literally will be able "to step back into the past" where cowboys and ranchers once stood," Curator of History Emeritus Dr. Bill Green said.

From its use as a ranching headquarters to its time as an agriculture dormitory, pioneers, cowboys, students and museum visitors have been contributing to the buildings heritage and legacy. PPHM will continue to maintain and present T Anchor Ranch for generations to come.

What is it like to be a hero?

In 1 Samuel 17, David becomes a national hero, defeating Goliath. The next chapter shows us that being a hero isn't all it is cracked up to be, because there are so many opportunities to get away from the Lord, either by becoming enamored with people or by being enraged at others.

David's newfound fame brings attention that had never come his way before. First, he and Prince Jonathan become best buds, next Saul gives him a highly honored military commission, crowds are proclaiming him as a greater warrior than the king, and enemies even respect his military prowess. It would have been so easy for David to succumb to people pleasing and popular opinion, but instead he stays the course for the Lord.

Although David is the popular figure in Israel, not all are in love with him. King Saul is fearful of David's influence and power, and acts in many ways that are engaging, yet David does not allow bad things to make him bitter. In 1 Samuel 18, Saul attempts to murder David multiple times, demotes him from his high position, is dishonest regarding marriage of his oldest daughter, has devious plans regarding the dowry for his other daughter, and eventually becomes David's mortal enemy.

Maybe, being a hero isn't all its made out to be for David, because of the many pitfalls that open up along the way, but it doesn't matter if you are a hero or a quiet Christian, you must beware of the trappings of becoming a people pleaser, as well as becoming bitter, when others mistreat you.
