# Potluck from Alaska

## BY RON CARR

You know a Church Supper Cookbook (CSC) will have its share of casserole recipes. Here is another in the continuing series from the CSC. It was submitted by Kathy Crow of Cordova, Alaska, hence the name Kodiak Casserole.

She says, "Because it packs a little kick and has an interesting and tasty mix of ingredients, this is the perfect potluck dish for fall get-togethers."

Since fall will be here soon, keep this one pinned to the refrigerator for that first frosty weather spell. This has a lot of stuff in it. You'll probably need to go shopping.

## Kodiak Casserole

Serves 16-20

- 2 lbs ground beef
- 4 cups diced onions 2 garlic cloves minced

- 3 med green peppers diced 4 cups diced celery
- 1 jar (5-3/4 oz) pimento stuffed olives undrained
- 1 can (4oz) mushroom stems & pieces undrained
- 1 can (10-3/4 oz) condensed tomato soup undiluted 1 jar (8 oz) picante sauce
- 1 bottle (18 oz) barbecue sauce
- 2 tbsp Worcestershire sauce
- 3-4 cups medium egg noodles cooked and drained 1 cup (4 oz) shredded cheddar cheese

In a Dutch oven, cook beef and onions over medium heat until meat is no longer pink. Add garlic: cook 1 minute longer. Drain. Stir in the remaining ingredients except cheese.

Cover and bake at 350 for 1 hour or until bubbly. Sprinkle with cheese just before serving.


