Maize Days photography show entries sought

Parmer County Extension and the Friona 4-H will host a photography show for Maize Days. The show is open to everyone.

There are four age levels, junior for children up to 10, intermediate for ages 11-13, senior for ages 14-18, and adult for all over 18 years old.

Photos may be entered in color or black and white. Categories are people, animals, landscape, still life, architectural elements, plant/flora, special effects, or theme. The show theme is "Signs of Parmer County". There is no limit on the number of photos that may be entered but each photo must be entered only once. The entry fee is \$2 per photo.

Photos can be taken to the Parmer

County Extension office on the third floor of the courthouse in Farwell until September 7 at noon. They can also be dropped off one day only on September 3 until noon at the Friona Chamber of Commerce or the Bovina County Tax Office. In Lazbuddie, drop off photos with Ann Rainey until September 3.

Co-Op Gin annual meeting

The Friona Farmers Do-Op Gin held its 48th annual meeting Tuesday August 24 at the junior high cafeteria. Attendees enjoyed a catered meal by Danny's Hens and Fins of Lubbock.

Board president Mitchell Wiseman presided over the business meeting. The new gin manager, Matt Lingle, was introduced. Jimmy

Rogers, CPA, of Rogers, Cross, Hanby, and Co. of Plainview, gave a financial report.

It was said the gin processed 4,800 bales in 2008, 3681 bales in 2009, and with more cotton acreage this year it was projected to do 10,000 bales in 2010. About 5,600 acres of cotton has been committed to the gin.

Three incumbent board directors were re-elected by acclamation. They were Mitchell Wiseman, John Jarecki, and Davy Carthel. Other board members are Raymond Hamilton, vice-president, Cris Ingram, Luke Steelman, and Gene Welch.

New gin manager, 25-year-old Matt Lingle and his wife

Alia, have moved to Friona from Frederick, Oklahoma. They have been married since April 2010, were high school sweethearts, and both have business degrees (BBA) from Cameron University in Lawton, Oklahoma. Matt Lingle said he grew up in the gin business as his father worked in the cotton indus-

try and was also a gin manager.

He invited all area producers to stop by the gin and get acquainted and reminded everyone that the gin also sells fertilizer.

After the business meeting many door prizes were given away to attending members and guests.

Football contest begins next week

The annual Friona Star football contest will commence with next week's September 2 issue. The contest will run for 12 weeks with \$25 awarded to the weekly winner and a \$150 grand prize to the overall point total winner. In case of a tie the grand prize will be divided among the winners.

The weekly deadline is 4 p.m. each Friday. Entries can be faxed to 806-250-5127, mailed to Friona Star, P.O. Box 789, Friona 79035 (postmarked by 4 p.m. Friday), or dropped off in the red mailbox at the Star office on Main St., or at Dorothy's Beauty Shop in Bovina.

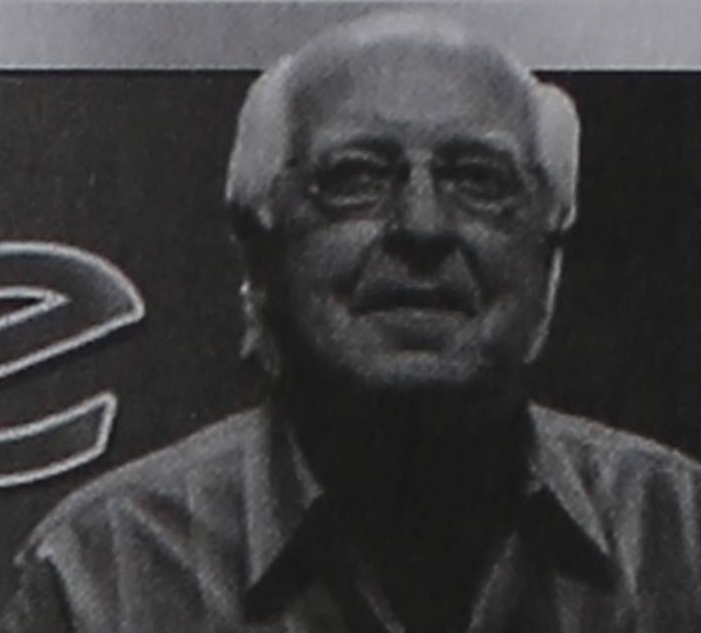

the real skinny on problem skin

Dr. Posey says the Panhandle is a great place to be a dermatologist.

He says with the 3000+ feet elevation, the hot, dry, windy weather, and all those fancy TV body washes people try, he has an endless supply of problem skin patients.

Dr. Randal Posey is an associate at High Plains Dermatology Center in Amarillo. He and Friona's Dr. Bob Alexander were medical school classmates. Dr. Posey and his dermatology group have many Friona patients.

I had occasion the past several weeks to become one of those patients. Had some problems with a pesky skin rash and a spot on my left temple that turned out to be a skin cancer.

For the skin cancer procedure he referred me to Dr. Liana Proffer who uses the MOHS procedure at her office next door to Northwest Texas Hospital in the Women's Health Associates building. That's where they take layers of tissue until they get it all. It was an efficient experience. Went back 10 days later to get the stitches out and it is now all clear.

Had never met Dr. Liana Proffer before. What a nice young lady doctor who could pass for a Dallas Cowboy Cheerleader. Maybe that is why the cutting and sewing didn't hurt very much.

But I digress. Among the salves and creams Dr. Posey prescribed was also a sheet of paper with a list of "Bathing Instructions for Problem Skin". It seems that how you treat yourself in the tub or shower determines the health of your skin. There are only four places on the body that you need to wash, unless you have a really dirty job.

In my youth I don't remember us ever having a shower. We would grab a 'washrag' and a bar of soap and scrub in the tub. Remember when we called them 'washrags'? That is because they were really rags ripped off of a flour sack or an old shirt. Later on they became store bought washcloths but they were always washrags to me.

Dr. Posey said to stop using them. After 70 years of scrubbing with a rag, all of a sudden I can't use one? That is definitely culture

shock. Not only that but I am supposed to 'pat dry, not rub'. How do you pat dry? It takes practice. At least I don't have to figure out what brand of soap to use anymore. Dove Sensitive, that's it.

He gave me a list of a few other rules too so I thought I would share them with you. I paid money to get this advice. I give it to you here free. Good luck. Old habits are hard to break.

1. Limit your bathing to 5 to 7 minutes or less with lukewarm water (never hot).

2. Use no bubble bath, body washes, or similar detergent bubbling solutions.

3. Use no wash cloth or sponge. These create too much friction.

That stubborn streak is what dermatologists like Dr. Posey count on to keep those patients coming.

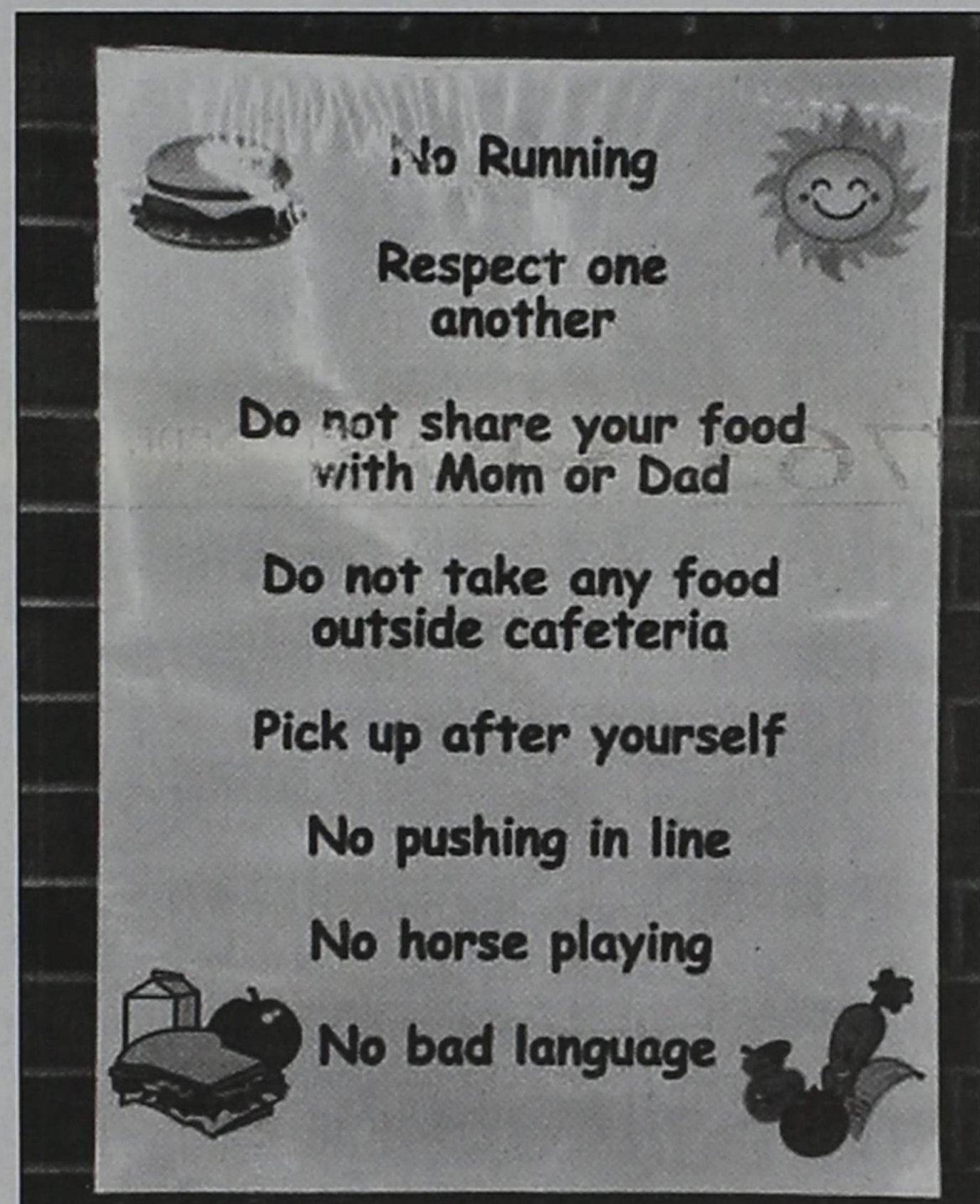
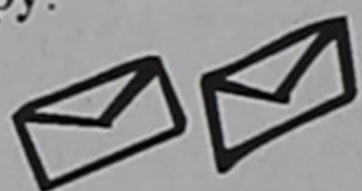
Letters to the Editor

One-pot meals from BHG

We are not thinking about winter now but it will be here soon enough. This recipe is from Better Homes & Gardens magazine's One-Pot Meals.

It was submitted by Debi Carnott of Calumet, Oklahoma. It is called Mexican Winter Chili. She won \$200 in the magazine's recipe competition. How about chicken broth, pumpkin, and whipping cream in chili? Whipping cream? Doesn't sound like cowboy chili but the picture in the magazine looked tasty.

If you give it a try let me know how the folks liked it.

Mexican Winter Chili

Serves 4

- 1 lb pork stew meat
- 2 tbsp olive oil
- 1 lg onion chopped
- 1 med fresh poblano pepper, finely chopped
- 1 lg red sweet pepper, cut into 3/4 inch pieces
- 2 tsp unsweetened cocoa powder
- 1 tsp ground cumin
- 1/2 tsp garlic powder
- 1/8 tsp ground cinnamon
- Dash cayenne pepper
- 1 14-oz can chicken broth
- 1 15-oz can pumpkin
- 1/4 cup whipping cream
- Fresh cilantro (optional)

1. In a Dutch oven cook pork in hot olive oil over medium-high heat 5 minutes or until browned. Stir in onion, poblano, and sweet pepper. Cook and stir 5 minutes or until tender. Stir in cocoa powder, cumin, garlic powder, cinnamon, and cayenne.
2. Stir in pumpkin, cream, and salt and black pepper to taste. Return to boiling; reduce heat. Simmer 5 minutes. Top with fresh cilantro.



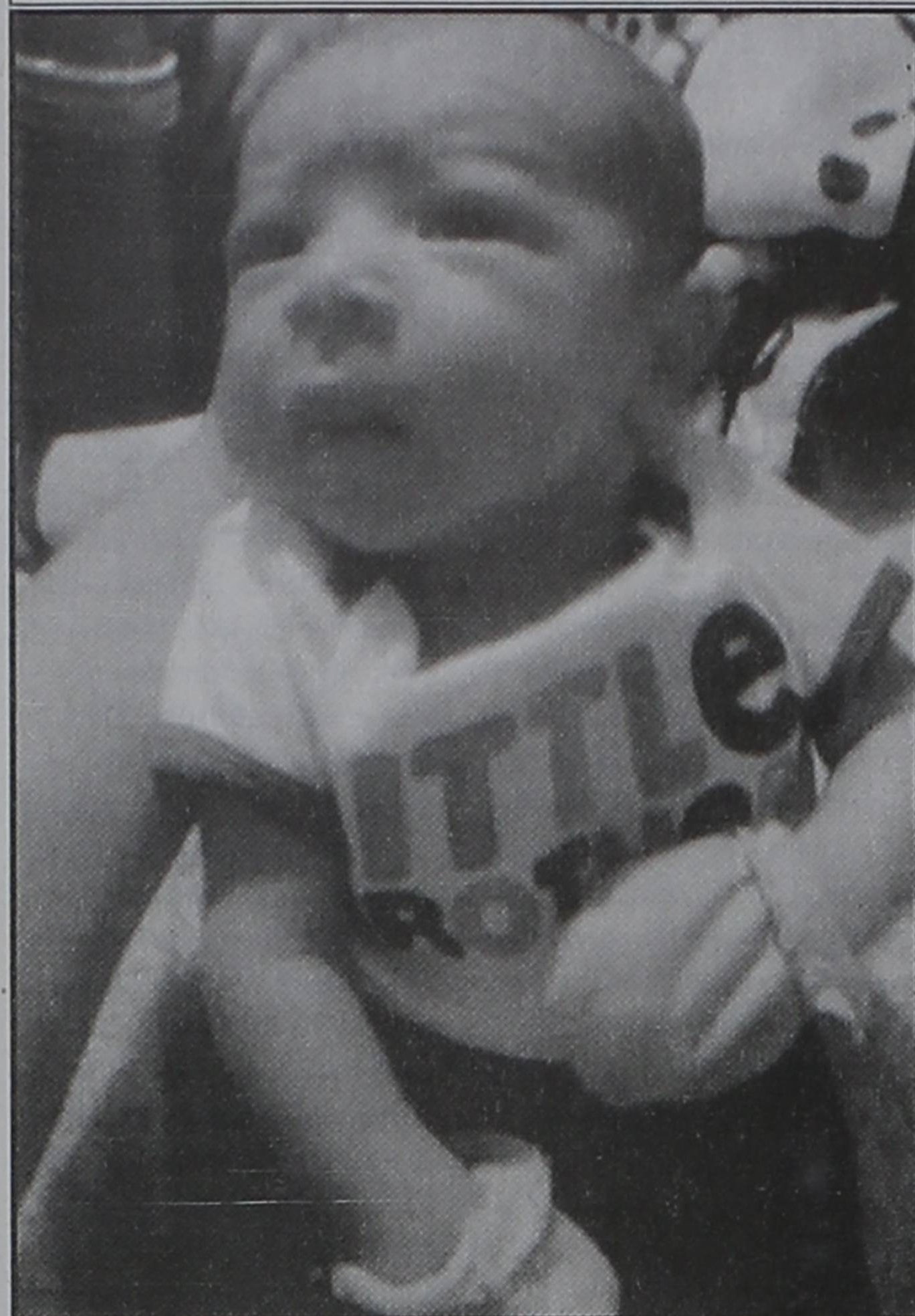

Parmer/Bailey counties Cotton Tour scheduled

The Texas AgriLife Extension Service offices in Bailey and Parmer Counties will conduct their Annual Crop Tour Tuesday, August 31, 2010 beginning at 9 a.m. on the James Brown farm north of Muleshoe. The free tour will conclude after lunch, which will be provided, just west of Texico, New Mexico.

The tour will be focused on cotton production and will include three replicated cotton variety trials with a very diverse group of genetics as well as a GlyTol demonstration plot. The GlyTol technology is a new trait for tolerance to glyphosate herbicide. Cotton industry representatives and AgriLife Extension personnel will be on hand to present information and to answer producer questions.

Three Texas Department of Agriculture continuing education units, two general and one integrated pest management, will be offered and NMDA CEUs have been applied for. Those unfamiliar with the area should call the AgriLife Extension office in Bailey County for directions to the first tour stop. 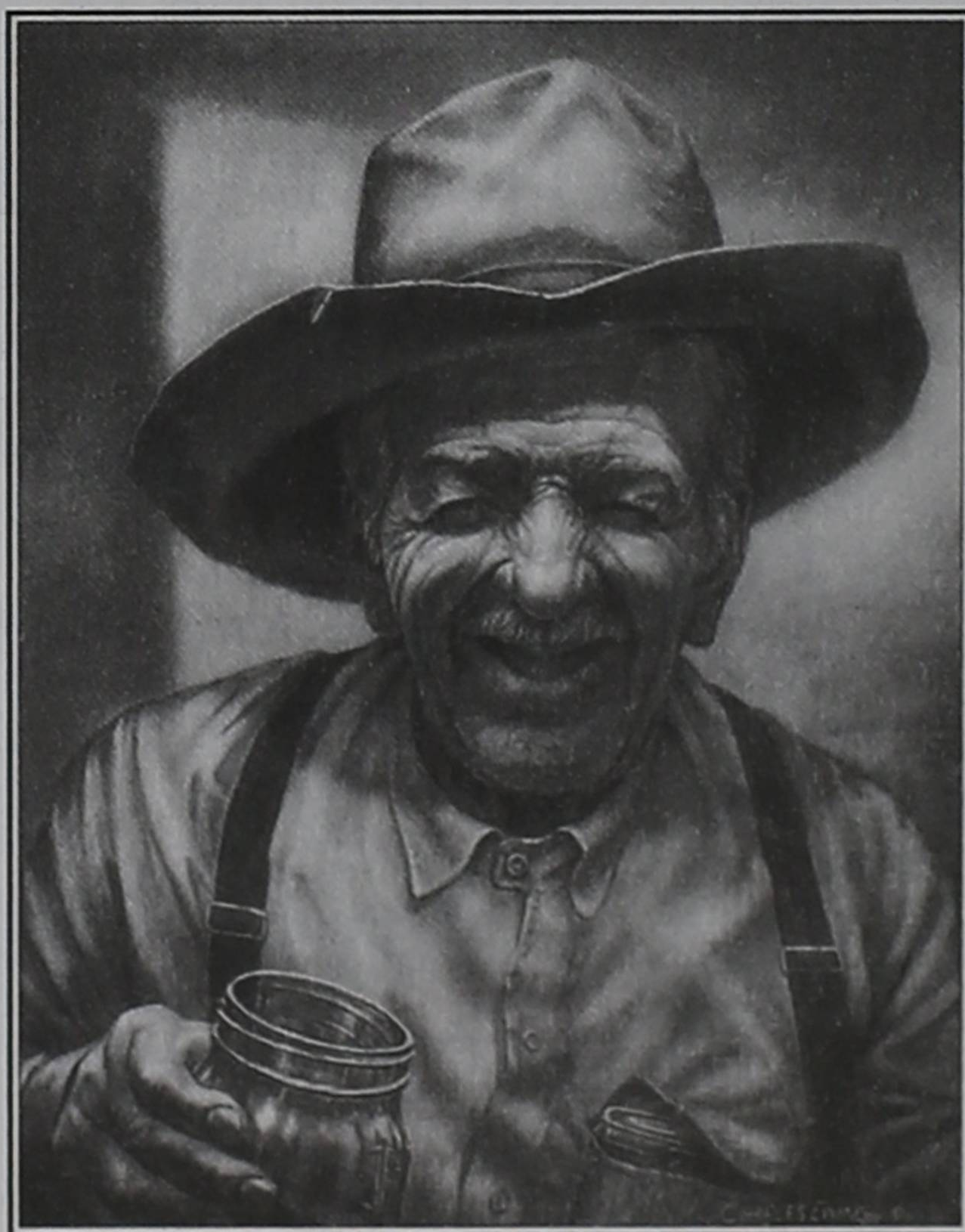

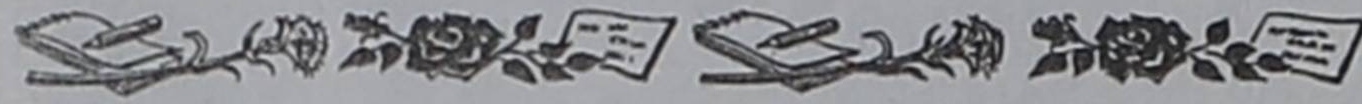
OBITUARY

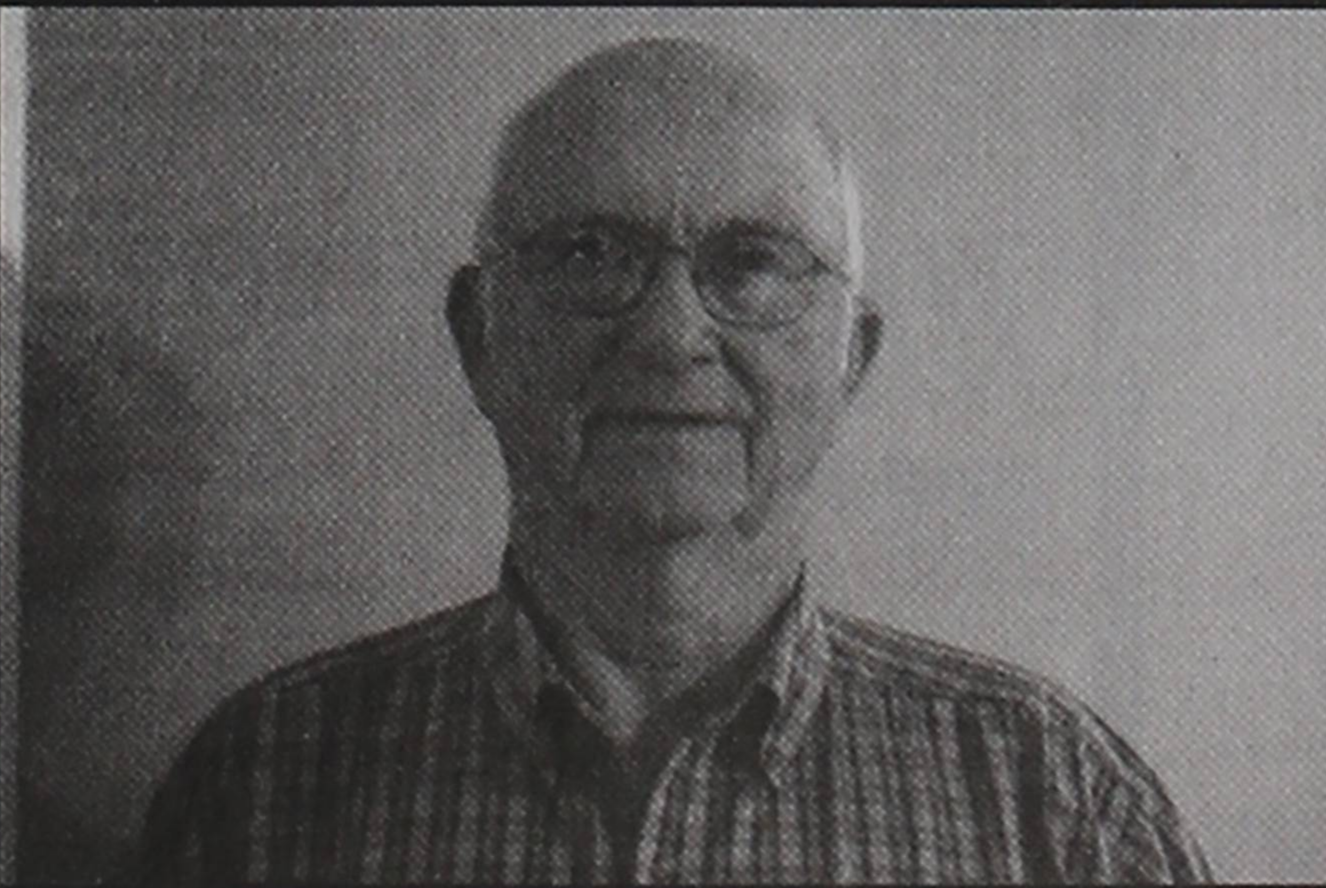

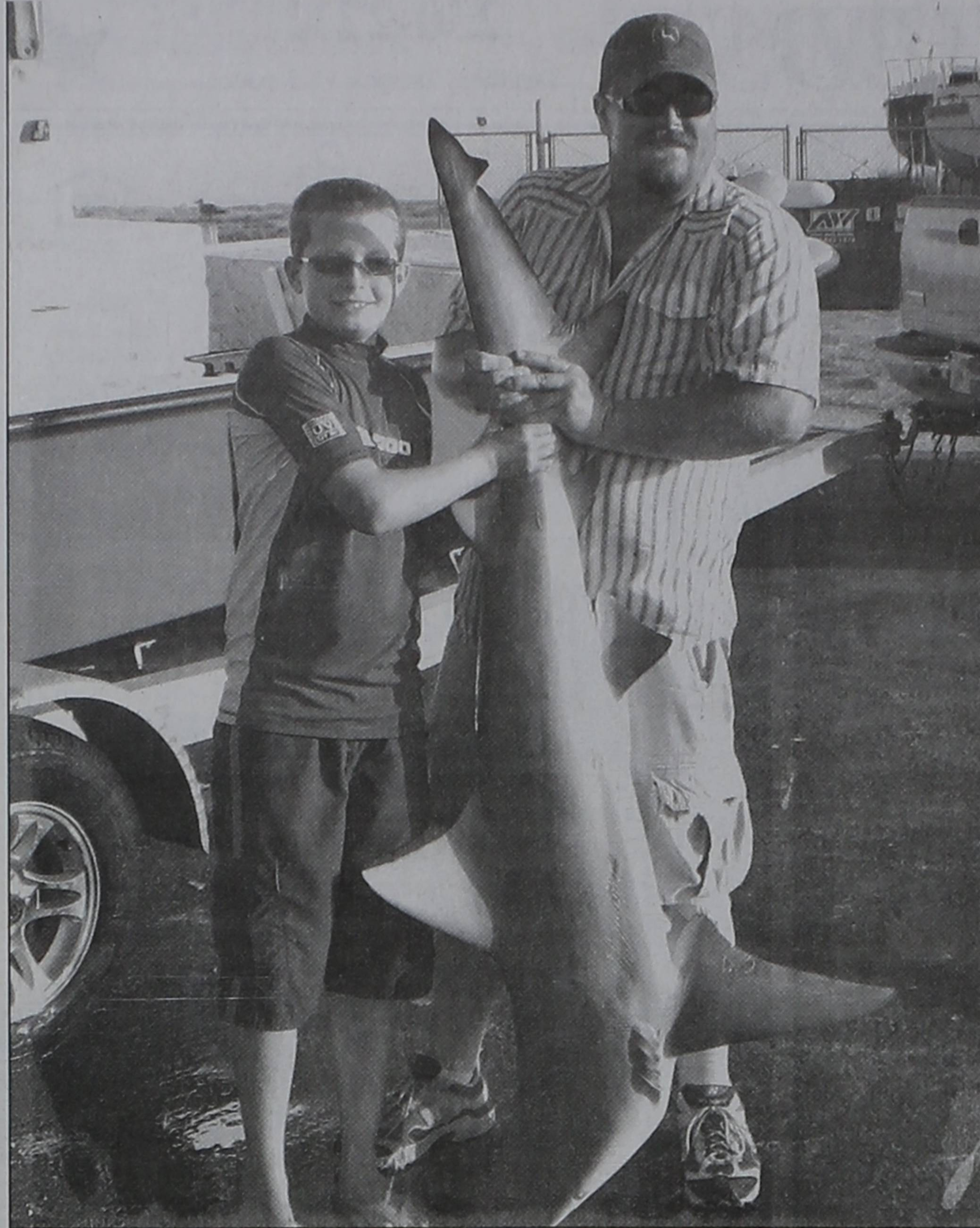

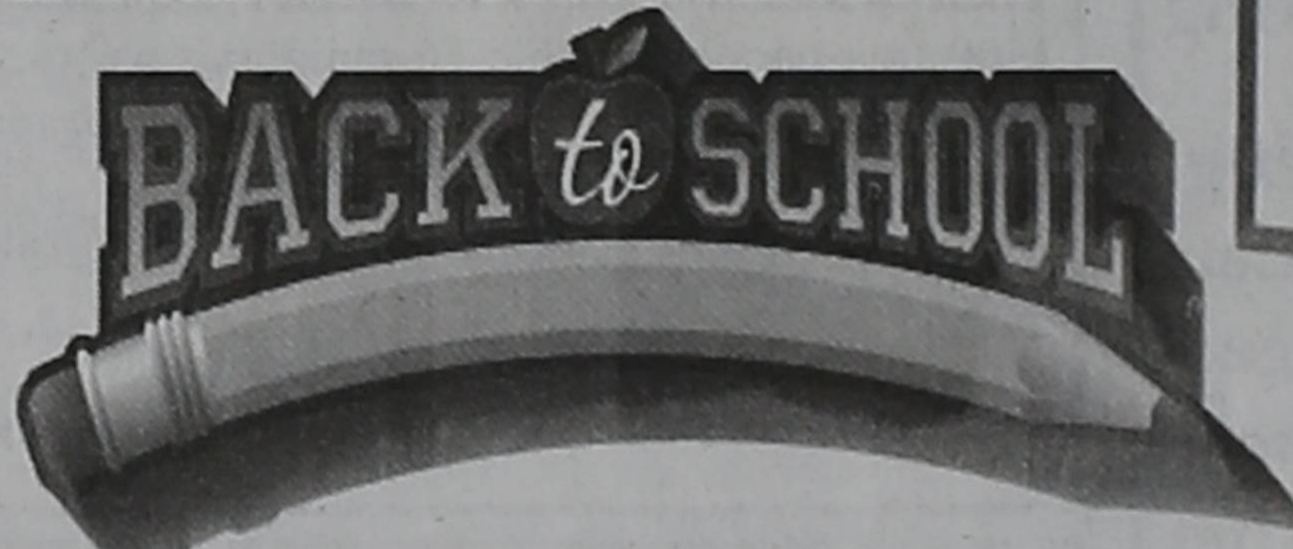

Members were given cer-

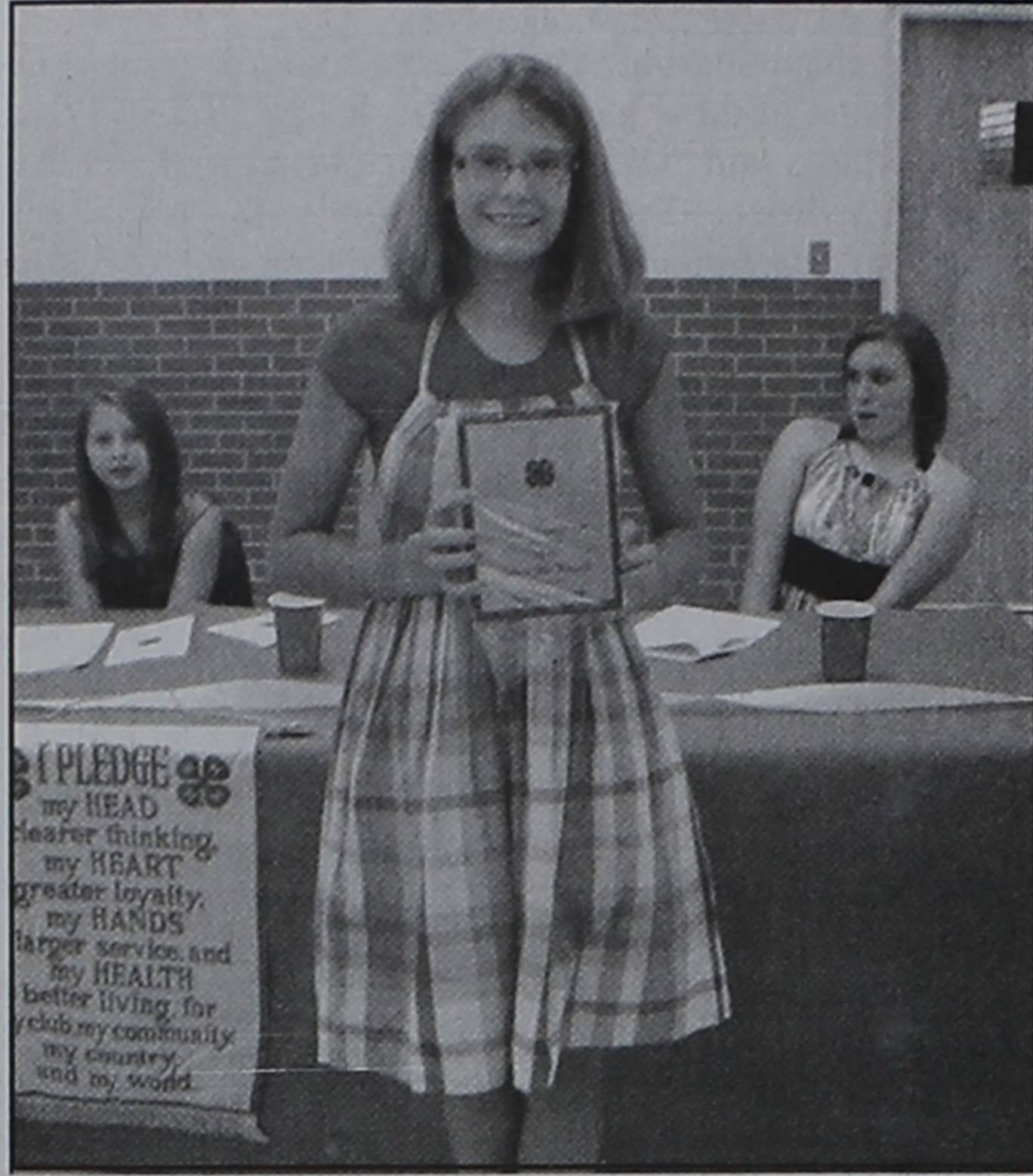

To be eligible a member

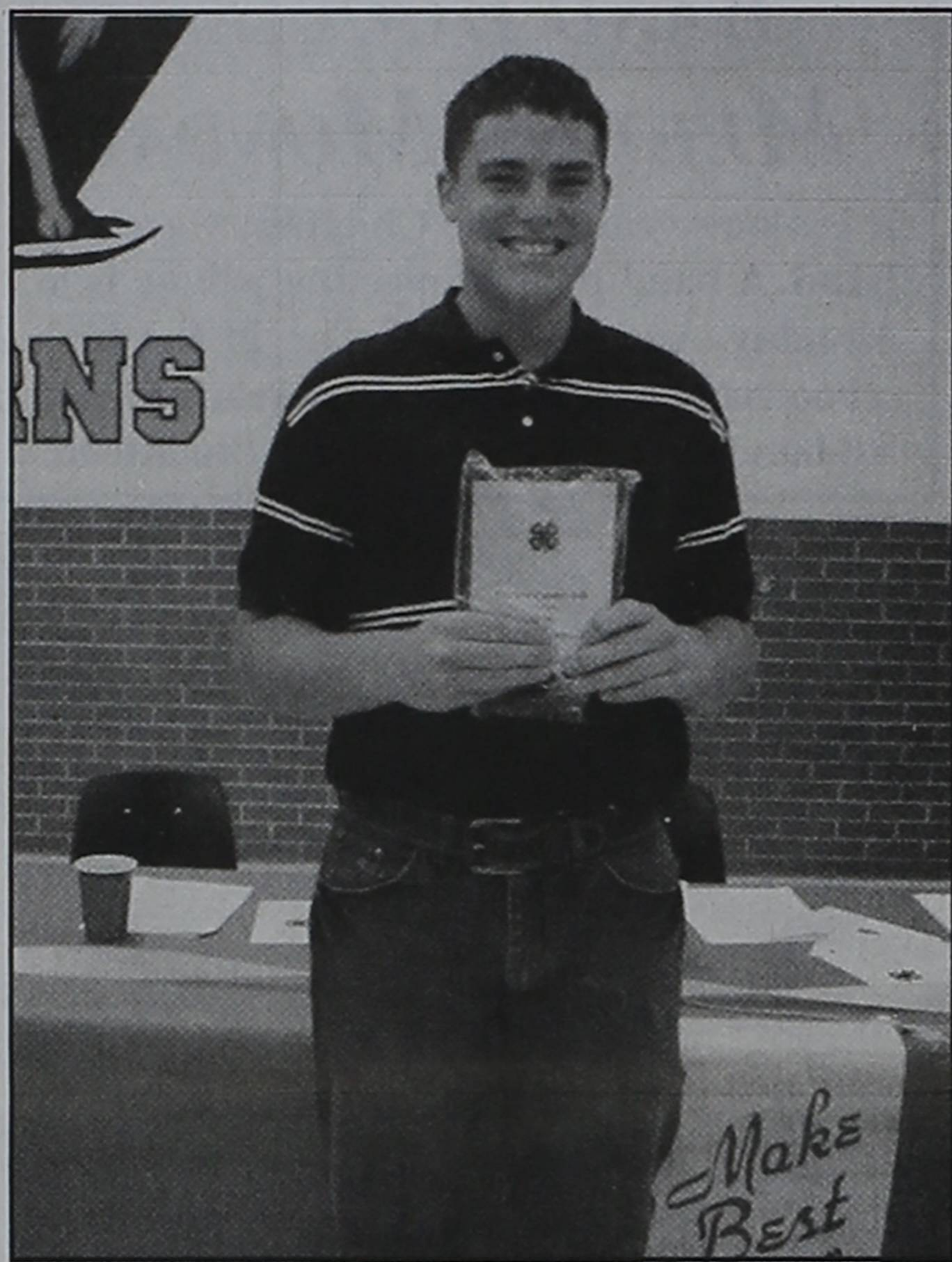

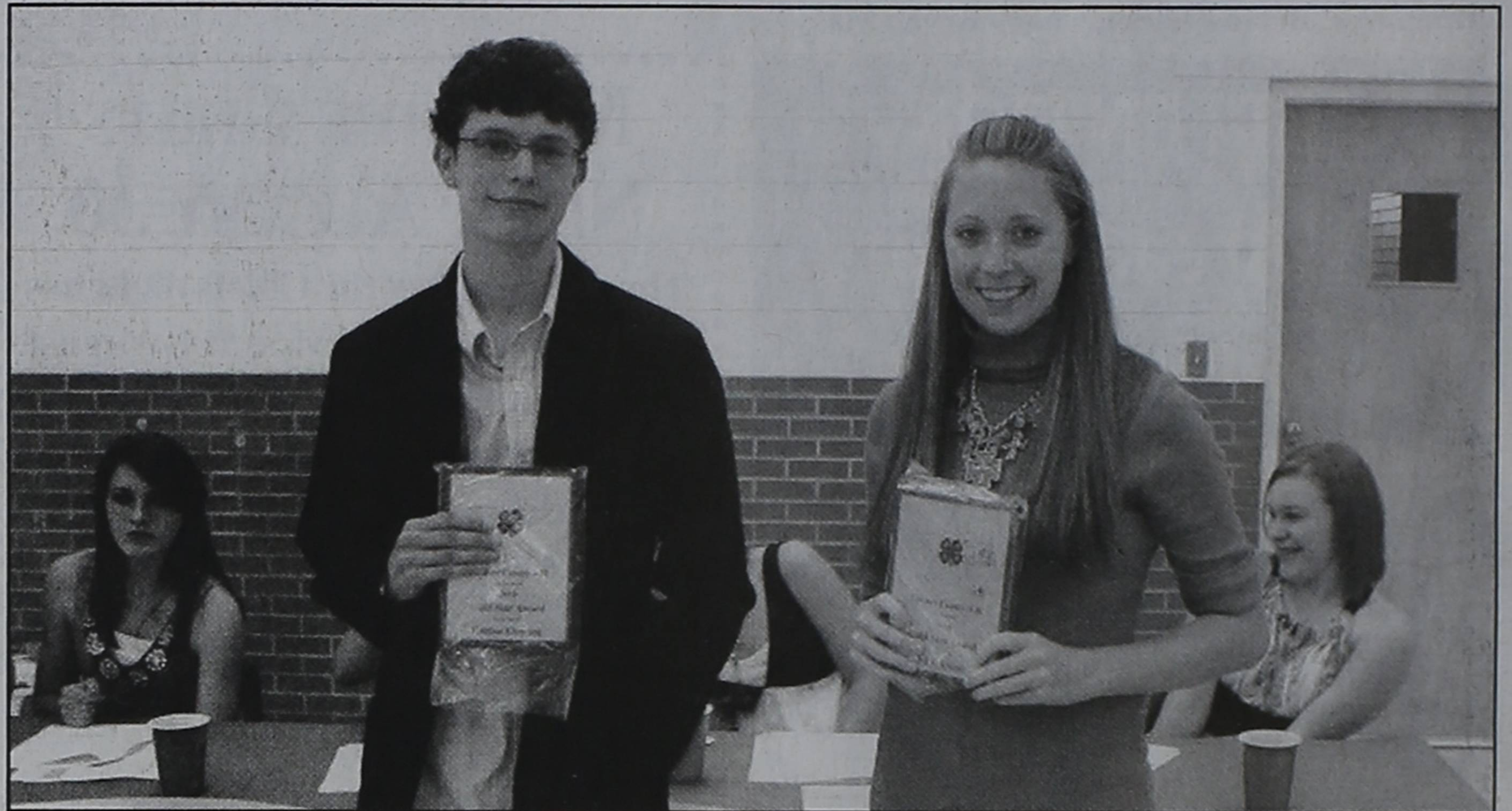
