Chiefs blast Abernathy 31-6 for opening win

Senior running backs Chris Garcia and Zack Fair accounted for 266 rushing yards, quarterback Brenner Barnett, in his first start, threw for 128 yards, and junior receiver Caleb Monroe caught 5 passes for 116 yards, as the Chieftains handily defeated the Abernathy Antelopes 31-6. It was the season opener for both teams.

For the Chieftains, the rest of the schedule will get tougher. Next up is powerhouse Stratford, followed by homecoming vs. the Idalou Wildcats.

The Chiefs scored quickly after winning the toss and

electing to receive. A quick slant pass from Barnett to Monroe turned into a first and goal inside the 10-yard line. With 9:58 left in the first quarter, Garcia powered in from the 2-yard-line to give the Chiefs a quick 7-0 lead.

Later in the quarter Zack Fair took an option pitch around the left side and outran the Antelopes for a 43-yard touchdown carry.

In the second quarter, Ernesto Monreal kicked a 32-yard field goal to give the Chiefs a 17-0 lead with about one minute left in the half. But an Abernathy turnover gave the Chiefs

another opportunity. Barnett scored on a 1-yard plunge with 0:03 seconds on the clock. The halftime score was 24-0.

Friona put a final touchdown on the scoreboard late in the third quarter as Chris Garcia took a reverse handoff and turned it into a 44-yard touchdown run. Monreal was good on four extra points and the field goal for 7-points and a 100% kicking average.

The Antelopes managed one scoring drive late in the fourth quarter. Clayton Smiley overpowered the 'Lopes line to burst through and block the ex-

tra point try, leading the Chiefs to the 31-6 win.

Fair gained 162 yards on 14 carries and Garcia was 13 for 104. Barnett had 45 rushing yards and was 5 of 10 passing for 128 yards. Duncan Welch 3 for 16, Vazquez 2 for 10, and Monreal 4 for 4, also added rushing yards.

Kirby Frye had one pass reception of 16-yards. The Chiefs had 473 total yards of offense. The Chieftain "D" held Abernathy to 196 offensive yards.

Credited with unassisted tackles were Dominique Kellum 4, Diego Licerio 3, Raul Anchondo 3, Gabriel

Avalos 2, Brenner Barnett 2, Serafin Vazquez 2, Adrian Merino 2, and Clayton Smiley 2. Avalos and Barnett each had one interception.

Monroe is the back up quarterback this season and has punting duties also. He had two punts for 68 yards. Fair and Avalos are the punt and kickoff returners. The Chiefs will travel to Stratford Friday, September 3. Game time is 7:30 p.m.

The Abernathy game and the Stratford game will be shown as a doubleheader on W.T. Services channel 76 Saturday morning beginning at 10 a.m.

unintended consequences

Didn't see that coming!
The formal name for it is unintended consequences. Barack Obama is a good example of an unintended consequence. We've all experienced it at some point. You plan, then implement the plan, and something happens as a result of your plan that you didn't plan on.

You will be hearing more and more about unintended consequences as the Obamacare nationalized health system is implemented.

First of all, for every government rule there is always a group of folks who figure out how to game the system and get around the rule. I read a report by Arlene Wohlgenuth, a former Texas representative, pointing out some unintended consequences in the Massachusetts government run health care system.

Did you know Massachusetts had a state run health system? Neither did I until recently. It was implemented in 2006 under then-governor Mitt Romney. One of the provisions is it prevents exclusion for pre-existing conditions. The idea was to keep insurance companies from denying coverage to consumers with lifelong conditions beyond their control.

So what happened? People began to wait until they had a health problem and then bought insurance just long enough to treat it. The unintended consequence was that premiums increased dramatically for individuals and small businesses. One report showed the short-term insurance buyers paid \$400 a month in premiums

but were paid out benefits of \$2,200 a month.

To counter these "short-term" buyers, Massachusetts enacted an individual requirement with fines attached. Mrs. Wohlgenuth says this was further incentive for people to buy insurance then drop it once verification was done.

As Massachusetts premiums soared, small businesses adjusted too. One Massachusetts business is now paying \$1,500 quarterly in fines to the state instead of the \$30,000 it paid quarterly for 13 workers' health insurance premiums. Many Massachusetts businesses are responding by dropping health benefits.

So what are Massachusetts lawmakers considering? Increasing the penalties for not having insurance, which will make more short-term buyers get insurance then

drop it as soon as the state verifies they have it.

The new federal health care law used Massachusetts as its model. They promised to deliver coverage to everyone while lowering costs. They promised to protect small business owners. Instead, small group insurance rates in Massachusetts rose 14 percent more than the rest of the country.

Last weekend Senator Max Baucus of Montana, chairman of the Senate Finance Committee and chief architect of the health care bill, told a town hall meeting that he did not read the healthcare bill. He said he did not think his constituents would want him to waste his time reading it. He said he hired people to read it and write the final version. He should be fired. If other people can read it and write it, why do we need Max?

As all 2,000+ pages of the Obamacare plan are gradually implemented there are sure to be many more unintended consequences that harm individuals and small businesses. According to Mrs. Wohlgenuth and the Texas Public Policy Foundation, "As Texas and the U.S. begin to implement these health laws, short-term buyers are but one on a burgeoning list of unintended consequences."

They lied. Probably didn't mean to. Your health costs will continue to go up. Government control does not bring the lower costs that market competition can deliver. They didn't read the bill, they don't know what is in it, and you and I are going to pay.

Unintended consequences. Will you remember in November!

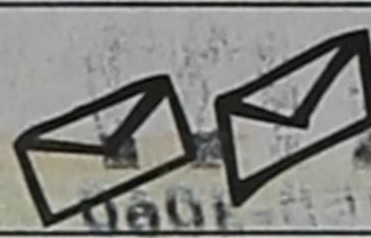

I've received the distinct honor of being accepted into the Texas Agriculture Lifetime Leadership (TALL) program for 2010-2011. The purpose of the TALL program is to create leaders who have an understanding of the key issues, theories, policies and economics needed to advance the agriculture industry. Over the next 2 years, the TALL program will meet every 3 months at different locations in order to broaden TALL members understanding of the vast array of agriculture in the state. We will also learn about state and national politics, global finance, and international trade issues that affect agriculture. In all, I will listen to over 300 speakers, and meet more than 2,000 people.

I'll be traveling to the gulf coast area to learn about marine biology, urban issues and gulf coast farming. I'll travel to the Texas valley area to learn about citrus, vegetables, and wildlife agriculture. I'll travel to East Texas to learn about forestry, fisheries, poultry houses, and wetlands agriculture. My fellow TALL members will travel here to the Panhandle to learn about our agriculture, including cotton, corn, and wheat farming, in addition to our cattle and dairy industries.

I'll visit Austin to learn about state politics and agriculture policies, and Washington D.C. to learn about national politics and homeland security. I'll also travel to New York to learn about the financial district and agriculture commodity trading.

On the international side, I'll travel into Mexico to learn about NAFTA, immigration issues, and border security issues. I will also spend a week in the country of India to learn about international trade, world markets, and foreign production practices.

We had our first meeting in July at College Station to learn about Brazos Valley Agriculture. Our list of topics included everything from bio-terrorism and animal cloning, to watermelon farms and Blue Bell Ice Cream. It was absolutely fascinating to learn about all the different aspects of agriculture in that area. As we finish each TALL session I'll write to the paper to share the experiences. I'm very honored to have been chosen for this program, and will strive to represent Friona, Parmer County, and the Texas Panhandle as an ambassador of agriculture.

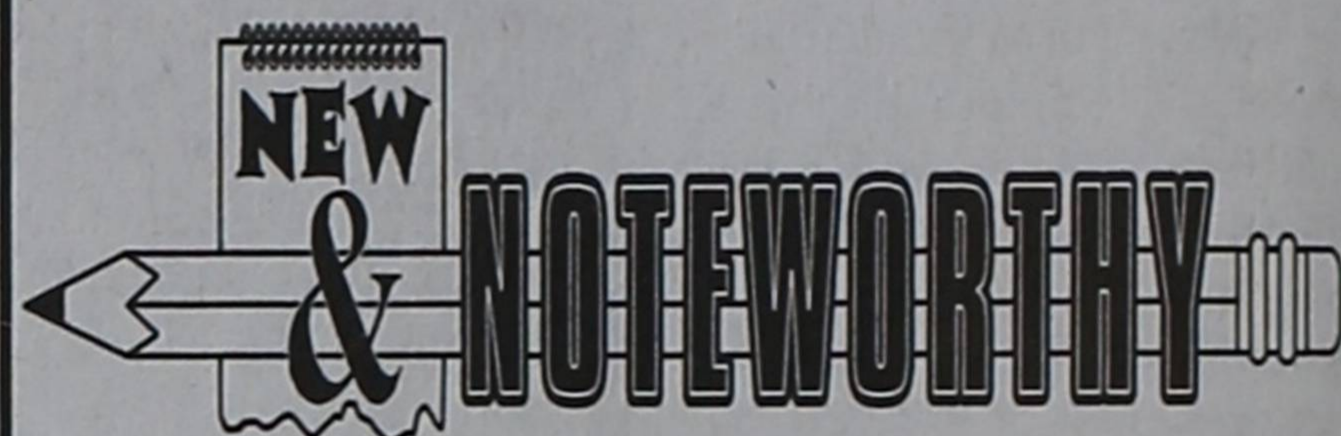

Meaty, messy, cheesy

Surprise the folks at your next church supper or family get-together with some meaty Italian manicotti. The recipe is from our Church Supper Magazine, submitted by Lori Thompson of New London, Texas. She says, "This dish has been very popular at get-togethers and covered dish dinners. You can assemble it ahead of time to avoid last minute fuss." Yes, thank heaven for freezers.

Another reader, Gayla A. of Pryor Oklahoma had this tip: "Spooning a cheesy filling into manicotti shells can be time consuming and messy. To avoid the trouble I put the filling into a cake decorating bag and easily pipe it into the pasta tubes."

Cheesy meaty, and messy. Just the way Italian food is supposed to be.

Meaty Manicotti

Serves 7

- 14 uncooked manicotti shells
- 1 lb bulk Italian sausage
- 3/4 lb ground beef
- 2 garlic cloves minced
- 2 cups (8 oz) shredded part-skim mozzarella cheese
- 1 pkg (3 oz) cream cheese cubed
- 1/4 tsp salt
- 4 cups meatless spaghetti sauce divided
- 1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese

1. Cook the manicotti shells according to package directions. Meanwhile, in a large skillet, cook sausage and beef over medium heat until meat is no longer pink. Add the garlic; cook 1 minute longer. Drain. Remove from the heat. cool 10 minutes.

2. Drain shells and rinse in cold water. Stir the mozzarella cheese, cream cheese, and salt into the meat mixture. Spread 2 cups spaghetti sauce in a greased 13 x 9 inch baking dish.

3. Stuff each shell with about 1/4 cup meat mixture; arrange over sauce. Pour remaining sauce over top. Sprinkle with Parmesan cheese.

4. Cover and bake at 350 for 40 minutes. Uncover; bake 5-10 minutes longer or until bubbly and heated through.

AgriLife Research-Amarillo hires grain geneticist

Dr. Shuyu Liu, formerly a research scientist at Virginia Tech in Blacksburg, Virginia, is now the small grains geneticist for Texas AgriLife Research in Amarillo. Liu joined the Amarillo faculty as an assistant professor on August 1.

"We welcome Dr. Liu to our AgriLife Research and Extension wheat improvement team for the High Plains and Rolling Plains Center of Excellence," said Dr. John Sweeten, AgriLife Research resident director in Amarillo. "He will be instrumental in helping us fulfill a major component of the statewide small-grains strategic plan which targets wheat breeding and genetics as one of seven objectives."

Liu spent the past three years at Virginia Tech working on breeding and genetic studies for resistance to Fusarium head blight, powdery mildew, rust and net blotch in wheat and barley, using conventional and genomics technologies.

At Amarillo, he will concentrate on the genetic and genomic studies of wheat traits important to the Great Plains region. Some of those traits include: drought and heat tolerance; resistance to diseases such as leaf, stem and stripe rust and wheat streak mosaic virus; and insects such as greenbug, Russian wheat aphid and Hessian fly, as well as good end-use quality of the grain.

Liu's genetic research will be closely coordinated with the traditional wheat-breeding research and development of new wheat varieties, Sweeten said.

Both traditional and molecular breeding techniques will be used to develop germplasm lines with one or more target traits, Liu said. He also will use genomic techniques such as gene mapping, target molecular marker identification, validation and utilization, gene

cloning and gene functional analysis to understand and improve those target traits.

From 1988 to 1996, Liu was a wheat breeder with the Shandong Academy of Agricultural Sciences in Jinan, Shandong, China. He conducted wheat genetics and breeding studies on yield, disease resistance, drought tolerance and quality.

Liu earned his doctorate in plant breeding and genetics from the University of Missouri-Columbia, Columbia, Missouri; his master's degree from Colorado State University, Fort Collins, Colorado; and his bachelor's degree from Shandong Agricultural University, Taian, Shandong, China.
