





### The big cookie search

From the Church Supper Magazine Cookbook. "I search all year for new cookie recipes to try and I give them as gifts to loved ones. I make hundreds of cookies each year." That is from Linda Kappelt of Linesville, Pennsylvania who submitted this cookie recipe to the magazine.

Aren't cookies fun? You will need some parchment paper and a ruler. The folks at church will love you.

#### Chocolate Coconut Slices

Makes about 3 dozen

6 tbsp butter softened 1 cup confectioners' sugar

l egg 2 oz unsweetened chocolate, melted and cooled

2 tsp vanilla extract

1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour

1/2 tsp baking soda

Filling: 1/3 cup cream cheese, softened

1 tsp vanilla extract

1 cup flaked coconut 1/2 cup finely chopped pecans

1. In a small bowl, cream the butter and confectioners' sugar until light and fluffy. Beat in egg, chocolate and vanilla. Combine the flour and baking soda; gradually add to the creamed, mixture and mix well. Refrigerate for one hour.

2. In another bowl, beat the cream cheese and vanilla until smooth. Stir in coconut and nuts. Refrigerate for one hour.

3. Shape dough into an 8 1/2 inch x 6 inch rectangle. Shape coconut mixture into an 8 1/2 inch log; place on dough. Wrap dough around filling, sealing the seam. Wrap in plastic wrap and refrigerate for 2-3 hours or until firm.

4. Cut into 1/4 inch slices. Place 2 inches apart on parchment paper lined baking sheets. Bake at 375 for 10-12 minutes or until set. Remove to wire racks.


The Noon Lions will have a burgers and fries tailgate party for the Chieftains vs. Bushland game on Friday October 8. As always the club appreciates your support.

King David is now a fugitive, running from the established authority to save his life from the hands of the insane King Saul. Where do you go when you are in deep trouble or in great need? Family, government, hospital, church? David goes to the priests and receives help in three specific areas from the priests.

First, the priests provided food for David and his men. In fact, these men are in such great need that the priest gives them the 'holy bread', which was all the 1956 he started work at Sherley Grain Elevators in Bovina and priests had to offer (1 Sam 21:1-6).
