## Chieftains rout Childress in district opener

It was the kind of night coaches dream about and hometown newspapers love to report.

The Friona Chieftains opened district play with 507 yards of offense, including seven touchdowns, two fumble recoveries, three pass interceptions, and a stiff defense in an impressive 46-13 rout of the Childress Bobcats.

The Chiefs scored early on a 6-yard Zack Fair run and Ernesto Monreal point after kick. The same combination later put Friona up 14-0 as Fair scampered 67 yards down the right sideline for the 2<sup>nd</sup> of his three TDs in the game.

Monreal was 2 for 3 on extra point kicks before a recurring groin pull forced him to the sideline. Clayton Smiley took over kicking duties and was also 2 for 3 on extra point kicks. The Chiefs' only two-point conversion attempt failed.

Fair accounted for 119 yards rushing on 10 carries and 141 yards on four pass receptions for an all-purpose yardage total of 260. Fair's third TD came on an 84-yard pass reception from Brenner in the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter.

Fair has a season rushing total of 479 yards on 55 carries and five touchdowns. Monroe is the leading receiver with 17 catches for 401 yards.

The Chieftain offense total was almost evenly split, with 245 rushing yards and 262 passing yards. Quarterback Brenner Barnett was good on 12 of 16 passes for 262 yards and one interception. In addition to the TD pass to Fair,

Barnett connected with Caleb Monroe, who made another leaping catch to spin into the end zone for a 24-yard touchdown. Monroe caught 3 passes for 63 yards and Kirby Frye had 4 catches for 46 yards.

Rushing totals were: Zack

Fair 10-119, Duncan Welch 8-49, Serafin Vazquez 4-32, Chris Garcia 10-32, Brenner Barnett 5-11, and Ernesto Monreal 2-10. Vazquez, Welch, and Barnett each added a touchdown on short runs.

As the Chieftain lead

mounted, by the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter Coach Herbert was able to give most of his reserves some playing experience. The win starts Friona 1-0 in district along with other first night winners Littlefield, Muleshoe, and Bushland. This week

Muleshoe travels to Bushland, Littlefield is at Childress, and the Chieftains make the trip down south to challenge the Lubbock Roosevelt Eagles. Slaton is at River Road. Kickoff in Lubbock is 7:30 p.m. Go Big Red!

## Voter registration deadline is Oct. 4

Texas Secretary of State Hope Andrade is reminding Texans the deadline is approaching if they need to register for the November 2 general election.

The deadline to register to vote is October 4. "Registering to vote is easy," says Andrade. "The voter registration application only has nine questions, including one which asks for your name."

Voter registration applications are available online at the Secretary of State's website, [www.VOTEXAS.org](http://www.VOTEXAS.org) or at county elections offices, and many post offices and libraries.

To register to vote in Texas, you must be a U.S. citizen; be a resident of the county; be at least 17 years and 10 months old (you must be 18 years old by Election Day); not be a convicted felon (unless your sentence is completed, including any probation and parole); and not be declared mentally incapacitated by a court of law.

If a person moves or changes their name after they are registered, they must notify the local voter registrar in their home county of the new information. Texans can check their registration status at [VOTEXAS.org](http://VOTEXAS.org).

To complete a voter registration application, a person must provide a Texas Driver's License number or Texas Personal I.D. number issued by the Texas Department of Public Safety. If a person has neither of those numbers, the applicant is asked to provide the last four digits of their Social Security Number. The number submitted by the applicant is verified before a voter registration certificate is issued.

If none of the required numbers are provided on the application, the person can still be registered, but they must show a proper form of identification at the polling location before they can receive a ballot.

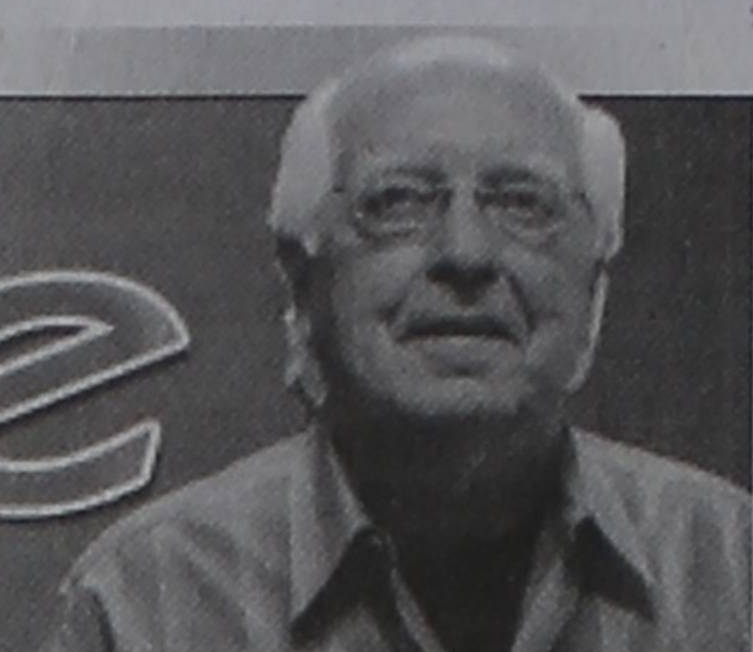

## terrorist threat has roots in U.S. policy

"While al-Qaeda continues to threaten America directly, it also inspires its affiliates and other groups and individuals who share its violent ideology.... Homegrown terrorists represent a new and changing facet of the terrorist threat. To be clear, by 'homegrown,' I mean terrorist operatives who are U.S. persons and who were radicalized in the United States...."

With those words, Homeland Security Secretary Janet Napolitano updated Congress on America's perilous condition. She wasn't quite accurate, however.

It is not al-Qaeda that inspires affiliates and radicalizes homegrown terrorists. It is America's violent policies in the Muslim world. Other government officials have acknowledged that Muslim radicals seek revenge for those policies in the Middle East, Africa, and Central Asia, but Napolitano perpetuates the myth that anti-American activity is unprovoked. The American people deserve to hear the truth.

Napolitano referred to recent unsuccessful attacks in the United States: "Other al-Qaeda affiliates have actually attempted to attack the homeland in recent months. These include Tehrik-e Taliban (TTP) [Pakistan] and al-Qaeda in the Arabian Peninsula (AQAP) [Yemen] —

which, until their respective claims of responsibility for the attempted Times Square and Christmas Day terrorist attacks, had only conducted attacks in their regions."

What she left out was that the U.S. government regularly fires missiles into Pakistan and Yemen from aerial drones, killing innocent people. The desire for revenge is a natural consequence.

Napolitano also warned of al-Shabaab in Somalia, which has taken responsibility for recent bombings in Uganda. But she neglected to mention both U.S. and Ugandan military intervention in Somalia, another Muslim country. Are we to be surprised that young naturalized Somali-Americans would feel impelled to go back to their native country to resist American aggression?

Why won't Napolitano acknowledge that the American empire provokes anti-Americanism? This isn't rocket science. You bomb someone; they get mad and try to get even. Terrorism is the price paid for maintaining an empire. But the imperial masters apparently think it's worth the price. They never suffer; on the contrary, they prosper when they can use the violence to justify further expansion of their power.

And so it goes on, like a

perpetual-motion machine. Each act of the empire provokes a response that serves as a pretext for further imperial action. The battlefield is the world, and the "war on terror" can go on forever. Except for the dead, the maimed, the malnourished, and the taxpayers, it's a sweet deal all around.

That "terrorism" is really vengeance (wrongly exacted from civilians) for earlier crimes of the empire that should come as no shock, though it undoubtedly will. Nevertheless, even the mainstream press has let us in on some relevant facts.

"In roughly a dozen countries — from the deserts of North Africa, to the mountains of Pakistan, to former Soviet republics crippled by ethnic and religious strife — the United States has significantly increased military and intelligence operations, pursuing the enemy using robotic drones and commando teams, paying contractors to spy, and training local operatives to chase terrorists," the *New York Times* reported last month.

"While the stealth war began in the Bush administration, it has expanded under President Obama, who rose to prominence in part for his early opposition to the invasion of Iraq. Virtually none of the newly aggressive steps undertaken by the United

States government have been publicly acknowledged. In contrast with the troop buildup in Afghanistan, which came after months of robust debate, for example, the American military campaign in Yemen began without notice in December and has never been officially confirmed."

In other words, America's fraudulent peace president is using the paramilitary CIA to fight secret wars. They may be described as attacks on "the enemy", but they inevitably kill innocents — while unflinchingly recruiting new militants bent on revenge. In the U.S. government's code book, "the enemy" is anyone who opposes a U.S. military presence in his country.

Who would trust the intelligence agencies to identify actual terrorists, anyway? As Andrew Bacevich, professor of international relations at Boston University, notes, "After September 11, Iraq, Katrina, the financial meltdown, etc., a bit of modesty might be in order."

If the terrorist threat is as real as Napolitano says it is, there's a way to diminish or end it: U.S. out of the Muslim world.

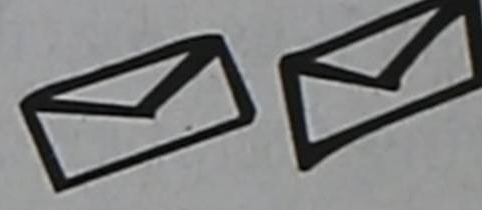
## Letters to the Editor

These are quick to put together and while they are in the oven I go get ready for the day. My children loved them, even when they were toddlers. So says Lisa Walder of Urbana, Illinois, who submitted this short recipe to the Church Supper Cookbook magazine.

Not sure if this is a candidate for a church supper unless you belong to a really small church that likes baked eggs. Three ingredients. Makes 6 servings. Even I could manage that. Except I don't have any muffin cups.

### Eggs in muffin cups

Serves 6

- 12 thin slices deli roast beef
- 6 slices process American cheese, quartered
- 12 eggs

Press one slice of beef onto the bottom and up the sides of each greased muffin cup, forming a shell. Arrange two cheese pieces in each shell. Break one egg into each cup.

Bake, uncovered, at 350 for 20-25 minutes or until eggs are completely set.

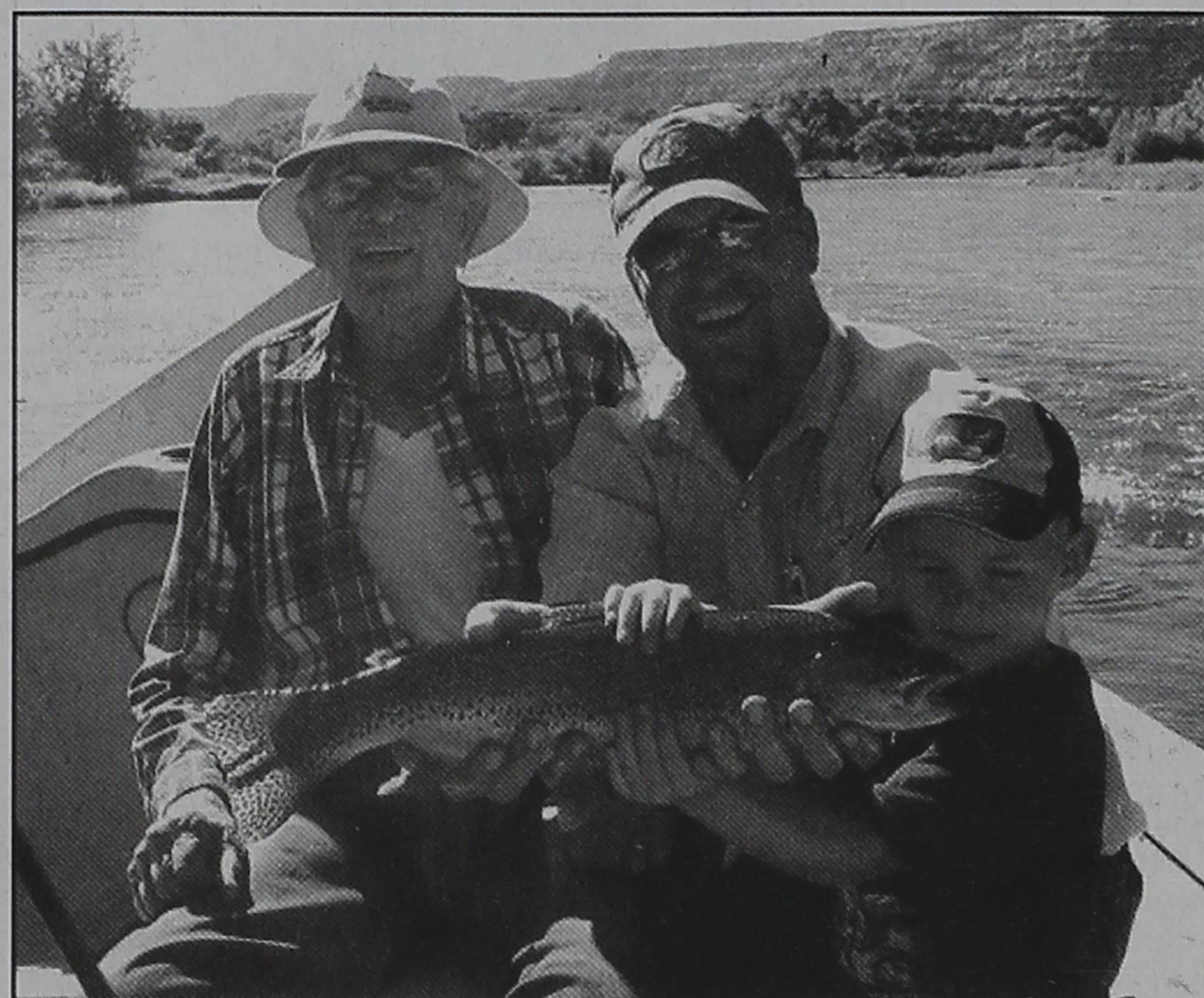

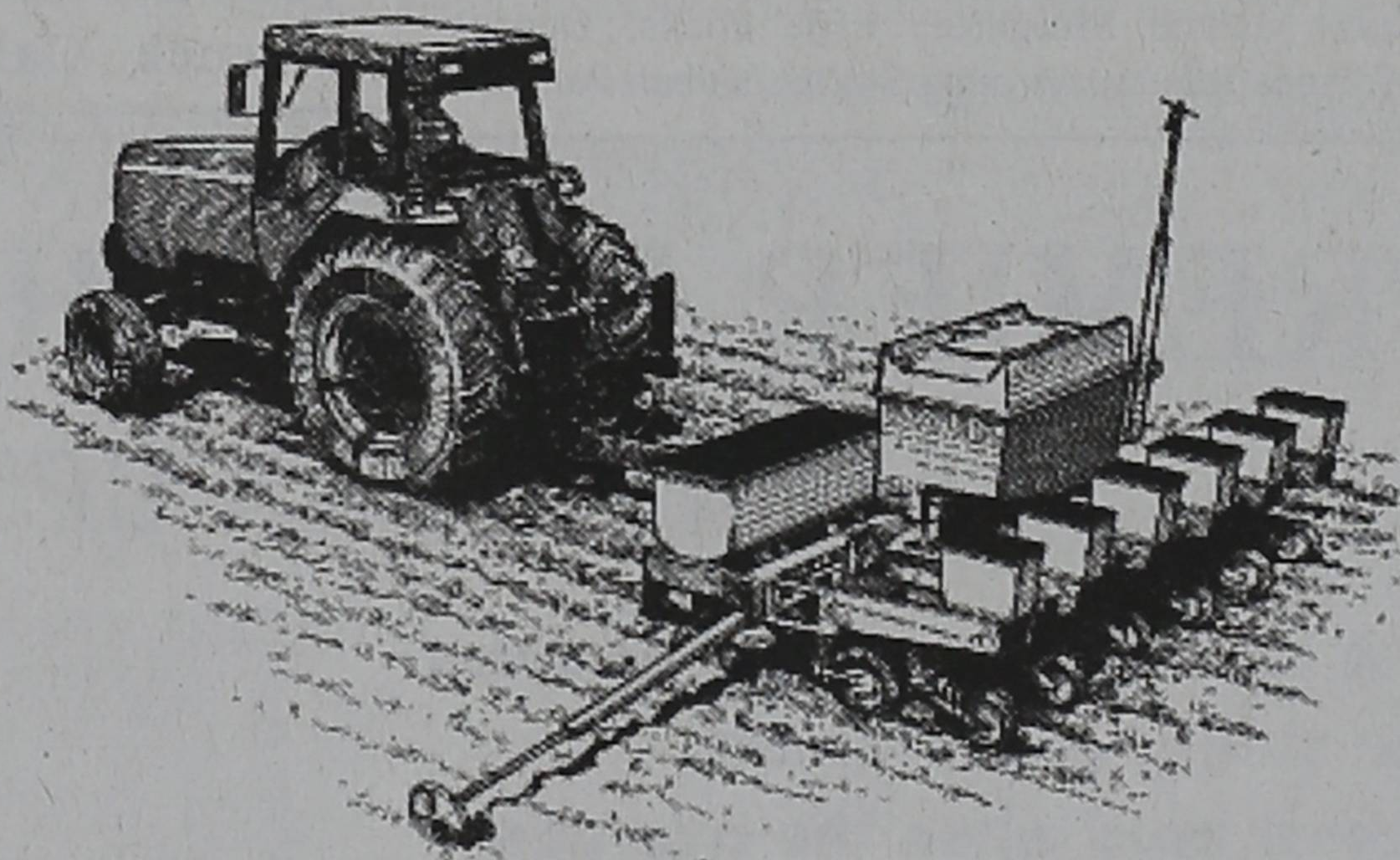

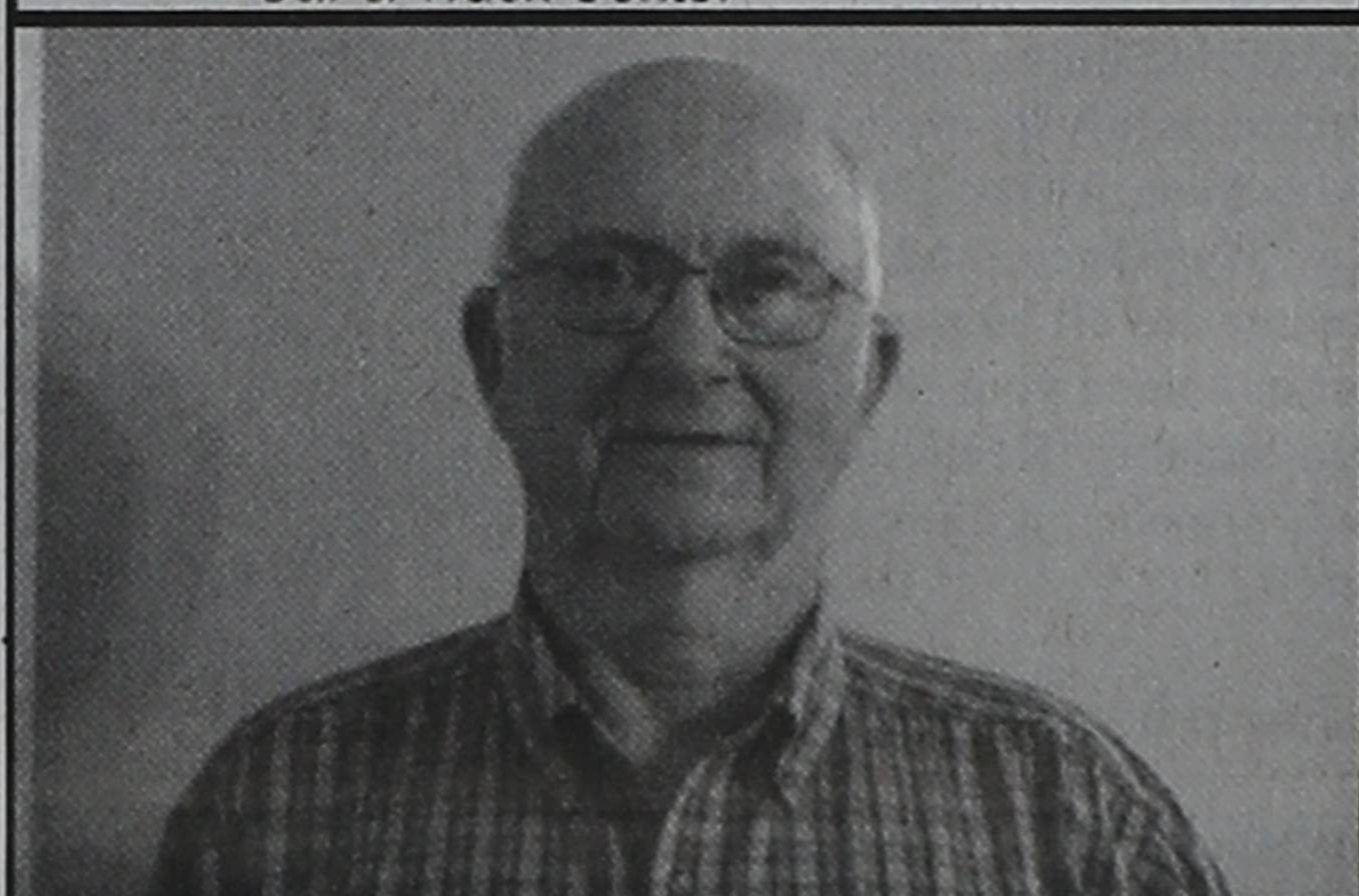

## Seliger announces 2010-2011 high school aerospace scholars

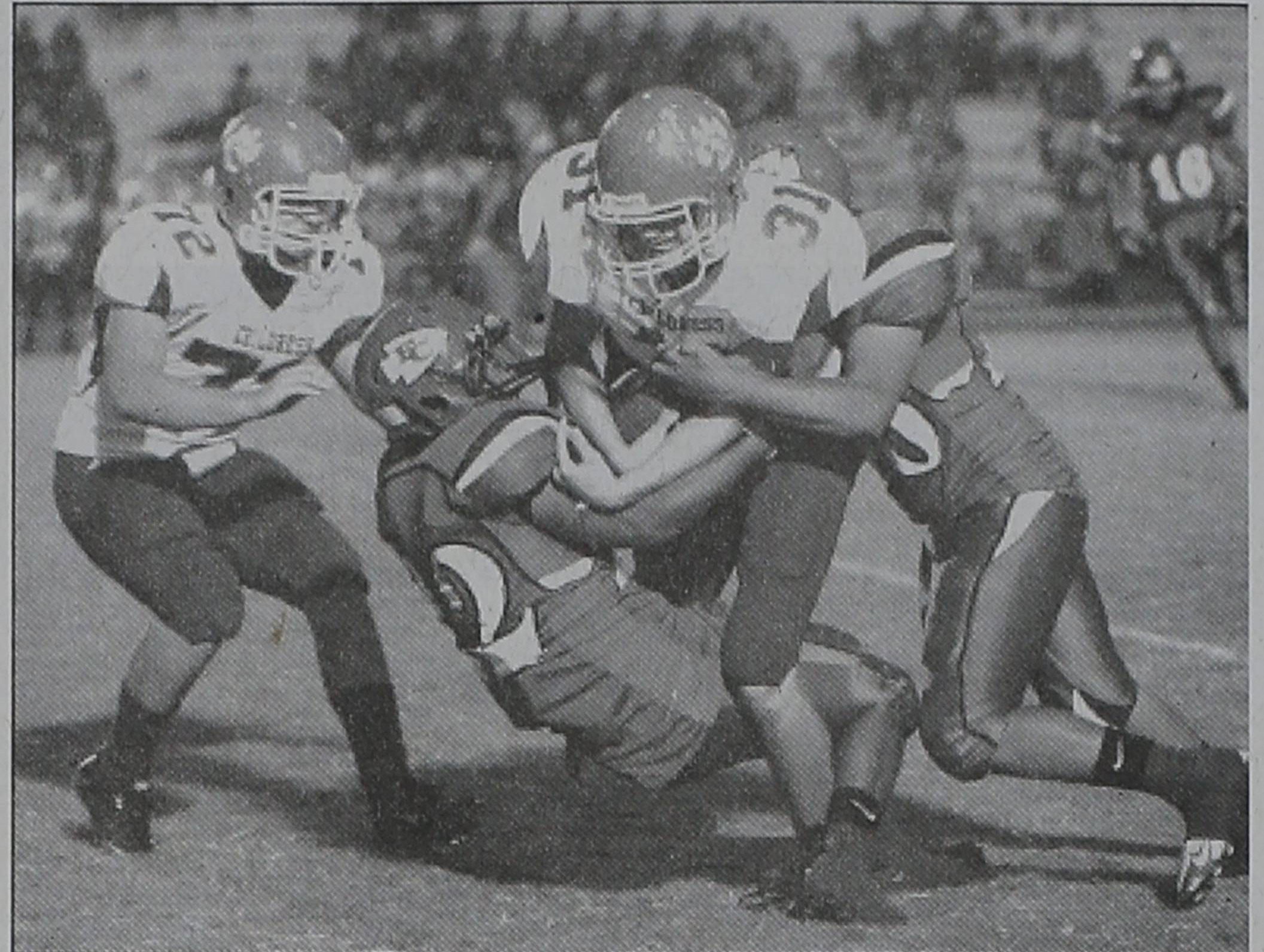
first on an 83-yard touchdown pass. Friona countered with a 75-yard interception return for a touchdown by Marco Terrones.

## Chief freshmen beat Childress

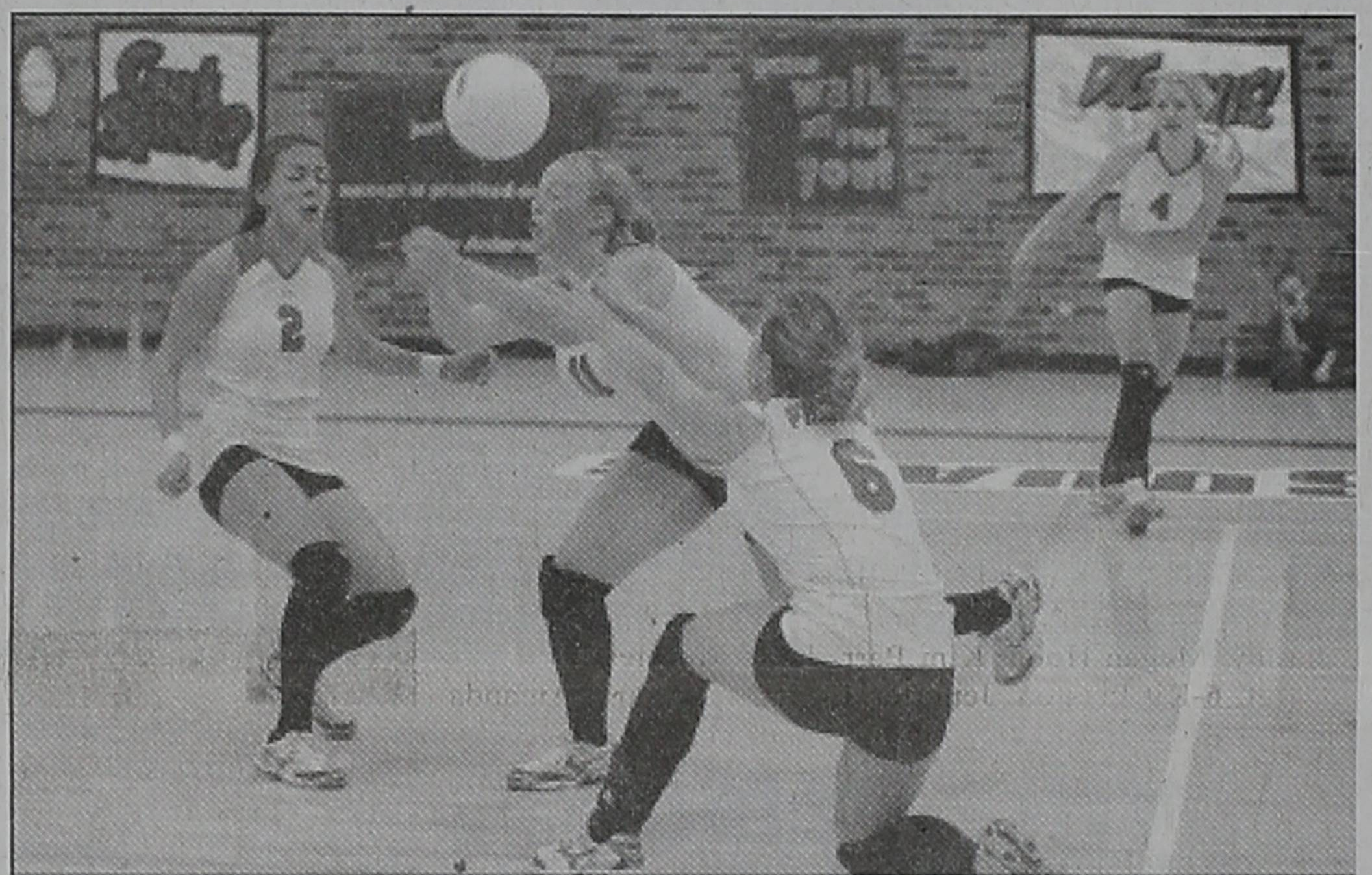

## Squaws lose to Arbor & Lubbock Christian

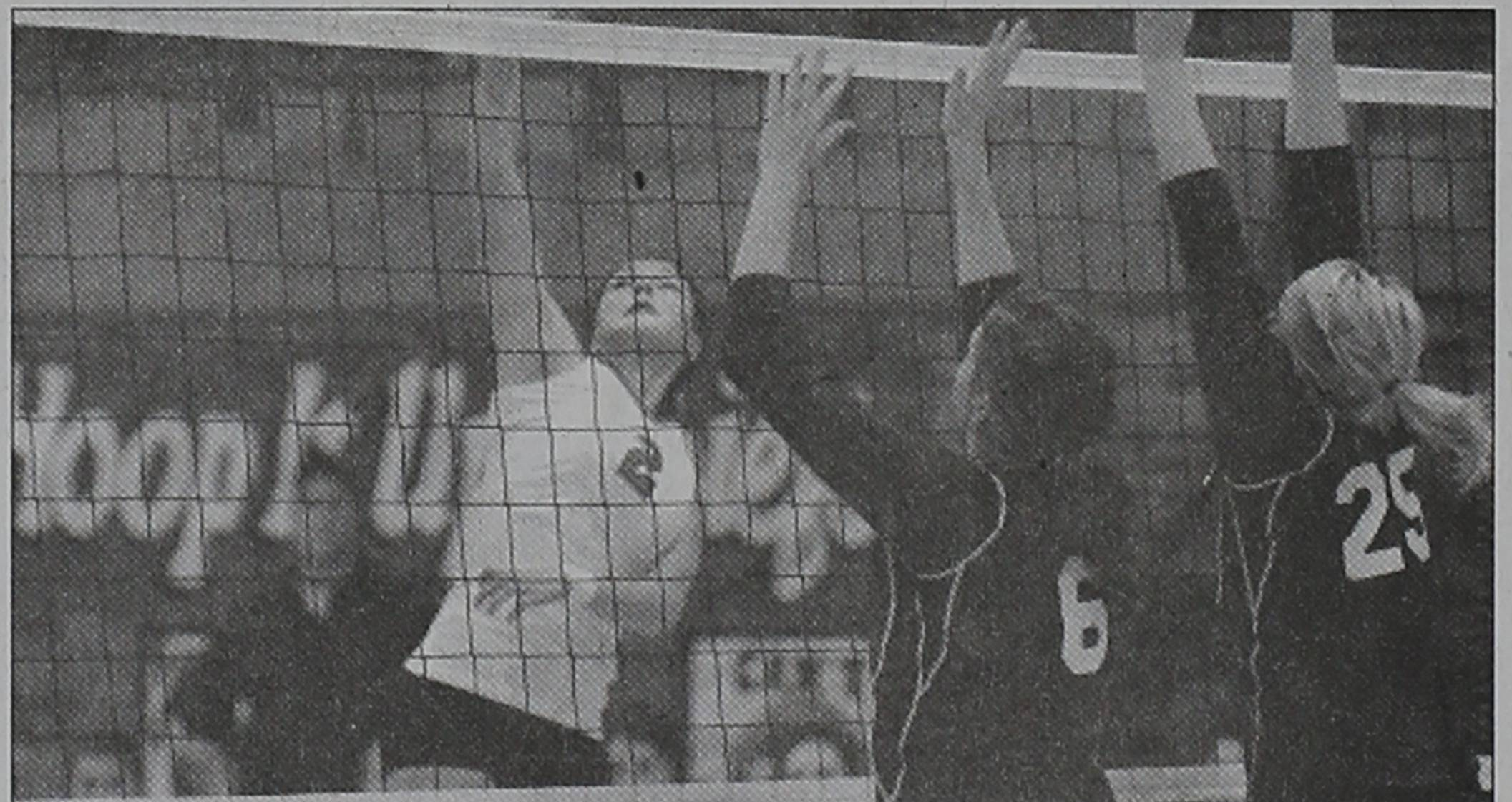

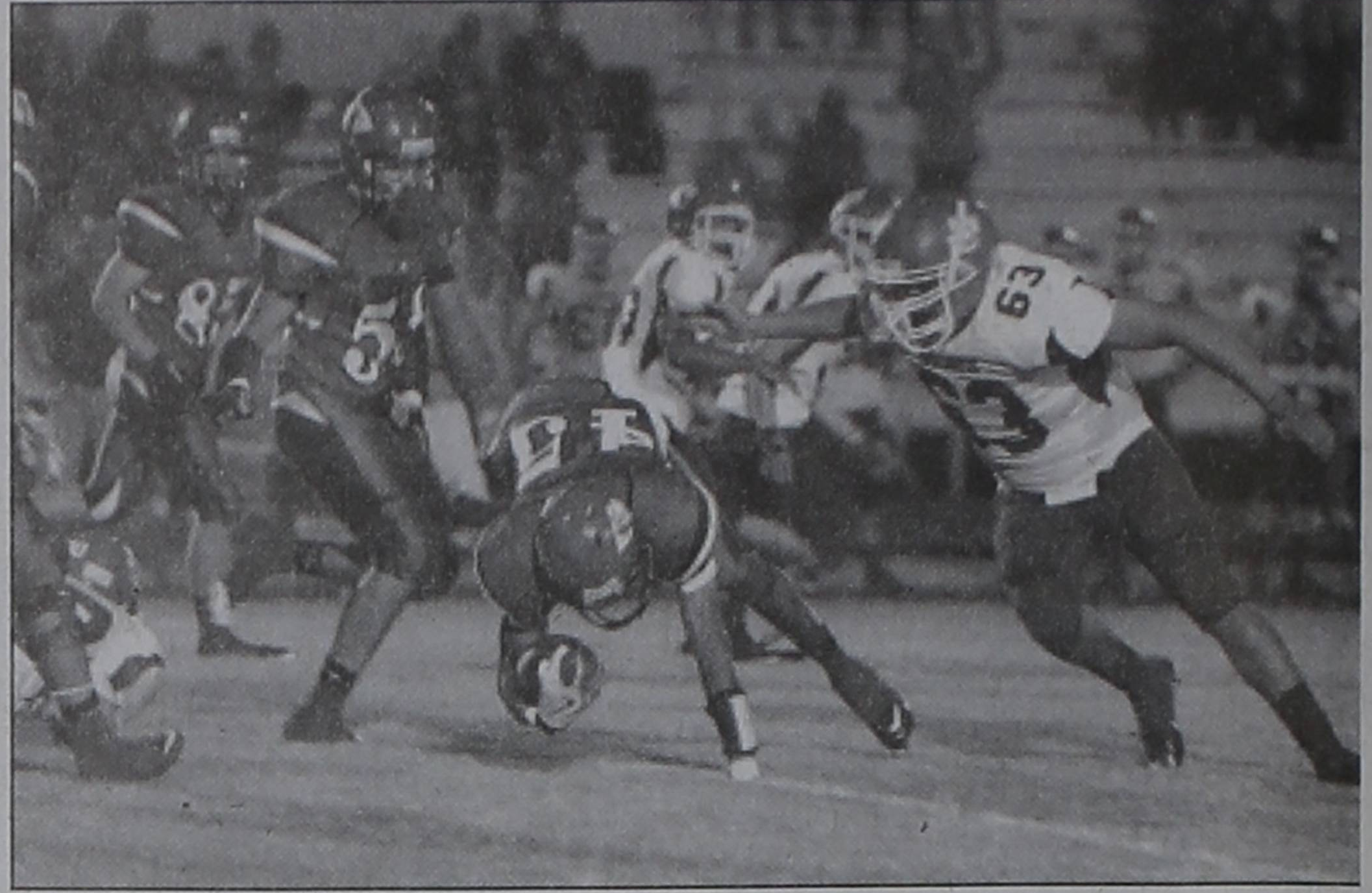

**Former high school guitar friends reunite after 40 years**

Dale Westbrook and Orval Blake were high school buddies in Friona in 1952. They shared an interest in music, playing guitars together for places like the Legion Hall Teen Twenty Club and at school functions.

Dale Westbrook moved to Friona in 1951. He and Blake met in 1952. On October 3, 1954, Westbrook married Mary Bell McGlothlin.

In 1955 Blake joined the army and got out in 1957 and married Phyllis Hinds. Westbrook also joined the Army in 1958 and got out in 1960 and moved back to Friona.

The two saw each other occasionally after that but lost contact in 1965. They didn't see each other for the next 40+ years.

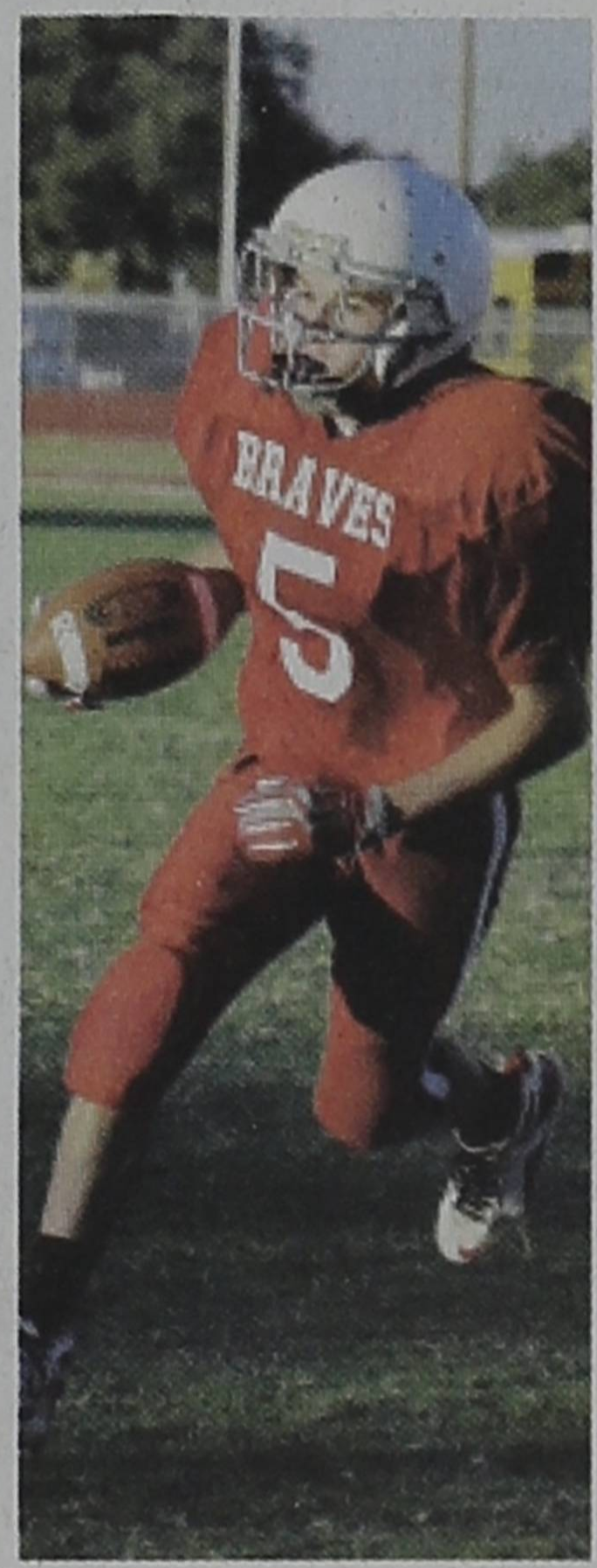
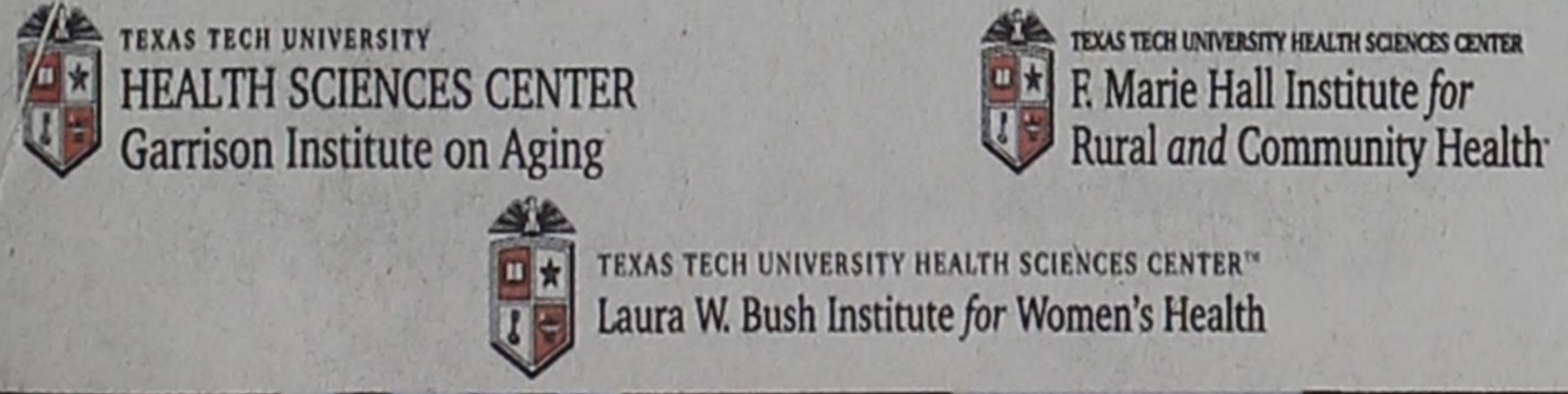
**What is involved?** The study takes 3-4 hours and involves a medical exam, blood work, an interview and memory testing. Participants are also reimbursed \$50 for their time.

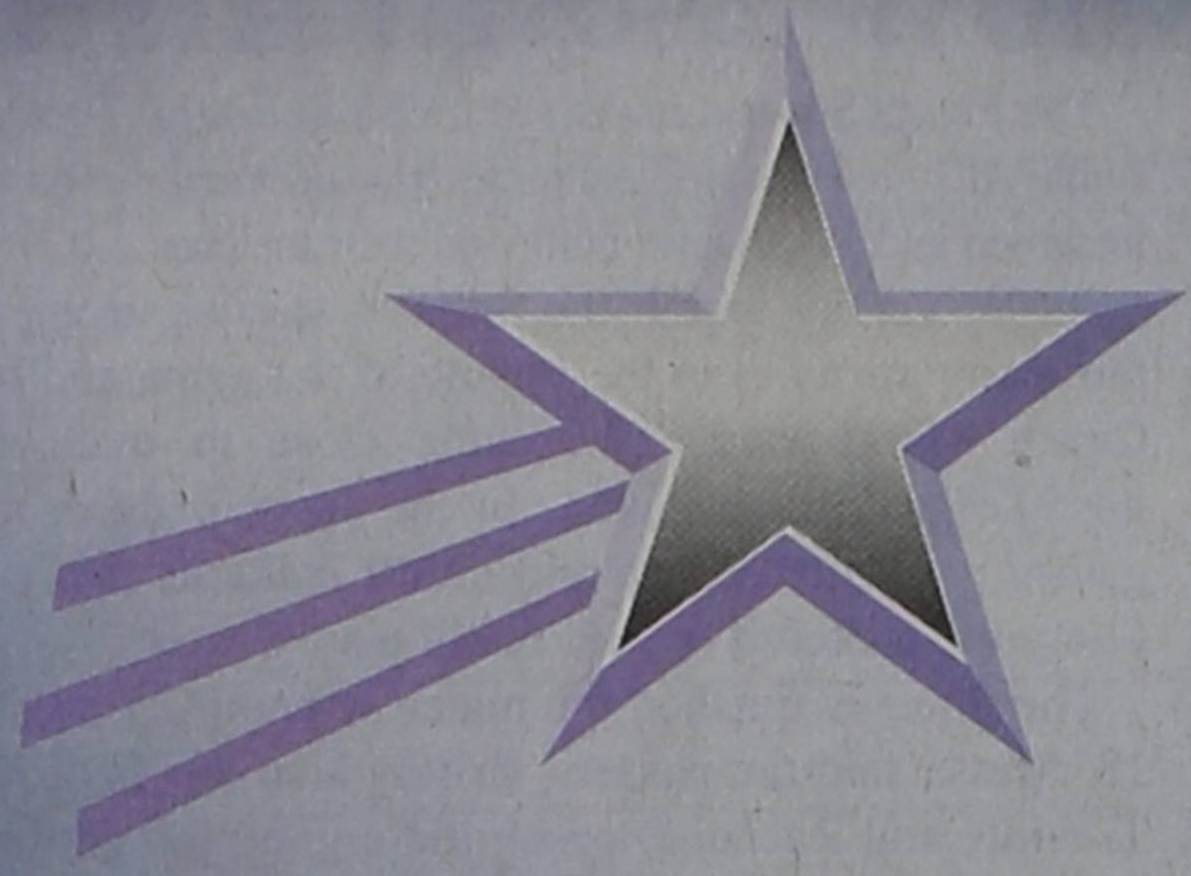
