
Tours of the facility will be available during grand opening hours. Immediately following the



it's a diet cola for seniors this year

No COLA for you. Not the drinking kind of Cola, although the government doesn't want you to have those sugary drinks either. This COLA is the Cost of Living Adjustment which governs annual increases in monthly Social Security checks. For seniors, 2011 will be a "Diet COLA" year. The Social Security Administration sent out a four-page press release last week explaining why Social Security recipients will not get a raise for the second consecutive year. Here is a small excerpt from their press release. It should clear up their reasoning and make you feel better:

"The Social Security Act provides for an automatic increase in Social Security and SSI benefits if there is an increase in the Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W) from the third quarter of the last year a cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) was determined to the third quarter of the current year. As determined by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, there is no increase in the CPI-W from the third quarter of 2008, the last year

a COLA was determined, to the third quarter of 2010, therefore, under existing law, there can be no COLA in 2011."

Those on fixed Social Security income will not get a raise in January 2011. However, there is a possibility your Medicare premiums might increase. They say 70 percent of current Social Security recipients will be "protected" if Medicare Part B premiums increase. I hope that means you.

If your monthly check does not go up and your Medicare premium does go up, that is a decrease in earnings isn't it?

For those of you still working, Social Security deductions of 7.65% will be withheld on the first \$106,800 of your earnings. That comes out of your check. Your employer also pays 7.65% for your Social Security and Medicare account.

So if you make \$106,800 in 2011, you will pay \$8,170.20 in Social Security deductions and your employer will pay the same amount, over and above your income.

But none of that real-

ly matters to the elderly and infirm living solely on their fixed Social Security monthly income. Chances are some of their "cost-of-living" has increased in spite of government formulas. Chances are their utilities, prescriptions, rent, food, and gasoline expenses have indeed increased but the government doesn't think so.

It doesn't take much of a cost-of-living increase to shrink the income of those who depend on Social Security.

There are said to be 58 million Americans that receive Social Security benefits. Even a small percentage increase for that many people is a huge increase for the government. Yet the COLA formula became law in 1975 and increases have been given every year since then, except for 2010 and 2011.

There is a certain segment of the Congress that wants to change the qualifications for receiving Social Security. They propose to make people prove they need Social Security before they can receive it. In other words if you retire

with a big nest egg and are living well in a big house with some big cars, checking your stocks and mutual funds every day, they might consider you "not in need" and deny paying you your own Social Security money.

I'm told there are many wealthy folks in America that never apply for Social Security because they do not need it. I'm not sure Social Security is a fair system. Some people pay into it all their lives, then die an untimely death and nobody gets the money. It is not available to leave to your heirs. Others end up living a long time and drawing more than they paid in.

In any event, you old folks, if you count on your monthly Social Security for food and medicine, better tighten the belt on your robe, draw your shawl up a little tighter, and live on what you've got for another year. Never mind that the government is spending trillions on other stuff, you won't get any of it. What can you do about it?

You can always hope for a change.

Meat loaf fit for a taco

More tasty food from the Church Supper Cookbook magazine. The recipe says it makes two loaves to serve 12 people.

Susan Garoutte of Georgetown, Texas, submitted it to the magazine. She says, "We live in Texas and love our region's style of cooking. This recipe spices up plain meat loaf so it tastes like a filling for tacos."

I'm not a big kidney bean fan but mixed with all the other ingredients this sounds tasty for a church supper or a weekend party at home.

Taco Meat Loaves

Two loaves, serves 6 each

- 3 eggs lightly beaten
- 2 cups picante sauce, divided
- 1 can (16 oz) kidney beans, rinsed and drained
- 1 can (11 oz) Mexican, drained
- 1 med onion chopped
- 2 cans (2 1/2 oz ea) sliced ripe olives drained
- 1/4 cup dry bread crumbs
- 1 envelope taco seasoning
- 1 tsp ground cumin
- 1 tsp chili powder
- 2 lbs ground beef
- 2 cups (8 oz) shredded cheddar
- Additional picante sauce optional

1. In a large bowl combine the eggs, 1/2 cup picante sauce, beans, corn, onion, bread crumbs, taco seasoning, cumin, and chili powder. Crumble beef over mixture and mix well.

2. Pat into two ungreased 9 in. X 5 in. loaf pans. Bake uncovered at 350 for 50-55 minutes or until no pink remains and a meat thermometer reads 160.

3. Spoon remaining picante sauce over each meat loaf. Sprinkle with cheese. Bake 15-20 minutes longer or until cheese is melted. Let stand for 10 minutes before slicing. Serve with additional picante sauce if desired.



Caleb Monroe was the leading receiver for the Chiefs, grabbing five passes for 85 yards and one touchdown. Other receivers were Kirby Frye 3 catches for 27 yards, Dominique Kellum 3 for 13, Serafin Vasquez 1 for 15, Eduardo Rojas 1 for 8,

Chris Garcia 1 for 5, Nick Ortiz 1 for 5, and Diego Licerio 1 for 11.

The Chieftains will host the Slaton Tigers Friday October 22 at Chieftain Field.

Proposed UIL regulation changes

Some proposed changes from the UIL to take effect next year were discussed at a UIL Legislative Council meeting Monday. The information was provided to the Friona Star from the Texas Press Association.

On recommendation of the Medical Advisory Committee of the UIL, the Legislative Council passed an amendment to alter the current UIL Concussion Management Protocol, taking effect August 2, 2011. The UIL will adopt the regulations for concussion management currently in place from the National Federation of State High School Associations.

After extensive discussion of increasing the distance

for girls cross country from 3,200 meters to 5,000 meters, the UIL Council instructed UIL staff to continue to study the issue for Conferences 4A and 5A only. The study will be presented at the meeting of the Standing Committee on Athletics in June 2011.

In other action the Council approved a proposal to establish an initial set of contest rules to conduct a Chess Puzzle Solving pilot event in grades 2-8. If approved the amendment will go into effect immediately.

Some other items approved by the Council will take effect August 1, 2011, if approved by the Commissioner of Education. They are:

Allowing interschool football scrimmages to be scheduled after six days of contact practices instead of seven: Allowing critiques when using panel judging in One-Act Play:

Allowing all players to participate in the team playoff in golf:

Adding verification period for all journalism contests: Allowing three games to be substituted in place of a tournament in baseball and softball.

The Commissioner of Education must approve amendments passed by the UIL Legislative Council before they take effect. All approved amendments are published at www.uiltexas.org/leaguer.

Calving clinic in Miami Nov 2

Texas AgriLife Extension Service will host the "Improving Beef Reproductive Efficiency: Calving Clinic" November 2 at the Roberts County Project Center in Miami.

"We can make every effort to improve the reproductive efficiency of our cow herd, but it's all for nothing if we don't get a live calf on the ground," said Brandon Dukes, AgriLife Extension agent in Roberts County.

Knowing when cows or heifers need assistance with calving is an extremely important skill producers must possess, Dukes said.

The clinic will include a demonstration of delivery of a calf with emphasis on appropriate timing and proper techniques of intervention to assist calving heifers and cows with dystocia.

The program will begin at 11:30 a.m. with registra-

tion, followed by a free lunch sponsored by Cattle County and Hi-Pro Feeds. RSVPs are requested by October 28.

The program will include Dukes discussing selection for calving ease with Dr. Buddy Faries, AgriLife Extension program leader for veterinary medicine in College Station, conducting the demonstration.


