## Halloween traffic accident injures two

A vehicle/pedestrian accident Sunday evening injured a mother and daughter.

The accident happened at 5th and Geneva St. at 8:40 p.m. when Petronila Tino, 22, was carrying her 2-year-old daughter and attempted to cross 5th St.

They were struck when they stepped in front of a 2004 Chevrolet pickup traveling eastbound driven by Shamarie Schumacher,

21, of Hereford. Her 3-year-old daughter was a passenger in the pickup.

Ms. Tino was airlifted to Northwest Texas Hospital in Amarillo with serious head and neck injuries. Her daughter was treated at Parmer Medical Center for a cut on her forehead and released. Friona Police Chief Tino Salinaz said it appeared to be an accident and no charges will be filed at this time.

## Council to consider street light request

The Friona city council will meet in regular session Monday November 8, 2010, in council chambers at 619 Main St. All regular council meetings are open to the public.

There are six action items on the agenda. The final official council meeting agenda is posted at city hall 72 hours prior to the meeting.

Items to be considered include approval of the October meeting minutes, hear the Library report given by Librarian Darla Bracken, and consider a request for a street light at 603 W. 15th St. which is at the Boy Scout house next to the community center.

The council will consider two resolutions.

One will authorize the city's participation in the Panhandle Regional Planning Commission (PRPC) fiscal year 2011 regional hazard mitigation plan update project.

The second resolution would deny an application by Southwestern Public Service Company seeking authority to implement a summer only credit option allowing SPS to interrupt service and a proposed voluntary customer load reduction program. Approval of Resolution 10.11.08A would deny the SPS request.

Also on the agenda is a discussion of the city's accounts payable and the financial statement for October.

## Friona State Bank returning to state bank charter

## Hospital visitation and parking reminder

Parmer Medical Center reminds everyone that the new main entrances to the hospital and the Friona Rural Health Clinic are open for public use. The information in last week's paper was incorrect in regard to the hours the hospital main entrance is open.

The new main entrance will be open during normal visitation hours of 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. seven days a week. Patients visiting the hospital for laboratory or diagnostic imaging service, physical therapy, making a payment, or visiting a hospital patient are requested to use the main entrance during these hours.

The main parking lot is also available to clinic patients during normal clinic hours.

Emergency patients are to enter through the Emergency Room entrance on the north side of the building. Parking is available on 14th Street for emergency visits.

The existing parking across the street on the east side of Cleveland will be employee parking. The current temporary entrances to the hospital and clinic are limited to employee use. Questions regarding the new parking may be directed to Heidi Eichenauer at 806-250-2754.

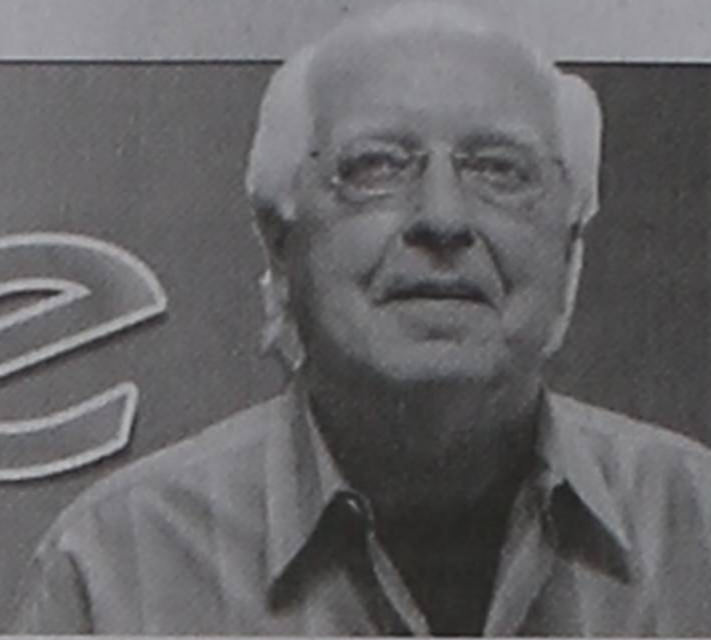

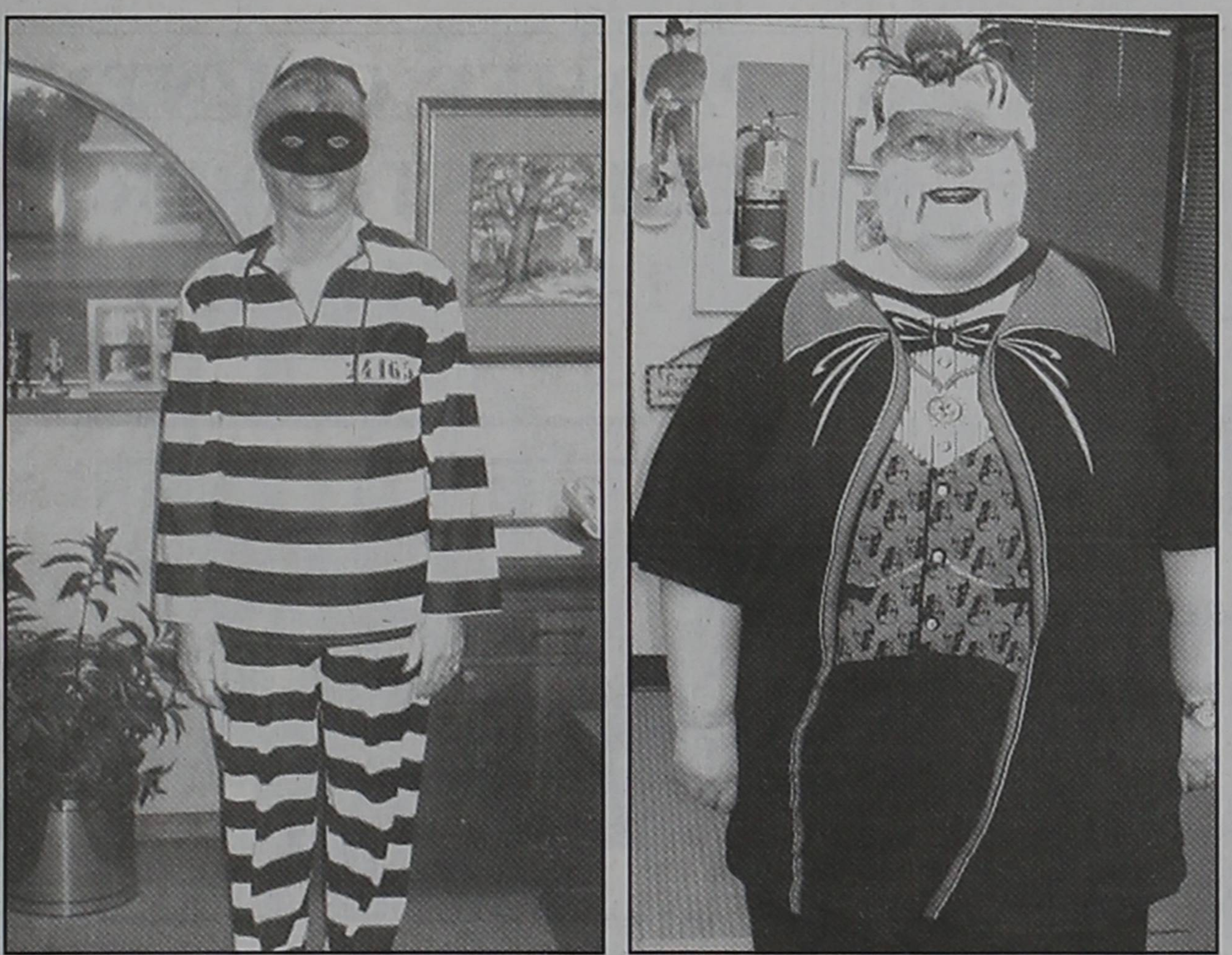
At Prairie Acres, Elizabeth Romero already has her Adopt-A-Resident list available. If you are interested in adopting a resident this year

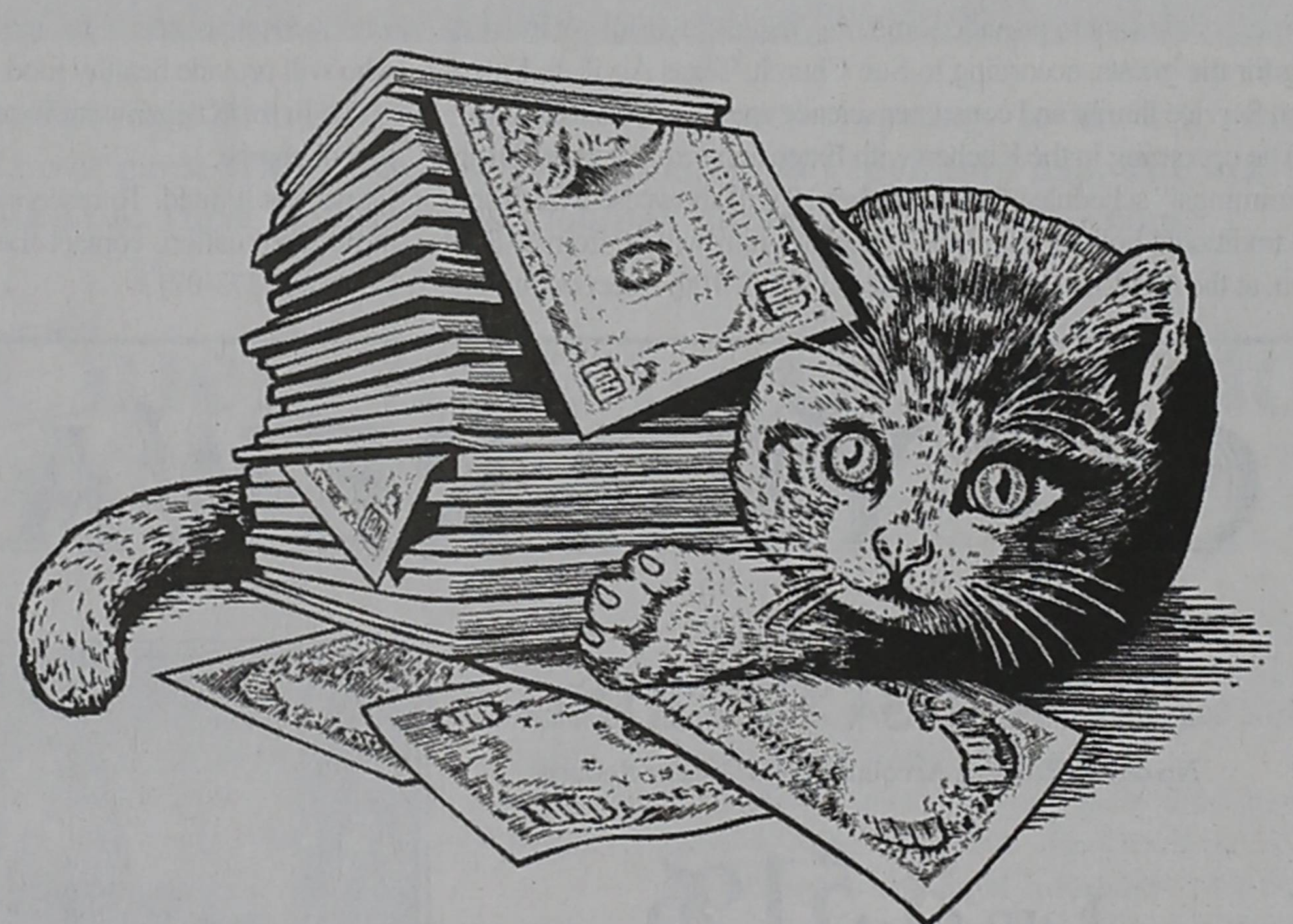

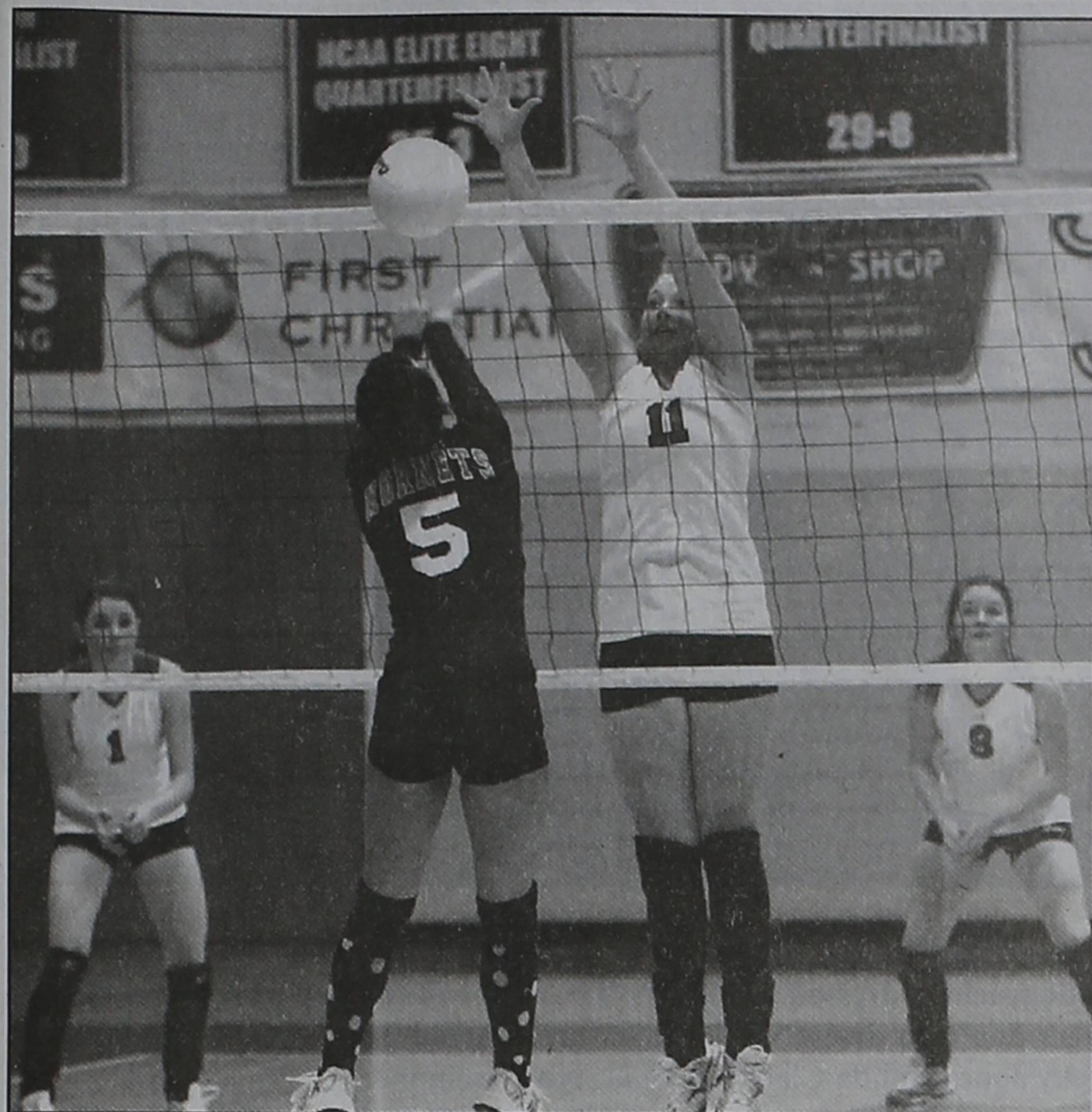

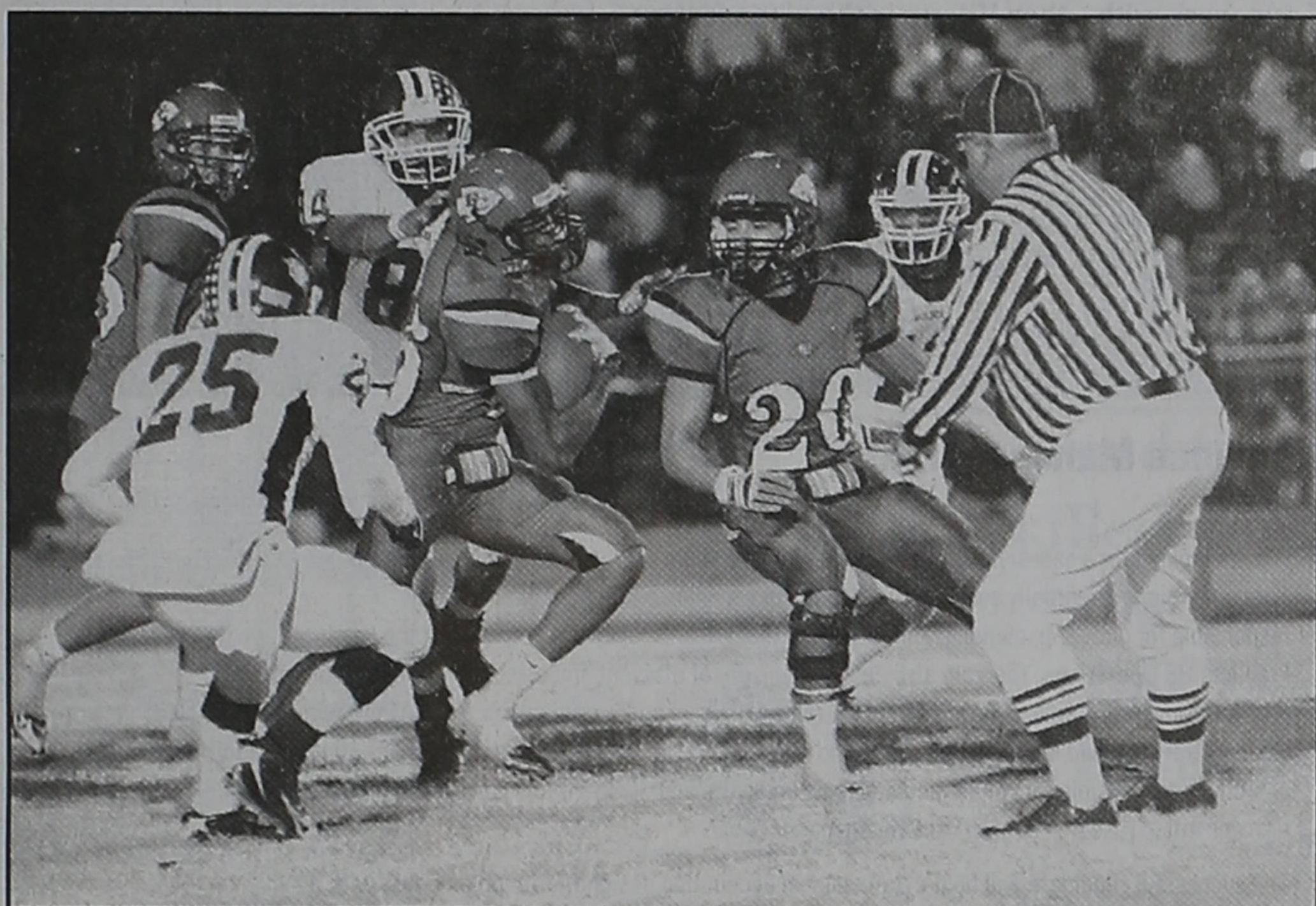

## And Literacy for All @ your library

The Friends of the Friona Public Library led by Literacy Chair Kip Kimbrough selected "Let Freedom Ring: Teaching Lifelong Competencies" as the theme for their Texas Book Festival Literacy Grant application. Laura Bush instigated the Texas Book Festival in 1995 by inviting authors to come to Austin, Texas, talk about their books and help raise money to support libraries and literacy in the state. Our library has received a \$5,000 Grant award which arrived in April just in time for the Friends Spring Newsletter Field Notes. It is the third Texas Book Festival Grant for our library.

As a result of that newsletter, Friends members Linda White and Sharon White, two certified ESL [English as a Second Language] teachers, shared that they had also been thinking of starting a class and agreed to join our effort. They approached Reg. 16 Learning Center in Amarillo and secured a grant for our area to provide classroom materials, instruction and certification if a needs assessment survey indicated need. Our literacy

team distributed the survey locally in July and found 120 very interested people! After a brief meeting with Reg. 16 in May to discuss a basic working agreement, work began in earnest. The City of Friona agreed to allow the Friends use of the Redeemer Center and also signed agreements with Region 16 in August.

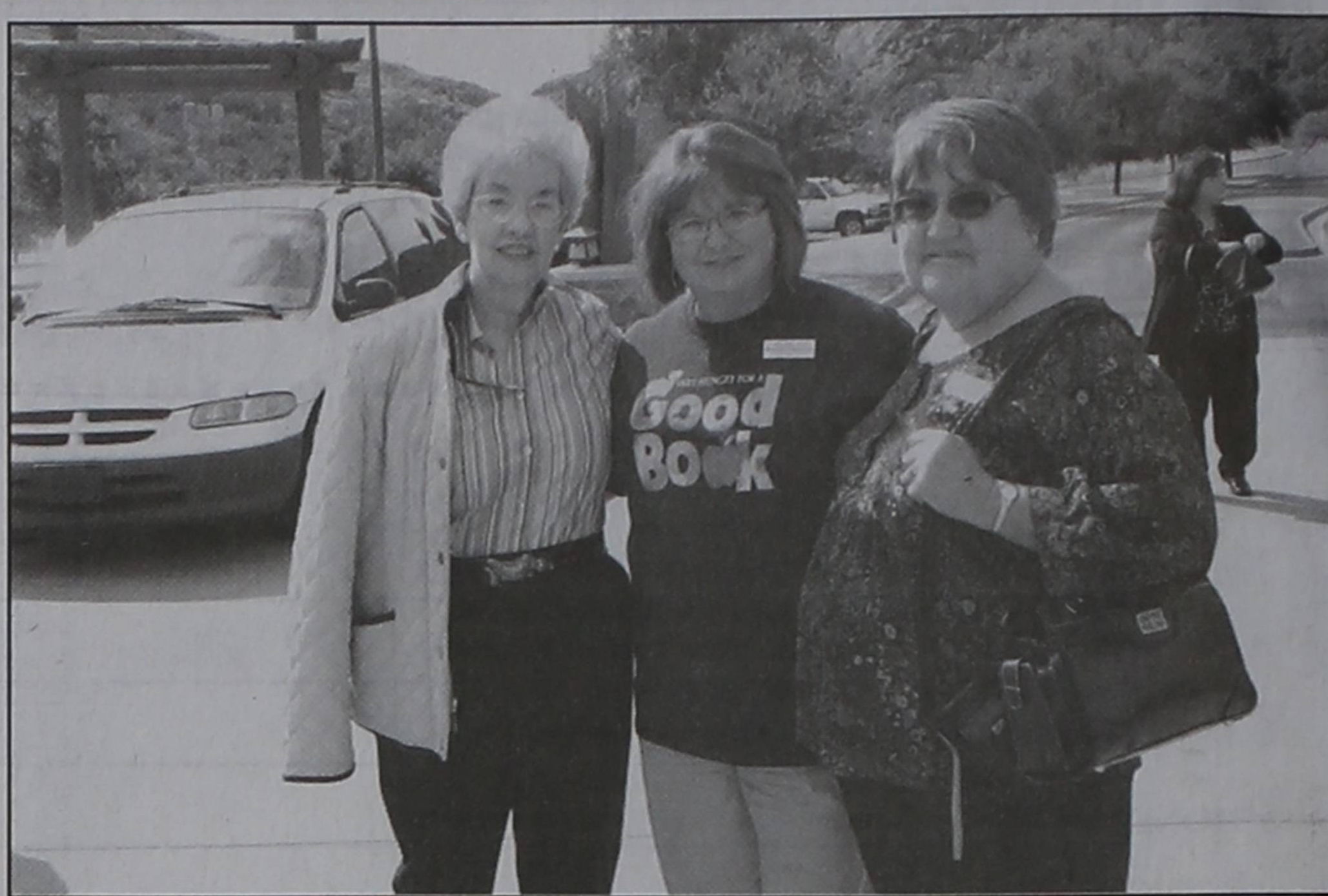
Also in August, as the first expenditure from their Centennial Endowment Fund, the Friends installed new flooring, carpet and tile, in the Redeemer Center, at 1304 Virginia. The building, owned by the City of Friona since 1999, was a gift from members of the Redeemer Lutheran Church.

The City of Friona will provide major repairs, furnishings, utilities, insurance and security, grounds keeping and cleaning of the facility. In addition, the Friends will provide teaching and presentation equipment, furnishings, minor maintenance/repair and supplies. Other partners in this endeavor include: Gifts in Kind, WIC, Campbell Electric, Cargill Meat Solutions, Hugh Moseley, et al. There continues to be on-

going needs; so if you are interested in supporting this project, please contact the library at 109 W. 7th or call 250-3200 to get a copy of the wish list.

On September 30, those who had participated in the survey in July took placement tests given by a team from Reg. 16. Forty-two students registered for the first class and there are approximately 35 are on the waiting list. Classes began October 5 and will continue for 12 weeks or 60 hours of instruction. "This is just one phase of the vision the literacy committee has for the family literacy center. We are planning to eventually sponsor all types of literacy and information training—health and wellness, financial planning, basic computer technology, as well as GED, ESL—i.e. whatever the need," said a spokesman for the group.

## Grant announcement honors local library

The Robert and Ruby Priddy Charitable Trust of Wichita Falls, Texas, has announced that 32 rural public libraries (18 libraries in Texas and 14 in Oklahoma) will receive between 500 - 600 Spanish and bi-lingual (Spanish/English) children's books each, as part of the "AMO LEER/I Love to Read" grant project. These books are aimed at a third grade reading level and younger. The Priddy Charitable Trust believes that encouraging every child to read is essential to help children in school as well as in daily life.

In the last few years, small rural areas in Texas and Oklahoma have seen a rapid increase in their Hispanic populations, especially families with small children. Public libraries, with their limited budgets, have not been able to keep up with the changing demographics. The lack of a sufficient and a culturally sensitive book collection directly impacts the literacy skills of these children.

When Hispanic families with children, whose native language is Spanish, visit the

public library, they're faced with a limited collection of books in their native language. This discourages them from helping their children with reading and in enhancing their own literacy skills.

Research shows that children who are read to and learn to read in their native language will have an easier time learning to read in their second language, such as English, than children who never learned how to read in their first language. This means that by developing early literacy skills in Spanish, parents will make it easier for their children to learn to speak, read, and write English in the future. A recent Harvard research study has shown the importance of exposing Hispanic children to books so they can eventually become proficient readers in both languages.

Through their research, Harvard recommends to "target and increase the frequency of book reading and storytelling, as well as other related language and literacy activities, in Latino families in order to keep Latino children devel-

opmentally on par with their white peers after nine months of age."

Public libraries can help make such a difference by offering a wide range of expertly selected culturally appropriate Spanish and bi-lingual books for children. The "AMO LEER/I Love to Read" project was developed to do exactly that. The intention is to help Hispanic children become life-long readers and library users because of the quality of reading materials that they can find in their public libraries at an early age.

"Friona Public Library is very proud to be named as one of the recipients of the 2010 Amo Leer Grant Award. Over 800 books have arrived and will be ready for the shelf soon," stated Darla Bracken, Library Director. Canyon Area Library, Deaf Smith County Library, Hereford, and the Childress Area Library join Friona Public Library as recipients chosen from the Panhandle of Texas.
