## Cargill to award scholarships for class of 2011

Cargill will award \$350,000 in scholarships to high school seniors who live in communities where Cargill has operations, and plan to enroll in post-secondary education next fall.

The national program will award 350 scholarships of \$1,000. In addition, each recipient's high school will receive a \$200 grant.

## Neugebauer promises immediate spending cuts

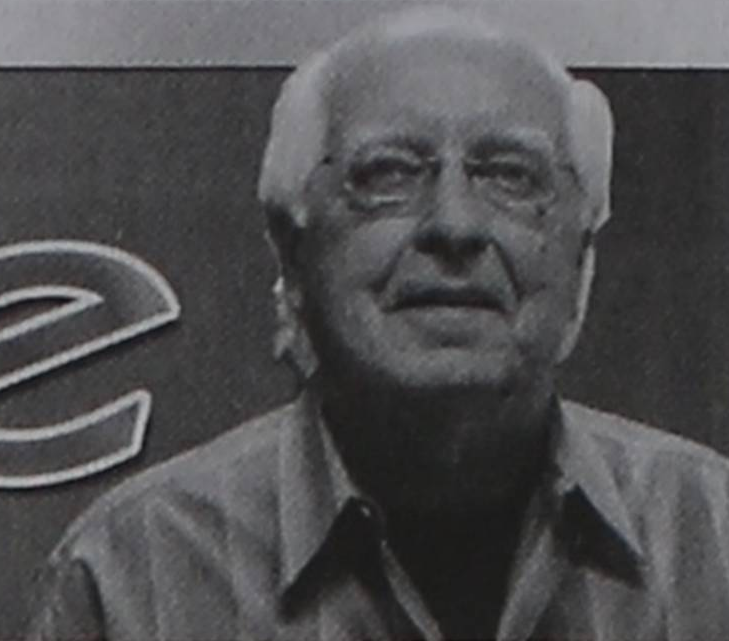
Congressman Randy Neugebauer released the following statement regarding his vote on the tax bill:

Dear Editor,

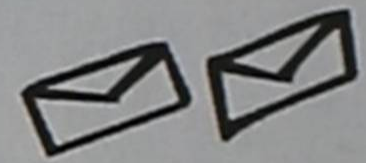

During the last 44 years she has made many trips to Friona where she has met and formed a friendship with many of its citizens.

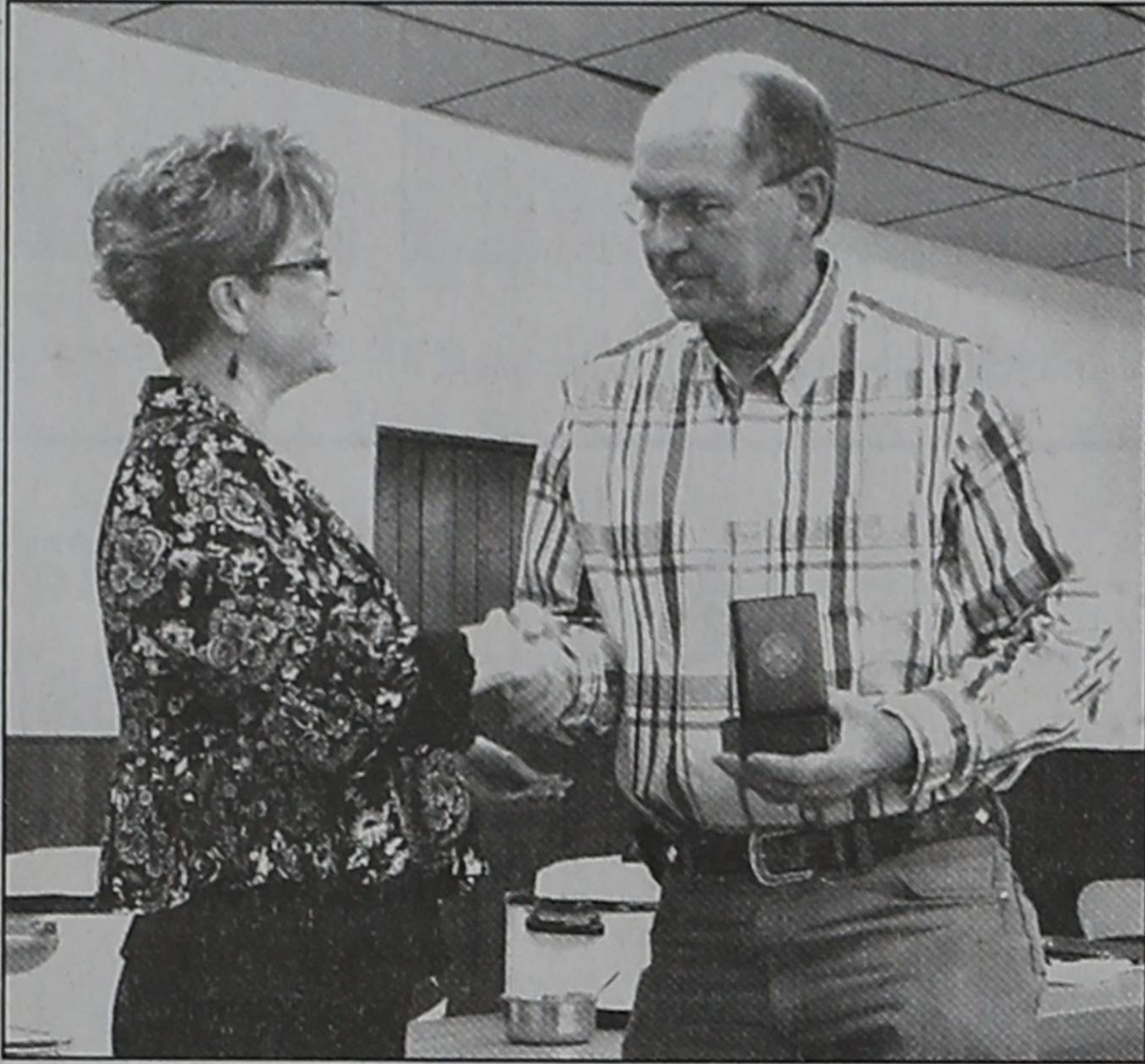

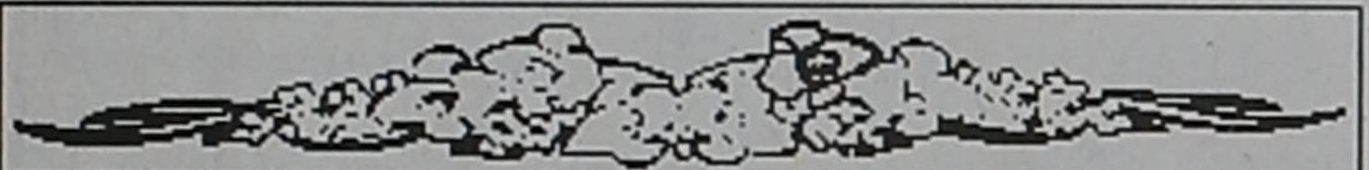
