





DPS warns of solicit scams

The Texas Department of Public Safety would like to remind the public about private organizations that solicit funds.

Private organizations claiming to be with the Texas Department of Public Safety have been calling Texas residents in various parts of the state, claiming to be raising funds to help the families of a Texas Trooper recently killed in the line of duty. Some groups include in their names the terms "Texas Rangers," "State Troopers," "Texas Highway Patrol," or "Department of Public Safety."

Texas residents should know that the Texas Department of Public Safety NEVER solicits financial contributions from private citizens. The Department will NEVER call you at your home or business to solicit cash donations. The Department is funded from your tax dollars.

The Department advises you not to give money to these groups, as the funds are not likely to go to the causes that are claimed. The Department does not receive any of these funds, even if the telemarketers say that the Department does.

The Department of Public Safety would like you to remember that while some officers may be members of some of these associations on their own time these organizations are not affiliated with the Department. They are private associations raising money to fund their own programs, some of which may benefit officers and their families.

Lubbock Regional Commander Billy Fulton says, "The officers of the Department of Public Safety and their families greatly appreciate the support offered by the citizens of Texas. The Lubbock Region lost two outstanding officers in 2010 in line-of-duty incidents, and the outpouring of support for the families by the local communities has been fantastic. We want to make sure that the public is fully informed where their support efforts are going, and who any benefits are provided too."

If you have been contacted by an organization that you believe is misrepresenting itself, you can contact your local Better Business Bureau for information about a fundraising organization or contact the Texas Attorney General's Consumer Protection Division at (800) 621-0508.


Crime Stoppers bumper stickers on dumpsters

Comptroller sends sales tax allocations


Texas Comptroller Susan Combs announced that the state sales tax revenue in December was \$1.81 billion, up 9.4 percent compared to December 2009.

"This marks the ninth consecutive month of year-over-year improvement in sales tax revenues, with increases posted across the board," Combs said. "There were increases in the oil and natural gas and manufacturing sectors reflecting recovering business spending. Sales tax in the retail trade and restaurant sectors were also up. As I outlined in this week's Biennial Revenue Estimate, we forecast growth in sales tax revenue for the current fiscal year as well as the next two fiscal years."


December state sales tax collections and January allocations to local governments represent sales that occurred in November. Parmer County's January 2011 payment totaled \$43,830.92 broken down as Bovina \$7,753.37; Farwell \$7,772.98; and Friona \$28,304.57. In January 2009 the tax payment total was \$31,195.61.

Comparing tax receipts from the same period last year, payments were up 40.50%, broken down as Bovina 52.45%; Farwell 13.84%; and Friona 46.78%. For the year, Parmer County cities have received a total of \$43,830.92 as compared to \$31,195.61 for the same period last year, a 40.50% change.

The next local sales tax allocation will be made on Friday, February 11, 2011.

APPLICATION AND PRELIMINARY DECISION. City of Friona, 623 Main Street, Friona, Texas 79035, has applied to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) for a renewal of TCEQ Permit No. WQ0010089001, which authorizes the disposal of treated domestic wastewater at a daily average flow not to exceed 550,000 gallons per day via surface irrigation of 186 acres of non-public access agricultural land. The proposed permit will authorize the disposal of treated domestic wastewater at a daily average flow not to exceed 321,000 gallons per day via surface irrigation of 186 acres of nonpublic access agricultural land. This permit will not authorize a discharge of pollutants into waters in the State. TCEQ received this application on June 1, 2010.

The wastewater treatment facility and disposal site are located 4,000 feet east of the city limits of Friona in a northeasterly direction on U.S. Highway 60 and on the south side of the Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe (A.T. & S.F.) Railroad in Parmer County, Texas 79035. The wastewater treatment facility and disposal site are located in the drainage basin of Upper Prairie Dog Town Fork Red River in Segment No. 0229 of the Red River Basin.

The TCEQ Executive Director has completed the technical review of the application and prepared a draft permit. The draft permit, if approved, would establish the conditions under which the facility must operate. The Executive Director has made a preliminary decision that this permit, if issued, meets all statutory and regulatory requirements. The permit application, Executive Director's preliminary decision, and draft permit are available for viewing and copying at Friona City Hall, 623 Main Street, Friona, Texas.

PUBLIC COMMENT / PUBLIC MEETING. You may submit public comments or request a public meeting about this application. The purpose of a public meeting is to provide the opportunity to submit comments or to ask questions about the application TCEQ holds a public meeting if the Executive Director determines that there is a significant degree of public interest in the application or if requested by a local legislator. A public meeting is not a contested case hearing.

OPPORTUNITY FOR A CONTESTED CASE HEARING. After the deadline for submitting public comments, the Executive Director will consider all timely comments and prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. Unless the application is directly referred for a contested case hearing, the response to comments will be mailed to everyone who submitted public comments and to those persons who are on the mailing list for this application. If comments are received, the mailing will also provide instructions for requesting a contested case hearing or reconsideration of the Executive Director's decision. A contested case hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in a state district court.

TO REQUEST A CONTESTED CASE HEARING, YOU MUST INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING ITEMS IN YOUR REQUEST: your name; address, phone; applicant's name and permit number; the location and distance of your property/activities relative to the facility; a specific description of how you would be adversely affected by the facility in a way not common to the general public; and the statement "[I/we] request a contested case hearing." If the request for contested case hearing is filed on behalf of a group or association, the request must designate the group's representative for receiving future correspondence; identify an individual member of the group who would be adversely affected by the proposed facility or activity; provide the information discussed above regarding the affected member's location and distance from the facility or activity; explain how and why the member would be affected; and explain how the interests the group seeks to protect are germane to the group's purpose.

Following the close of all applicable comment and request periods, the Executive Director will forward the application and any requests for reconsideration or for a contested case hearing to the TCEO Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting.

The Commission will only grant a contested case hearing on disputed issues of fact that are relevant and material to the Commission's decision on the application. Further, the Commission will only grant a hearing on issues that were raised in timely filed comments that were not subsequently withdrawn. TCEQ may act on an application to renew a permit for discharge of wastewater without providing an opportunity for a contested case hearing if certain criteria are met.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ACTION. The Executive Director may issue final approval of the application unless a timely contested case hearing request or request for reconsideration is filed. If a timely hearing request or request for reconsideration is filed, the Executive Director will not issue final approval of the permit and will forward the application and request to the TCEQ Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting.

MAILING LIST. If you submit public comments, a request for a contested case hearing or a reconsideration of the Executive Director's decision, you will be added to the mailing list for this specific application to receive future public notices mailed by the Office of the Chief Clerk. In addition, you may request to be placed on: (1) the permanent mailing list for a specific applicant name and permit number; and/or (2) the mailing list for a specific county. If you wish to be placed on the permanent and/or the county mailing list, clearly specify which list(s) and send your request to TCEQ Office of the Chief Clerk at the address below.

All written public comments and public meeting requests must be submitted to the Office of the Chief Clerk, MC 105, Texas Commission on Environmental Quality, P.O. Box 13087, Austin, TX 78711-3087 or electronically at www.tceq.state.tx.us/about/comments.html within 30 days from the date of newspaper publication of this notice.
