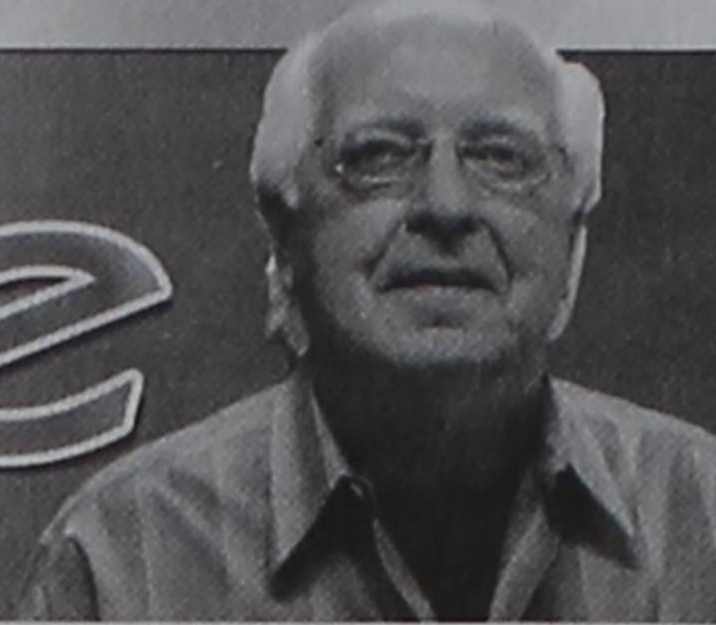

Dear Ron,

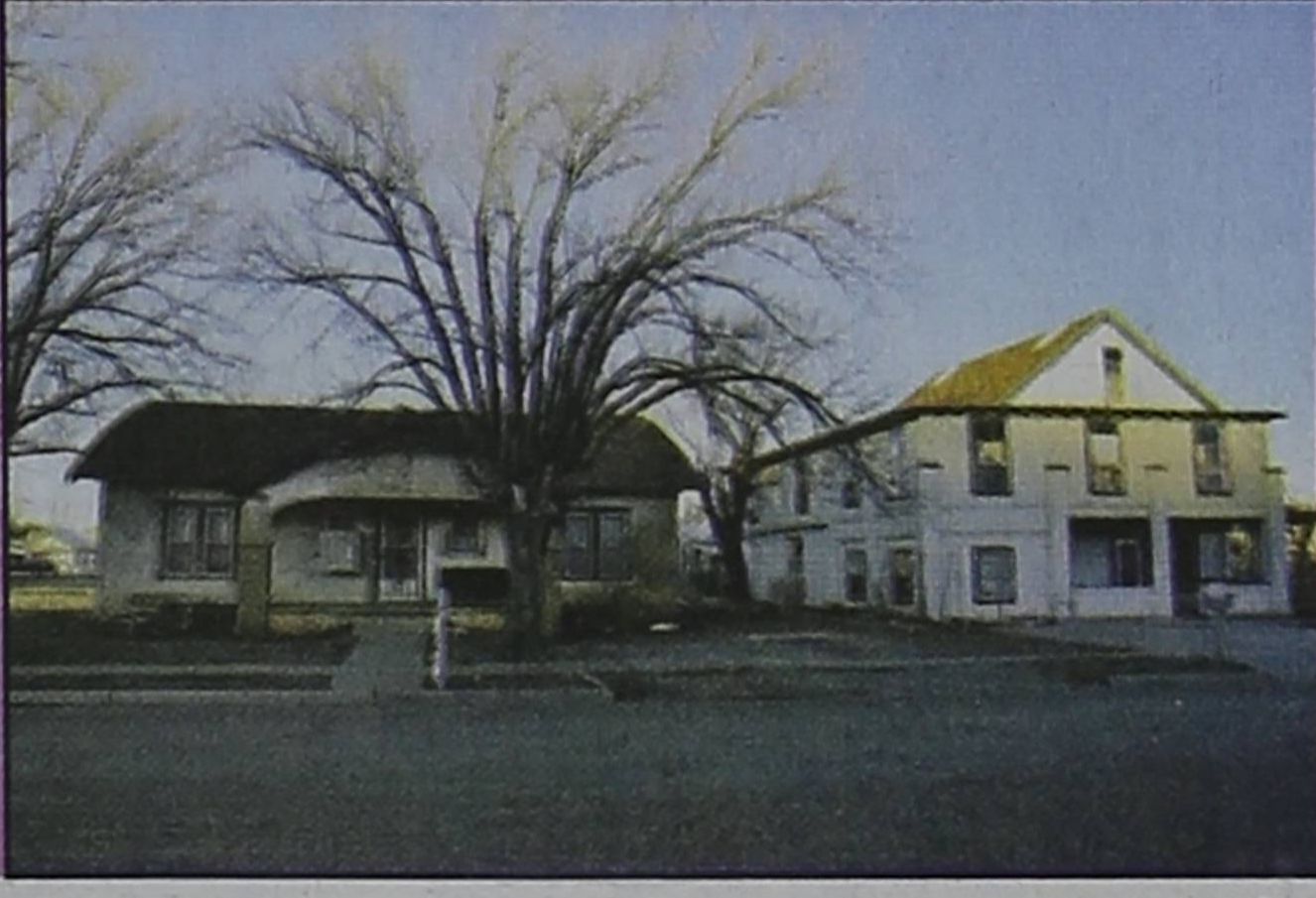
I enclose a little bit of history that might be of interest to some of the Old Timers.

The warehouse that is described was situated on the property where the primary school building now sits. Happy New Year!

*Friona Star May 10, 1935*

*"The Baptist congregation has purchased a part of the J.L. Landrum building on Euclid Avenue and moved it to the lot adjoining their church property. The building is being converted into a cottage to be used by the pastor as a*

parsonage. The carpentry work is being supervised by Rev. E. Ray Lansdown, assisted by members of the congregation."

Hugh writes:

When I was in third grade in the Old Red School Building I observed workmen with hand saws on the roof of the above described warehouse where they were sawing the building into two halves. The first section was moved to the Baptist Church property above described.

The second section was moved to the vacant lots on Euclid Avenue that belonged to F.S. Truitt. Mr. Truitt's property was between the homestead of Floyd W. and Ethel Reeve and Sixth Street. This building became the home of Mr. Truitt and remains at that location at this writing in 2011. Further, Mr. J.L. Landrum's name is recorded on the cornerstone of the junior high school building on Euclid Avenue.

This is the cornerstone on the junior high building with the name of J.L. Landrum and others. It was originally placed on what was referred to as the Old Red School Building that burned in the 50s. The cornerstone was then placed on the current junior high school building, which served as the high school until 1967 when the current high school was completed.

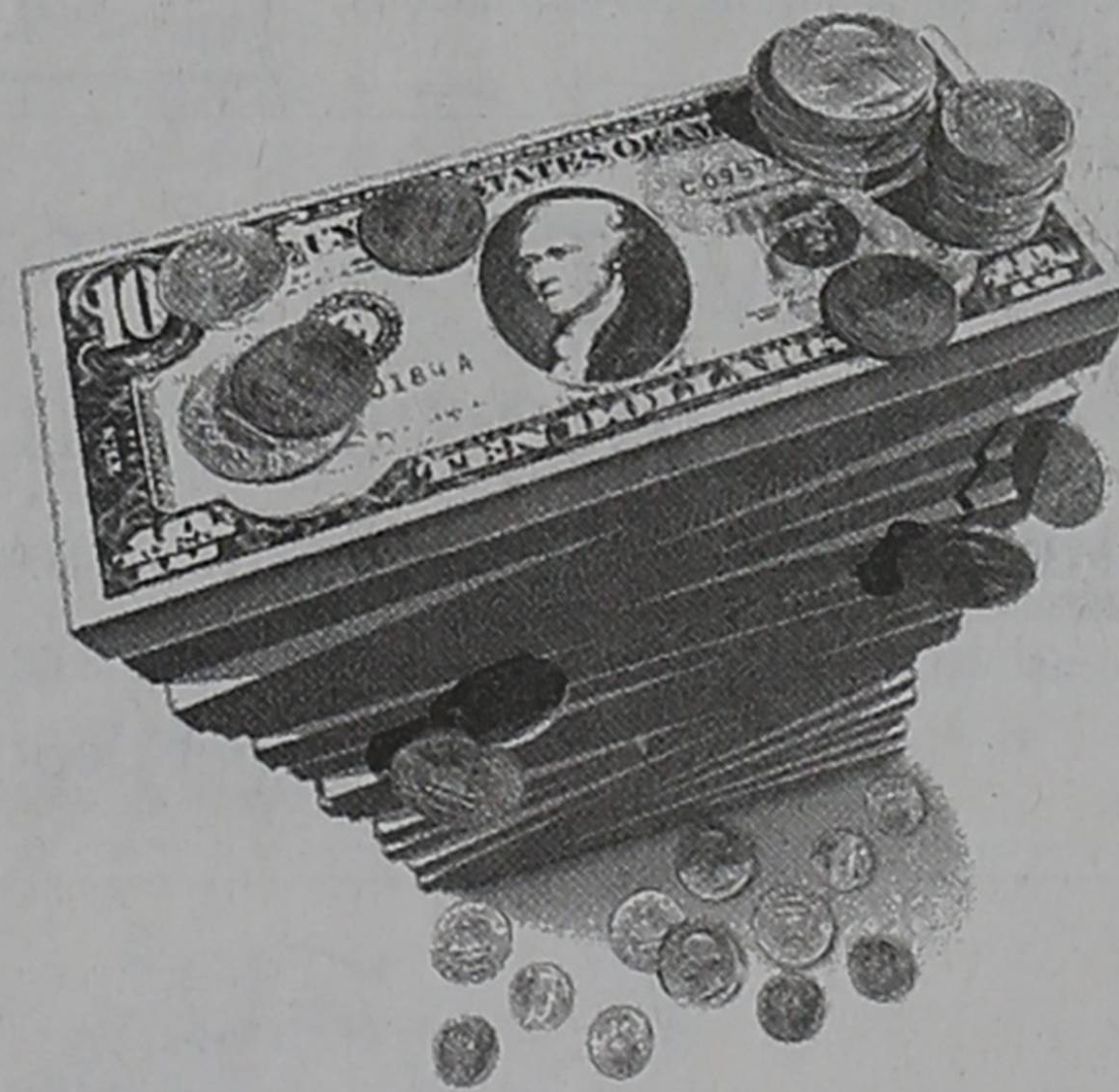
If you dialed \*69 and the line was busy and now you decide you don't want to call the number back, pick up the phone and dial \*89 to cancel your request.

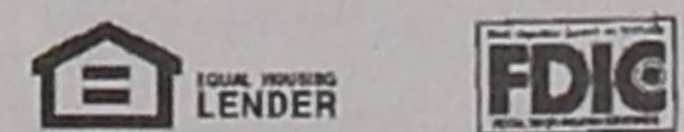
