





Hugh writes:

When I was in third grade in the Old Red School Building I observed workmen with hand saws on the roof of the above described warehouse where they were sawing the building into two halves. The first section was moved to the Baptist Church property above described.

The second section was moved to the vacant lots on Euclid Avenue that belonged to F.S. Truitt. Mr. Truitt's property was between the homestead of Floyd W. and Ethel Reeve and Sixth Street. This building became the home of Mr. Truitt and remains at that location at this writing in 2011. Further, Mr. J.L. Landrum's name is recorded on the cornerstone of the junior high school building on Euclid Avenue.


Current scholarship holders and past winners who are still completing their college education are reminded that they are eligible to apply for renewal of their scholarship.




