Simplified vehicle registration fees

A new system that standardizes and simplifies registration fees for nearly every vehicle owner in Texas begins September 1, 2011.

Currently, Texas has 1,745 fee categories for registration. That number is being reduced to nine weight classifications. The simplified structure makes it easier for Texans to know what they owe, and reduces administrative costs for the state, counties and private businesses.

Registration fees contribute more than \$1 billion each year to the state

highway fund, which is used to build and maintain Texas' roads and bridges. There are more than 21 million registered vehicles in Texas.

Car and truck owners whose vehicles weigh 6,000 pounds or less will pay a base vehicle registration fee of \$50.75. This is a slight reduction - about \$8 - from the previous registration fee for new vehicle owners, and a small increase - around \$10 - for those with older vehicles.

Some Texans also will pay a new \$1 automation fee. This fee was assessed in Texas' largest 60 counties, but now applies statewide. The automation fee is used for improvements to the registration and titling computer system. Vehicle owners will continue to pay the \$1 Department of Public Safety fee for TexasSure, the electronic insurance verification pro-

gram, and any local county fees.

Fees being eliminated include the annual 30-cent reflectorization fee (used to purchase the reflective license plate sheeting) that was on every registration renewal, and the \$5 charge for license plate transfers. Texans who transfer their plates when they sell or trade in their vehicle to the new one they buy, are protected from anyone

running up toll charges or committing criminal activity that traces back to their name.

Those with heavy vehicles (more than 6,000 pounds) where registration fees were previously calculated by 100-pound weight increments in 1,600 fee categories will now find their registration fees fall into seven weight classifications.

Fees also change for

trailer owners. The 75 different trailer categories, which include travel trailers, are reduced to one annual fee. It will cost \$45 to register any trailer or travel trailer up to 6,000 pounds.

The new law also standardizes the license plate replacement fee at \$6, and eliminates the fee for classic, cotton, forestry, volunteer firefighter, tow truck, and radio operator license plates.

Kropp new coordinator for Crime Stoppers

The Parmer/Bailey County Crime Stoppers announced that they have a new coordinator for the group. Sgt. Matthew Kropp of the Parmer County Sheriff's Office was voted in at the meeting on Monday, July 16. Matthew is very interested in the group and highly motivated to help the Crime Stoppers grow and be more visible in the communities they serve.

Parmer/Bailey County Crime Stoppers will be at Border Town Days, and ordered banners for the booth as well as new T-shirts for members. The billboard signs for roads in the communities served were also purchased. There will be ten new signs entering and exiting the

towns of Bovina, Farwell, Friona, Lazbuddie and Muleshoe.

Parmer/Bailey County Crime Stoppers has applied through the Governor's office for a grant, which will allow up to six members of the board to attend the Texas Crime Stoppers Conference for 2011, which will be held in October in McAllen, Texas. This grant will pay for a cell phone and laptop for the coordinator for his use with the Crime Stoppers internet service.

The next meeting is scheduled for August 16, 2011 at 6 p.m. at A-Me-Dees Restaurant on the Texico/Farwell line.

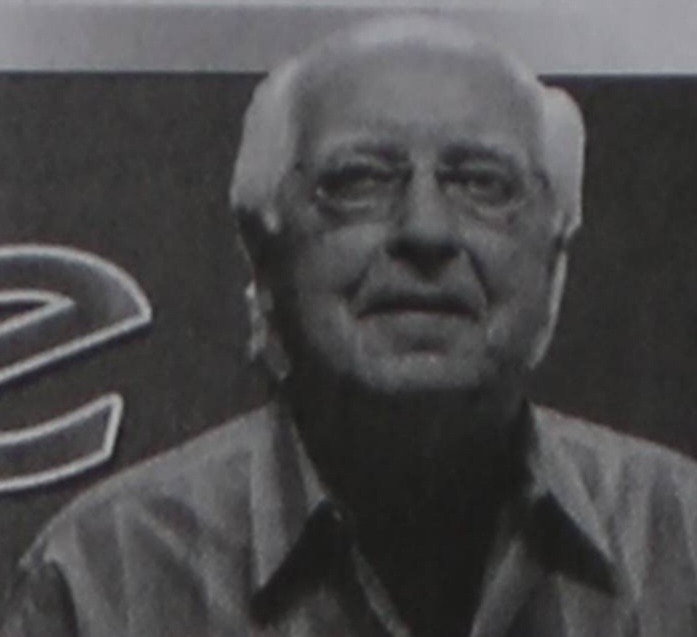

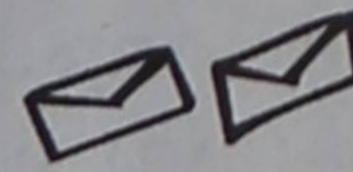

Spoonburgers recipe found

Last week in Town Talk I asked if anyone had a recipe for spoonburgers. The request was made for Janet Rose of Ennis, Texas who said she remembered them from long ago being served by the Friona Rebekah chapter.

Rachel McMurtrey Clark also remembered when she worked for her mother serving spoonburgers for the Rebekahs at a booth during Maize Days. Rachel sent me a spoonburger recipe she found. She wrote, "I served MANY of these in my day. I'm not 100% sure this is the one but it's close. We would serve them on hamburger buns with mustard and sometimes relish."

As I understand it the meat concoction is 'spooned' from a container onto the open face buns, hence the name spoonburgers. Sort of an old fashioned Sloppy Joe but I'm assured this recipe is much better. Thanks to Rachel for bringing us a bit of history. Enjoy.

Spoonburgers

- 1 1/2 lb ground beef
- 1/2 cup onion chopped
- 1/2 cup green pepper chopped
- 1 clove garlic minced
- 1 tsp Worcestershire sauce
- 1 tsp dry mustard
- 1 tsp salt
- 1/2 tsp paprika
- 1/8 tsp pepper
- 1 6 oz can tomato paste
- 3/4 cup water
- 2 tbsp vinegar
- 2 tsp brown sugar

Brown ground beef in skillet, drain fat. Combine all ingredients in crockpot, stirring well. Cook on low 6-8 hours or on high 3-4 hours. Serve over warm hamburger buns.

All clinic times are subject to change or cancellation due to weather conditions or scheduling conflicts.

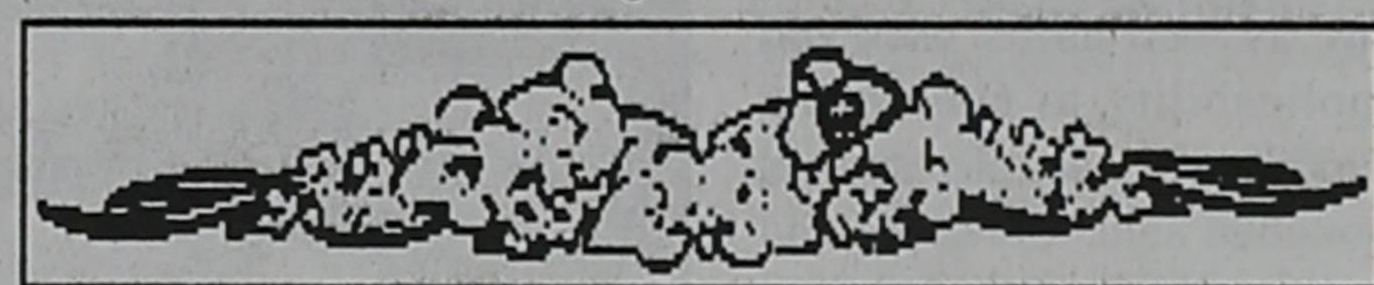

Crops: Something better than nothing!

Some of the area corn continues to be harvested prematurely due to extreme drought conditions. While not ideal, "something is better than nothing."

Some severely stressed crops, which received significant precipitation last week, have not responded to the additional moisture but later planted and crops in better condition have shown improvement. The rainfall was just too late to salvage some crops.

I have noticed that some dryland cotton has started to emerge but obviously it has no chance of developing into a harvestable crop.

Many forage crops are being planned behind recent thunderstorms in an attempt to produce a bit more feed which will desperately be needed in confined animal feeding operations.

Much of the irrigated cot-

ton is going into bloom with good yield potential assuming adequate growing season to mature the crop. Cotton under more stress is, as expected, going into bloom with less potential and some fields have yet to start blooming.

At this point projecting yield in area corn would be a crap shoot, but one thing is certain, yields will be significantly lower than we have

seen in a long time. Yield reports for corn that has been prematurely harvested (no ear) for silage have ranged from 3 to 6 tons per acre. A very rough "rule of thumb" I've heard tossed around is one ton per acre per foot of plant height. Once remaining corn has pollinated and set grain we might be able to tell a little more about what we've got.

Rainwater harvesting workshop

A rainwater harvesting workshop will be held August 5 at the Texas AgriLife Research and Extension Center, 6500 Amarillo Blvd. West, Amarillo. The workshop will be held from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m. with registration beginning at 5:30 p.m., said Brandon Boughen, AgriLife Extension agriculture and natural resources agent in Potter County. Cost of the workshop will be \$25, and pre-registration is required.

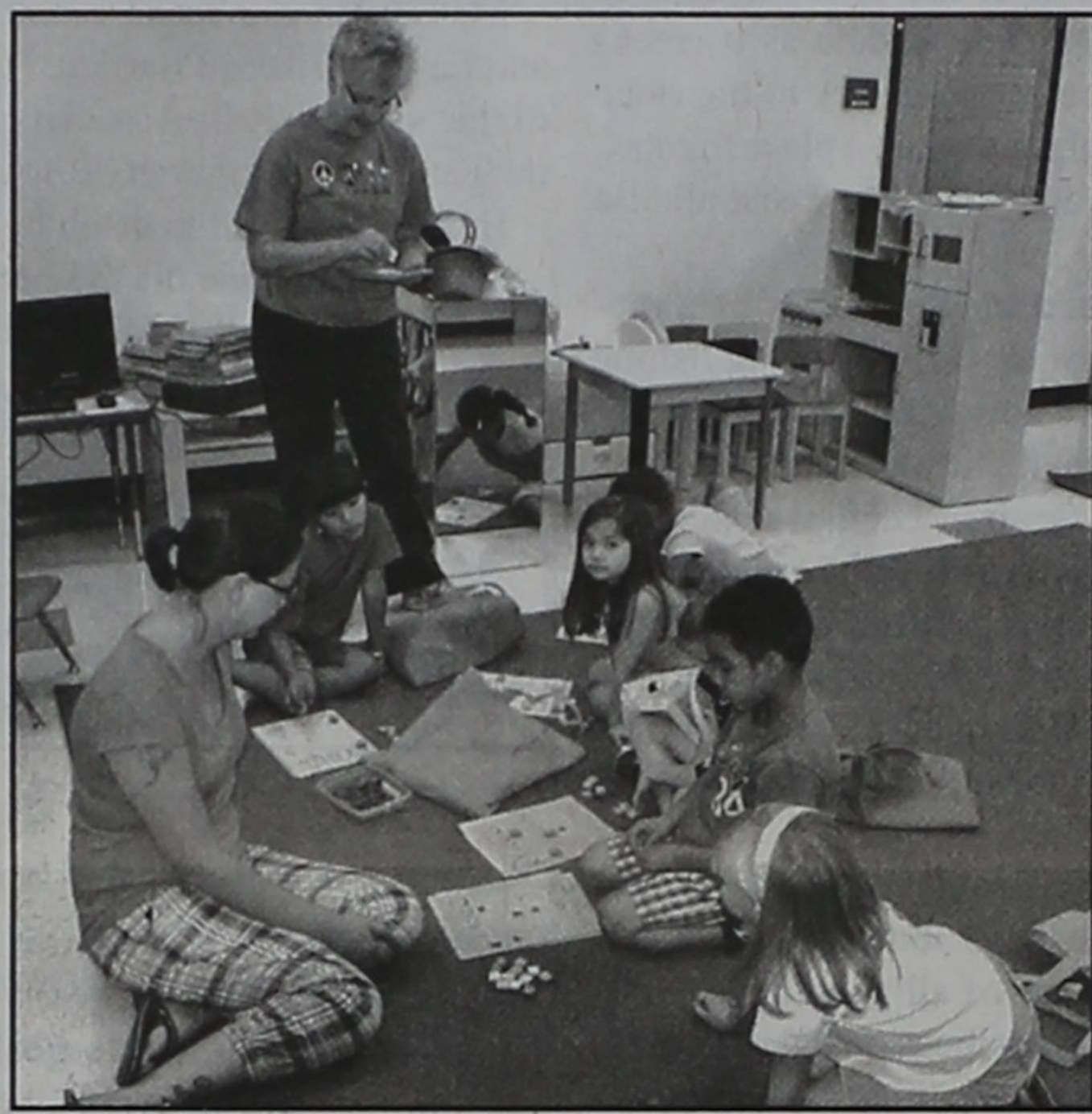
This course will provide an overview of rainwater harvesting, as well as its uses and applicability to conserving rainfall as a natural resource, Boughen said. Concepts and techniques introduced will cover both passive and active rainwater harvesting, he said. That includes rain gardens, landscape design, rain barrels, sanitation, maintenance and use of rainwater for wildlife, livestock, pets, landscape and vegetable production and in-home use.

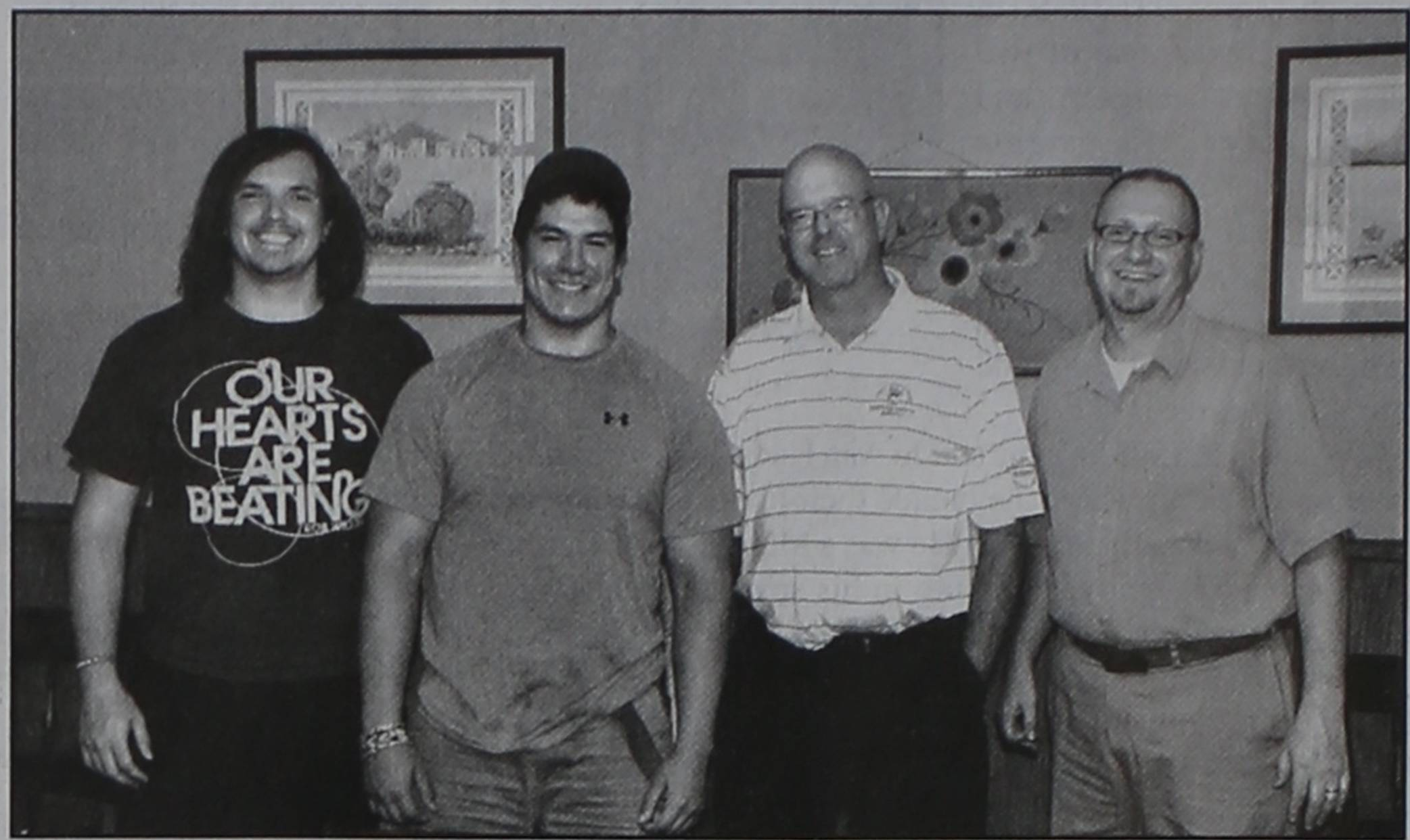
