2012 changes to sales tax exemptions

The following letter was sent to customers of Veterinary Industries explaining new regulations for claiming agricultural sales tax exemptions. Changes are in effect January 1, 2012. The letter is reprinted with permission of Eldon Reeb, Manager of Veterinary Industries.

To our valued customers:
As you may know, our lawmakers have been hard at work in Austin simplifying how business is done in Texas. Pursuant to House Bill 268, effective January 1, 2012, in order to claim an Agricultural exemption for sales taxes in the State of Texas you will be required to obtain a registration number from the State Comptroller's office.

Some of the items you have purchased from us in the past still qualify for sales tax exemption without the necessity of a registration number. However, there have been specific items determined to require the registration number which you may purchase

from time to time. In an effort to prevent any confusion as to whether the items you purchase are tax exempt or not, we are asking our customers to complete the required application either on-line or by written application and obtain a registration number no later than January 1, 2012 deadline. You will be required to sign a new Tax Exemption Certification form which includes your registration number to ensure that your purchases are tax exempt. It is my understanding from telephone conversations with the State Comptroller's office that you will be required to obtain one registration number in order to exercise your right to agricultural tax exemption. You registration number can be provided to all entities with which you do business on a tax exempt basis.

If you choose to apply on-line, you will obtain your registration number immediately. Apply at www.GetReadyTexas.org. Complete the required information and print the registration number. We have

the proper forms in our office for you to complete with the required information. If you choose to apply by mail contact them at 1-800-252-5555. **Please note that it will take approximately 4 weeks to process the application and receive your confirmation letter and registration number.** If you do not have access to a computer, please stop by our office and pick up a copy of the application at your earliest convenience.

Again, please note that you must have your registration number and complete the appropriate forms by January 1, 2012 in order to maintain your tax exempt status. If you do not complete the requirements, we will be required by law to charge tax on your purchases.

DPS says travel safely this Thanksgiving

The Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) would like to remind Thanksgiving travelers to be safe on the roads during the long holiday weekend.

"Between distractions and the rush to get to holiday destinations, it's easy for drivers to lose focus on the road," said Assistant Director Luis Gonzalez, Chief of the Texas Highway Patrol Division. "Practicing safe driving habits will help ensure everyone arrives at their Thanksgiving des-

tinuation without incident."

Drivers are also reminded to slow down to 20 miles per hour below the speed limit for stopped emergency vehicles with emergency lights activated, or to vacate the lane closest to the vehicle if the road has multiple lanes traveling in the same direction. Effective September 1, 2011, this law applies to tow trucks in addition to law enforcement, fire, and emergency medical vehicles.

DPS troopers, along with many law

enforcement agencies, will be patrolling throughout the holiday weekend to promote safety. During the Thanksgiving weekend in 2010, DPS troopers arrested 376 individuals for driving while intoxicated, issued 9,025 speeding citations and issued more than 1,000 safety restraint citations.

DPS offers the following tips to ensure safe travels:

- Minimize distractions as much as possible. Don't text and drive and keep cell

phone chatter to a minimum. Just drive.

- Don't travel fatigued. Switch drivers or find a safe location and take a break.
- Adjust speed for weather, traffic conditions and emergency vehicles.
- Don't drink and drive; designate a driver.
- Make sure everyone in the car is buckled up.
- Drive courteously.

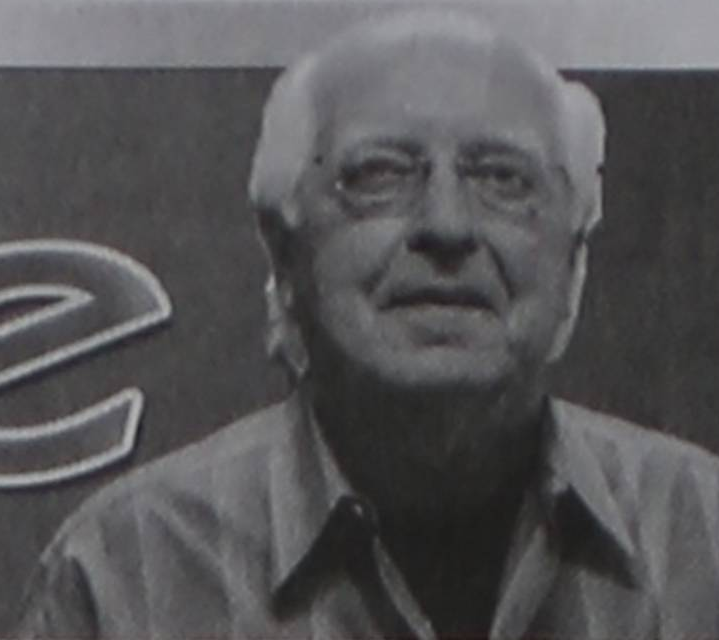

cogitations & aphorisms of jodok

By Uncle John White • 1868 - 1965

From the Friday, November 20, 1936 Friona Star. Uncle John White muses about what folks could do to keep Friona clean and friendly. Seems his thoughts might still apply in 2011. Imagine Friona in 1936 when society was not so politically correct.

Then there is another classification which should include each and every citizen of our town, both old and young, without regard to trade, profession, business, or social standing, and that is in individual effort to do anything and everything we possibly can do that is good for our town, and the different things we can do will be varied as the individuals.

It may be simply keeping the walks clean in front of our home, or if there should be no sidewalk there, we can keep the gutter free from weeds, or other litter that may prevent the free flowing of water that may fall there, or we may plant a tree or two for shade along the street between the curb and the sidewalk, etc.

In this way streets and alleys could be kept clear of waste papers and other refuse, sidewalks could be kept clean and clear of any and all kinds of obstructions, eyesores and nuisances such as foul smelling incinerators, slop barrels or pails, hog pens, and many other things that are disagreeable to the smell and the sight of our neighbors, our families, and our visitors.

And even, as I stand on the street corner, may learn to give a pleasant smile, a cheerful greeting, an encouraging word, and a ready and willing hand to assist any and all who may pass by.

Let us each and all include ourselves in this latter class I have mentioned above and put forth a united effort and an individual effort to make Friona the outstanding city of the county, and of the Panhandle, and of the state and nation for morality, honesty, service, courtesy, and charity.

From the front page of the November 20, 1936 Friona Star under the heading "Just Little Things", this sounds a lot like an early version of Town Talk.

John Blackburn is the new clerk at the Blackwell Hardware and Furniture Store.

Miss Mary Emma Stover spent Saturday night with Miss Gladys Settle.

A few coops of turkeys have arrived on the Friona market the past ten days.

Ervin Johnson, whose farm home is seven miles northwest of Friona, brought seven nice hogs in and sold them on the Friona market last Friday.

Mrs. Lorene Hughes is reported as still slowly improving at the Friona hotel.

Those new 1937 Chevrolet cars are being admired by those who visit the Lunsford Chevrolet sales rooms.

A few of our men have been busy for the past week burning weeds along the

sides of the streets for the city. They have made quite an improvement in the appearance of the streets.

O.F. Lange, manager of the local Rockwell Bros. & co. lumber yard has devised an ideal method for stacking and counting brick.

Some of our citizens were engaged at butchering hogs one or two days this week.

Rev. D.E. Moore, pastor of the Baptist Church, returned Saturday from attending the Baptist State Convention in Mineral Wells.

John Chronister, lunch room manager at Lazbuddy, was a visitor here Monday forenoon. John says he is doing a fair business with his lunch room.

Those of our farmers who own threshing machines are being kept quite busy now threshing the row crops of the community.

Rev. and Mrs. K.G. Parks, of the Congregational Church, took dinner with Mr. and Mrs. L.F. Lillard at their farm home north of town last Friday and enjoyed eating some delicious venison steak.

The Friona Fire Boys got out Tuesday afternoon and did some good work with the city's fire hose and truck in wetting down the freshly graded caliche on the streets in the business section of the city. This both settled the dust and served to pack the caliche, making it more durable to traffic.

After you miss a call, pick up the phone and dial *69. An announcement will tell you the phone number of the party who last called you. Dial 1 if you want to return the call. 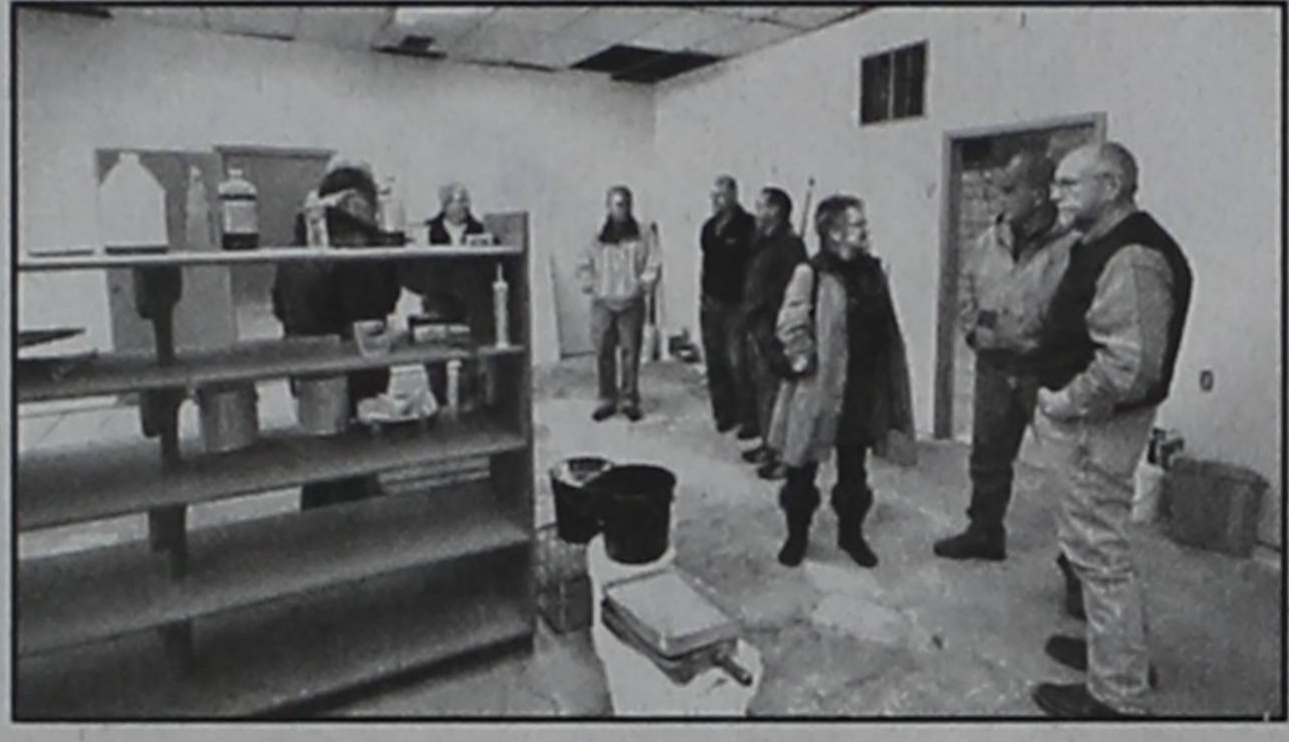
After the meal, several Noon Lions members went to tour The Gym, a new business opening on Main St. by Michael Davila. He plans to open the facility for membership around the first of December.

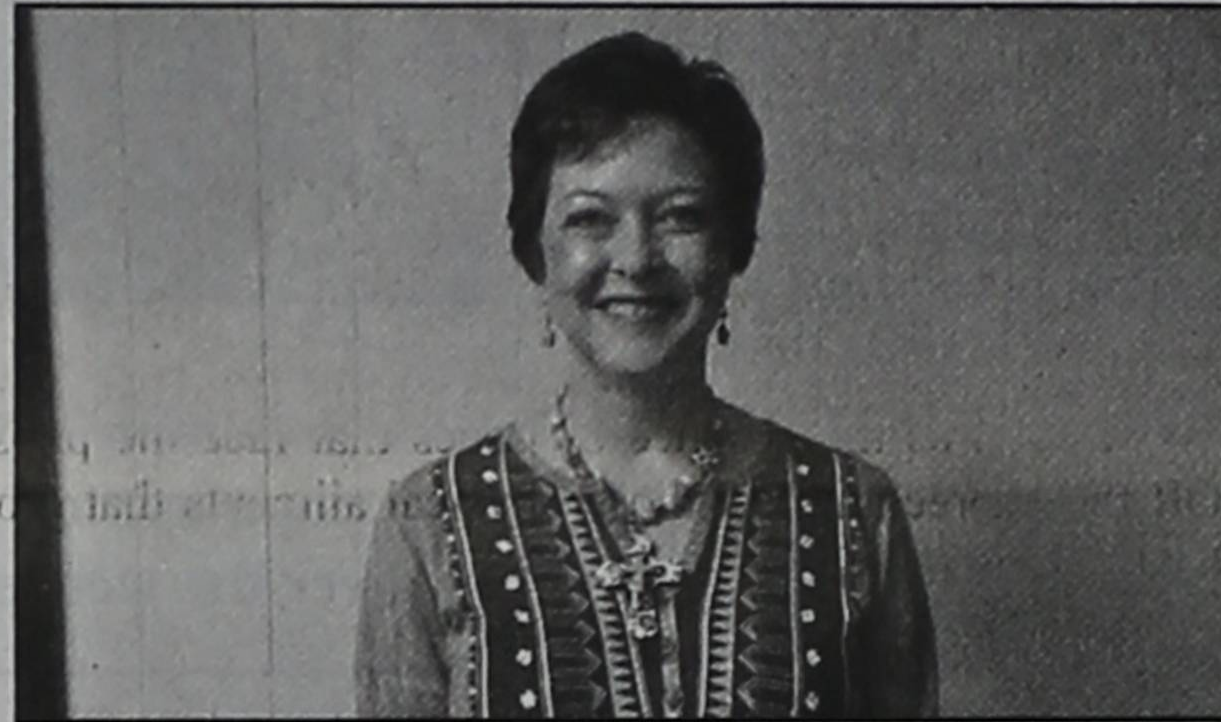

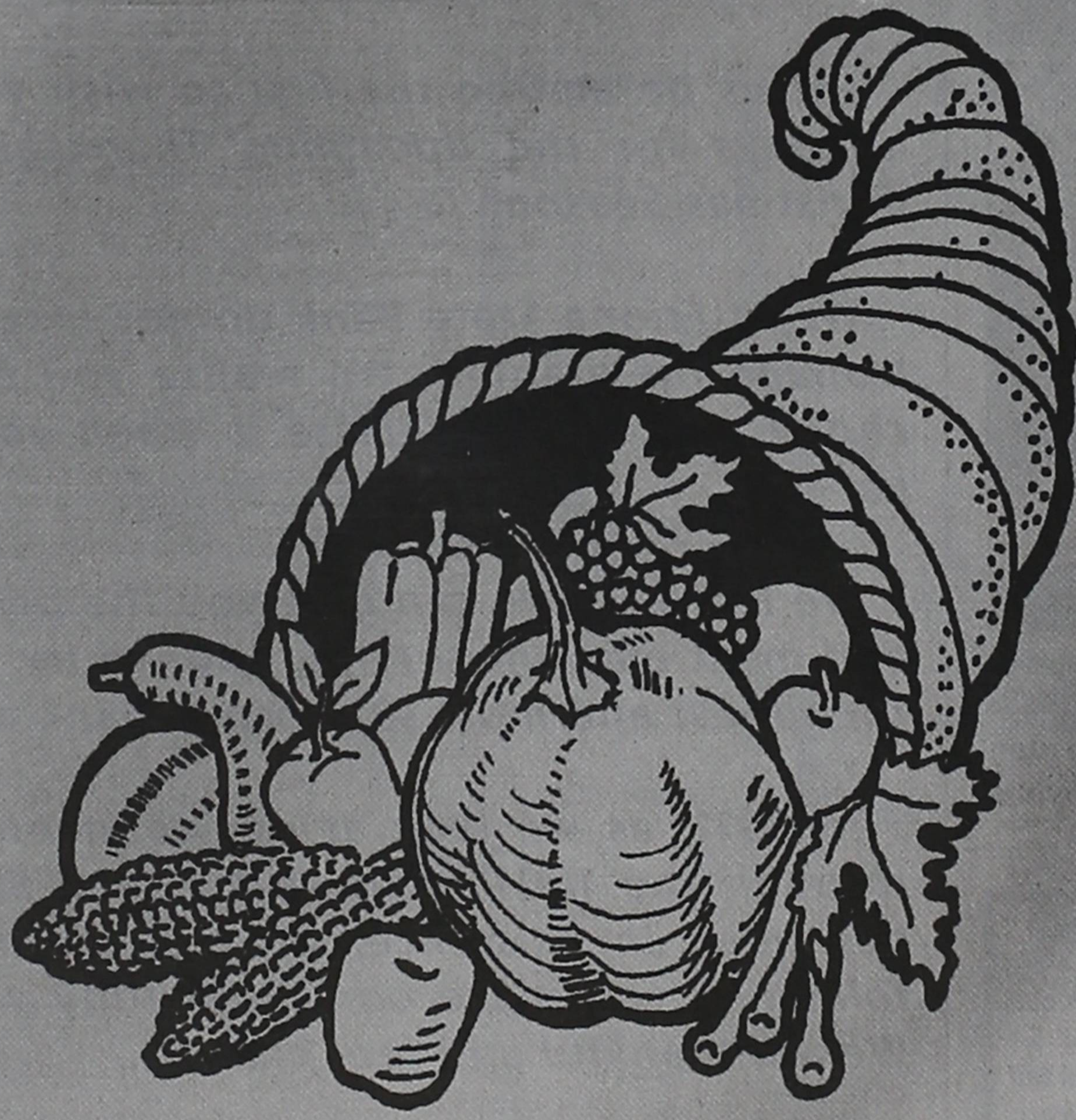

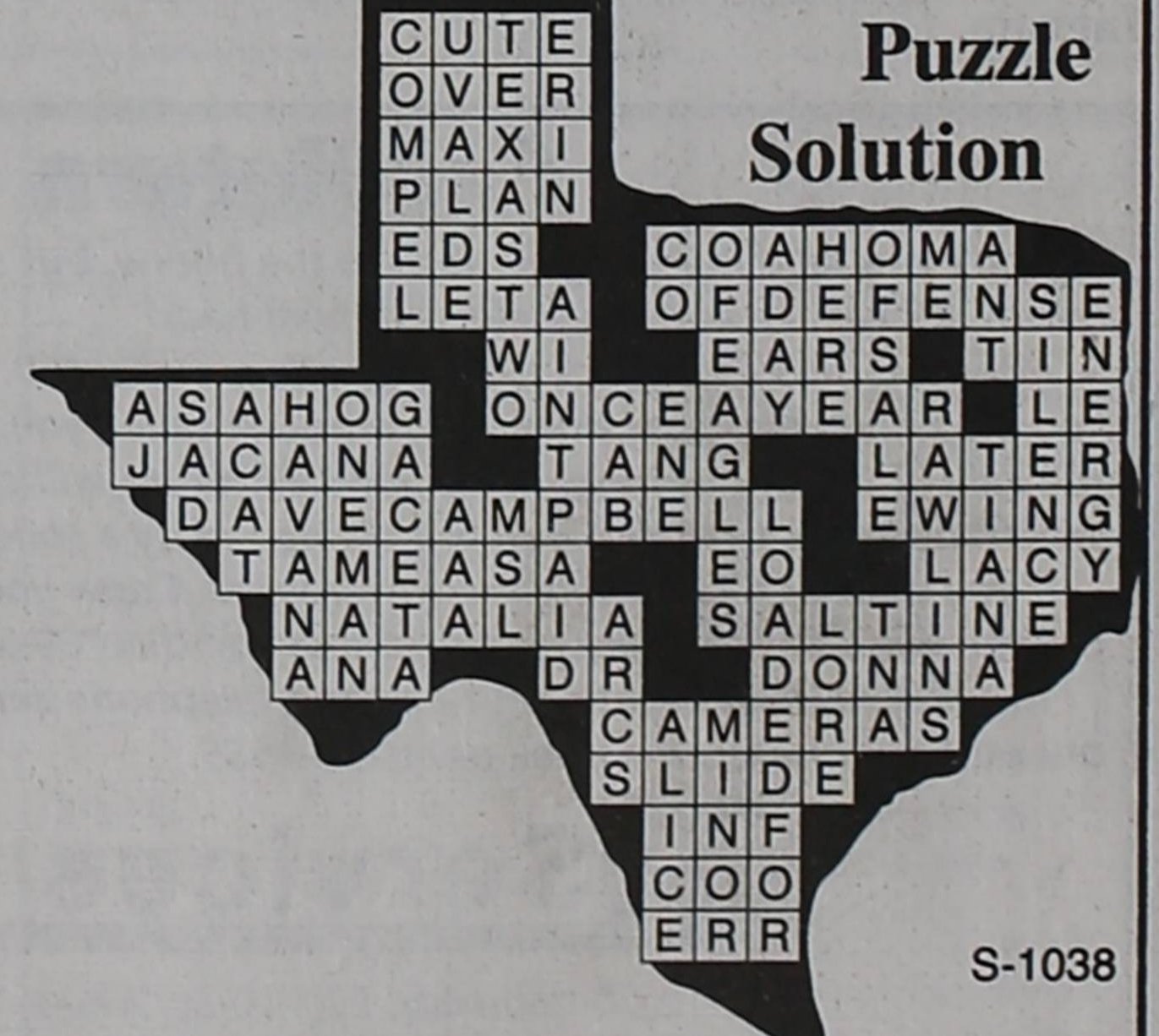

Much of the dryland and irrigated wheat has been planted and some is starting to emerge but will soon need some type of precipitation to keep them going. According to the National Weather Service, the precipitation forecast for the next one and a half months has us at normal to below normal for precipitation. Hopefully we will receive some much needed moisture soon.

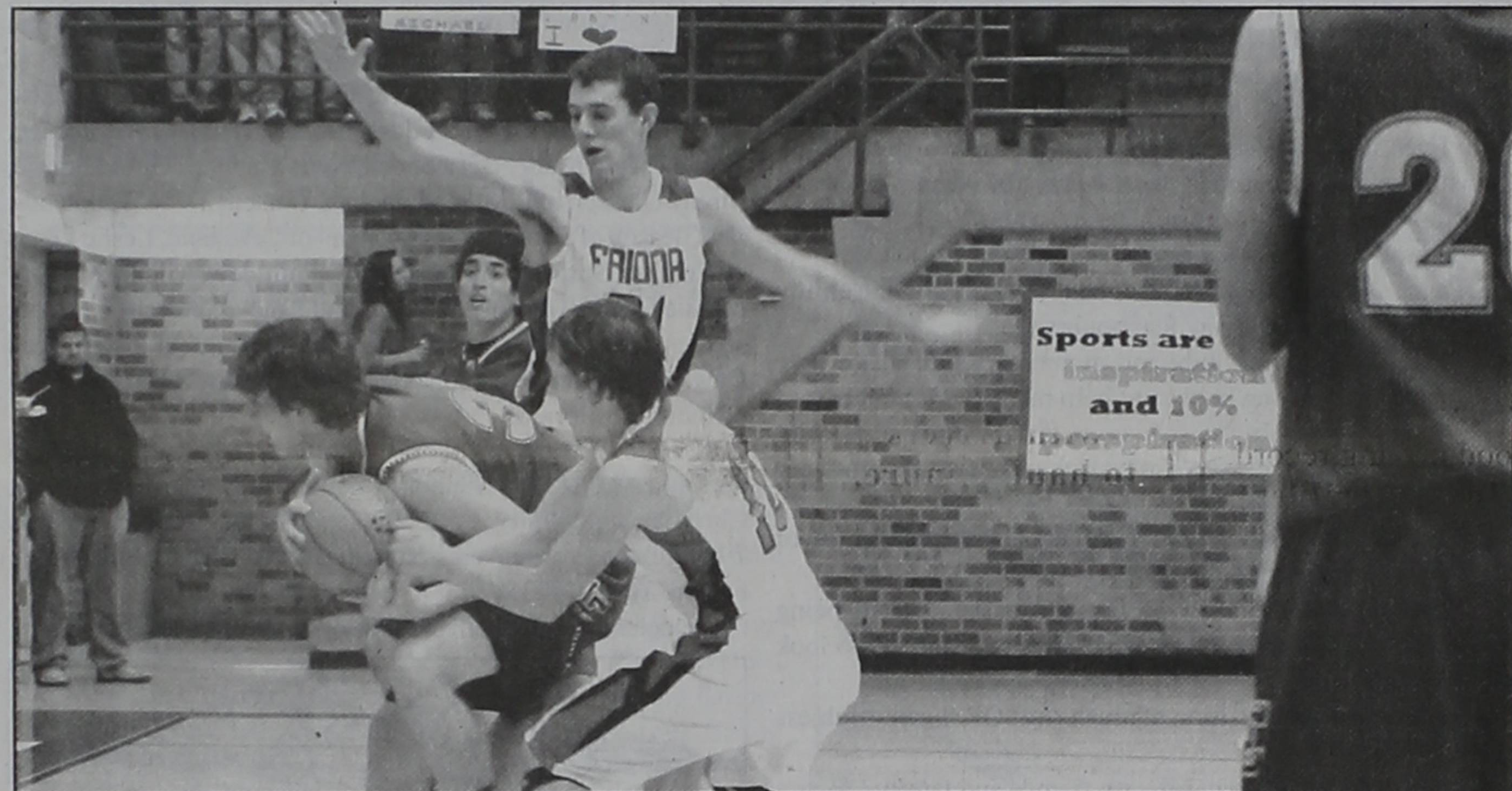

Section 504 Grievance Procedure

The City Friona has adopted an internal grievance procedure providing for prompt an equitable resolution of complaints alleging any action prohibited by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development regulations (24 CFR Subpart A Sec. 8.4(a) implementing Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 as amended (29 USC 794). Section 504 states, in part that "No otherwise qualified handicapped individual shall, solely by reason of his handicap, be excluded from the participation in, denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving federal financial assistance..."

Complaints should be addressed to: **Patricia Phipps, City Manager, 623 Main Street, Friona, TX, 79035**, who has been designated to coordinate Section 504 compliance efforts.

A complaint should be filed in writing or verbally, contain the name and address of the person filing it, and briefly describe the alleged violation of the regulations.

A complaint should be filed within ten (10) working days after the complainant becomes aware of the alleged violation. (Processing of allegations of discrimination occurring before this grievance procedure was in place will be considered on a case-by-case basis).

An investigation, as may be appropriate, shall follow a filing of a complaint. The investigation will be conducted by **Patricia Phipps**. These rules contemplate informal but thorough investigations, affording all interested persons and their representatives, if any, an opportunity to submit evidence relevant to a complaint.

A written determination as to the validity of the complaint and description of resolution, if any, shall be issued by **Patricia Phipps** and a copy forwarded to the complainant no later than ten (10) working days after its filing

The Section 504 coordinator shall maintain the files and records of the City of Friona relating to the complaints files.

The complainant can request a reconsideration of the case in instances where he or she is dissatisfied with the resolution. The request for reconsideration should be made within ten working days to the City of Friona.

The right of a person to a prompt and equitable resolution of the complaint filed hereunder shall not be impaired by the person's pursuit of other remedies such as the filing of a Section 504 complaint with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. Utilization of this grievance procedure is not a prerequisite to the pursuit of other remedies.

These rules shall be construed to protect the substantive rights of interested persons, to meet appropriate due process standards and assure that the City of Friona complies with Section 504 and HUD regulations.

I hope everyone enjoys a Happy Thanksgiving this year with friends and loved ones. I constantly keep in my thoughts and prayers all the service men and women who are not home this holiday season.

Supercommittee Fails to Reach Deal

The Joint Select Committee on Deficit Reduction, known as the "Supercommittee," announced today that it did not find a meaningful solution to our serious budget problems before its November 23rd deadline.

The next step of this process is sequestration, or automatic cuts based on a formula that was put in place to ensure \$1.2 trillion cuts in the event a deal was not reached. These cuts include \$600 billion from defense spending and \$600 billion from other discretionary spending. I am very concerned about the cuts to defense and the impact they could have on our national security. Without any action by Congress, these cuts will begin in 2013.

Even with the failure of the Supercommittee, we must find a way to cut spending. We cannot continue down this path and let future generations get stuck with the bill. The Supercommittee was created to change the course of our country's fiscal path. Ultimately, a small group of twelve members of Congress was not the answer to the problem. Congress as a whole must take responsibility, show fiscal restraint and control the debt we have accumulated.

House Passes Bill to Help Veterans

On November 16th, the House passed H.R. 674 by a vote of 422-0. This legislation will repeal the 3% tax withholding requirement made to contractors doing business with federal, state and local governments. The bill also includes provisions that will help aggressively attack the unacceptably high rate of veterans' unemployment. It will expand education and training for veterans, require the Department of Labor to focus on translating military skills and training to civilian sector jobs, and provide tax credits for hiring veterans and disabled veterans who are out of work. I support this comprehensive veterans jobs plan to help our nation's heroes get the jobs and security when they return home that they deserve.

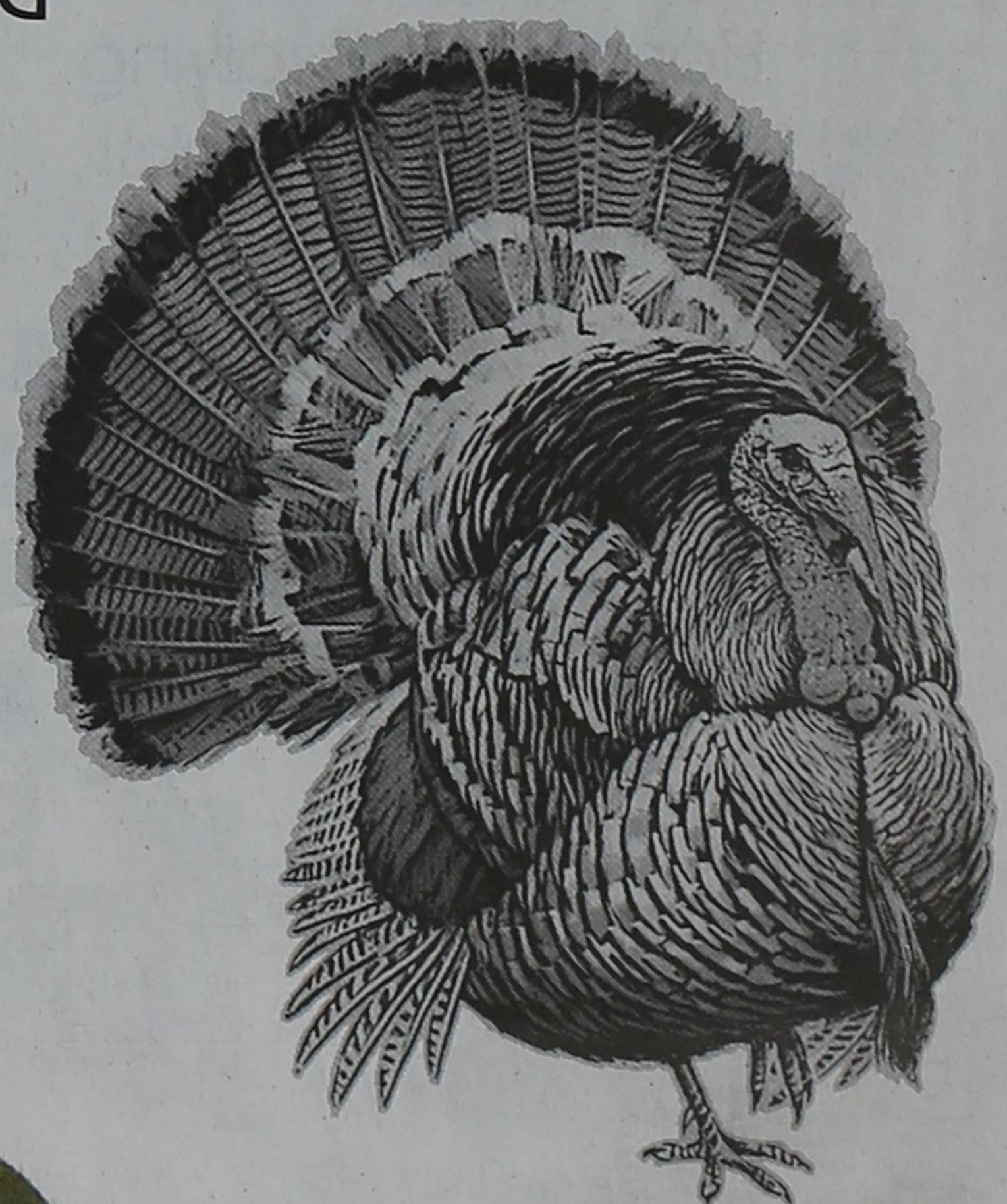
Pro-Life Letter to the Appropriations Committee Chairman

On November 10th, I signed a letter with 124 of my colleagues to Appropriations Committee Chairman Hal Rogers to ensure pro-life protections of the Abortion Non-Discrimination Act (ANDA) be added to the Labor and Health and Human Services Appropriations bill. ANDA codifies the Hyde-Weldon amendment, which limits funding to ensure that state, local and federal governments do not discriminate against health care entities that refuse to provide abortions.
