

3. It must be in writing and signed by the maker. It must contain an unconditional promise to pay a certain sum in money. It must be payable on demand or at a fixed or determinable future time. It must be payable to or-

4. The date, which includes the place, month, day of month and year, the number of the check, the name of the bank or concern, the amount of the check and the signature of the drawer.

5. Checks can be sent by mail safely and conveniently while currency cannot. A paid check is evidence of payment having been made. Money need not be kept on hand to meet obligations. Payments made by check can be readily traced. There may be occa- valid sale?
