The temple that Solomon built was one of the greatest achievements during Israel's dynastic history. The skillful workmanship, ornate designs, precious metals and countless hours diligently spent
working toward its completion are captured in 1 Kings 5-7. You way not realize it, though, but the temple is a powerful statement of God's amazing grace, and how God can use the most shameful failures for His glory.
Do you realize who Solomon's mom was? It was Bathsheba, the woman David committed adultery with, murdered her husband, then tried to hide his heinous sin by marrying this poor widow.
David didn't politic Solomon to the throne, God chose Him, as a reminder that our greatest failures, though consequences may be severe, and repentance difficult, can be used of God.
