TxDOT plows state highways and pushes the snow to the right of the pavement. They continually run across as many roads as quick as possible and then they start again. They do an excellent job cleaning the highways but this snow does end up in the intersections on Highway 60, Main Street, and 5th Street.
Kirk Frye and the county crew help the City by cleaning streets around the hospital and all the schools. This is a big help to the city. We would also like to thank the farmers for coming to town and helping clean their neighbor's driveways. Neither the City, county, nor the State can clean personal property.
Of the six men on the City crew, two of the public works employ ees head to the sewer plant and the four water well plants and 17 wells making sure the plants are up and running. One of the public works men gets on the grader, one on the front end loader, and the other two get on the two backhoes.
