Bank tour to Alaska
By Marca Herring
We saw a T-Shirt with the state
of Alaska beside the state of Texas printed on it. The caption said, "Isn't Texas Cute!!" Well we Texans can't help that Alaska is 2 $1 / 2$ times larger than we are, but have $26: 1$ more people!
Forty customers and friends of Friona InterBank leff July 11 it really was!
We arrived in Fairbanks and began our tour the next day with a
trip on the Stern Wheeler, Discovery. It was a slow and gentle ride down the Chena River, a glacial river. We saw a float plane take off and land, sled dogs practicing their runs and demonstrating their strength, the "wedding" of the Chena and Tanana River. visited a Chena village which re-
sembles the original sembles the original Chena Athabascan Indian Village of the early
1900's. We learmed about the way of life of the Athabascon Indians who live along the major river who live along the major river
ways of the interior Alaska. Today 90,000 Native people make up $15 \%$ of Alaska's population. They live in remote villages as well as cities like Fairbanks. What a great start for our tour. Enroute to our second day's destination, Denali, we stopped at a tiny village, Nenana, where a lady boarded our bus to tell us about her village. Her name is Joanne Hawkins and has written
her story in her book "Alaska her story in her book "Alaska,
the Land of M\&Ms, 'Men \& the Land of M\&Ms, 'Men \&
Money'". She visited Alaska in Money . She visited Alaska in
1971 and decided that was home. 1971 and decided that was home.
At that time men outnumbered women 20:1. She was the first to give us the saying, "The odds to give us the saying, The odds
were good (to catch a man), but the goods were odd"! We enjoyed this saying the entire trip. July 13 saw us driving by bus to Denali National Park. Our guide told us that Denali means "the high one" regarding Denali, now known as Mt McKinley The park one road going through the park and it is 91 miles long. We drove only 17 of those miles. The 5 large animals in the park are caribou, bear, wolves, Dall Sheep and moose. We saw a moose along the highway and in the brush and we saw Dall Sheep in the distance. We also saw smaller animals, especially rabbits and birds. Our guide had many jokes about the hare including "hare today, gone
tomorrow" etc. The glacial rivtomorrow" etc. The glacial riv-
ers inter-twine or "are braided" all along the valley.
We finally had to ask about the difference in tundra and taiga. A taiga is a "quiet northerm forest where plants, fungi and animals are joined by invisible ecological threads" (the plan of all life: plants, animals, water and air
existing for the benefit existing for the benefit of other
wildlife and vegetation) We widalife and vegetation.) We
were especially intrizued about were especially intrigued about
seeing a Dogwood "tree" that seeing a Dogwood "tree" that
was very old, yet was only about was very yold, yet was only about
1 foot high. At about 2500 feet, the Tundra begins. This is where cold temperatures, permafrost and winds prevent trees from growing, yet brush and other low plants including wild flowers grow. We stopped at Savage Cabin, where rangers conducting park patrols in the winter use the cabin
and in the summer, a member of and in the summer, a member of the park staff gives a history les-
son of this cabin and others like son of this cabin and others like
it in the park, to us visitors. We it in the park, to us visitors. We
also met a Native American who told us of her family's history and what they do today. It was all very interesting and we enjoyed
our morning. The afternoon was our moming. The afternoon w
spent with free time for us spent with free time for us

We enjoyed the "Music of Denali" Dinner Theatre in the eve-
ning. There was singing during ning. There was singing during

There was also hail, high winds and blowing sand that knocked out fields. Many dryland and re-planting were late, bumping right up against the crop insurance planting dead-

Kelley noted there hasn't been anything resembling "typical" for years, but typical abandonment rates are about 25 percent. And in the last few years, a larger percentage of cotton is being planted dryland, which usually has a higher abandonment rate.
