## Letter to the Editor

U.S. Senator John Cornyn (R-TX) criticized President Obama and Senate Democrats on the Senate floor today for choosing to let the government shut down for political purposes, when Congress
has the ability to act on Obamacare and keep the government open. "The most amazing thing that I heard today is, the Majority Leader said that Obamacare is sacrosanct. It's the law of the land you can't touch it. Well over the last three years, the Obama Administration has repeatedly and unilaterally issued waivers, granted exemptions and announced delays relating to this sacrosanct law known as Obamacare.
"And since when is it beyond the power of the United States Congress to change existing law by amending it or repealing it or defunding it? It's absolutely unprecedented to have a Majority Leader well as nnyone to say that Congress is powerless to ans when a constituents tell us they want us to act, because they don't believe Obamacare will perform as advertised.
"Members of Congress should not be treated differently, certainly no better, than the rest of America when it comes to the law of the land. So those who cast that vote, who walked that plank last night, will be held accountable in the 2014 election.
The president wanted to demonstrate some leadership. He should demonstrate some leadership. People expect leadership out of the President of the United States. But Harry Reid shut it down. ## The Good Guys - MUFA and PUFAs

## By Melanie Gallman Braun

These are the good guys in the world of dietary fats-monounsaturated fatty acid (MUFA) and polyunsaturated fatty acids (PUFAs). Remember that unsaturated fats are generally liquid at room temperature. Examples of foods that are high in monounsaturated fats are olive
oil, canola oil, and nuts; foods that are high in oil, canola oil, and nuts; foods that are high in
polyunsaturated fats are canola oil, corn oil, and polyunsaturated fats are canola oil, corn oil, and
safflower oil. MUFAs and PUFAs should be consafflower oil. MUFAs and PUFAs should be con-
sumed in moderation every day because of their health benefits.
Dietary fats are important because they provide energy ( $30-70 \%$ of the energy used by our muscles and organs while we are at rest comes from fat), fats are a major fuel source during exercise, fats transport the fat-soluble vitamins (A, D, E and K) into the body, fats help regulate cell function and maintain cell membrane integrity, stored body fat protects vital organs and pads the body, and fats contribute to the taste and texture of foods.
Lard, butter, and margarine versus canola and corn oil? Well, animal fats provide approxi-
mately $40-60 \%$ of their energy from saturated mately $40-60 \%$ of their energy from saturated
fats (these fats are the bad guys). Most plant fats fats (these fats are the bad guys). Most plant fats
provide $80-90 \%$ of their energy from mono- and provide $80-90 \%$ of their energy fom mono- and
polyunsaturated fats (the good guys). You can
lower your intake of saturated fats by switching from animal-based products to plant foods. How odo that? Cook with olive or canola oils instead of butter. Nuts and seeds, when eaten in mod ration, are rich in unsaturated fats and provid potato chips, snack on whole-grain. crackers and peanut butter. You can also drink soy or almond milk instead of cow's milk, but...well, that' almost sacrilegious to those in this part of the country. You might ought to keep that one to yourself if you do.
Low-fat, reduced-fat and nonfat. While these oods are healthier choices, be aware that you are reducing the amount of fat you consume, but not necessarily the amount of calories. Watch you labels and compare. For example, a serving of Regular Fig Newtons has 210 calories and 4.5 grams of fat and a serving of Fat-free Fig Newtons has 204 calories and no fat. So don't be
tricked into thinking that because they are fattricked into thinking that because they are fat ree, they are also calorie-free.
The take away today? Include healthy fats in out for saturated and trans fats; they should be very small percentage of your daily intake. AND, make exercise a priority!
