PMC to hold Medicare educational program

Parmer Medical Center is proud to announce their upcoming community education program on November 13th. As most Medicare recipients are aware, open enrollment started on October 15th and will end on December 7th. Medicare and its plans change every year, especially the prescription drug plans. Part D deals entirely with your prescription medications and although the plan you had for 2013 may have been ideal for your prescription medications, that plan may have changed for 2014.

By the time you realize your current plan is no longer the most appropriate, open enrollment is over and no changes can be made on your Part D. This program is being presented by Area Agency on Aging and they have the capability to review your medications and let you make an informed decision on which Part D plan is most appropriate for your medication needs.

The educational portion of the program will begin at 2:00pm in the conference room at Parmer Medical Center and last approximately one hour. Immediately following the program, the benefits counselors will stay until 5:00pm to assist anyone with questions regarding the Part D plan. The Area Agency on Aging serves as the advocate for the Panhandle's elderly population and is not an insurance company.

Parmer Medical Center and Area Agency on Aging want to assist individuals within our service area in making informed decisions regarding their Medicare care needs for 2014. Please bring your medication list, any insurance cards, including your Medicare card, and join us on November 13th - the one hour program may have a significant impact on your prescription drug costs for the upcoming year.

Parmer Medical Center will provide Spanish translation for anyone needing assistance. If you have any questions, please contact Rhonda Wilkins at 806-250-2754.

Council accepts Pope resignation

The Friona City Council met in regular session Monday November 4, 2013. No members of the public attended. Mayor Rick White presided.

After approving the minutes, the council approved a resolution to oppose another Atmos Energy rate increase request.

Police Chief Frank Mooney reported six arrests in October, most for public intoxication, 21 citations and 74 warnings issued. He said 800-900 people attended the National Night Out. A new police vehicle, a Ford Explorer, has been ordered and should be delivered in February. The department

has an officer opening and a cadet, Andrew Aguirre, hired who will attend the Police Academy beginning in January then become a Friona officer.

The council approved a modified lease with Scandia Wind for property south of Friona and renewed a contract with Dr. Jeff Dickson to be the EMS medical officer.

After a brief discussion, the council accepted the resignation of Councilman Charlie Pope. Applications are being accepted and considered to appoint someone to fill the vacancy until the May 2014 election at which time the seat will be on a special

election ballot for a one year term. Information available at city hall.

A trailer will be placed behind city hall from now until December 13 for citizens to get rid of old electronics at no cost. Only electronic items such as computers, printers, televisions will be accepted. The trailer will be there Mon-Fri from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

The next meeting of the city council will be Monday December 9, 2013 at 6:30 p.m. in council chambers at 619 Main St. All council meetings are open to the public and time is allotted for public comments.

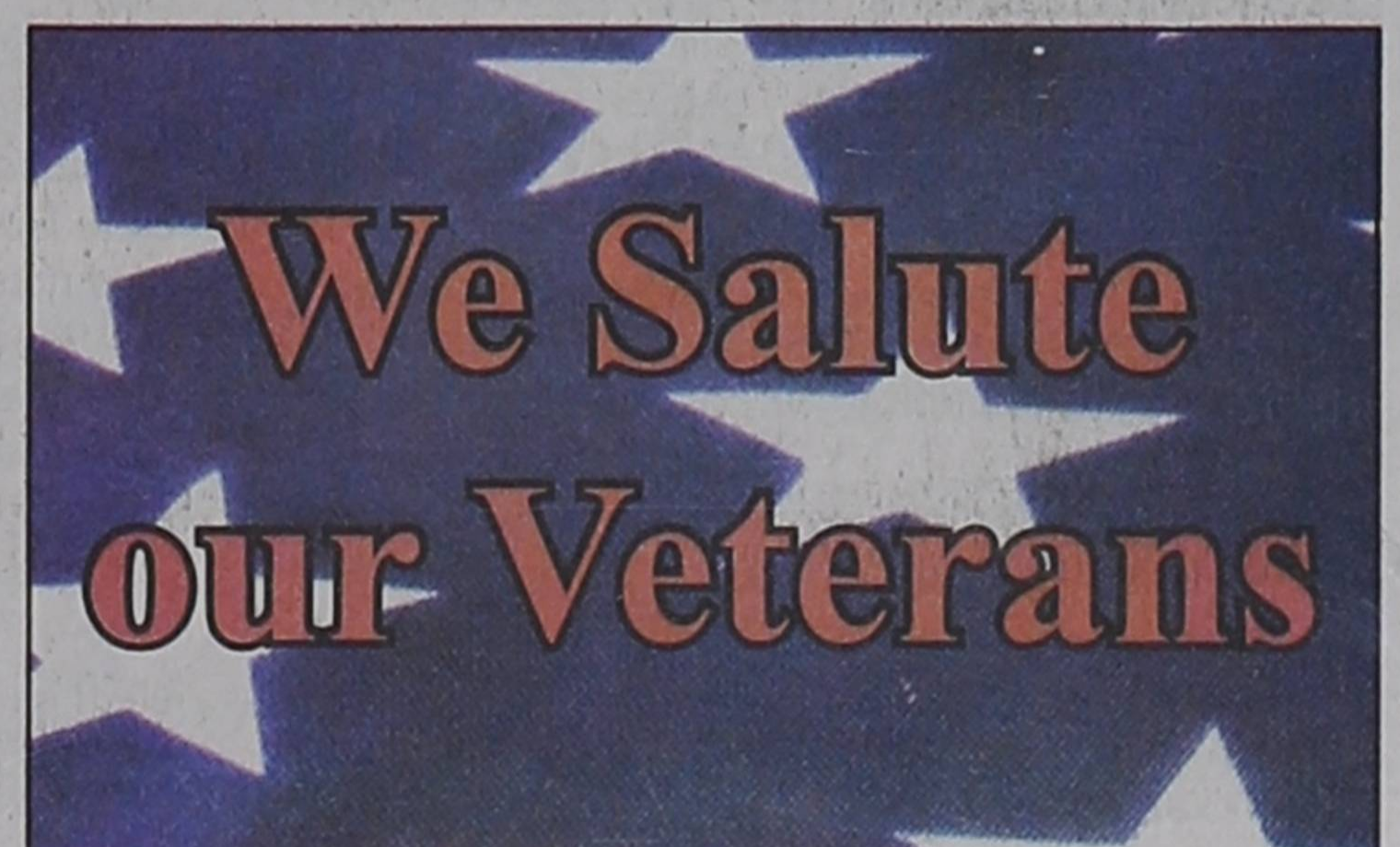

Mayor's Minutes by Ricky White

Recently, I was asked a question, from a Mayor's perspective, "How would you define success and prosperity in your community"? I thought about this question and really struggled coming up with that miracle answer. I called Chris Alexander and asked her the same question to get a Chamber of Commerce point of view and she reached out to the Chamber members and ask each of them the same question. I would like to thank Julie Mason for her response and comment on this very question. Once I read her response, it really hit home and made a lot of sense to me.

Success is creating a safe and secure community to raise a family with a great school system, excellent emergency services, successful businesses and neighbors you can count on. Having healthcare facilities that you are confident will provide great care for you and your family and, as important, elderly care facilities that you are confident will provide great care for your loved ones while being able to keep them close to home.

Prosperty is not defined by material wealth, but by the wealth gained by being part of a great and thriving community.

I had the opportunity to sit down with the Fire Chief, Jim Taylor to inquire about our great emergency service (Volunteer Fire Department) and I must say that I have a better understanding and respect for the volunteers that donate their time and effort to assist in an emergency situation. There are 27 total volunteer firemen that are active in our community who are available to assist in an emergency. Each fireman must have an extensive amount of hours in training before they can assist in fighting a fire. (A minimum of 70 hours to help assist in a fire fire).

To be basic certified, each fireman must

have a minimum of 160 hours of training. John Taylor is the Training Coordinator and is involved and responsible for all of the training. Records must be kept and maintained on each fireman to show the State that all required training is met before they step into action and assist in fighting a fire or any other emergency situation. Also, each volunteer must attend a minimum 60% of all of the scheduled meetings. This training is not just about fighting fires, but it also includes other emergency situations such as car wrecks, chemical spills, ammonia leaks, etc.

There are 9 total fire trucks available if needed. Out of the 9 trucks, 7 are capable of pumping water. Engine #5 can pump 1000 gal per minute. There are 4 trucks that can pump 250 gal per minute.

The Volunteer Fire Department meets the first three Thursdays of every month. The first Thursday is set for meetings, second Thursday is for training, and the third Thursday is used for work. (Maintaining trucks or any preventative maintenance needed on the fire equipment).

The Volunteer Fire Department does a great job in our community and we should be proud of each person that volunteers their time and effort to help keep our community safe. We, the city would like to say "thank you" for what you do in our community. We appreciate you very much.

Police Chief Mooney reported the following: Calls for service = 187. There were 6 arrests made for the month of October. Most of the arrests were due to intoxication. Citations = 21 and warnings issued = 74. The activity is down a little from previous months due to 3 Officers on duty. Chief Mooney is in the process of hiring another

officer. We do have a cadet that will be in police academy in January. The current 3 officers will work extra hours until Chief Mooney can get another officer hired. The grant for the School Resource Officer is approved and Chief Mooney is accepting applications to begin the hiring process. The projected month to have a qualified officer in our school system will be by January.

Court: There were 39 new cases in the month of October. Twenty two cases were tried by Judge. Court fines collected \$5,632.46.

EMS: There were eight, 911 calls made in October and 5 transfers. There was \$17,746.55 collected for the month of October in ambulance service cost.

Fire: 2 fire calls made in October. 1-grass fire and 1 electrical fire

Water & Sewer: The city pumped 18,842,200 gallons for the month of October. It sold 15,576,000 gallons and billed \$68,589.18.

Lastly, I want to comment on the handicap curbs that were installed up and down highway 60 as well as 5th street. I have received a lot of comments on this subject.... some positive and some negative. The city did not know that this revision was going to happen. We learned of this revision the Monday the State came in and started constructing the curbs. Although I personally do not agree with the money being spent in this manner, it did clean up the streets and the streets look much nicer. John T. Smithee (your state representative) investigated who was responsible for this revision and found out that this was mandated by the Federal Government. The cost will be paid by the Federal Government (80%) and the State will pay the remaining 20%.

DID YOU KNOW?

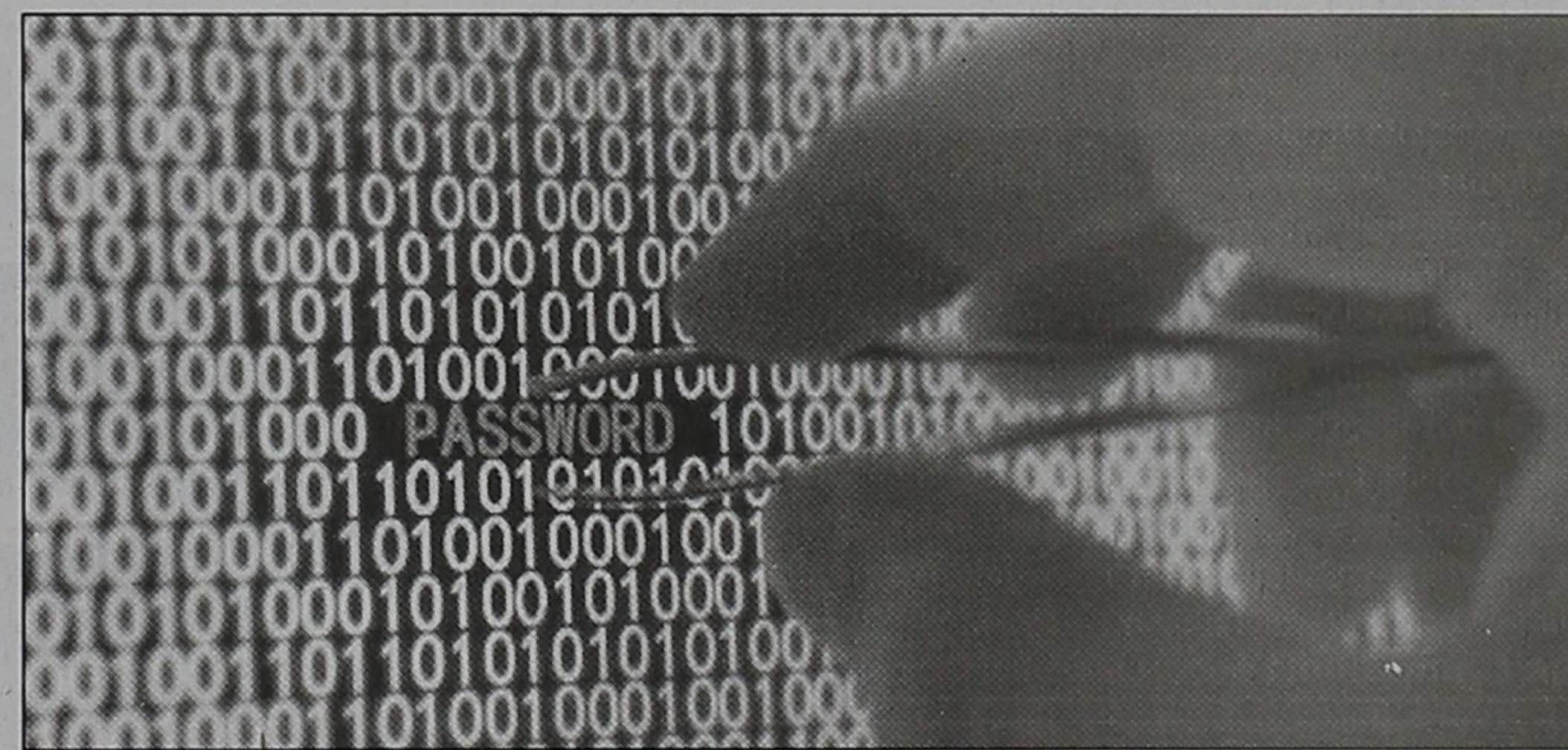
onstrate holiday recipes. You will be given a chance to sample each of the dishes and a book with all of the recipes included in the program to take home.

Have you even been dirt poor, up a creek without a paddle, or hit rock bottom and the only way you can look to is up? 2 Kings 4:1-7 introduces us to a godly widow, with two children, in debt up past her eyeballs and in danger of losing her freedom to her creditors. She has nowhere else to turn but to the prophet Elisha, who directs her to prepare and trust God.

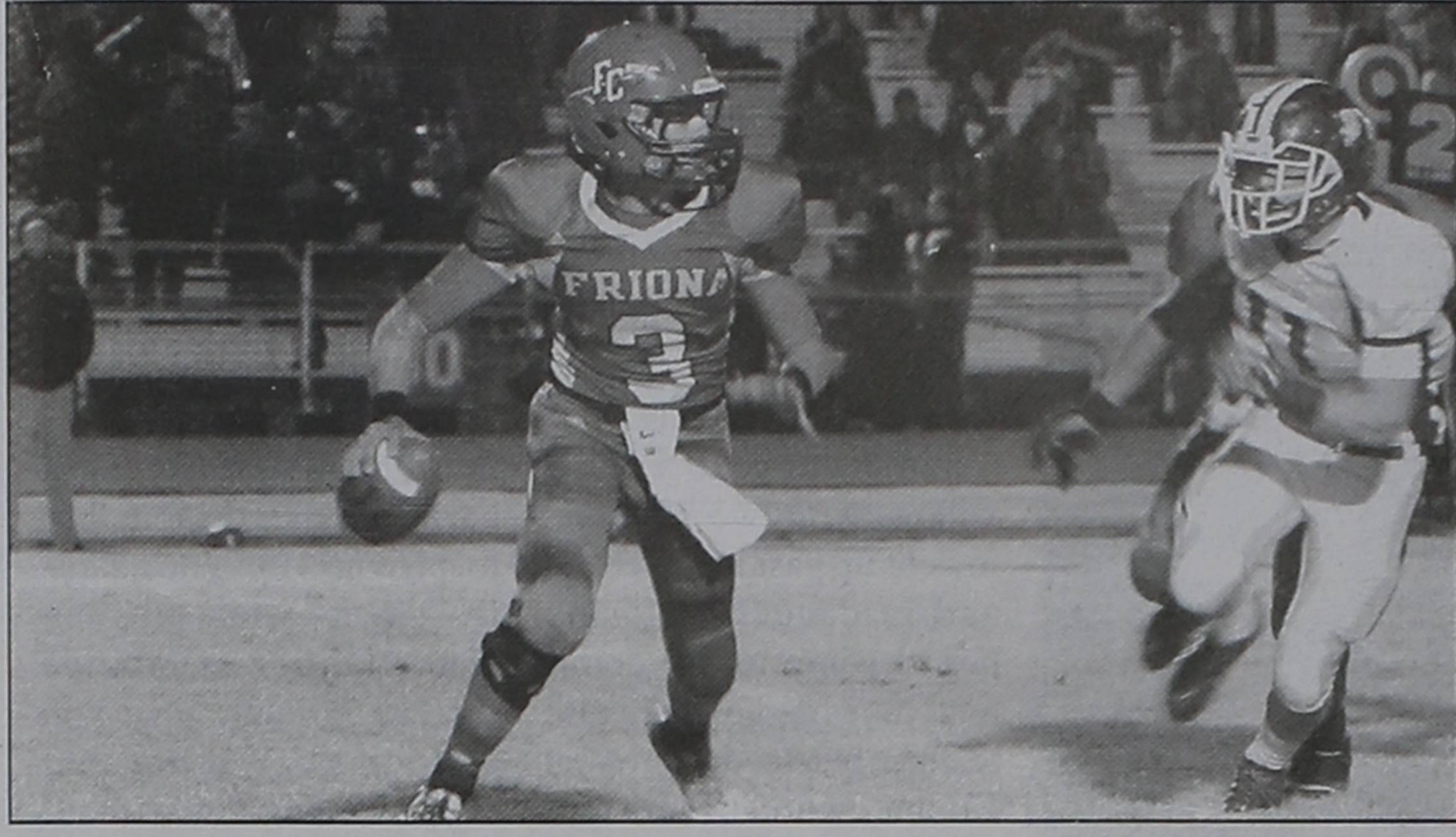

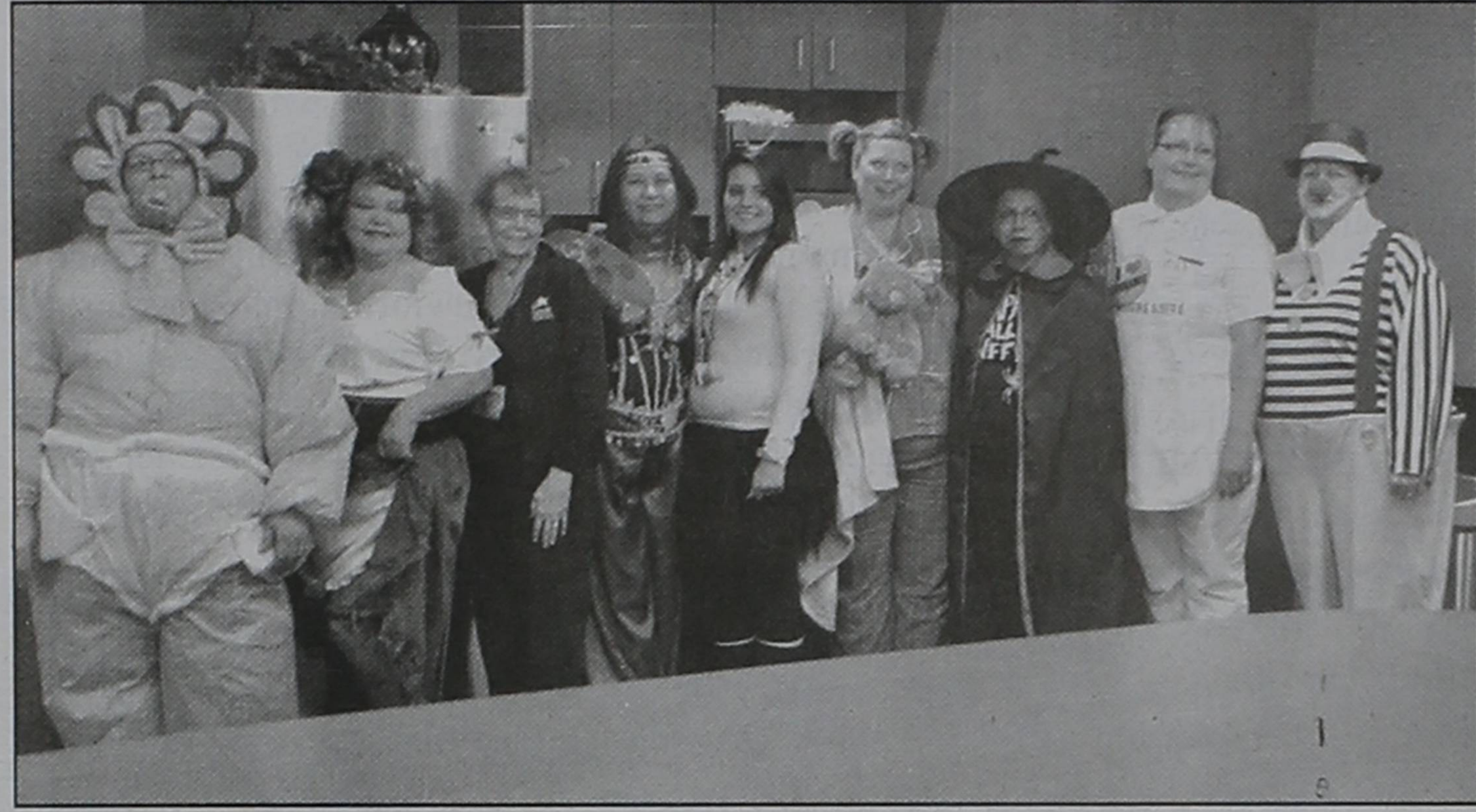

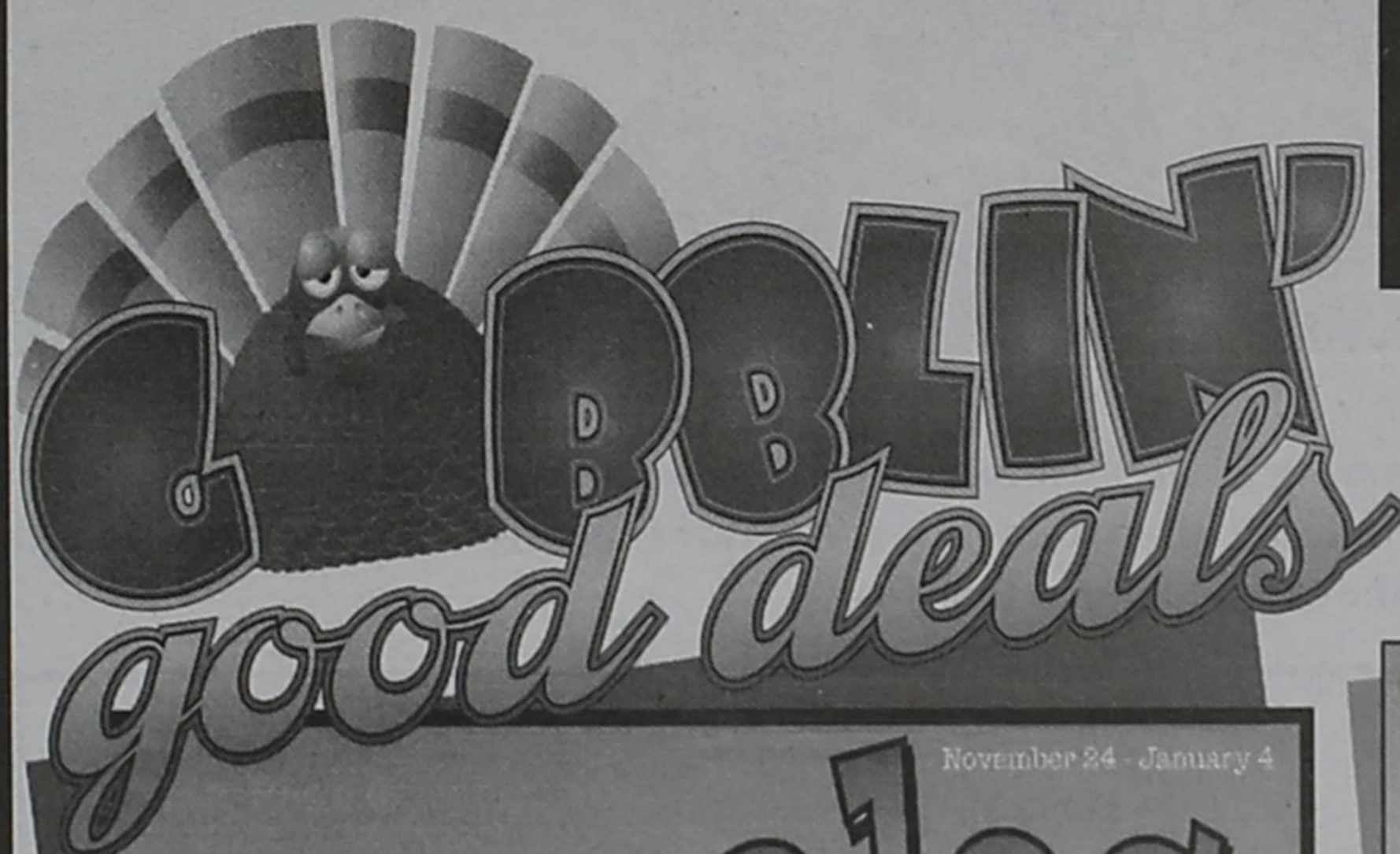
Chiefs fall to Littlefield 53-7
