PLANNING AN AEROPLANE RACE AROUND THE WORLD

New York, Feb. 2. The Aero Club of America announced; that it had promised its co-operation in plans to be started from the Panama-Pacifi Exposition grounds in San Francisc in May, 1915 and to be completed a the same place within ninety days

The first prize will be \$100,000 The promise was given on the receipt of telegrams stating that the Panama-Pacific Exposition and the Pacific Aero Club of San Francisco were organizing a race and applica tions for sanction had been mailed.

'The telegram stated," said the club's announcement, "that the exposition of offers \$150,000 in mone prizes and expects to obtain at least \$150,000 more, which will be divided among the contestants, the first prize to be \$100,000. The race is to be run inder the rules of the International Aeronautical Federation. The Aer Club of America will officiate.

"The plan is to have the race open for any type of motor driven air eraft. Guy Slaughter, president of the Pacific Aero Club, in his telegram recommends that sanction be granted and advises that full particulars and the application for sanction have been mailed and will be received at the Aero Club by Feb. 4



rchitects Going Over Ground With View to Putting up Much Larger and More Handsome Building

Another new church is to be erected Wichita Falls, probably within the urrent year; the First Baptist con regation is now making its plans for structure to cost \$40,000 or more and while the plans are as yet not in def nite form, there is every reason to beleve that the building will go up dur ng this year.

The new church will occupy the site f the present structure at the corner f Tenth and Austin, but will cover nore ground. If possible, some of the present building will be used in build ng the new one: this is a matter which is receiving the attention of the architects at present. The tentative extend sixty feet further westward han the old building, giving a great deal more seating space and provid

ing much more room for the various departments of church activity. The church has been feeling the nee of additional room for some time and at first contemplated building an addition to the present building. Later is was decided that in order to meet the quirements of the future as well as f the present, an entirely new build ng would be required and the congre tion is now at work to this end.

Architects have recently been going ver the ground and are outlining the cans for the building, but are not yet eady to proceed indefinitely. The ongregation expects to spend in ex ess of \$40,000 for its new building. I s worthy of note, in this connection that within the past four years every enominational congregation in thi: ity has either built a new church o as taken active steps toward that end The present Baptist church was ompleted in 1906 and was the firs brick church building to be erected in Wichita Falls.







I have decided to create an outdoor amusement park for this class of men. We are now constructing a wall about a six acre enclosure back of the prison where such men can play baseball or in dulge in other sports during their

"Of course we have in the prison chapel the regular motion picture shows, yet there are a great many en who are employed in our cell houses, prison shops, boiler room etc., who do not get enough exercise "It has long been by theory and I

think it has proved correct from the experience we have had with men in our road camps, that it is hard to build up a man morally or to strengthen his character without first building him up physically. We purchased all of the buildings of the Fremont County Fair Association and are placing a grand stand in this inclosure for the use of the prisoners. There will be an opening to this enclosure, to what is known as the south gate of the prison, which opens on to the street and one portion of the grand stand can be used by the public to see ball games or other athletic amusements participated in by the prisoners

"The main feature will be that men after completing their tasks for the day, will be allowed to go into the park for such exercise as will do them the most good. Each prisoner in the institution will be provided with an honor button and will be allowed to have access to the park during his leisure hours so long as his behavior is what it should be. Should he violate any of the rules of the in-stitution he will be deprived of his button and will not have access to the park.


