PRESIDENT ORDERS FEDERAL TROOPS SENT INTO COL

PROCLAMATION COMMANDS ALL VIOLENCE TO CEASE

Secretary Garrison Prepares Order For THE AUTHORITIES ARE BLAMED Movement Of Troops Into Strike Torn Districts

By Associated Press

Washington, April 28.—President Wilson today ordered United States troops to take charge of the strife torn scenes of the industrial war in Colorado. In a proclamation to the people of the United States he commanded that all violence and disorder cease.

The proclamation reads: "By the President of the United States of America, a proclamation. Whereas, it is provided by the Constitution of the United States that the United States shall protect every state in this Union, on application of the legislature, or of he executive, (when the legislature cannot be convened), against domestic violence:

"And whereas, the Governor of the State of Colorado has represented that domestic violence exists in said state which the authorities of said state are unable to suppress, and has represented that it is impossible to convene the legislature of this state in time to meet the present emergency;

Washington, April 28.—President Wilson has decided to orde regular troops into the strike zone in Colorado.

This decision was reached after the President had gone over the Colorado situation with his cabinet during the greater part of a two hours' session and a proclamation will be issued later today

The number of troops will be decided upon in a conference with Secretary of War Garrison.

At 2:30 o'clock this afternoon Secretary of War Garrison left SEVEN MINE GUARDS the White House to go to the war department where he will pre pare the order for the movement of the troops. A proclamation was being prepared by the President in the meantime.

"And whereas, the laws of the United States require that in all cases of insurrection, whenever in judgment of the President MILITIA AT WALSEN MINE OUT it becomes necessary to use military force to suppress such insurrection or obstruction to laws, he shall forthwith by proclamation command such insurgents to disperse and retire peaceably to their respective abodes within limited time.

Now, therefore I, Woodrow Wilson, President of the United States, do hereby admonish all good citizens of the United States, Report To Sheriff That They Can and all persons within the territory and jurisdiction of the United States against aiding, countenancing, abetting or taking part in such unlawful procedings and I do hereby warn all persons egaged in or connected with said domestic violence and obstruction of laws to disperse and retire peaceably to their respective abodes on or before the thirtieth day of April, Instant. Signed,

"WOODROW WILSON, President, "WM. J.-BRYAN, Secretary of State."

Denver, Colo., April 28 .- Conditions in the Colorado strike zone are more serious than at any time since the inception of the strike last September. Violence has spread from the southern fields to those of the extreme north continuing with vigor in the southern zone where seven lives were lost last night. Violence was inaugurated last night in the northern fields at Louisville, Lafayette and Marshall with unknown cas-

Mexico City, April 23 .- Admirers of Felly Diaz are very few in the Mexican capital. The enemies of his revolution, of course, execrate him, but he finds as much criticism among his former supporters as he does among those who have always opposed him. "Lack of nerve and ability" is the charge generally brought against him. No man in Mexico has had more opportunities to make something of himself and to take a hand in the destinies of Mexico than Felix Diaz for, even though he was only the nephew of old President Diaz, the president felt even more kindly to Felix than he did to his own son, who was thereughly incapable of assuming responsibility of any sort? "I tried to make a statesman," they say old Porfirio remarked of Felix," and he wasn't bigenough for it. I tried to make him a financier, and gave him every chance

in the world, but he couldn't rise to the opportunity. I tried to make him a soldier, but he failed. Then I gave

him the little job of being chief of police of Mexico City and he was Felix Diaz's selzure of Vera Cruz. efore the downfall of Madero, is a story that is full of instances of his inability to make the most of opportuni ties. In the custom house, when Felix Diaz gained control of the town, was the sum of \$3,000,000. 





SAVE MONEY BY PLANNING MEALS

St. Louis, April 27.- The real problem of home cooking is the preparing of appetizing and wholesome meals. time and money. Meals should be planned several days ahead, each meal and the program for each day hinging on the proceeding one. this way desirable combinations car be made with little or no waste. the meal is prepared without plan ning the housekeeper must use what she has on hand and a badly balance ed meal and poor combinations ofter result. If a market is near and the telephone is used in ordering she is apt to get an expensive price of meat which can be cooked nicely while the meat and wegetables left over from the preceding day are often wasted
