Acting on a tip, the Parmer County Sheriff's Department launched an in-vestigation several weeks ago into alleged theft of meat from the Excel Friona plant. On Wednesday evening, December 12, the Sheriff's office, assisted by the Friona Police Department, initiated a search warrant at a Friona residence. While the warrant was in relation to the meat theft,

residence. While the warrant was in relation to the meat theft, officers got a bonus when two occupants at the residence were also charged with possession of marijuana. Charged with felony theft of meat from Excel was Sheon Anthony Polk, 22. He was also charged with the mari-juana possession. His bond was set at \$5,800 and at press time he remained in the Parmer County jail. Carl Polk, 60, was not implicated in the meat theft but was arrested at the residence for marijuana possession.

Polk and others were allegedly stealing the meat from trucks and the final processing area at the Excel location and selling most of it. One theft incident was valued at \$2,800. 



Farmers, Ranchers Are Urged To Address Operating Needs

Low prices, tight markets and reduced yields due to extreme climatic conditions will squeeze profit margins for some producers to the point where funding needed to produce next year's crop will be difficult to obtain. As a result, the Farm Service Agency (FSA) announced the availability of operating loans for eligible farmers to secure next spring's planting needs. The Novem-ber interest rate is five per cent.

planting needs. The November interest rate is five per cent. FSA provides low interest loans to qualified farmers inable to obtain credit from commercial sources. An operating loan may be issued directly from FSA or in the form of a guaranteed loan secured by the government but funded by a conventional agriculture lender. The basis of our loan program is to provide temporary credit to those who can demonstrate both need and repayment ability." said Thomas S. Taylor, farm loan manager. "Our goal is to help farmers show that they will be able to obtain credit from private lenders when they are financially able." Operating loans are used to purchase supplies and input for farming enterprises. Input items may include seed, fertilizer, livestock, feed and equipment. Financing may also be used to pay for minor improvements to buildings and to refinance debt under certain conditions.

"Credit is usually ex-tended to established farmers who have suffered financial setbacks because of economic downturns or natural disasters," said Thomas S. Taylor. "Farmers who do not qualify for conventional loans because of insufficient net worth are also eligible for the program."

erating Needs U.S. citizens operating a family farm are eligible for a loan if they are unable to obtain credit from a financial institution, have the ability to incur debt, can demon-strate ability to repay the loan and are not delinquent on any Federal debt. "FSA doesn't just disburse loans," added Thomas S. Taylor. "We help our custo-mers manage their finances by providing credit counseling and supervision through required farm and financial training course." Direct operating loans can be made for up to

Direct operating loans can be made for up to \$200,000,00 and FSA can guarantee loans up to \$759,000.00. The repayment terms may vary, but typically will not exceed seven years for livestock and equipment. Crop funds are generally repaid within 12 months or when the commodities are sold. Producers needing addi-tional information about operating loans should contact their local FSA Farm Loan Office in Parmer County at (806)481-3349.



How to Move Your 401(k) to an IRA

THESE YOUNG LADIES added to the festive atmosphere at Friona State Bank's annual Christmas tea this week. They are, 1-r, McKenzie, Justin and Evan Davis, daughters of Dirk and Pam Davis.

When the day comes for you to change jobs, you may have to decide what to do with your 401(k). By making the right choice, you can save yourself hassles, aggravation--and

When the day comes for you to change jobs, you may have to decide what to do with your 401(k). By making the right choice, you can save yourself hassles, aggravation-and money. You actually have several options for dealing with your 401(k). You could, of course, cash it out, but you'd have to pay income taxes on the proceeds, plus a possible 10 per cent early withdrawal penalty. You also may be able to move your 401(k) money to your new employer's plan, if the plan allows it. Or, you may even be able to keep your money in your former employer's plan, although you won't be able to make any more contributions. However, if you're like most people, you'll move your 401(k) funds to an IRA. In that case, you'll have to decide how you want to make the move: via an "indirect rollover" or a "direct rollover." If you go the indirect rollover route, you'll receive your 401(k) money in a check, made out to you. To avoid paying any taxes and penalties, you must move these funds to an IRA within 60 days of getting the check. So far, so good. But the check you get for your 401(k) will be for only 80 per cent of your account balance. The IRS takes the other 20 per cent to cover any possible income taxes you may owe on your distribution. And you must dip into your savings to come up with the missing 20 per cent to complete the rollover within 60 days. If you don't, the 20 per cent will be taxable to you. And if you're younger than 59-1/2, you' also may have to pay the 10 per cent early withdrawal penalty. If you do pay the 20 per cent yourself, you will get it back as a refund, as long as you owe no additional income taxes for the year. But in the meantime, you've been greatly inconvenienced. You can avoid these problems by selecting the "direct rollover" method of moving your 401(k) money to an IRA. When you close your 401(k), nothing will be withheld, so you won't have to worry about paying taxes or raiding your other investments to come up with the missing 20 per cent. In fact, with a direct rollover, you'll never see your
