FOR LONGTIME Texas Rangers and/or Houston Astros
baseball fans, the fact that the Arizona Diamondbacks won baseball fans, the fact that the Arizona Diamondbacks won
the World Series in only the fourth season of their existence hardly seems fair.
Long-suffering fans of the Rangers, whose franchise dates

But Ye Editor thoroughly enjoyed watching the "rag-tag" But

their state, in spite of the sentiment surrounding the Yankees in light of the September 11 disaster.
I had not watched a single World Series game in at least I began to pick up tidbits about the Arizona team in the sports pages that peaked my interest.
After hearing about Arizona's

Schilling, I definitely became interested, but still not enough
to watch an entire game.
